1. AMIK has recently requested permission to return to Army stocks, on a reimbursable basis, certain items of Signal supply furnished that agency by this Command but no longer required by AMIK.

2. In accordance with the provisions of paragraph 6 c of SR 730-5-10, dated 20 April 49, the following information is furnished: number of items involved total 130 with an original acquisition value totalling approximately \$7,300. Items can be used in support Korean effort and their acquisition will have little effect on existing requisitions on SFPE for types of items involved. Sufficient appropriations available FEC to effect purchase.

3. Assessment of fair value will be by mutual agreement using SR 755-60-20 as a guide.

SUBJECT: Reacquisition of Supplies from Another
Government Agency

27 Feb 51

1. Ltr, AMIK, subj: Equipment, dtd 24 Jan 51, fwded a list of Engr, Ord and Sig equipment which had been furnished AMIK by FEC agencies and for which AMIK has no further use. Items included in the Engr and Ord list do not require reimbursement, however, since the Signal items were purchased by AMIK, reimbursement for these items is required. Ltr requested permission to return the supplies to FEC stocks. C/N 1, subj: Return of Certain Equipment to Army Stocks, 27 Jan 51, G-4 to Engr, Ord, Sig and COM, fwded the lists to the tech svcs mentioned for review, comment and/or recommendations relative to desirability of accepting any or all of the items listed thereon. By C/N 2, 3, 4 and 5, the tech svcs and COM recommended the items be returned to Army stocks.

3. Prior to finalizing this action, it is necessary to comply with the provisions of para 6 c, SR 730-5-10, which requires DA approval for the acquisition of supplies from other governmental agencies when such supplies are on requisition by Army agencies, and for which reimbursement is required. COM, GHQ indicates that sufficient funds are available to effect the acquisition.

3. Instant msg to DA furnishes info required by the above referenced SR and indicates the method by which "fair value" will be determined. Msg requested authority be granted to acquire the items on a reimbursable basis.

4. The basic ltr and supporting C/Ns are attached to G-4 File and action will be completed on the AMIK request upon receipt of a reply to the instant msg to DA.



Change part three ref rad to read: Basic commodity rate for stevedoring at commercial facilities averages \$1.30 revenue ton plus sundry expenses (night work, overtime, cleaning holds, standby, etc) averaging \$1.50 revenue ton. Arrastre fee \$2.75, stated part two additional. Total average handling cost at commercial piers, \$5.55 revenue ton.

Average discharge costs of \$2.225 for stevedoring at AF piers includes sundry expenses. Longshoring, intransit operations, and all extra costs incidental to terminal handling averages \$1.207. Total average handling cost at AF facilities \$3.432 revenue ton.

MEMO FOR RECORD:

1. Recent inquiry of OCT, Wash D.C., requested info as to whether any tax or charge of any kind is levied against MDAP cargo at Manila and if so, it was requested that a detailed breakdown be furnished, showing differences between cargo discharged at AF facilities and commercial facilities.
2. Radio, CINCPAC, ZX 26185, 19 Nov 50, to CG PHILCOM (AF), requested details regarding levies against MDAP cargo and a breakdown of costs for stevedoring and handling cargo at the AF piers and at commercial piers so that a comparison may be made.
3. Radio, CG PHILCOM (AF), U 28255 D/M, 4 Dec 50, provided the info requested. A review of the costs indicated a wide variance between the costs of stevedoring cargo at AF and commercial facilities. The information revealed that commercial stevedoring, which is on a commodity basis, averaged \$1.30 per revenue ton, while the same service at the AF facilities averages \$2.225 per revenue ton, 71% higher.
4. GHQ, FEC, ltr, AG 567 (30 Dec 50)TC, subj: Comparison of Costs for Stevedoring at Manila, 30 Dec 50, to CG FEMAF, furnishes info regarding the disclosure of the apparent wide variance in costs and suggests that a review of the subject be made to ascertain reasons for the difference.
5. Ltr, Hq FEMAF, AG 567 (10 Feb 51) MAT-SS-T, same subject, 10 Feb 51, advises that the info contained in CG PHILCOM (AF) radio, U 28255 D/M, 4 Dec 50, was insufficient and is apparently responsible for the erroneous conclusions cited in GHQ, FEC, ltr of 30 Dec 50. The cost figures listed in this radio were furnished by this letter.
6. CINCPACMSG ZX 28669, 7 Dec 50, provided the DA, 900FT, comparative costs for handling cargo at Manila as furnished by CG PHILCOM (AF) rad U 28255 D/M. Instant rad is forwarded to correct the info furnished the DA.

Request authority be granted to formalize and settle claims arising under implied, informal and invalid contracts to the extent permitted by, and under such procedure as may be prescribed under, the legislation referred to in CP Dir 61, 8 Jan 51, or other existing legislation.

Part II. Because of economic conditions, many contractors operate on a hand-to-mouth basis and lack financial stability so that any delay in payment of amounts due on contracts endangers their ability to continue operations and their future availability as sources of supply. Moreover, contractors subjected to such delays become reluctant to enter into new contracts for needed supplies. Contraction of sources tends to increase the cost of procurement.

Part III. In order to provide supplies and services urgently needed for operations in Korea, and, in some cases, because of situation changes there, contractors complied promptly with informal orders for supplies or services. Settlement for such supplies or services under current procedures will cause hardship because of the inevitable delay in payment for an indeterminate period. In addition, there have arisen what appear to be meritorious claims for demurrage not covered in the supply contracts, arising from delays caused solely by US personnel in unloading ships chartered by contractors to deliver supplies as required by the contracts.

Part IV. In order to minimize delays in payment of just claims, to prevent contraction of sources of supply, and to counteract tendency toward increased costs arising from such

M/R: By ltr JL 167 JA-A, 30 Jan 51, subj: Authority for Administrative Settlement of Informal Contract Obligations Incurred During Current Emergency, CG, JLCOM, requested that action be taken to "grant, confirm, or secure authorization and establishment of procedures to provide fair and just compensation to persons, firms and corporations in Japan, and the Japanese and foreign governments, retroactive to start of the current emergency, in certain exceptional and meritorious cases of informal procurement related to the emergency". Various types of informal, implied and invalid contracts were cited and previously authorized procedures were discussed. The necessity for financial relief for Japanese contractors was elaborated.

Section 17 of the Contract Settlement Act of 1944 is believed not to be applicable to contracts entered into in support of the Korean effort. That act was designed to facilitate the transition from war production to peacetime production following the cessation of hostilities at the conclusion of World War II, and Section 17 must be construed in the light of that purpose.

The procedures currently available appear to be those provided in AR 35-730, 31 Jan 49, and CP Dir 61 - FY 51. Section 22a of AR 35-730 reads as follows:

"Department of the Army. Where any purchase or sales contracts or transactions implying contract and involving foreign governments or nationals thereof cannot or may not properly be settled by the field installation and/or headquarters concerned, a complete file on the matter will be forwarded to the Chief of Finance, United States Army, for

examination. Such file will include the signed claim of the contractor or, where applicable, the letter of the contractor declining to make payment. A full explanation of the matter also will be included."

CP Dir 61, FY 1951, ltr, DA OACS-G4, Logistics, G4/E1 1270, 8 Jan 51, subj: Amendments and Modifications of Contracts Without Consideration, provides for no-consideration modifications of contracts through a procedure to be administered by the War Contract Hardship Claims Board (designated as the Army Contract Adjustment Board) and requires responsible procurement agencies to develop the facts and forward the papers to Washington. The procedure outlined in CP Directive 61 is based on legislation enacted at the beginning of the year, based on Title II of the First War Powers Act of 1941. Neither of the foregoing procedures provides the expeditious settlement necessary under current circumstances.

Instant radio to DA seeks authority to establish procedures for local settlement of informal, implied and invalid contracts so as to avoid the delays inherent in currently authorized procedure, to eliminate financial hardship to the contractors, and to maintain their good will so that they will be available for future service to the US.

Radio has been discussed informally with COM (Mr. Ashworth) and G-4 (Lt Col Alfrey), whose suggestions have been incorporated.

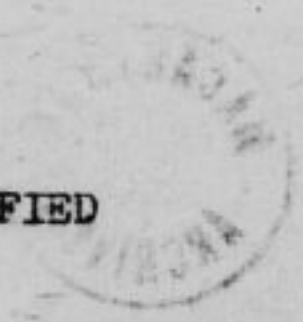
