EXPLANATORY NOTE

The courage, devotion and loyalty to our Government and our people of civilians, who continued the armed resistance against the Japanese forces during World War II, have been duly acknowledged by our Government in Executive Order No. 21, dated October 28, 1944, when the President of the Philippines, in recognition of such invaluable services declared therein to be "on active service" all persons who were actively serving in recognized military forces in the Philippines. The same executive order defines a "recognized military force" as a "force under a commander, who has been appointed, designated or recognized by the Commander-in-Chief, Southwest Pacific Area."

There are still many persons qualifying under the definition of such Executive order who, for one reason or another, have been refused recognition as, and denied the rights and privileges of, recognized guerrilla organizations. Among these privileges are the educational benefits under R.A. No. 1362, backpay under R.A. No. 304, as amended by R.A. No. 897, condonation of certain taxes under R.A. No. 1253, and others.

We cannot think of a more unjust discrimination than this, more so because they offered even their lives and sacrificed the welfare of their families when they showed faith in the victory of our cause in these trying days of the Japanese Occupation and contributed invaluable to that victory by their effective resistance, and because their services were recognized and acknowledged by such executive order. Merit must be given where it is deserved. Hence, this bill must be approved.

AN ACT

GRANTING TO ALL PERSONS WHO WERE ACTUALLY SERVING IN MILITARY FORCES IN THE PHILIPPINES UNDER A COMMANDER WHO HAS BEEN APPOINTED, DESIGNATED OR RECOGNIZED BY THE COMMANDER-IN-CHIEF, SOUTHWEST PACIFIC AREA, ALL THE RIGHTS AND PRIVILEGES OF MEMBERS OF RECOGNIZED GUERRILLA ORGANIZATIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled.

1       SECTION 1. All persons who were actively serving in military  
2 forces in the Philippines under a commander who had been appointed  
3 designated or recognized by the Commander-in-Chief, Southwest  
4 Pacific Area, shall be entitled to all the rights and enjoy all  
5 the privileges of members of recognized guerrilla organizations in  
6 cluding the benefits of Republic Act Numbered Three hundred and four,  
7 as amended; Provided, that the right to salaries and wages under  
8 such Act shall be computed from the time such persons joined the  
9 service up to the time he was honorably discharged therefrom, but in  
10 no case beyond the date of the liberation of the capital of the provin

11       SEC. 2 Applications for the grant of backpay under Republic Act  
12 Number Three hundred and four, as amended, shall be filed within the  
13 period of one year from the date of the approval of this Act.

14       SEC. 3. The President of the Philippines shall promulgate rules  
15 and regulations to carry into effect the provisions of this Act.

16       SEC. 4. Such sums as are necessary to carry into effect the pro-  
17 visions of this Act are hereby appropriated out of any funds in the  
18 National Treasury not otherwise appropriated: Provided, however, That  
19 if the same are inadequate, the President of the Philippines is  
20 authorized to incur a loan or loans for said purpose under such terms  
21 and conditions as he may deem proper.

22       SEC. 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

1. EXECUTIVE ORDER No. 21 BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE PHILIPPINES

The following Executive Order No. 21 by the President of the Philippines is published for the information and guidance of all concerned;

Executive Order No. 21

DECLARING TO BE ON ACTIVE SERVICE IN THE PHILIPPINE ARMY ALL PERSONS NOW ACTIVELY SERVING IN RECOGNIZED MILITARY FORCES IN THE PHILIPPINES

WHEREAS, many civilians residing on the Philippines or Filipino, American and other foreign citizenships, and officers and enlisted men of the Philippine Army of the Armed Forces of the United States and the Allied nations, have continued armed resistance against the Imperial Japanese Government since the sixth of May, 1942

WHEREAS, this action has written in blood and epic of courage, devotion and loyalty to the government and the people of the Philippines;

WHEREAS, these military forces have contributed in a large measure to the Allied military effort and to the liberation of the Filipino people from the yoke of the Japanese invader;

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Government of the Philippines to recognize this allegiance;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, SERGIO OSMEÑA, President of the Philippines, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Emergency Powers Law, Section 22 and Section 27 of Commonwealth Act Numbered One notwithstanding, do hereby ordain and promulgate the following;

1. All person of any nationality or citizenship, who are actively serving in recognized military forces in the Philippines, are hereby considered to be on active service in the Philippine Army.

2. The temporary grades of Enlisted men, enlisted or promoted in the field by Commanders of recognized military forces or by their delegated authority, are hereby confirmed.

3. The temporary ranks of all officers, appointed or promoted in the field ~~by Commanders of recognized military forces~~ prior to this date by Commanders of recognized military forces are hereby confirmed.

4. The date of entry into active service in the Philippine Army will be that of joining a recognized military force.

5. The effective date of rank for commissioned Officers and En-

listed Men will be the date on which they were appointed or promoted to such rank by the Commanders of recognized military forces.

6. A recognized military force, as used herein is defined as a force under a commander who have been appointed, designated or recognized by the Commander-in-Chief Southwest Pacific Area.

Done at the seat of Government in the Field, this 28th day of October, in the year of our Lord, Nineteen Hundred and Forty-Four and of the Commonwelath of the Philippines, the Nánth.

11. EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 22 BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE PHILIPPINES.  
 The following Executive Order No. 22 by the President of the Philippines is published for the information and guidance of all concerned:

Executive Order No. 22

FIXING THE SALARIES OF THE OFFICERS  
 AND ENLISTED MEN OF THE PHILIPPINE ARMY

Pursuant to the provisions of Section No. 90 of the National Defense Act and of the Emergency Powers Law, I, SERGIO OSMEÑA, President of the Philippines, do hereby prescribed the following schedule of salary rate and quarters allowances for officers and enlisted men of the Philippine Army, effective on dates as indicated herein, and extending for the duration of the war and for six months thereafter unless sooner terminated by competent authority.

The rates of pay and allowances prescribed herein shall become effective for officers and enlisted men of any unit upon the date on which the unit is returned to or constituted under organized military control, and for any individual officer or enlisted men upon the date on which he reports to a unit organized military control after having been called or recalled to active duty or after having been enlisted for such a unit. A unit shall be considered as being returned to or constituted under organized military control on the date of announcement thereof is made by the Commander-in Chief, Southwest Pacific Area.

No increase of pay or allowances shall accrue because of foreign service.

During the period that the rates of pay herein prescribed are effective, there shall not be paid to any person an increase of pay or allowances by reason of length of service.

During the period that the rates of pay herein prescribed are effective, there shall not be paid to any person an increase of pay for duty requiring ~~any~~ regular and frequent serial flights.

Any provisions of existing Executive Orders in conflict herewith are hereby superseded.

Done at the seat of Government in the Field. This 28th day of October, in the year of our Lord, Nineteen hundred and forty-four, and of the Commonwealth of the Philippines, the Ninth.

SUBJECT : Payment of Members of Recognized Guerrilla Forces

TO : Chief of Staff, Philippine Army, APO 501

1. Paragraph 4 of Executive Order No. 21, 28 October 44 by the President of the Philippines reads: "The date of entry into active service in the Philippine Army will be that of joining a recognized military force." It is believed that it is the intent of the paragraph cited that all members of guerrilla force, contributing or having contributed to the effort against the enemy to an extent warranting the recognition of that force, eventually be paid from the date that they joined the force rather than from the date of recognition.

2. Current pay of members of recognized guerrilla units, from date of recognition, should be effected as soon as payrolls can be prepared and finance officers can be furnished to make the actual payments.

3. Payment of arrears in pay; e.e., payment from date of joining a recognized guerrilla force in the case of volunteers or from date of last payment in the case of personnel already in the Philippine Army and in service of the armed forces of the United States, to the date of recognition of the unit will have to wait formal processing of each individual and final determination of his status and for the amount pay due. This Headquarters will approve settlements of such accounts for arrears in pay, from the United States appropriations for the expenses of the Philippine Army from the date of volunteer joined a guerrilla force which has been subsequently recognized.

like the Four Horsemen of the Apocalypse.

Even as men fell valiantly in their stand in Batan and Corregidor, so

were given to different units of squadrons, such as 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th,  
and SAMPALOC Squadrons, under the Officers of

Joseph R. Barker II, of the 26th Cavalry, US Army (PS) who had long been stationed in Camp Stotsenburg, Pampanga after that fateful December 8, 1941, was appointed Executive Officer of the Luzon Guerrilla Army Forces. The staunch courage of these men in the face of immovable dangers, was itself a saga worth mentioning in the annals of our dear country.

Circumstances conspired, in many ways hard to understand, against leaders and men of the resistance movement. And chances of leadership were made when Officers died and perished.

Above is the prologue of other history of a Unit, one among many, during the era when perils, hardships, famines, and deaths rode over the land like the Four Horsemen of the Apocalypse.

Even as men fall valiantly in their stand in Bataan and Corregidor, so other men as brave took up resistance. When Capt. Joseph R. Barker II assumed the Overall Commander Post of the East Central Luzon Guerrilla Area in 1942, more soldiers were stationed in the City of Manila, and assignments were given to different units of squadrons, such as Sta. Br. US Army (PS) Lt. Col. Castle had long been in  
service of the AS Expeditionary Force in Mindanao  
Archipelago under the direct command of the late Gen. John Pershing from 19  
11 to 1914, barely a few months before the declaration in World War I when  
Gen. Pershing was called upon to become the Commander-in-Chief of the US  
Army Forces in France.

At the outbreak of World War II, Lt. Col. Castle was an inspector -  
at-large of the Republic Service Commission all over the Philippines on land  
and water, and was instructed to see the sound operations of land and water,  
and air transportation facilities in the Philippines. Later, he was inducted  
in the USAFEE Guerrilla Army Forces on April 15, 1942. Upon order of Capt.  
Joseph R. Barker II, Lt. Col. Castle, with all the men under his command,  
became part of the East Central Lamon Guerrilla Area on May 15, 1942. Men. Se-  
cretary of Public Works and Communications during the  
Commonwealth Government of the Philippines and now Secretary of Interior of

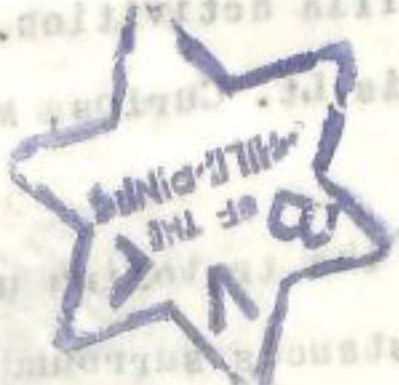

Enriquez was apprehended, and taken to Wack-Wack Jail as a prisoner. In the search made all over the house, the army found no important papers.

Fortunately the Unit's roster already submitted to Major Edwin P. Ramsey who was then the Overall Commander of the ECOMA, thru the District Military

Commander of the Manila Military District. Assurance was made that the roster to be sent Australia, while the rosters for their regiments were kept

and hidden by Major Jose Razon, the Inspector General of the Barker's Unit. With the news that the Americans have already landed in Lingayen, Pa

Many were brave enough to display such feelings to the Japanese.

When the Americans landed in Leyte in September 1944, the Japanese began to make threats. They told people that they not see the return of their American friends, because all Filipinos will be killed before they come "to our succor". The Japanese intensified their campaign against the guerrillas, and some of Lt. Col. Castillo's men fell victim. Major Legaspi and his son, Lt. R.C. Bobadilla, Capt Domingo Bona, Capt. Jesus Yalong, and Sgt. Tec. Castro were successively caught in various raids made in their mountain hideouts. Only Bobadilla, Castro and Legaspi's son survived.

The Japanese spies became active too. With the aid of their spies the Japanese raided the house of Lt. Col. Castillo on 1940 Dapitan Street, Quezon City. Counter Intelligence was able to inform the occupants of Col. Castillo's house of the impending danger, so all male were made to escape, but for the unknown reasons Lt. Col. Castillo's son-in-law, Lt. Cresencio Enriquez was apprehended, and taken to Wack-Wack Gulf as a prisoner. In the search made all over the house, the nemy found no improtant papers. Fortunately the Unit's Roster already submitted to Major Edwin P. Ramsey who was then the Overall Commander of the ECLGA, thru the District Military commander of the Manila Military District. Assurance was made that the Roster to be sent Australia, while the rosters for their regiments were kept and hidden by Major Jose Razon, the Inspector General of the Barkers Unit.

With the news that the Americans have already landed in Lingayen, Pangasinan, San Jose, Mindoro, and Nasugbu, Batangas, the Unit made moves and preparations for a simultaneous attacks against the enemy. Then Lt. Col. Castillo and his staff received an order from the Overall General of the ECLGA, thru the Manila Military District, to proceed to Manila and ordered a general mobilization of troops to help the US Forces asault Japanese defense and save the starving inhabitants and internees who were trapped in many dangerous places in the City. To evade the watchfull eyes of the enem and to prepare plans of operations, Lt. Col. Castillo and a few members of his staff hired a big fishing boat for P1,200.00) hacabese War Notes, and through water routes by-passed enemy guards and by dawn of 11 January 1945, landed at Pretil Market, Tondo District. At the foot of the bridge nearby they landed easily and safely. Then from there they gathered at Juan Luna and Tayuman Streets, hurried toward their Headquarters, whcih has been fix

Whatever hardships and sacrifices these men in the modest Barjer's Unit contributed for the cause of the emancipation of this country from the yellow race, those were inspired by the high and heroic ideals of those noble men who died fighting during dark days in the battle fields of honor. Their memory will never fail to kindle the lives of others, Col. Thorpe, Capt. Joseph Barker II, Col. Straughn, and other Americans, Filipino Officers and men of the USAFFE, Civilian Guerrillas, and multitude of the others heroes are bright symbols of their highest idealism and courage. Their names will not die in the hearts of the Filipinos and will continue to their mighty source of inspirations.

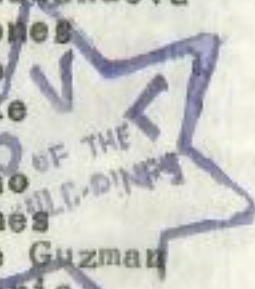
