MEMORANDUM FOR:

Lieutenant Colonel Charles Backes, Air Corps, U. S. Army.

The following instructions will govern the induction into the service of the Armed Forces of the United States of the Philippine Army Air Corps units at Maniquis Field, Cabanatuan, P. I.:

1. Acceptance will be accomplished on Friday, August 15th as follows:
 - a. The Philippine Army Unit Commander will report his organization to you and present the necessary rosters and property records for check.
 - b. You will read the Proclamation of the President of the United States and General Orders No. 5, Headquarters United States Army Forces in the Far East.
 - c. You will administer the oath of allegiance to the United States, the personnel repeating it after you.
 - d. You will accept the unit for service with the United States Army Forces in The Philippines.
2. Full instructions as to your duties in connection with administration and supply functions are contained in information documents inclosed herewity.

PRESIDENT'S PROCLAMATION

Under and by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution of the United States by Section two (A) (12) (of the Philippine Independence Act of March 24, 1934) and by the corresponding provision of the Ordinance appended to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of the Philippines and as Commander in Chief of the Army and Navy of the United States I hereby call and order into the service of the armed forces of the United States for the period of the existing emergency and place under the command of a General Officer, U. S. Army to be designated by the Secretary of War from time to time, all of the organized military forces of the Govt. of the Commonwealth of the Philippines: provided, that all Naval components thereof shall be placed under the command of the Commandant of the 16th Naval District, U. S. Navy.

This order shall take effect with relation to all units and personnel of the organized military forces of the Govt. of the Commonwealth of the Philippines from and after the dates and hours respectively indicated in orders to be issued from time to time by the General Officer, U. S. Army, designated by the Secretary of War.

GENERAL ORDERS.
No. 5.

Pursuant to the provisions of the proclamation of the President of the United States dated July 26, 1941, the active, organized units of Philippine Army Air Corps are hereby called into the service of the armed forces of the United States in the Philippines, effective 12:01 A.M., August 15, 1941, for the period of the existing emergency. The Philippine Army Air Corps and attached medical personnel, are assigned to the Air Force, United States Army Forces in the Far East. Lieutenant Colonel Charles Backes (O-11968), Air Corps, United States Army, Acting Chief of Air Corps, Philippine Army, is assigned to command of the Air Corps, Philippine Army, and will report to the Commanding General, Air Force, United States Army Forces in the Far East for duty accordingly.

SUBJECT: Induction of the Air Corps of the Philippine Army.

The Chief of Staff directs the following procedure for induction
of the Air Corps on Friday, August 15th.

1. The personnel will assemble in formation at Zablan Field
prior to 9:00 o'clock A. M. The band may play selections while the troops
are being formed and the official party or parties are arriving.

2. Acceptance will take place at 9:00 A. M. as follows:

a. The Commanding Officer, Zablan Field, will report the command
to you.

b. YOU will then read the Proclamation of the President of
United States calling and ordering the forces of the Philippine
Commonwealth into the service of the Armed Forces of the United
States in the Philippines, and General Orders No. 5, this head-
quarters, ordering the Philippine Army Air Corps into service
with the U. S. Armed Forces in the Philippines.

c. You will administer the oath of allegiance to the United
States, the personnel repeating the oath after you.

d. You then face about, salute, and report to General MacArthur.

"Sir, Pursuant to the Proclamation of the President of
United States and General Orders No. 5, Headquarters, United States
Armed Forces in the Far East, I report the Air Corps, Philippine Army
for service with the Armed Forces of the United States in the
Philippines."

3. General MacArthur will then acknowledge the acceptance of
command for service with the Armed Forces.

4. The band will play "The Star Spangled Banner".

There will be no platform erected.


