Japanese imports of copra are handled on a private trade basis and import licenses are not repeat not validated by SCAP. Under private trade no attempt is made to control prices paid by individual importers as it is considered that importers should be permitted freedom to pay prices which are commercially feasible. Furthermore, it is not considered desirable or feasible for either SCAP or the Japanese Govt to attempt to impose any price limitations on imports made on a private basis under regular commercial conditions. From 20 Oct 50 copra imports have been handled under the Automatic Approval System and import licenses granted subject only to overall limitation of funds under each funding category. Imports were authorized from dollar area principally to cover imports from Guam and it was not anticipated that offers would be received from United States. During Jan and Feb exports of copra from the Philippines direct to Japan were restricted by Philippine Govt because of provisions under existing trade agreement with Japan which resulted in condition outlined in urmsg. Restriction regarding export of copra to Japan was removed when Trade Plan was revised on 3 Harch 1951. For your info copra will be handled under the Automatic Approval System during Apr-Jun. However, no dollars have been budgeted for the import of copra from United States during this period.

The freight amounted to \$25 per LT from a Pacific Coast port to a Japanese port. These Philippine-Japan Trade Agreement. The radio expresses the opinion that such negotiation would upset the copra market as well as shut it off from U.S. buyers. The question was further raised as to why SCAP would permit the Japanese to pay such premiums and use scarce freight space.
- 3. Para 1-d of the old Philippine-Japan Trade Agreement provided for the importation of all items on the Trade Plan up to but not to exceed the corresponding amount indicated for each item. Copra had been imported up to the ceiling provided in the Trade Plan by Jan 51 and export licenses for Japan were stopped by the Philippine Government pending amendment or revision of the Agreement. Approximately 20,000 if of copra, amounting to radio. This copra was all from one supplier in the Philippines, namely, Pacific Vegetable Oil Corporation.
- 4. As a result of the Philippine Trade Review Conference a new Trade Plan was adopted on 3 Lar 51 which eliminated the ceiling limitation on individual items.
- 5. Outgoing radio states that from 20 Oct 50, copra has been subject to the AAS under which import licenses are granted subject only to the overall limitation of the funds allocated to each country; that the amendment limitation on Philippine-Japan Trade Plan on 3 Harch 51 eliminated the ceiling still be under AAS during the April-June Quarter, import licenses will not copra is on a private trade basis and import licenses do not require SCAP validation.





Japanese natls permanently residing abroad are encountering almost insurmountable obstacles in obtaining documentation for tvl to Japan. For example, a large nbr Japanese resident Brazil desire entry Japan as tourists. SCAP regs prov appli must be submitted through govt channels and that indiv must possess valid tvl doc prior to clear. For various reasons neither US, Brazilian, nor Swedish consul auths will process subj appli. Further the Swedish consul, which acts as protecting power for Japanese interests, will not issue a passport until SCAP clear has been obtained. It is considered that these procedures are entirely unsatisfactory and impose undue hardship on indiv concerned and deprives the Japanese economy of foreign exchange.

In view foregoing and since it is announced policy this has to restore controls to Japanese Govt, study is being made to determine feasibility permitting Japanese Govt issue autonomous passports to Japanese natls residing abroad. The extent of such a plan would depend on concurrence of country in which natl resides and tvl would be limited to those countries recognizing such passport as valid tvl doc. Along with other cogent reasons, this auth would avoid vacuum created by a peace treaty which would exist until Japanese devised passport and regs and disseminated to reps abroad.

As an interim measure to meet immed prob, it is ppsd that Japanese Overseas Agencies act as SCAP agents and process appl for entry Japan fr Japanese natls residing abroad in fol manner:

- 1. Receive appl and verify info therein.
- 2. Verify that applicant possesses a valid reentry permit into country concerned which will also be construed as valid tvl doc insofar as ent Japan is concerned.
- 3. Fwd appl to Japanese Min Forcian Affairs who submits appl to this has with recommendations of Japanese Govt.
