1. The following press release was made on 2 March 1950:

"General MacArthur today announced that new trade and financial agreements between Japan and Thailand, providing for the exchange of \$90,000,000 worth of goods, were signed in Tokyo. The documents were signed in Bangkok on behalf of the Royal Thai Government on 2 March 1950.


"SCAP officials stated that the new trade agreement provides for an increase of approximately \$50,000,000 over Thai - Japanese trade during the past year, and that prospects are favorable for continued expansion of trade between the two countries. SCAP officials expressed the belief that the new agreement is a significant step toward the attainment of economic self-sufficiency for Japan in view of this country's growing capability to supply the industrial products required by Thailand in exchange for food and other raw materials available in Thailand.

"The new agreements were negotiated early in December 1949 at Bangkok by a SCAP Trade Mission headed by F. E. Pickelle, Chief of SCAP's Foreign Trade and Commerce Division, and Representatives of the Royal Thai Government. The agreements provide for balanced trade on an open account basis to be conducted in terms of U.S. dollars.

"The new annual trade plan provides for the exchange of a variety of goods. Japan will import from Thailand: rice, soybeans, castor beans, sesame seeds and other oil seeds, hides and skins, teak, gum darmar, lac and shellac, salt, bone meal, antimony ore and other raw materials.



ZX39309 For SAOUS (OUSFE). 1. Urmsg WCL 24560, New 49. Proposal to authorize Military Governor, Ryukyus to negotiate bilateral postal agreements appears to be only practical solution and is agreeable here. Recommend that at least initial negotiations be conducted through FEC and SCAP. Most nations with which agreements are necessary are represented by missions in Japan and negotiations can be expedited by direct contacts. Agreements to be signed by MS for Ryukyus Postal Administration and approved by FEC.

2. In view fast Ryukyus not member UPU, recommend State Dept ascertain if other nations agreeable to exchange regular surface and air mails with Ryukyus within provisions UPU Convention. Such agreement would obviate necessity negotiating bilateral agreements covering these mails, which would be extremely unusual procedure. Ryukyus would then need only agreements covering special services such as parcel post, money orders, etc., involving financial obligations. Principal countries involved in approximate order importance are: USA, Japan, Argentina, Brasil, Peru, Mexico. Other countries from which some mail received: Canada, England, China, Australia, Korea, Philippines.

## Command Channel mag fr CINCFE to DA dtd 3 Mar 50

MPR:

l. SGAP ltr to DA dtd 2 Jul 49 outlined problems re Ryukyus participation in International Postal Sve and explained existing government and postal organisations.

2. DA ltr AGAA-O 311.11, dtd 29 Jul stated Post Office Dept being requested to consider proposal to modify UPU Convention to permit adhesion

of Ryukyus.

3. SCAP mag Z 20290, 17 Aug 49 advised that time required to obtain modification makes such action undesirable, except as last resort.

4. SCAP ltr to DA 20 Sept 49 requested consideration of Articles 9, 10 and 11 of UPU Convention as furnishing possible solution.

5. DA msg WCL 42855, 21 Sept advised State and PO Depts disapprove proposal to modify UPU Convention.

6. DA msg WCL 24560, 19 Nov 49, proposed to authorise Ryukyus MB to negotiate bilateral agreements with other nations; that State Dept would concur and that POD would approve. Views requested as to whether this would be practical arrangement.

7. SCAP mag Z 29706 to RMD quoted DA mag and requested views of MB.

8. CG Rycom msg R 08431, 30 Nov 49, requested that no further action be taken until postal advisor arrived that Hqs.

9. SCAP msg Z 38455, 23 Feb 50 requested immediate decision and recommendations re DA proposal.

10. Matter thoroughly discussed with Mr. E. F. Powell and Mr. E. D. Rastorfer, Rykyus MB. They advised informally that the MD was agreeable to accepting the responsibility, after formation of Central Postal Authority. This was done on 18 Jan and has been formalized by means MD directive.

11. CG Rycom msg R 03105, 25 Feb 50, stated "MS assumes he has authority to negotiate bilateral postal agreements and intends to do so as seen as Ryukyuan Comm, Admin, formed," This is expected to commence functioning 1 April.

12. SCAP msg Z 38884 informed MD Ryukyus that such assumption incorrect and that only DA, with approval of State and PO Depts could grant such authority.



Part I. After careful study of the advisability of project discussed by General Sams with Howard R. Brooks of Unitarian Service Committee, New York, request recruitment group of medical professors as visiting experts for two months concentrated medical course of instruction to Japanese medical professors in fields of pharmacology-therapeutics, physiology, pathology, biochemistry, internal medicine, surgery, anesthesiology, radiology, bacteriology and pediatrics. The proposed group consists of ten professors (one for each of the foregoing fields) for a period of 62 days and a chairman and an executive assistant for 76 days. Chairman and executive assistant should arrive Tokyo approximately 1 July 1950 and instructors should arrive to conduct institutes to be established for two 30-day periods, 15 July in Tokyo and 15 August in Osaka. Costs estimated at \$31,836 as follows: Commercial air transportation \$14,616 (San Francisco to Tokyo and return); \$10 per diem (which includes salary plus nominal per diem rate) for ten persons for 62 days and two persons for 76 days, \$7,720; land travel within Zone of Interior and normal per diem enroute, \$4,000; preliminary travel and other expenses in connection with recruiting, \$2,500; contingency for supplies, \$3,000.

Part II. Provided you concur this project, request Part I be furnished Howard R. Brooks, Unitarian Service Committee, Inc., 31 Union Square West, New York 3, New York. Further request DA coordinate recruitment with Brooks, clearing each nomination with SCAP prior to final commitment, and obligate necessary GARIOA funds from Projects 412, 415 and/or 162, as appropriate, and advise action taken.
