for Japan or Korea.

Part one. No rpt no epidemics known to exist in Japan or Korea at present but in view of potential hazards, for protection of troops and to relieve processing under difficult conditions particularly in Korea, request following immunization requirements be applied prior departure for Japan or Korea for U. S. forces and allied personnel attached to or augmenting these forces.

Part two. Successful smallpox vaccinations and basic series or stimulating doses cholera and typhus vaccines within six months prior departure. Typhoid, paratyphoid and tetanus immunizations in accordance with TB MED 114 with change one.

MEMO FOR RECORD: Reference message suggested that in revising SR 65-160-5, AFR 182-11, standardized addresses were to be used and concurrence in these was requested. The suggested addresses were: (1) For Military personnel - "Casual Mail Directory, APO ____". (2) For Civilian personnel - "Civilian Mail Directory, APO ____". These addresses, with appropriate APO number, would be assigned to unassembled casualties departing ZI for FEC.

Objection to the proposed addresses is that experience indicates that whatever form of address is used, such form will be abbreviated. The change would result in the mail arriving at FEC APOs addressed "CMD" which is the abbreviation used on mail being routed to the Central Mail Directory at APO 503. It is believed that confusion would result and that such mail would be routed to the Central Mail Directory.

At present FEC addresses for military personnel within the command are one hundred per cent consistent: "Casual Personnel Section". For civilians the majority of FEC locations use "Civilian Directory". It is believed that the military address should remain the same to avoid possibility of confusion as noted above and that the civilian address should conform to that used in the majority of instances at present.

Major Fisher, Staff Postal Officer, FEAF, concurs.

question of frequencies, CINCFE entertains no objection to establishment of Press Wireless, RCA, and Mackay stations in Korea. Review of frequency situation in the light of possible future military requirements leads to conclusion that any agreement made with company or companies should include proviso that company or companies will provide own frequencies from Korea. Although it is possible that frequencies now assigned Korean government and formerly used Seoul-San Francisco circuit might be made available for one company only, it would be necessary in the light of recent developments to review the entire commercial vs military frequency requirements with a resultant delay which is most undesirable. No objection to one or more companies being selected for entry Korea with proviso that company or companies will furnish entire complement of operating frequencies from Korea. If the selection of one company only will expedite establishment of commercial communications in Korea, that action is recommended. Authorized carrier should offer a comprehensive telecommunications service to include radio-telephone, radio-photo, program transmission service, and message service to include government, press, ordinary,

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD:

SUBJECT: Request to Utilize Type C Grade Gasoline During Period October Through March

1. Ourmsg ZX 13632 requested delivery of cold-weather type gasoline for Korea. ASPPA msg cites several technical reasons and one economical reason for not supplying this type gasoline.
2. Our original request was based on anticipated temperatures to be experienced in Korea and also on the geographical areas for which this type gasoline is designed.
3. While it is recognized that cognizant services in DA understand the problem, this msg is intended to advise ASPPA that the original request was not made without due consideration of the technical objection raised by ASPPA.
4. It is believed that DA objections stem primarily from the fact that high ZI inventories of temperate-grade gasoline exist. In view of this fact and of the technical objections cited, this msg cancels our request for cold-temperature grade gasoline.
5. This action is within established policy.
6. BYCOM is not affected by this action.
7. Ref msg requests earliest advice.

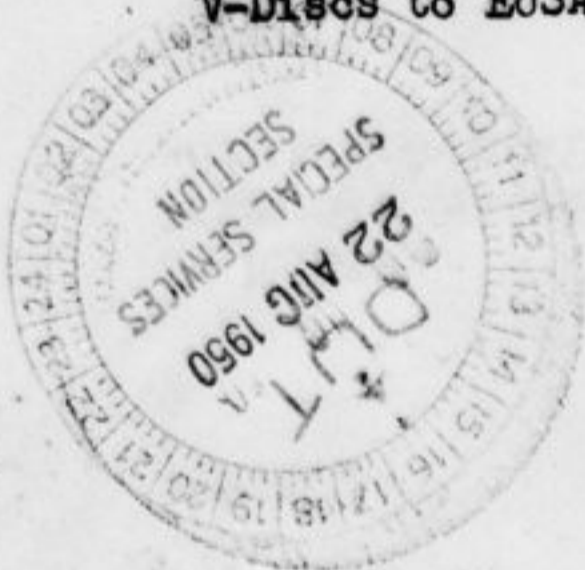

Ref your msgs WCL 37356 and W 88359 concerning casualties officially reported to the DA, there is no rpt no backlog of unreported casualties in this hqs. This hqs is fully aware that there is an excess of non-effectives over the number of casualties that have been reported by name. This situation will continue as there is no intention here to report other than facts. Hundreds of personnel originally reported as missing in action as a result of having been cut off from their units for periods varying from several hours up to many days have subsequently been able to make their way back through enemy lines to safety. The above is exemplified in such newspaper articles as Hal Boyle's AP story of 29 Jul entitled "Don't Call us the Lost Company", Jack Jame's UP story, 12 Jul, titled "Five Safe After Days Behind Red Lines" and Peter Kalischer's UP story of 8 Jul recounting his experiences with a battalion encircled for 2½ days. In addition to the above type of non-effective, there have been 1395 individuals returned to duty who had been listed in cumulative non-effectives reports.

Release of unverified information brings unnecessary alarm and grief to the families and loved ones of personnel fighting in Korea. The intense shock and sorrow to families receiving casualty information before full facts have been established is such as to cause this headquarters to furnish only properly authenticated information in our AG Casualty reports. It is considered infinitely more important to provide next of kin with established facts than it is to satisfy the press with daily reports of non-effectives who may be only temporarily so or who may have been evacuated through other than normal channels. To be certain of facts there must be delay between the actual time of casualty and the time the facts are determined to be true.

This hqs operates on the principle that wounded should be given complete medical attention as expeditiously as possible. This has resulted in air evacuation by all means at our command directly from areas in rear of the battlefield to hospitals in Japan without processing through normal medical channels. The normal methods of casualty reporting are not followed in all cases because of this procedure.

The above subj has been carefully considered from the beginning of operations and every known method, including special liaison with hospitals in Japan together with newly developed special forms for casualty reporting to meet this situation, has been taken to expedite the reporting of facts. The policy remains that it is more important to have a report which may be delayed and be factual than it is to furnish information to make "scare" headlines for the press which is not factual
