Postoperative diagnosis: Laceration, severe, right hand

Operation: Suture.
 Patient brought into operating room in state of severe ~~extremities~~ ^{exsanguination} and shock. Plasma was immediately started and two units were given. Patient responded with perceptible pulse and blood pressure 70/40. Under gas oxygen ether anesthesia, wound was cleansed with tincture of green soap and water. Six tendons of the right wrist were found to be severed. The head of the second metacarpal was found to be fractured. Interrupted cotton sutures were used to approximate the extensor tendons. Remarks: ends, periosteum and skin edges. Hand placed in cock up plaster splint. Patient removed to ward in fair condition.
