# MEMO FOR RECORD:

- 1. The TC-58 (Daily Port Activity Report) required by DA msg WCL 37336, 8 Aug 50, and implemented by CINCFE ms ZX 13339, 12 Aug 50, is, in its present form, primarily a report of cargo handling operations. It is used, however, not only to check on cargo operations but to record vessel movements as well.
- 2. Having been designed primarily to account for cargo handling, the report makes no provision for reporting actual time of departure of vessels. Estimated times of departure are shown, but no provision is made for recording the departure of a vessel which is diverted from the port prior to commencement of loadin or discharging.
- 3. To make the report more useful to the Movt Cont Div as a source of information concerning vessel movements, the instant message requests DA authority to add a Part 4 to the report, listing all vessels departing during the reported period, with ATD and next port of call.



Seventh Div shipped to Pukchong by rail, by truck beginning 1160 hours 22 Nov over Chonnan Myan peak. Subzero temp and 11 inches snow arrived div forward 1630 hours 22 Nov. All unit trucks waiting loaded with turkey departed 1900 hours. Seventeenth Inf Regt turkey arrived Hyesanjin after all night drive subzero 0230 hours 23rd. Enough for complete meal of 40 ingredient dinner each man. Each regt recd approximately total 23000 pounds. Seventeenth Regt on Yalu delivered to patrols on duty with insulated hot containers. These paper cartons improvised from C ration paper cartons, etc., to keep food warm. Urmsg 171616Z. Statements of large scale pilferage up to one-third of stocks of winter clothing are without factual basis. Some pilferage has occurred, with evidence of culprits being South Koreans and, in some instances, Americans. However, it is emphasized that total pilferage is minor in volume and consequence and is of a degree inevitably experienced in all military operations. There is no evidence that pilferage occurring in Korea is at any greater rate than that experienced in World War II. Winter clothing was procured in adequate volume and was received in Japan and South Korea sufficiently early to meet all requirements despite these minor losses, which have been exaggerated to gargantuan proportions, apparently through irresponsible sources of information. It is reiterated that losses were so minor as to have no bearing whatever on the temporary delay in delivery of winter clothing to troops in North Korean areas. This temporary delay, as reported in ourmsgs CX 69130 and Z 25574, resulted entirely from the difficult supply situation emanating from the spectacularly swift advance of UN troops in pursuit of the disintegrating enemy. The supply difficulties thus engendered were applicable to all classes of supply, not to winter clothing alone. Disrupted highway and rail traffic, due to destroyed bridges and primitive road system, plus scarcity of operable airfields, reduced the flow of all supplies to front line troops to irreducible minimum, which had to be pro-rated as to food, clothing, ammunition, fuel, etc. This situation improving daily as LOC's improve. Above conditions have been restated to emphasize that initial shortage of winter clothing at front was due in no degree whatever to pilferage and/or black marketing. In summation, urmsg has been read over phone to logistics commanders in Korea who emphatically deny any such losses as alleged in subject article and who further have no knowledge of any such investigation as that reported to have occurred on 1 Oct 50. These logistics officers took opportunity to wholeheartedly endorse all above statements, which were outlined in phone conversation. Most strongly urge that every legitimate means be utilized to refute the entire contents of subject news release and place an accurate presentation of the factual situation before American public in order that unwarranted and severecriticism may be avoided and damage already wrought may be alleviated all possible.



MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD:

Subject: Looting of Winter Clothing

- 1. DA msg 171616Z quoted an article by a Mr. John I. O'Donnell in Washington Times Herald, New York newspaper which stated in brief that Americans fighting in Korea were short on winter clothing because of large scale organized looting by South Korean racketeers from warehouses at Pusan.
- 2. The G-4, 2d Logistical Command, Colonel Crabill was contacted via telephone and the DA msg was quoted to him. Col Crabill vehemently denied the accusations as quoted in the TA msg. He stated there had been no large losses of winter clothing from Pusan warehouses. Golonel Crabill admitted the possibility that a few items of winter clothing may have found their way into unauthorized hands, however, no more than normal under field-combat conditions.
- 3. G-4, Eighth Army (Col Stebbins) also advised there was no foundation for the accusations quoted in the DA msg. Col Stebbins stated that an INS new story refuting the O'Donnell item had already been released by the Eighth Army PIO.
- 4. The foregoing is considered an adequate basis on which to reply to the DA msg. CINCFE msgs Z 25574 and CX 69130 are referenced since these two msgs contain a complete explanation for the delay in supplying winter clothing to combat troops.
- 5. Necessary action is to advise DA of the facts in this matter and to deny the accusations of the O'Donnell story in the Washington Times Herald.

Ref SR 755-60-5. Subj is Scrap Materiel in Korea. Scope of ref SR does not cover present situation. Anticipate clean-up in Korea will generate considerable scrap materiel including ferrous and nonferrous metals. Largest percentage of materiel was originally US Army stocks. Other sources will be Navy, AF, and foreign units with UN Forces. If UN Forces so desire they should be allowed to recover and retain, or dispose of their own scrap; however, excepting naval vessels and aircraft, segregation and separate disposal actions not considered feasible. For best interest all concerned, and to expedite clean-up with least costs in time and personnel, recommend all scrap generated in Korea usable for civilian relief and rehabilitation be transferred to ECA without reimbursement or donated to UNKRA. Residual scrap to be sold or disposed of on site, or returned to Japan for sale in accordance with existing disposition instructions. This should not be interpreted to prohibit the recovery of precious metals or strategic and critical materials under existing regulations, or the use of scrap for military purposes when such requirements exist.



For the Adjutant General (AAFPS). Reference TO: recent messages calling for investigation and report of alleged delay in delivery mail several units. This headquarters alert to and cognizant of importance prompt and expeditious handling mail and every effort being made expedite and improve mail handling. In spite shortage postal personnel, officers this headquarters continually in field checking on mail handling procedures. No delay in forwarding mail from Japan to Korea. Whatever delay does exist is due transportation difficulties in field between division and lower echelons. Road conditions, frequent movement of units and acute shortage personnel cause some unavoidable delays. To date all investigations of complaints received from the Department of the Army indicate no unusual delay. Complaints such as one that Eighth Cavalry had not received mail for two months are so farfetched they hardly warrent consideration. Experience has proven that most cases delay or nondelivery of individual mail not fault of procedures but due to frequent changes in status and station and inability of mail to catch up. Also individuel's failure in keeping correspondents advised of change of address and similar reasons. Personnel available this headquarters not sufficient to send officer from here to conduct investigation in each individual complaint which consequently must be accomplished by personnel in field where shortage is just as acute. In order to conserve time of personnel and issue prompt reply to complainant suggest that, except in cases of such nature as obviously to warrant special investigation, reply substantially as follows be sent by The Adjutant General to complainant. "CINCFE conscious of importance of prompt and efficient delivery of mail to personnel in field. This matter receiving personal attention of all concerned at every echelon. 
