- 1. Leur 1-4. Description of postwar Japanese export procedure follows: From the opening of limited private trade in 1947 until 1 December 1949 all Japanese exports were covered by contracts which were validated by SC.P. During this period commodity, price and destination were reviewed and approved by SCAP Headquarters. Upon the passage of the Foreign Exchange and Foreign Trade Control Law by the Japanese Diet, the control of exports and imports was put under Japanese law with SCA' exercising surveillance over the actions of the Japanese Government and it in turn over private exporters. Cabinet Order 378 was issued 1 December 49 under the authority of the aforementioned law. This Cabinet Order provides that all Japanese exports, on which satisfactory means of payment have been made by the buyer, may be moved without license except for a list of commodities set forth as appendix 1 in that Cabinet Order on which export licenses are required. The Order also delegates authority to the Customs Chief to act for the Ministry of International Trade and Industry in the issuance of re-export licenses on non-strategic and noncritical commodities where these commodities have been imported and held in customs bonded worehouse. Appendix 1 to the Cabinet Order includes in exact comprehensive terms the commodities which appear on the U. S. Positive List as well as all food and goods imported into Japan and items specifically described as contraband. This list has been revised four times to conform with changes in the U. S. cositive List. Most recent revision was 9 October and includes 40 categories of goods.
- 2. Leur 1-B. 2CLP has directed the Jacanese Government to refer to this Headquarters for validation, all applications for expert licenses covering designated numbered cat gories of commodities which appear in Appendix 1. Japan with coking coal and iron ore and with the durable goods in limited quantities, have been approved and validated when the payment for these commodities has been made with Chinese exports of food and raw materials. essential to the Japanese economy. Since 25 June 50, there have been approximately 300 applications covering commodities valued at over 10 million dollars for export to Communist China covering goods considered by this Headquarters committee to be strategic and critical on which no repeat no favorable action has been taken. There have been limited deliveries made on some approved non-military commodities which were put into manufacture after the receipt of an export license validated prior to 25 June. During this recent period similar goods have been exported freely by Hongkong, Singapore, and the UK and other exporting nations.

- 3. Leur 1-C. Procedures and SCAP surveillance are carried out as follows:

 - (2) Control of export licenses by Ministry of International Trade and Industry over which Foreign Trade and Commerce Division, Els, exercises supervision.
 - Bureau of Ministry of Transportation operating through the Maritime Safety Igency which controls herbor-masters and operational units under SCAP supervision.



Conversion of employees from nonappropriated to appropriated funds involves only those employees engaged in Special Services recreational activities and Troop Information and Education activities. Employees of revenue-producing activities, Exchange and Motion Picture Service, not involved.

Employment of Special Services and Troop Information and Education personnel is essential to perform assigned missions. Duties and functions are the same regardless of source of funds for payment of salaries. Payment of all employees from appropriated funds is temporary for the time being. Considered here that conditions dictated by the current emergency and the large number of resignations impending as a result of conversion to appropriated funds warrant an attempt to secure waiver of provisions of Classification Act of 1949 to permit conversion at rates higher than entrance rate of grade. Substantial savings in appropriated funds otherwise required for recruiting replacements would accrue to the Government and since such waiver would be on a temporary basis, nonappropriated fund structure would not be jeopardized. - b. Financial grants to underwrite production of significant monographs, scholarly journals, etc. within Japan. Much significant Japanese research unpublished due lack of funds. Scholarly journals facing tremendous difficulties; some are suspending.
- Japanese research. Much ignorance in U.S. of valuable Japanese research, especially in social sciences, largely due language barrier. American scholars could benefit greatly from availability in English. Work could be done eithe U.S. or Japan provided funds made available.
- d. Grants for specific research projects in designated fields. Du exchange rate, relatively small grants would finance important projects by Japanese scholars.
- e. Mechanical aids to research such as tape sound recorders, typewriters, bibliographical materials, mechanical computing machines sorely need ed by universities and research laboratories.
- f. School equipment of all kinds, audio visual materials, charts, maps, athletic supplies, materials for schools for handicapped such as recordings, etc., needed.
- g. In addition to publications noted para a. above, need gift books of all kinds with obvious exception of those trashy or sphemeral. On basis of most beneficial, kind needed in greatest quantity, and Japanese imability to obtain without assistance, priorities approximately as follows:
- (1) Children's books, especially picture books and books in simple English.
- (2) Teen-age books, also in simple English, on the U.S., outstanding Americans, school life, world problems, and sports.
- (3) Current and recent books in social sciences, emphasis on democratic political theory and institutions, general sociology, communicatio anthropology, labor-management relations, community welfare, women's position cooperatives, etc. These for university and other libraries.
- (4) Books of and about American literature, art, music, and stagecraft. Expecially needed are books which can be used in university courses in American literature.

- (5) Subscriptions for individuals and libraries (in addition to para a. above) for such magazines as Saturday Review of Literature, New Yorks Times Book Review, Harpers, Atlantic Monthly, Foreign Affairs, Theater Arts, Virginia quarterly Review, Fortune, etc., can help enrich thought in areas not easily covered by other media.
- h. Organizational literature many American organizations, institutions and companies publish brochures, pamphlets, charts, discussion guides and related literature normally not purchasable. If publishing agencies can be persuaded to mail them, in almost all cases there are parallel Japanese agencies which would be stimulated by them and interested in adapting them for distribution within own circles.
- i. 16-mm prints of educational films on all subjects, even though titled or voiced in English, would receive wide use in Japanese schools and organizations.
- j. Art: Expense involved probably makes impossible exchange original art works for museum display but American art galleries and libraries might consider exchange photographs or other reproductions of art with Jap counterparts.
- k. Dehation of printing paper for scholarly publications, plates for book illustrations, especially color plates in scientific books, raw film for making of motion pictures by Japanese non-commercial agencies, strings and reeds for musical instruments.
- l. Michange of persons: Private agencies might well consider supplementing GARIOA program by providing expense-paid observation trips and fellowships for artists, musicians, writers, actors, librarians and organizational leaders. Also important is development of real exchange professor and exchange student program. Additional programs such as Rockefeller-Stanford University-Tokyo University 1950 semipars considered invaluable.

MEMO FOR RECORD:

The BIG 9 Program for repair of construction equipment and other types of Engineer equipment could be increased at least 20% with the present facilities provided DAC now authorized could be obtained. Shortages in DAC now total 54. For the past several weeks the YED under which the Depot Maintenance program functions, has been unable to secure the needed personnel. Any help which OCE may apply toward securing personnel would help the BIG 9 program. Inasmuch as facilities are available for increasing the program on a one shift basis, provided the DAC shortages are filled, it is not advisable to attempt to start a second shift. However, in limited activities to balance production, a second shift is being, and will be used for short periods of time. Once the single shift is raised to a production equal to the capabilities of the physical plant now available, a second shift will be considered. This has been coordinated with YED.



The following is furnished for information. In order to meet future economic requirements of Japan, the Japanese Government has proposed the following JFY 1950/51 new Steel Merchant Ship Construction rogram and has requested that former tonnage and speed restrictions, arbitrarily imposed by SCAP during JFY 1949/50, in lieu of positive shipbuilding directives, be lifted.

It is proposed to remove tennage and speed restrictions.

Under existing limitations new shipbuilding is difficult to finance except by counterpart loans because ships are not competitive with larger and faster vessels.

Revenue from shipping is highly important to Japanese economy and directly affects balance of payments and consequent United States support.

With restrictions removed more ships can be built and greater use will be insured in competitive shipping service.

It is further proposed to approve the following program:

- 1. Thirteen 5000 10,000 gross tons diesel or turbine driven cargo vessels aggregating 87,250 gross tons, with speeds ranging from 14.5 to 18.8 knots.
- 2. Two 12,000 15,000 gross tons diesel propelled tankers aggregating 27,000 gross tons with speeds ranging from 14.5 to 16.0 knots, a total of 114,250 gross tons.
- 3. The remainder of the 250,000 gross tons ocean-going construction program (135,750 gross tons) is still under study by the Japanese Government and the shipping industry in Japan. It may not be possible for the Japanese to realize this entire program due to general financial limitations.
- b. In addition to the above program, Japanese whaling interests have proposed to construct 35,000 gross tons of whaling factory vessels. Such vessels not to exceed 20,000 gross tons. In accordance with Japanese Taws, whaling factory vessels are considered to be in the category of fishing vessels and therefore would not fall within the purview of the above Merchant Vessel Construction Program. Whaling factories are employed in whaling for about five months and during the remainder of the year, carry commercial oil cargoes and as such are considered tankers (merchant vessels) in the United States.
- c. Legislation to encourage scrapping of superannuated low efficiency and wartime standard vessels passed by last Japanese Diet session authorizes a program for scrapping 400,000 gross tens to liquidate financial burdens and release idle crews.
- d. As of 1 April 1950, the Japanese steel merchant fleet consisted of 1,682,705 gross tons. Retirement due to scrapping of superannuated vessels during the Japanese fiscal year 1950/51 totals 400,000 gross tons, as indicated in para c above. This deducted from the present existing steel merchant fleet plus addition of 300,000 gross tons proposed construction for the Japanese fiscal year 1950/51, will provide a total steel merchant fleet of approximately 1,582,705 gross tons by the end of the Japanese fiscal year 1950/51.
- e. Newly constructed ocean-going vessels will be efficiently powered and built to Classification Rules, complying with International Safety of Life at Sea Regulations and International Load Line Regulations.

Oil owned by U.S. interests and exported by Isbrandtsen Steamship Company, agent for American Oil Company, New York, and licensed for shipment to China by U.S. Department of Commerce was offloaded in Kobe and Osaka as in-transit cargo pending owners arrangements for satisfactory payment by Chinese buyers. Subsequently Japanese Customs officials permitted continuation of shipment of 12,349 drums in accordance with their understanding of Japanese law relating to in-transit or temporary landing of cargo. First SCAP knowledge of this type of cargo movement occurred while "Flying Cloud" was enroute Kobe to Yokohama on 10 August 1950 and action was taken immediately to call to the attention of the Japanese Government officials the applicability of Japan's new Export Control Law promulgated 1 December 1949, which carries provisions against removal from bond for export of items comparable to U.S. positive list without special authority of the Ministry of International Trade and Industry and SCAP validation. The Ministry of International Trade and Industry placed in the hands of A.P. Pattison (agents for Isbrandtsen Steamship Company) an official interpretation of the abovementioned Japanese law ruling that this oil cargo required an export license of the Ministry of International Trade and Industry. Upon receipt of this interpretation 6,460 drums loaded at Kobe were offloaded and returned to : . . . Customs bond in Yokohama, 14-15 August. Pattison company protested action on behalf of Isbrandtsen claiming oil to be "in-transit" shipment and not subject to re-export procedures. Customs officials in releasing the 12,349 drums of oil acted under long standing Japanese customs procedure based upon original Act of 1899 which did not recognize goods held in-transit or temporarily landed to have been imported into Japan and consequently not eligible for consideration as J panese re-exports. Japanese customs accepted U.S. Department of Commerce export licenses as clearing shipment U.S. to North China until action halted by headquarters, Occupation Headquarters

- 1. Incoming radio WCL 20589, 20 October 50, stated that Senate Interstate and Foreign Commerce Committee investigating shipments to China. U.S. Dept. of Commerce advised Committee that 24,000 drums of oil destined for China from the U.S. were offloaded in Japan during Harch-April. State Dept. testified to Committee that policy to prohibit shipment of strategic materials to China was initiated some months prior to Horean aggression and that SCAP had been so advised; stated that SCAP message C 61418, 28 August 50, cited 12,349 drums of oil shipped from Japan to Tientsin during period 25 June 11 August 50. State Dept. had indicated that oil shipped from Japan to China during this period apparently due to administrative error or conflict in jurisdiction. Committee chairman stated to press in reference to matter that: "A very lax situation that could have been a tremendous value to the enemy." and "Improper and wrong a gross miscarriage of regulations". Incoming radio stated that Senate Committee desires information as follows:
 - a. Reasons for snipment of 12, 49 drums of oil.
- b. Reasons for offloading of 6,460 drums of oil in Yokohama, 14-15 August.


Committee cannot reconcile p rmitted shipments during period 25 June-11 August with offloading of 6,460 drums, 14-15 August. Secretary of Army requested unclassified reply for release to Committee.

- 2. Outgoing radio C 61418, 28 August 50, referenced in incoming radio MCL 20589 gave the facts regarding the offloading and shipment of oil in question.
- 3. The Japanese Customs Law No. 61, 1899 (revised periodically through 1949) and the Japanese Bonded Marchouse Law No. 15, March 1897 (emended periodically through 1946) freely permitted offloading and reshipment of intransit and temporarily landed cargo. Japanese Customs operated under the provisions of these laws until 14 August 1950 when it was interpreted that the Cabinet Order Concerning Control of Export Trade (Cabinet Order No. 378, promulgated on 1 December 1949) applied to offloaded in-transit shipments as well as snipments of good of Japanese Origin.
- 4. Japanese Government interpretation of Cabinet Order No. 378 was delivered to A.P. Pattison and Company on 14 August 50 in reference to oil aboard "Flying Cloud". "Flying Cloud" offloaded oil after receipt of Japanese Government interpretation but protested by letter to MITI dated 15 August 50.

Part 1. Joint Regulation AR 55-107 dtd 20 Sep 50 has omitted any consideration for civilian employees or their dependents to provide space available transportation previously authorized in JA-F Bulletin Ho. 36, 1949. This action obviates authority granted in 0-R 11 Section 6-5 to permit employees with 3 years continuous service and also after 1 year to use transportation to the ZI for ordinary leave purposes. The provision of DA Memo 55-120-6, dtd 31 Aug 45 which authorizes space available to US citizens locally hired and their dependents upon completion of assignment is also obviated.

DA Pamphlet No. 29-14, dtd May 1948, as amended authorizes movement of unaccompanied dependents to and from ZI under certain conditions. No references to cover such extenuating cases are cited. Do existing regulations stated above fall within purview of para 3b, AR 55-107 where conditions and regulations proceed by the Departments apply in movement of civilians?

Part 2. As consideration given to employees in Guam, Okinawa or Philippines where facilities are limited, to use water transportation to Japan or between the islands mentioned Allocations of space on the vessels to the individual ports concerned invariably permits espace available use in this theater. To improve job performance, as well as to reduce total accrued leave (on which Congressional pressure is now bearing), continual stress has been placed on the desirability of civilians taking annual leave whenever possible.

Elimination of inter-island space defeats the policy of this command. . CINCFE has endeavored to afford equal treatment to military and civilian porsonnel in all matters. "Withdrawal of a long standing privilego from one class of people seriously affects the morale of personmel, especially in the isolated areas mentioned. It is difficult enough to obtain personnel for Guam and Okinawa. The elimination of a privilego that does not require the expenditure of funds reduces the effectiveness of sound management in efforts to obtain and retain these people.

Where commercial transportation is available the excessive time lost from the job to make a trip by water where poer connections require long layovers procludes approval of leave by the operating official; Commorcial air transportation is out of the question as distance involved to got to any interesting area makes the cost prohibitivo.

Part 3. The newly announced policy is considered here to be not to the best interest of the Government, and immediate reconsideration' of ordinary leave privileges for civilian employees and their dependents as outlined above is recommended.







The facilities of the American Consul are now extended to maximum in processing the marriage applications of those aliens whose U. S. spouses are already serving in FEC. It will not repeat not be possible, therefore, to obtain from the American Consular officers in Japan either an investigation or letter indicating, prior to marriage, that the alien spouse of an individual will be entitled to entry into the U. S. upon completion of the marriage, or that a visa will be furnished. Neither is it feasible for this command to attempt to provide reasonable advance assurance that proposed alien spouse can meet immigration requirements. However, the prospective husband should be advised that the proposed alien spouse will have to qualify under the provisions of Title 8 of U. S. Code, except the racial provisions of Sect 13c of the Emmigration Act of 1924 which were set aside by PL 717. This command now requires prospective alien spouses to:

- Submit evidence of a physical examination by a physician approved by the Consular Service indicating freedom from infectious venereal disease, active tuberculosis and/or other major communicable diseases.
- b. Secure signed statements from responsible parties testifying to the background and character of the prospective alien spouse.
 - c. Be able to satisfactorily pass a local police check.
- d. Be able to satisfactorily pass a U. S. counter-intelligence check for derogatory information or subversive activities concerning the prospective alien spouse.

It is suggested that before the DA authorizes the travel of military personnel to the FEC for the purpose of marriage under PL 717 that each individual be required to sign a statement indicating his knowledge of the above requirements and his belief that the prospective spouse will be able to comply with them.

Part IV. In the interest of the individual applicant, and of expediting his return to ZI subsequent to marriage, it is strongly recommended that DA arrange with Dept of Justice to permit the American citizen applicant to file, with Dept of Justice, petition Form I-133 prior to departure from ZI and prior to his marriage.

Failure to make these arrangements will necessitate applicant remaining in Japan for at least six additional weeks following his marriage if husband and wife are to return to ZI concurrently. Another reason for this request is that present Justice Dept procedure requires two witnesses who have known the potitioner at least one year. Anticipate that visitor to Japan would have difficulty meeting this requirement after arrival in Japan.

Part V.

- a. Service personnel entering the FEC by air or water should be ordered to report as follows:
 - (1) Army personnal will report to Central Billeting, Yokohama Command,






