CINCFE position is that these vessels are required by MSTIS to support FEC and any change in number or types of these vessels will be subject to approval by CINCFE.

Following are CINCFE recommendations with respect sea transportation in FEC:

SCAJAP fleet to remain under complete control, administration and operation of SCAP.

PHMP vessels to remain in title, control, administration and operation of Army and Air Force until completion of mission at which time if not desired by MSTIS will be reported as excess.

Ryukyus Military Government vessels to remain in title, control, administration and operation of Army until replaced by commercial type vessels purchased in Japan.

Operation, administration and control of one FS and two LSM in RYCOM to remain with Army, title to Navy, as use mostly local and not sea transportation in strict sense.

ECA - Korea Fleet. In teleconference on 5 April 1950 between representatives COFT, COMSTS, CINCFE and DEPCOMSTS WESTPAC, CINCFE was informed Baltic Coasters will be reassigned at DA level from Army direct to ECA under P.L. 447. CINCFE concurs.

Residue of Eighth Army operational and reserve fleet not transferred to Navy to remain under CINCFE control, administration and operation.

Military personnel now contemplated for loan to MSTIS reduced to Seagoing - 2 officers and 4 EM; Shoreside - 3 officers and 18 EM. There are additional military personnel who are performing MSTIS functions to be transferred. These personnel, however, are engaged part time in these functions and cannot be considered for full loan. They will, however, assist MSTIS during the transition period.

Subsequent to transfer of vessels to Navy, CINCFE will require usual quantity of small harbor craft plus the following:

In Japan - Thirteen 6000 barrel Y tankers, four LTs operating, four LTs reserve, and one FS of PHMP fleet assigned to CG, Eighth Army.

In Ryukyus - Three 6000 barrel Y tankers, four LTs and vessels of Ryukyus Military Government fleet plus one FS and two LSMs as indicated above--all assigned CG, RYCOM.

In Philippines - One 6000 barrel Y tanker and five FSs of PHMP fleet assigned CG, 13th Air Force.

In Marianas - Harbor craft only assigned CG, MARBO.

Following vessels remaining in FEC fleet to be declared excess:

6 LTs  
4 LSTs  
12 FSs  
2 Y Tankers (6000 bbls)

Information relative to TSA funds required to support MSTs and fund requirements for water transportation which will remain Army responsibility, being compiled in connection FY 52 budget and will be forwarded about 5 May.

MSTs will have no logistical supply responsibilities since existing Army and Navy activities in FEC will provide therefor. MSTs will procure and/or contract for maintenance and repair of MSTs vessels in Japan from Naval facilities and local commercial shipyards. In Guam and the Philippines COMNAV Marianas and COMNAVPHIL will be responsible for emergency and voyage repairs of all MSTs vessels. In Okinawa emergency repairs will be performed by CG, RYCOM, insofar as local repair facilities will permit.

Local agreements covering transfer of vessels and all related functions including above being prepared for submission to COFT and COMSTs.

MEMO FOR RECORD:

1. Department of the Army message WCL 48531, 21 Apr 50, advised that DEPCOMSTSWESPAC has recommended to the Commander, Military Sea Transportation Service, that only certain vessels in the FEC be accepted by MSTS. In view of this recommendation, referenced radio requested CINCFE's position on this recommendation and further requested information and recommendations regarding various fleets in operation in this command as well as the reserve fleet.

2. The vessels listed in the instant message to DA are employed in a function to be absorbed by MSTS in accordance with the Directive of the Secretary of Defense, 2 Aug 49. It is believed that any reductions or changes in the composition of the MSTS FEC fleet should be subject to CINCFE approval to insure that intra-theater requirements for seagoing vessels will not be jeopardized.

3. Background information and draft of the instant message were forwarded to the Chief of Staff for approval thru G-1, G-3 and G-4, in Checknote 1, subj: Transfer of Sea Transportation Functions to MSTS, 26 Apr 50, Trans Jo. 

1. Radio WCL 47511 requests following information be furnished at 30 day intervals to cover non-appropriated financed portion of FY 50 Import Program. This information to reflect both monthly and cumulative position:

a. Quantity and value of commitments by project and major commodities within project, similar to breakdown contained in radio C 54993.

b. Total quantity and value of theatre arrivals indicating separately those against FY 50 Program.

2. Reference radio states that the above requested information supercedes that requested in radio W 99457; and that for future planning purposes the same information will also be needed for FY 51 as soon as that program becomes operative.

3. Reference Par 1a, radio WCL 47511. IBM listing showing quantity and value of non-appropriated commitments by project and major commodities within projects covering the period 1 July 49 through 31 March 50 cumulative are being forwarded to DA via air mail. Similar data cumulated through each succeeding month will be transmitted via air mail on approximately the 15th day of the following month.

4. Reference Par 1b, radio WCL 47511. Total quantity and value of theatre arrivals indicating separately those against FY 50 Program are not available. The import data have been heretofore prepared by standard commodity classification and time of arrival in Japan. Import data have not been related to type of funding or period of commitment. Procedures are being perfected whereby future import statistics may be related to program project, type of funding and period of funding. This relationship was impractical prior to 1 January 50, the effective date of the Japanese foreign exchange control law.

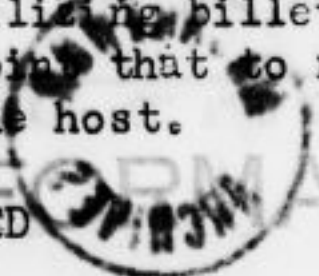
Part I. The concerted effort of GHQ to reunite families in the earliest possible time has resulted in complete utilization in Japan, from a practical standpoint, of all dependent housing units, billets and hotel spaces available from all sources. During the past six months the arrival of dependents in Japan has been accelerated by approximately 30 days under the foregoing. Consequently, these circumstances have resulted in utilizing to the maximum extent available, shipping spaces allotted. Currently, a backlog of shipping spaces to the ZI exists in the amount of 534 PCS spaces and 64 space available spaces. This condition is expected to prevail for several months.

Part II. At present there are a number of retired service personnel in Japan who had been cleared for space-available transportation under the provisions of paragraph 2f (22), DAP 29-14. Due to present and forecasted backlogs of PCS personnel, space-available return travel is not available. For these individuals to depart Japan via government transportation will result in a like number of PCS individuals to be displaced and delayed.

Part III. In granting clearance to enter Japan to retired service personnel, CINCFE has stressed the necessity of such personnel being prepared to depart Japan via commercial transportation provided space-available government transportation is not available. From a practical viewpoint this does not work out. Allocation of shipping space to FEC is received from COT two months in advance. More outbound spaces to ZI are utilized than inbound spaces to Japan for the following reasons: husbands travel with family; impractical to separate family groups in order to berth ship 100 percent; additional children are born in Japan; enlisted husbands must be berthed with family when infant children are under six months of age.

Part IV. One solution considered here is to prolong visit of individuals until space is available. This is impractical from viewpoint of utilizing billets needed for occupation personnel and from standpoint that to remain several months as houseguest is imposition on the host.

PART I

In line with United States policy of providing technical assistance, programs of the Occupation in the field of forestry have been directed toward restoration of forest areas, reduction of waste in basic wood using industries, and the development of sound, long-range programs and planning for sustained yield of timber. Forest policy has been developed to provide for reduction of flood damage, for the peacetime wood and pulp requirements of the population for fuel, shelter and clothing and to promote economic security by stabilizing the forest industry. The cooperation of the Department of Agriculture in making available foresters and forest economists for extended periods of duty in Japan has been most helpful. There is continued need for technologists qualified to extend benefits under the technical guidance program.

PART II

A. Continued development of present programs is required to insure that results to date are consolidated and that full restoration

of forest areas is accomplished within a minimum period of time. This is essential to provide a supply of timber to meet indigenous demand without reliance on foreign sources, to control soil erosion and floods in effecting maximum protection to agricultural areas, reservoirs and transportation and communication systems and to assist in maximizing employment. Programs now under way are: improvement of watershed management techniques to provide for accelerated reforestation, improved silvicultural practices and greater timber productivity; improvement of soil erosion and flood prevention and control practices; democratization of the forest social structure including establishment of cooperatives and improvement of association; improvement of forest legislation and the tax structure to provide maximum sustaining public benefits and revenue; development of adequate survey methods to provide an accurate inventory of forest resources and products; development of a forest extension service to furnish technical assistance to private forest owners; improvement of forestry research; improvement of techniques and reduction of waste in basic wood using industries including sawmilling, plywood and wood pulp manufacturing and extension of the life of wood products through the use of preservatives; and development of greater uses for hardwoods.

B. An estimated staff of 9 to 12 professional personnel in the several fields of forestry is necessary if effective technical assistance is to be continued for all programs. This staff includes those already on duty here. Employment of United States forestry specialists beyond end of United States fiscal year 1951 is not possible to estimate at this

time because of the changing character of the Occupation. Future personnel turnover not expected to exceed 25 percent annually under any continuing program.

C. Visiting expert consultants are desired for 90 day assignments on specific projects during fiscal year 1951 depending on fund availability. One specialist is needed to advise on each of the following projects; preparation of forest management plans, insect and pest control, basic democratic principles to be incorporated in pending forestry legislation, a long term program of equitable taxation to assure maximum government revenue from forest areas, forest nurseries and reforestation to accelerate the replanting of more than seven million acres of forest land, a forest survey to secure an accurate forest inventory, organization and establishment of forest cooperatives and associations in watershed communities, forest extension to provide for full dissemination of information necessary in implementing forest restoration, wood preservation to secure greater life of wood products particularly in contact with the soil and thereby reduce demand, and kiln drying of wood to promote a greater use of hardwoods to reduce the drain on the overexploited softwood stands and to provide products acceptable in foreign trade.

D. 1. Forestry trainees and college students to study in forestry schools will probably be limited in number as no United States educational institution participating in the student program has an appropriate curriculum. Selections are made by Japanese agencies and estimates for fiscal year 1951 have not been prepared.

2. Casual technical visitors during fiscal year 1951 probably will not exceed more than five concerned with specific problems of forestry technique.

3. Long term technical visitors may approximate 20 in fiscal year 1951 if funds for the purpose are equivalent to those available in 1950. These specialists will be primarily from the technical fields of forest management, silviculture, erosion and flood control, forest influences, education, research, administration and organization, legislation, taxation, and development of techniques in plywood and glue inspection and testing, wood preservation, and dry kilning.

The Industry Division, ESS, in a check note to the Director of Production and Utilities, ESS, did not favorably consider a loan of the size requested on the grounds that borrowings of 250,000,000 yen on a capital investment of 1,000,000 yen is financially unsound. However, the expansion of the industry is looked upon with favor.

5. The purpose of this message is to determine possible changes in world sources of supply and new uses in industry.

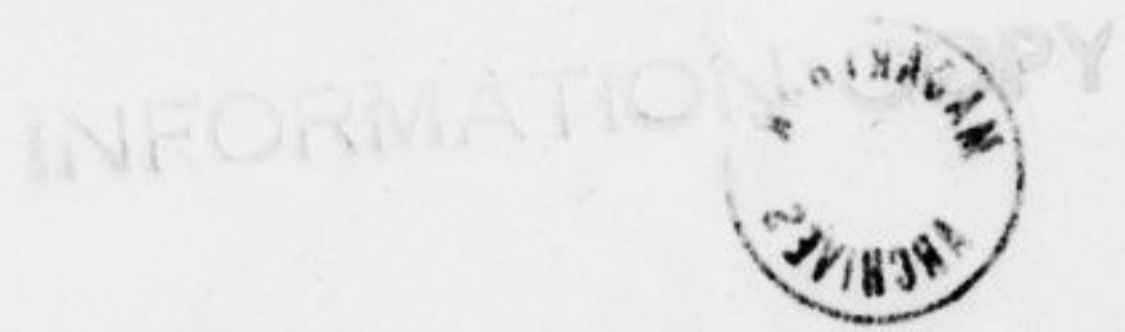

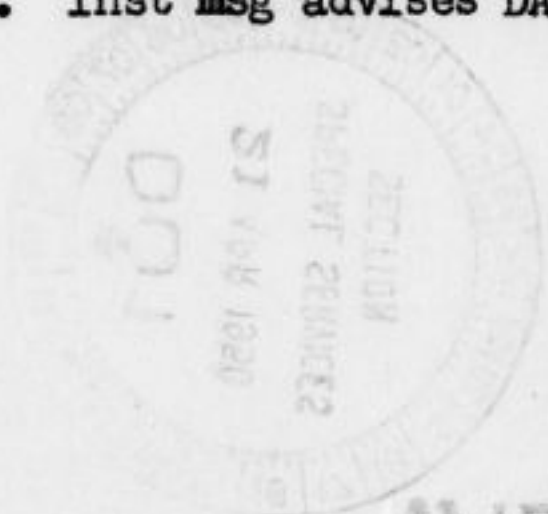

Memo for Record:

1. DAMSG WCL 31764, 7 Jan 50, states that FAQA is negotiating for purchase of 23,000 metric tons skim milk from CCC. Law under which CCC operates makes possible export sale at sacrifice prices direct to Japan, but sale to Army for Japan would have to be at full price.
2. DAMSG WCL 46226, 6 Apr 50, states 1000 tons skim milk to be procured for Ryukyus in fourth quarter FY 50. Suggests attempt to arrange free dollar purchase from Japan out of 23,000 tons now being purchased from CCC. Also states: "If GARICA funds are used for procurement dried skim milk, price will approximate 12.5 cents per lb FAS."
3. CG RYCOM msg R 05920, 14 Apr, requests delivery of 500 tons dried skim milk in June and 500 tons in September and authorizes use of RDCA funds to purchase from Japan at 4 cents a pound if other funds cannot be used.
4. Telephone conversations between Mr. V. R. McLeod, ESS (26-6332) and Mr. Cleland, RMGS, 14-15 Apr, indicate:
  - a. Sale to Ryukyus by Japan, at cost, of 1000 tons of dried skim milk can be arranged.
  - b. Negotiations now under way to charter ships to carry 23,000 tons to Japan make impractical any attempt to arrange direct shipment to Okinawa of 1000 tons out of this total.
  - c. Japanese economy must be fully reimbursed, in dollars, for any handling or possible warehousing costs incurred in connection with quantity sold to Ryukyus.
5. WCL 31764 indicated cost of roller process skim milk purchased from CCC would be aprx 3 cents per pound. Assuming one-half cent per pound added to this cost for handling in Japan and shipment from Japan to the Ryukyus, savings on 1000 tons (GARICA cost 12.5 cents per pound stated in WCL 46226) would aprx 9 cents a pound or more than \$190,000 on 1000 metric tons. 1. Radio message Z41285 from G-1 to DA 27 Mar 50 requested four experts to come to Japan for three months for training appropriate Japanese staff in Training-Within-Industry techniques. DA was asked to contact either Training-Within-Industry, Inc., Cleveland, Ohio or Training-Within-Industry Foundation, Summit, New Jersey and obtain offers and estimates.

2. Requirement of four men for three months is flexible, provided that some combination to cover 12 man-months service to include all three basic Training-Within-Industry courses (Job Instruction, Job Methods, Job Relations) is arranged. For example, two men for six months would be acceptable.

3. Preliminary estimate by Training-Within-Industry, Inc., was \$25,500 plus travel and living expenses to provide for four men for three months, plus \$850.00 for materials. Estimate of Training-Within-Industry Foundation at \$1,000 per man per month would come to \$12,000 plus travel and living expenses for same amount of service. It is felt DA should get formal estimate from both organizations before making a contract.

Programs of the Occupation in the fields of mining and hydrology have been directed toward the maximization of minerals and metals output and the development of sound long-term projects and planning for sustained yield of mineral raw materials and development of water resources, in line with U.S. policy of technical assistance exemplified by the Point Four Program. The cooperation of Department of the Interior in making available mining, milling, and metallurgical engineers, as well as geologists and hydrologists, for extended periods of duty in Japan has been most helpful. A need exists for continuing cooperation of this kind by providing technical personnel qualified to extend benefits of the technical guidance program.

A. Continued development of present programs is required to insure that results already obtained are made secure. Programs are: development of mineral exploration techniques, including geological and geophysical methods adapted to minerals, coal, and petroleum; improvement of mining techniques for minerals and coal; improvement of petroleum drilling practice; development of efficient coal washing, mineral beneficiation and processing methods; development of coordinated research and long-term planning for mineral resources; improvement of safety conditions and advising on plant control techniques for the mining industry, and development of sound methods of hydrologic investigations and utilization of improved geological methods in planning for construction of hydrologic or water impounding dams.

B. Current estimates plan for a staff of 11 to 13 professional personnel if the technical assistance programs already instituted are to be continued effectively. This number includes personnel currently on duty here. Anticipated demand for U.S. mineral specialists beyond end of USFY 1951 not possible to estimate at this time because of the changing character of the Occupation; 25 percent personnel turnover can be expected annually under any continuing program.

C. Visiting expert consultants are desired for 90-day assignments on specific projects during FY 1951, depending on fund availability. Present plans contemplate recruitment of one specialist to advise on projects as listed: Mining research specialist to advise on research coordination and development of mining industry research centers; underground water specialist to assist in the establishment of a program for development of underground water resources; petroleum drilling specialist to assist in the solution of oil well drilling problems, particularly on the deep wells; ore dressing specialist to advise on latest techniques of ore dressing and the use of controls in milling; mining engineering specialist to advise on improved methods of ore extraction in mines containing massive orebodies or exceptionally wide veins.

D. (1) Mineral industry trainees and college students to study in mining schools will probably be limited because U.S. educational institutions participating in the student program and which have appropriate curricula are few in number. In addition, since selections are made by Japanese agencies, reliable estimates for FY 1951 are not possible.

(2) Casual technical visitors during FY 1951 probably will total not more than four concerned with overall problems of mining administration.

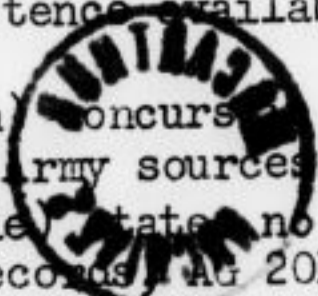
