Name: Dixon, John L.

Age: 20

Date of injury: April 6, 1942

Diagnosis: GSW, gunshot, left forearm, with comp. comm. fracture of left radius

Treatment: Wound debrided and cleansed. Insertion of soft rubber drain. Application of plaster cast with hand in supination.

Progress: May 5, 1942, Cast reapplied. Condition good. Wound has granulated well.

Name: Abel, Charles E.

Age: 21

Date of injury: April 7, 1942

Diagnosis: Fracture, simple, complete, proximal end of the 3rd metatarsals,  
right foot.  
Fracture, simple, incomplete, medial condyle right tibia.  
Struck by truck near Limay.

Treatment: Alignment good. Application of plaster cast walking boot and iron.

Progress: April 26, 1942, Cast removed, good callus formation.

Name: Arnoldy, Arthur A.

Age: 26

Date of injury: Dec. 24, 1942

Diagnosis: GSW, shrapnel, right scapular region, and left thigh; wounds superficial. Left foot, thru and thru; wound of entrance, plantar surface; wound of exit, dorsum of foot. Fracture, compound, comminuted, of 2nd, 3rd, 4th, and 5th metatarsal bones of left foot.

Treatment: Wounds cleansed, debridement, and packed with sulfa powder and iodoform gauze. Posterior splint applied to left foot.

Progress: March 6, wound has consistently been draining there seems to be a good deal of sequestra. Wound is granulating well though. Wound packed with vaseline gauze and a plaster cast applied from web of toes to knee.

April 4, Walking iron applied over old cast, and patient urged to walk with the aid of the crutch.

April 12, Old cast removed and wound dressed.

April 16, Patient complains of sharp pain on dorsum of foot. Upon examination the Ward Surgeon extracts one long piece of sequestrum. Wound on plantar surface of foot is well granulated up and healed.

April 22, Ward Surgeon extracts another piece of sequestrum nearly as large as the first piece. Drainage from wound decreased.

May 18, Another piece of bone has worked its way out of the wound. Drainage from wound on dorsum of foot persists.

Date of injury: Feb. 4, 1942

Diagnosis: GSW, Shrapnel, Fracture, comp. comm. lower one-third left ulna

Treatment: Bebridement of wound, hemostasis, wound cleaned with metaphen; instillation of sulfathiazole and packed with vaseline gauze. Application of an antero-posterior splint to forearm.

Progress: Splint removed, wound cleansed and dressed. Application of a plaster cast. date: March 2, 1942.

March 24, 1942, Cast removed. This patient has a nice result, in the fracture of the ulna. There is a small bridge of callus, there is not enough, however, to leave the arm without support, a small posterior splint is wrapped on the arm for protection at night, and should be removed at intervals, with exercise and physiotherapy, with massage.

March 25, 1942, Massage and exercise to left arm begun.

May 9, 1942, wound has healed nicely. The ulna has good alignment. Posterior splint is being worn.

Diagnosis: GSW, rifle, Penetrating wound of left thigh.

Wound cleaned, instillation of metaphen, sulfa powder and  
packed with a vaseline wick.

Progress: April 19, 1942, Wound filled in satisfactorily. Vaseline gauze  
laid over granulating surfaces. Leg cast applied. Condition good.  
Soft callus.

May 10, 1942, Cast is found to be in fairly good condition.

Name: Bonas, Romto

Age: 24

Date of injury: April 7, 1942

Diagnosis: Fracture, comp. comm. of all metatarsals bones of left foot.

Treatment: Debridement and cleansing of the wound. Bleeders clamped and ligated. Sulfa powder and vaseline gauze packed into the wound. Plaster cast applied.

Progress: May 9, 1942, a bloody, purulent, fluid is draining from the top of the cast. Cast in poor condition.

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GENERAL HOSPITAL NO. 2

Name: Braumberger, John

Age: 22

Date of injury: March 7, 1942

Diagnosis: GSW, gunshot, left hand with fracture of the proximal phalanx of the third finger. Self inflicted.

Treatment: Wound debrided, and cleansed with metaphen, packed with sulfa powder and vaseline gauze. Posterior splint to forearm applied.

Progress: March 30, 1942, wound granulating well. May need reamputation to produce a flap.

May 9, 1942, The palmar surface of the wound has healed in good condition, but the dorsal wound still persists to drain moderately.

April 21, 1942, Condition good, ambulant. No complaints from the patient.

Treatment: Operation: Amputation, guillotine, Upper one-third of left thigh  
because of gas gangrene infection.

Progress: Feb. 26, 1942, Re-amputation of left thigh to establish correct

Feb. 28, 1942 After forty-eight hours, the rubber drain was  
removed. Wound looks clean.

March 5, 1942, Sutures removed from wound and a very mild stitch  
abscess was found. adhesive straps were applied. Condition of  
stump fairly good.

May 9, 1942, The flaps have grown together, with fair results.  
Appearance of the stump is good.

## GENERAL HOSPITAL NO. 2

Name: Deckers, Jacques J.

Age: 45

Date of injury: March 28, 1942

Diagnosis: GSW, shrapnel, penetrating, medial aspect of right upper arm severing ulnar artery and vein, and progressing down to the distal third of the forearm.  
Fracture, compound, comminuted, upper and middle third of the right ulna.

Treatment: Operation, incision over ulnar aspect of the forearm, vessels ligated, wound cleansed with sulfa powder and hydrogen peroxide, wound closed in the usual manner. Shrapnel removed from the lower third of the forearm.

Progress: March 29, 1942, There is considerable hemorrhage. The dressing is changed and the condition of the arm appears good.

March 30, 1942, The arm is much swollen and there is gross evidence of gas infection, this is freed by loosening the sutures.  
Operation: Incision of the lower forearm multiple, Gas Gangrene anti-toxin given. Sodium Pentothal as the anesthetic, 7½ grains.

April 1, 1942, The gas infection has extended to the upper arm, and there is total loss of blood supply to the arm and hand.  
Operation: Amputation, guillotine, thru middle third of right arm. Veinoclysis, 1000 cc of Normal Saline Solution. Anesthetic, Sodium Pentothal, 10 grains. Patient returned to ward in good condition.

April 4, 1942, Stump healthy, no gas present.

April 28, 1942, Stump reamputated. Anesthetic, Ether, 4 ounces.

May 9, 1942, Sutures are still intact. Drainage is profuse consisting of a thick, creamy, purulent discharge. Odor is fetid. Obviously there can be seen no superficial inflammation.

Name: Diosdado, Marte

Age: 24

Date of injury: April 7, 1942

Diagnosis: GSW, shrapnel, thru and thru, right foot. Wound of entrance of lateral aspect, and wound of exit on medial aspect. Fracture, compound, comminuted, right Os calcis.

Treatment: Wound debrided, cleansed with metaphen, packed with sulfathiazole powder and vasoline gauze. Plaster boot applied. Cast to be removed on or about May 5, 1942.

Progress: May 5, This cast is found to be in a satisfactory condition at this time and will be removed in about two weeks.

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## GENERAL HOSPITAL NO. 2

Name: Dulay, Catalino

Age: 25

Date of injury: April 7, 1942

Diagnosis: GSW, shrapnel, left wrist, right supra-orbital, and right upper arm, thru and thru, Fracture, compound, comminuted, distal one-third of the left radius.

Treatment: Wounds cleansed and dressed, the fracture is splinted with a posterior splint.

Progress: Fracture in good position. No cast is needed, though patient will keep the posterior splint intact. The right arm is swollen due to a large hemotoma. Patient should wear a sling until swelling subsides. - April 28.

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GENERAL HOSPITAL NO. 2

Name: Dumalag, Francisco

Age: 42

Date of injury: April 7, 1942

Diagnosis: GSW, shrapnel, left forearm and left leg with comp comm fracture of left tibia.

Treatment: Wounds on forearm and leg debrided and cleansed with metaphen, packed with sulfa powder and vaseline gauze. Wound on forearm dressed. Tibia manipulated into apposition and a plaster leg cast applied.

Progress: May 9, 1942, Cast is still in good condition.

Name: Flowers, Daniels

Age: 24

Date of injury: Jan. 21, 1942

Diagnosis: GSW, shrapnel, on chest and over the sternum.  
GSW, shrapnel, Fracture, compound, comminuted, left radius.

Treatment: Debridement of chest wound and removal of foreign body.  
Wound on left forearm cleansed, debrided, metaphen, sulfa powder, and packed with vaseline gauze, Reduction of fracture, and application of plaster cast. splint.

Progress: Feb. 1, 1942, wound on chest healing and granulating well.  
Feb. 27, 1942, old cast removed and position of arm changed.  
new plaster cast applied with hand in supination.  
March 18, 1942, The cast is removed, the wound is granulated.  
the fracture is well callused.

Time of injury: April 5, 1942

Diagnosis: GSW, rifle, Fracture, compound, comminuted, middle third, left radius with extensive soft tissue destruction to volar surface of forearm.

Treatment: April 8, 1942, Wound cleansed, debrided, metaphen, sulfa powder and vaseline gauze. Posterior splint applied.

Progress: April 16, 1942, Removal of posterior splint, wound cleansed, sulfa powder and vaseline gauze packing. Arm cast applied.

May 7, 1942, Old cast removed, wound cleaned and re-dressed. Wound granulating and fracture callused, though soft, condition good. Radial nerve paralysis.

Date of injury: Feb. 17, 1942

Diagnosis: GSW, bullet, wound, lacerated, thru and thru, right parietal region from front to rear.

Left Hemiplegia.

Treatment: Area around wound shaved and cleansed. metaphen, sulfa powder, and compression bandage applied. Also drain tube inserted.

Progress: March 9, 1942, Able to move left arm and hand voluntarily. left leg still paralyzed. Wound has granulated and healed over well.

April 7, 1942, Patient not able to walk due to pain in left leg.

May 9, 1942, patient is ambulatory, but hemiplegia is still persistent on the left side.

Age: 23

Date of injury: April 7, 1942

Diagnosis: GSW, shrapnel, right thigh.  
Fracture, Compound, Communited, middle third, right femur.

Treatment: Wound cleaned, packed with sulfathiazole and vaseline gauze.  
Introduction of Kirschner wire into distal end of femur. traction.

Progress: Traction removed and leg cast applied. Condition good.  
Peroneal nerve paralysis. (April 16, 1942)

May 9, 1942, Wound discharging purulent fluids immensely.  
Cast will have to be changed soon. Soaked thru and thru with  
suppurative material.

Name: Hendricks, Jr., L. C.

Age: 25

Date of injury: Jan. 21, 1942

Diagnosis: GSW, right forearm, middle third.  
Fracture, comp. comm. right radius, middle third.  
Radial nerve paralysis

Treatment: Wound debrided, cleaned with metaphen, sulfa powder and packed with vaseline gauze. Plaster cast applied.

Progress: Feb. 19, 1942, Old cast removed and a new one reapplied. Condition of fracture good; previous cast was too short, allowing flexor tendons to retract. This means he will need a radial nerve repair.

March 5, 1942, Cast removed, small granulating wound on inner and outer aspects of right forearm. Am sending patient to P.T. clinic for massage and exercise to right arm.

March 25, 1942, Cock-up splint applied to right forearm.

April 7, 1942, Splint removed. Arm in good condition.

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GENERAL HOSPITAL NO. 2

Name: Ibanez, Eliennaventura

Age: 23

Date of injury: April 7, 1942

Diagnosis: GSW, right forearm, thru and thru, upper third.  
Fracture compound, comminuted, proximal end of ulna, just below the olecranon.

Treatment: Wound cleansed, application of metaphen, packed with sulfa powder and vaseline gauze. Application of plaster cast.

Progress: April 23, 1942, Old cast removed, Wound cleansed, application of metaphen, sulfa powder, and vaseline gauze. Plaster cast re-applied. Patient went home.

(trans from General Hosp. No. 1)

Name: Ildfonso, Felix

Age: 21

Date of injury: Feb. 22, 1942

Diagnosis: GSW, 45 caliber pistol, left thigh, thru and thru.  
Fracture, comp. comm. left femur, middle third.

Treatment: Wound cleaned, metaphen and hydrogen peroxide instilled into the wound. Packed with sulfathiazole and vaseline wick.  
Introduction of Kirschner wire thru distal end of femur. Traction.

Progress: April 7, 1942, removed Kirschner wire and applied a plaster hip spica. Wound has healed completely over.

April 19, 1942, Old cast removed, and new plaster hip spica applied.

May 10, 1942, Cast in good condition.

Name: Litch, Thomas M.

Age: 23

Date of injury: Feb. 4, 1942

Treatment: Debridment and cleansing of the wound, introduction of packing into wound. Posterior splint applied.

Progress: Feb. 12, 1942, Foreign body, 45 caliber bullet was found to be lodged in the lateral epicondyle of left humerus.  
Operation: Removal of the bullet and application of a swinging cast. Anesthesia: 6 grains of Sodium Pentothal.

March 21, 1942, The cast is removed, the condition of the arm is good; the patient should have a course of Physiotherapy, and then he will be ready for duty.

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GENERAL HOSPITAL NO. 2

(3-25-42)

Name: Head, Joseph T.

Age: 24

Date of injury: March 23, 1942

Diagnosis: GSW, severe, pistol, thru and thru left elbow, wound of entrance anterior cubital fossa, and wound of exit over the oleocoronon. (self inflicted)

Treatment: Wound cleaned, debrided, painted with metaphen, insertion of sulfa powder and iodoform packing.

Progress: March 26, The X-ray reveals a compound, fracture of the lateral condyle of the left humerus. There is considerable separation of fragments. The arm is placed in flexion and the cast applied with pressure over the condyle. The patient should be watched for swelling of the arm, he should lay on the bed most of the time, with the arm on his chest.

April 24, Cast removed, wound cleansed and dressed. Sling applied and patient should start active motion.

Time of injury: April 11, 1942

Diagnosis: GSW, shrapnel, right hand.

Progress: May 4, 1942, Splint and traction removed. Non-union of metacarpals. Wound granulating.

plaster cast is applied to middle thigh to web of the toes.  
Cast to remain for three or four weeks.

Progress: May 4, 1942, The cast is removed. There is an area of tibia  
about two and a half cm. in diameter which is missing from  
anterio-lateral aspect of bone, upper one-third. Hole packed  
with vasoline gauze and dressed.

Diagnosis: GSW, shrapnel, left leg, middle third, medial aspect.  
Fracture, compound, comminuted, distal third of the left tibia.

Treatment: Wound cleaned with hydrogen peroxide, metaphen and packed with vasoline gauze and sulfathiazole. Reduction closed method. Posterior plaster splint applied to left leg from web of toes to the knee.

Progress: April 14, Leg cast applied. Wound is granulating well, There seems to be some soft callus formation.

May 10, Cast is found to be in a fair condition.

Treatment: The wound is cleansed with metaphen and a small vasoline gauze wick inserted in each wound; plaster cast applied, the position of the fracture is satisfactory.

Progress: May 4, 1942, The cast was removed. The wound was found to be still draining moderately from both entrance and exit of the wound. The 3rd and 4th metatarsal bones seems to be well callused.

Progress: May 10, Wound is granulating good; there is still an area of about 2 cm in diameter which is not healed yet.

Treatment: Wound debrided, cleansed with hydrogen peroxide and packed with  
sulfa powder and rubber tissue drain. Posterior splint applied.

Progress: Jan. 22, 1942, drain was removed. Wound is still inflamed.

Feb. 1, 1942, Swinging cast applied. Swelling has decreased.  
Wound has begun to granulate in.

April 10, 1942, Old cast removed, arm and wound cleansed with  
green soap. Wound painted with metaphen and remaining sutures  
removed.

April 13, 1942, Patient rebroke the old right humerus fracture;  
There seem to be a good deal of callus. Swinging cast applied.

May 10, 1942, The cast is still in good condition
