That on June 29th, 1942, I had taken from said Norberto Dalmacio his revolver Colt S 32 No. 164985, and had issued receipt to him properly as a symbol of confiscation.

That I was Sgt. of the Philippine Army on that time, and member of the Guirrella Force, and that I was force to confiscate all Fire-Arms Ammunition from any Civilian for our defence, from the enemy.

That from June 29th, 1942, the date of confiscation up to the present time, the said revolver of Norberto Dalmacio was not yet return to him, for the fact that said revolver can not be located any more.

That I was formerly the Regimental S-4 of the 12th Infantry Regiment, 11th Division, Philippine Army.


That on December 1941, I was authorized by Col. GLEN TOWNSEND of the 11th Division, to commandeer food stuffs and clothing equipments to supply the 12th Infantry Regiment, Army of the Philippines.

That by virtue of said authority, in December, 1941, I commandeered food stuffs, clothings, and other articles in the store of chinese Sy Tuat, alias Ciriaco Po, at Naguilian, Isabela. The articles which are appearing and listed on the receipt dated December 24, 1941, which was issued to chinese Sy Tuat alias Ciriaco Po, with the total amount of FIVE HUNDRED EIGHTY SIX PESOS (P586.45) AND FORTY FIVE CENTAVOS, were taken and brought by me with the Chief of Police Mr. Filoteo M. Capuchino, at Palattao, Naguilian, Isabela, where they were supplied and distributed to the members of the regiment.

Some of the horses were used by the runners to deliver messages from one post to another.

I further certify that upon the landing of the American Forces the Japanese rushed to the mountains of Southern Benguet and had forced us to abandoned the said animals right in the mountains so that we were not able to return them to the owners.

I finally certify that I have full knowledge of the foregoing fact, I being the Bn. S-3, of 2nd Bn, 66th Infantry, USAFIP, NL, at the time.

TO : The Commanding General,

1. Reference is to letter, Camp Spencer Branch, Claims Service, PHILRYCOM, dated 16 July and signed by Vincent E. Costales, Captain, Inf., Director, Team No. 7, enclosing affidavits by A. J. Zarate.

2. On or about 15 December 1941 I was directed by General (then Major General) Jonathan Wainwright, commanding the forces in Northern Luzon, to proceed from my station near Dagupan, Pang., to Ilagan to take command of all American-Filipino Forces and to coordinate all military activities in the Cagayan Valley. In compliance with this order I arrived at Ilagan on 16 December and shortly thereafter authorized and directed Mr. Antonio J. Zarate, then District Engineer of the province of Neuva Vizcaya to commandeer all available motor vehicles suitable for military purposes. This was necessary as the troops then in the Valley were equipped with no motor transportation of any kind whatever except a few vehicles taken over from civilian sources prior to my arrival. Under this authority approximately forty vehicles of various types, including buses, trucks and passenger cars, were obtained and used in the government service. All these vehicles were removed from the Cagayan Valley upon the withdrawal of the Cagayan Valley Force upon General Wainwright's order on 25 December 1941 and were subsequently turned over to various units of the Philippine Army in the service of the United States. The bulk of these vehicles went to the 12th and 13th Infantry regiments of the 11th Division (PA) and formed the only motor transport of these units throughout the remainder of the campaign for the Defense of the Philippines.

3. I have no present recollection with reference to the particular vehicle for which claim is made by Mr. Lee Kim Tian. However I have faith in the integrity of Mr. A. J. Zarate, who gave me very loyal and efficient cooperation during the brief period I was directing operations in the Cagayan Valley, and would be willing to accept his statements as fact.

In the absence of the USFIP operating in this area, Lt. Fortunato Banayos is hereby authorized to commandeer the following:

1. Horses of all kinds male or female which are available for use in the Cavalry will be taken by said person mentioned above. Upon the confiscation of these properties, receipts will be issued to the owners. This authority has been given to him in accordance with the rules and regulations existing in our limit.
2. In view of these rules and regulations you will not feel disgusted upon this treatment because it is a matter of unity among us Filipinos. We are fighting this War for our own cause and we are convinced that ourselves will have coordination, cooperation as one.


So in this commandeering of said properties is in accordance with existing rules and regulations promulgated by the modern Warfare.

It is requested that you do not offer any resistance in giving up these things desired by our own Army.

Hoping that these will meet your favor and cooperation.

That I was a Junior Officer of "D" Company, 1st Bn., 14th Infantry, USAFIP, North Luzon, with Official Station at Maguillian-Lullutan Sector, Ilagan, Isabela, from the early part of January, 1945, to June, 1945; that in procurement of foodstuffs and other supplies for our men and civilian laborers attached to our outfit, I was expressly authorized by my Commanding Officer to requisition food supplies and other articles from the civilians within our territorial jurisdiction in connection with our military operations against the enemy; that to the best of my knowledge and belief our unit thru the detachment Supply Mess Sergeant requisitioned from one VICENTE SANTIAGO, of Barrio Carikikan, Ilagan, Isabela, one (1) female cow, big size, on or about the month of May, 1945; that the same cow was delivered by the lawful owner at our camp which was consumed by our outfit, bolo unit, civilian laborers who were at the time made as guards, runners, and other duties assigned them accordingly; that I am executing this affidavit for the purpose of substantiating the veracity and authenticity of the claim of Mr. Vicente Santiago over his one (1) female cow, hence, considered to be in order; and that for the execution of this affidavit, I was not promised of any reward or compensation but that the same is given of my own free will and volition for the sake of justice and equity.

I, ANTONIO C. LAMBINO, of legal age, married, a physician by profession and a resident of Malasiqui, Pangasinan, after having been duly sworn to in accordance with law, depose and say:

That from October 14, 1943 until about July 1945, I was the Commanding Officer of the 5th Squadron, 2nd Prov. Regt. Western Pangasinan Military District, ECLGA. The 5th Squadron 2nd Prov. Regt. WPMD, ECLGA, was re-designated as the 2nd Bn., 2nd Pangasinan Regt., Pangasinan-Tarlac Military District, ECLGA, under which designation it was duly recognized by the U.S. Army on 15 March 1945. This date of recognition was later on set back as of May, 1942; The battalion was a part of the vast organization under the overall command of Major Edwin P. Ramsey;

That as authorized by the over-all commander of the of the East Central Luzon Guerrilla Area (ECLGA) duly transmitted to my organization, I, as Commanding Officer of the unit above referred to had to depend for the subsistence clothing and other supplies of the organization from the civilians during all the time that our organization was in operation against the enemies until a few months after the liberation which our unit was directly supplied by the U.S. Army;

That as a matter of policy in order to keep our organization as secret as could be possible, it has been decided to assess and levy all necessary supplies for our consumption in furtherance of our resistance and operations from persons who were believed in a position to furnish our organization with the needed supplies. Wealthy residents were then approached and requested to supply us with anything within their ability to give.

That one Lt. Nazerio C. Macaraeg was first designated as Acting Supply Officer. In both capacities, he was authorized also to solicit and receive contributions under receipts which may bear his signatures and countersigned by the Executive Officer, Capt. Victor G. Santillan, in his authorized code number, viz.: 06;

That I had ordered that in addition to receipts issued to contributors for anything given by them, records thereof were to be made and kept on file in our Headquarters. That said procedure was followed and records were made. That all such records were intentionally destroyed in order to safeguard the civilian contributors from harm and torture by the Japs in anticipation of a raid by them as a result of the discovery of our organization sometime in February 1944 when a number of my officers and men including myself were held as hostages by the Japs. Thereafter on advice of my officers, no such records were kept on file except the receipts which were issued to contributors.

That my Executive Officer, Capt. Victor G. Santillan, and my Supply Officer, Lt. Nazerio C. Macaraeg, are the ones who know of the persons who generously contributed to the cause, altho

I knew several of such contributors:

That supplies were received under the express understanding that everything taken would be paid ~~after~~ for upon the expulsion of the Japanese and that every effort would be exerted to have the same paid and that the obligation therein incurred is the obligation of the USAFFE.

1. In December 1941, the North Luzon Force commanded by General Jonathan Wainwright and of which I was the Chief Engineer prepared to receive the attack of the Japanese Landing Forces in the Lingayan Gulf Area. There were no trained engineers available except those with the District Engineer of Pangasinan Province, to hurriedly construct new bridges and repair existing ones.
2. The Chief Engineer of the USAFFE, Brig. General Hugh Caspy, had made arrangements with the Director of Public Works of Luzon, for the District Engineers of the Province to place their organizations at my disposal. This they did and thereby performed a most valuable assistance to the heroic defense of the Philippine Islands and in the case of the North Luzon Force, it successfully withdrew to the Bataan Peninsula.
3. The District Engineer of Pangasinan Province was authorized by me to requisition the necessary men and material to accomplish his mission of construction and repairing bridges required by the tactical situation. He was informed that his organization would later be reimbursed by the United States Government.

That on 10 December, 1941, I received a telegram from the Director of Public Works, authorizing me to commandeer all available vehicles to evacuate all war materials that may prove useful to the enemy, from the province of Isabela to points south of Balate Pass. That when the American officers from Cagayan Province came to Ilagan on the same day, I gave them the copy of the telegram which they failed to return.

That on 13 December 1941, I received another telegram from the Director of Public Works, Manila, quoted below:

"110 Cm Vh md rush  
Manila December 13 14 via Ilagan 14  
Confidential the district engineer  
Ilagan, Isa.

Preliminary arrangement should be made and performed immediately so that military supplies and anything useful to the enemy are evacuated within capacity of transportation which can be commandeered and complete destruction of these supplies made on approach of enemy in force stop these particularly refer to petroleum products, gas and oil military weapons transportation and signal communication facilities warehouse stock of food and construction supplies and equipment stop close and continuing control of this directive must be exercised so that nothing should be left to the enemy that will assist him stop contact and cooperate with local commander USAFFE.

FRAGANTE - 717p"

That on 16 December 1941, Capt. Eulogio Balao authorized me to commandeer for the USAFFE troops in Isabela Province, all vehicles, gasoline and oil, tires and spare parts, tools and anything the army might need in connection with their defense of the province from the Japanese Forces in Tuguegarao, Cagayan.

That when Lt. Col. Glenn Townsend took command of the USAFFE forces in Cagayan Valley, he again gave me the same authority as Capt. E. Balao gave me.

That on 10 December 1941, upon receipt of the first telegram from the Director of Public Works, I ordered the commandeering of all available vehicles in this province and issued receipts for them. I also commandeered all military supplies including petroleum products, tools and equipments the army needed or ordered me to procure for them.

How are you and the rest of our buddies, doing?

I am very anxious to hear about all the men I knew. Who survived, and who did not?

I expect to return to the Philippines soon. In fact, I should have been on my way now, but complications set in my hand, and I needed more operations than the Doctors or I anticipated.

Hoping that these certificates, facilitate the payment of claims, and hoping to hear from you soon, regarding same, I remain
