Tirst principle: Concur.

Second principle: Delete "in consultation as appropriate with Red Cross Representatives". This proposal is impractical since allocations are made on a bulk basis without regard to the source of donation. It is impracticable to segregate and earmark sups from specific donors to be allocated to specified recipients in Korea. Specific donors to be allocated to specified recipients in Korea. It is inappropriate for Red Cross Representatives to participate in It is inappropriate for Red Cross Representatives to participate in the allocation of sups received from other donors and it is equally inappropriate to permit Red Cross participation without also authorizing other groups to have representatives engage in such activities, which would create administrative chaos.

Third principle: Do not concur. Distribution of sups in Korea must of necessity be ade to meet the needs as and where they arise. Korean Red Cross, as one of many Korean agencies engaged in relief Korea, has received and will continue to receive its proportionate in Korea, has received and will continue to receive its proportionate share of sups regardless of source of donation. Journal on earmarking of sups made reference principle 2 above applies equally to this principle.

Fourth principle: Do not concur. Temyins CX 58526 HVKOR 63 dtd 8 Nov 50 and urmsg W 97019 KOTCIV 66 dtd 22 Nov 50. Part 1. This information has not been passed to major subordinate commands for reasons indicated hereafter.

Part 2. Urgently request reconsideration of proposed criteria in part 2 your msg for the following reasons:

a. Use of same identifying bar for overseas service in Korea as was authorized in WW II is inconsistent as such action only remotely conected with WW II.

b. Those personnel wounded in the initial critical period in Korea and who did not serve six months in Korea would have no distinctive overseas bar to denote their Korean service.

c. Restricting the wearing of the bar to personnel who served in Korea creates an injustice to those Dept of Defense personnel in Japan and Okinawa whose sole duty is supporting the war effort in Korea.

Part 3. This is a definite morale item, therefore strongly recommend adoption of policies similar to those contained in GHQ, FEC letter AG 421.4 (11 Jan 51)GA, dated 14 Jan 1951, subject: Proposed Overseas Service Insignia. Signed Hickey.

Part I. General. This is additional information to that which you have in your PIO biographical files, Generals Gay, Barr, Church and Kean. Copies of all available citations awarded for service in connection with war effort in Korea will be forwarded air mail.

Part II. Maj Gen Hobart R. Gay. Names 1st Cav Div and Gen Gay are practically synonymous. Div definitely reflects his drive, aggressiveness and daring. Led Division into Korea, 18 Jul. Relieved 24th Division south of Taejon on 21 July and by successive delaying actions retarded advance of North Korean forces until defensive perimeter established at Pusan. Successfully defended Taegu. Partieipated in break out of UN forces from perimeter on 16 Sep and led Eighth Army in linkup with Inchon forces at Osan on 28 Sep. Continued to load Eighth Army drive to capture Pyongyang. On 2 Dec when Chinese Communists threatened to overrun Eighth Army right (east) flank, the 1st Cav was given the mission of holding them. This they did. Awarded 1st Oak Leaf Cluster to DSC for conspicuous bravery and the DFC for air flights under particularly hazardous conditions. Recommended for DSM. The very strong affection that the men of the 1st Cav Div fool for their commander can be traced to his leadership but also to his unremitting concern about their personal safety and wolfare.

Part III. Maj Gon David G. Barr. Roorganized and trained 7th Inf Div in Japan in record time. Led Div since landing at Inchen 18 Sep. Some of the outstanding operations after landing were capture of Suwen, key south Korean communication point, linkup with Eighth Army at Osan and conducting successful attack on 12 hr notice which involved moving RCT, in its first combat operation, ever 15 miles at night, making an amphibious attack across Han river at dawn and capturing the key hill dominating the city of Secul. Second amphibious landing was made at Iwon on 29 Oct. After attacking across rugged mountains,

Div captured Kapsan in North Korea and continued drive to Yalu near Hyesanjin. These were the only American troops to reach and occupy positions on south bank of Yalu facing Manchuria. Skillfully withdrew from Yalu when Chinese Communist offensive began on 25 Nov. Assisted materially in reducing pressure on 1st Mar Div at Chesin so that it could be withdrawn. Had major role in defense of Hungnam perimeter and in the evacuation of UN forces from this port. Presently engaged in defeating Chinese Communists in Korea. Awarded DSC and SS in Korea. Recommended for DSM, see CINCFE message Z 34730, 21 Jan. Gen Barr has the complete confidence of and is very close to his men. No personal sacrifice for their benefit is too great as far as Gen Barr is concorned.

Part IV. Maj Gen John H. Church. Assumed command 24th Inf Div on 23 July at a critical yet very difficult period. Div disorganized. Had lost many key leaders, and was at 45% strongth. NK drive throatoning Pusan from south forced commitment of Div in this condition. Under Gen Church, Marines, RCKs and 24th Div were banded together and stopped NK threat. On 16 Ser, 24th Div broke hold of NK forces oncircling Eighth Army by capturing Waogwan and Taojon. Continued advance northward until Div reached Songchon and within sight of Yalu by late Oct. Prior to assuming command of the 24th Div, Gon Church had been charged with organizing advance CP, GHQ in Kerea and with reorganizing the dispersed elements of the ROK forces. It was due in large part to his heroic efforts between 27 June and 12 July that impotus and direction was given to reestablishing the deteriorating front lines. Awarded Legion of Merit for this latter action and the 1st Oak Loaf Cluster to SS for gallantry in action on 19 Sep. Recommonded for DSM (see CINCFE msg Z 37430, 21 Jan). 24th Div awarded Dist Unit Citation and has been proffered the ROK distinguished citation. Gon Church is a tiroloss worker and is unremitting in his devotion to his mon and their welfare.

Part V. Maj Gon William B. Koan. Commanded 25th Inf Div silco 7 Sep 48. After arrival in Koroa on 10 Jul 50 led Div through 190 days of combat. Outstanding operations - 10 Jul to 31 Jul. With Piv hold line northwest of Taegu against desperate assaults by two North Korean Divisions until forced withdrawal after four days fighting. On 21 July - 1 Aug task force Koan staged diversionary attack toward Sinju to delay the enemy's attack on the Naktong line until this line could be prepared for defense. After taking part in coordinated Army attack launched on 24 Nov 50, Div repulsed strong counterattacks. As enemy offensive forced 8th army back, 25th covered withdrawal in defensive positions at Pahchon and Won-ni. Gon Koan executed the all important mission of defending the bridges and fords across the Chongchon River to cover the withdrawal of Army units. Dotailed planning resulted in the completion of the withdrawal and the destruction of the bridges in the vicinity of Anju in an outstandingly successful manner. Part 1. Recommend the award of second OLC to DSM for Maj Gen David G. Barr, 010313, US Army. This officer is highly recommended for DSM by Maj Gen E.M.Almond, CG X Corps and concurred in by Lt Gen Ridgway. Gen Ridgway desires to present this award prior to departing of Gen Barr for new asgmt. Proposed citation follows: "For exceptional meritorious conduct in a duty of great responsibility during military operations against an armed enemy in Korea from 30 June 50 to 20 Jan 51. As CG of the 7th Div, immediately preceeding his arrival in Korea, Gen Barr was faced with the momentous task of reorganizing and treating his division after it had been depleted of trained troops to reinforce units already committed to the battle front in Korea. The highly successful accomplishment of this task in a minimum time is evidenced by the outstanding combat effectiveness displayed by his division in Korea. Gen Barr displayed a high degree of leadership, aggressiveness, and a complete devotion to duty during the planning stages and execution of the amphibious landings and combat operations during the invasion of Inchon and the attack southward to seize Suwon and its vitally needed airfield. The combat effectiveness of the division in amphibious operations once again proved itself during the invasion of Iwon and the attack NW to the Yalu River on the Manchurian Border. His highly competent supervision of command and staff functions as revealed in the smooth transition of this division from a peace time mission to one of combat in such an extremely short period, ably demonstrated his superb fitness for high command. His leadership, initiative, tactical judgment and unremitting devotion to duty in projecting and coordinating the tactical elements of his command have materially contributed to the success of the UN mission. Frequently exposing himself to enemy fire, he personally visited subordinate commanders on the front lines and by fearless leadership aided and encouraged his forces in the attainment of their assigned objectives. Gen Barr's extraordinary performance of duty reflects great credit on himself and is in keeping with our highest ideals and the esteemed traditions of the military service. Entered the federal service from Alabama."

Gen Ridgway desires to present this award to Gen Church prior to his departure in the near future on new assignment. fromosed citation follows: "Gen Church rendered exceptionally meritorious and distinguished survices in the performance of duties of great responsibility during the period 23 July to 20 Jan 1951. When Gen Church assumed command of the 24th Inf Div, combat effectiveness had been reduced to less than 45% by an exhaustive delaying action during which the Division had suffered severe losses in men and equipment. Though the Division had been relieved for badly needed rest and reorganization, the gra. .. of the military situation necessitated immediate recommitment to defend the western flank of the American zone against an enemy drive on Pulen. Gen Church committed his forces on an eighty mile front and succeeded by series of tenacious delaying schions in thwarting the enemy timent. On 6 Aug 50 the Division was given a new defensive mission on the central Maktong River line. The enunc surconded in securing a bridgehead on the outhern end of the Division's and dufensive sector. For thurch communitied the small reserve available to rin in an effort to contrain the penetration. When the reserves proved to be themfffclent, he andacionally withdrew infantry and artillery units from in relainder of the Division'; wide front and replaced them with his engineer bastalion. With show new forces, he counter attacked the enemy bridgehear which recessed in containing the enemy. When the 1st Provisiona Marine bragedo was attached several days later, another counterattack was made which succeeded in crasing the enemy bridgehead. On 6 September 1950, Gen Church was ordered to move his command to the Kyongju-Pohang area where the enemy had breached the lines of the Army of the Republic of Korea. He was ordered to assume command of the badly shaken Republic of Yoros Forces in his zone in addition to the 24th Inf Division, and to restore the original line. by a serie of rapid attack, he accomplished this missio ... Several days later Cen Church was cracred to cross the laktong diver in the vicinity of Waogwan and to attack to the north set along the main axis of communications in South Korea with Macjon as the livision objective. Initial elements of his command crossed the Mattene River on 18 September 50 against heavy opposition. Eight days later the livision recaptured Maejon. In this ninety mile offensive more than gover thousand prisoners were captured, hundreds killed, countless items of armor and equipment destroyed, and the once powerful enemy divisions in this area rendered totally ineffective. Several weeks later Gen Church was ordered to move his Division to the north, attack across the 38th parallel and cut off the peninsular portion of North Korea to the west of Haeju-Chaeryong. Again he directed elements of his command in an outstanding offensive that accomplished this mission and inflicted severe losses upon the enemy. On 20 Oct 1950, Gen Church was ordered to move the 24th Inf Division to the vicinity of Pyongyang and attack to the northwest on a forty mile front. Gen Church made brilliant tactical decisions backed by a correct analysis of the enemy's capabilities and probable courses of action. His decisions enabled the Division to overrun each of the enemy's many defenses in the area. The record of the 24th Inf Division in Korea is a noble one and its achievements under Gen Church mark a distinct period in its magnificent accomplishments on the battlefields of Korea. Gen Church's exceptionally

In accordance with DA msg W 99351, 21 Dec 50, instant meg requests suthority to procure 1,000 MT of sosp and 63,800 lbs of calcium hypochlorite for civil relief use in Kores. These quantities are within approved program requirements for South Kores for FY 51. 2. Requirements for this procurement were contained in EUSAK msgs G-1-598 KGAN, 8 Jen 51, G-1-727 KCAC, 10 Jen 51, end G-1-1320 KCAN, 16 Jan 51. Modified by telecon, Lt Col Hardin (G-4 KEAD) with Lt Col Sundlof (CAS EUSAK) to reduce Feb and Mar soep romts to 500 MT for each month. 3. Subject msg points out to DA that it is felt here that price of soap in Japan is excessive. Info is requested from DA on any quantities programmed in ZI for supply against South Korean requirements. Authority is requested to procure locally the remaining quantity of soap to meet emergency needs which cannot be supplied from ZI for Feb and Mar deliveries. 4. The lead time for procurement of these two items in quantities requested is approximately three weeks. In view of the short leed time, it is planned, based on DA reply, to place only those quentities on procurement at this time to meet Feb needs. The local procurement which might be necessary to meet Merch remts can be held in abeyence until the first week of February and still meet planned phased delivery schedules. This will permit some letitude for maintaining a balance between procurement of these items and the constantly changing requirements for Kores. 5. Stocks on hand in Japan which are to be used to meet requirements for Cheju-do ere: Soep, 206 tons; Celcium Hypochlorite, 1,000 lbs. Neither of these two items are on procurement at present.

- 1. Present admission rates of 15¢ for children from 6 to 14, 20¢ for military personnel and their dependents, 30¢ for Dept of army and air force civilians and their dependents and all other authorized personnel 35¢, should be stabilized to a straight 25¢ for the following reasons:
- (a) To have uniformity in army and air Force theater admission charges. In the ZI the present admission charge is 24¢ for all authorized personnel including military and sivilians with children under 12 15¢.

(b) The decrease from 30¢ to 35¢, though reducing the revenue on these sales, should be more than offset by the increase in military and their dependents rate of 20¢.

(c) An increase from 20¢ to 25¢ for military personnel within the FEC should not be objectionable in view of the present admission rate of 24¢ in the ZI.

(d) By standardizing on one admission rate of 25¢ for all adult personnel the temptation of selling love rate tickets at higher prices by ticket cashiers would be eliminated. This has happened in several instances, necessitating boards efforficers to be appointed to investigate.




