INSTRUCTIONS

I

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF ALL SECTIONS OF THE STATISTICAL REPORT (FORMS 26a, 26b, 26c, ETC.)

BY PLAN AND PURPOSE OF THE REPORT.—The Statistical Report conveys crucial statistics in each of which is incorporated specific information required by the various divisions of the Surgeon General's Office and the office of the Chief Surgeon in a theater of operations. The statistics are designed to furnish the following laboratory: First, section (Form 26a), data concerning sick, injured, and battle casualties, hospitalizations, and other statistical data covered under Form 26b, movement of personnel, other personnel attached to the Medical Department for duty, and transportation and material available for utilization by the Medical Department. The third section relates solely to Medical Department personnel, or personnel attached thereto, while the other sections (26d and 26e) include statistical data covering the entire command of which the Medical Department constitutes an integral part. Additional sections may be adopted as necessary for their respective areas. (Par. 3a and 2b, AR 45-102.)

BY WHOSE REPORT.—All Medical Department units will render this report. In the case of units separate reports will be rendered for each character of theater unit. (Par. 3c, AR 45-102.)

BY THIS DIVISION FOR REPORTING.—Unless otherwise directed by competent authority, the first and second sections of the report normally will be rendered weekly to include data appearing on the morning report for Saturday, and the third section on the last day of each month. Under exceptional circumstances any section of the report may be rendered daily. (Par. 3d, AR 45-102.)

BY CHANNELS THROUGH WHICH REPORTS.—In time of peace, and in the Zone of the Interior in time of war, the statistical report will be made in duplicate and carbon copy forwarded direct to the Surgeon General, U. S. Army, Washington, D. C.; the original copy to the Army and or department museum; and the second carbon copy retained, except that detachments, regiments, and other organizations forming part of a

division, camp, or subordinate administrative unit which renders a consolidated report will render the report in duplicate only, forwarding the original to the next higher authority, who will consolidate the reports of units under his jurisdiction in triplicate and forward as directed above. (Par. 3e (1), AR 45-102.)

In a theater of operations in time of war the reports, unless otherwise directed by competent authority, will be made in triplicate, one carbon copy forwarded direct to the Chief Surgeon of the force, the original through medical channels to each concerned administrative division or unit, and all the second carbon copy retained, except that detachments, regiments, and other organizations forming part of a division, camp, or subordinate administrative unit which renders a consolidated report will render the report in duplicate only, forwarding the original to the next higher authority, who will consolidate the reports of units under his jurisdiction in triplicate and forward as directed above for a theater of operations. (Par. 3e (2), AR 45-102.)

EXPLANATION OF SPECIAL SYMBOLS.—The purpose of the symbols in parentheses (A), (B), etc., and of the notations (*) is explained in paragraphs (1). The Arabic numerals in parentheses (1), (2), etc., refer to the paragraphs in special instructions for the preparation of the sections of the report (Forms 26a, 26b, or 26c) in which the details of the preparation are covered.

TELEGRAPHIC REPORTS.—Telegraphic reports will be rendered only when specifically required or in emergency. Such reports will be forwarded in code and will contain the data on all items on the report marked with an asterisk. Capitals (A), (B), etc. (Generally preceding or following the headings) will be used as code letters to designate the location. In addition to the telegram, all systems of the completed report (the 26a, 26b, etc.) will be forwarded by mail as provided for in paragraph (4). (Par. 3f, AR 45-102.)

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF THIRD SECTION, STATISTICAL REPORT (FORM 26c)

One Par. 2, c and p, AR 45-102

The Third Section will be prepared by the senior medical officer of every station and command in the field, including commands and units under direct control of the War Department. This report will be rendered by all Medical Department Schools, Corps Area Laboratories, Medical Department Training Centers and Detachments, Medical Supply Depots, newly formed units, Medical Department, Headquarters, etc., even though they are not responsible for the treatment of the sick and do not render returns on Form 26c.

The numbers preceding the following paragraphs correspond with and relate to the numbers appearing on the face of this form.

(1) In a theater of operations the numerical designation of unit by name and place will be given. In the case of the theater complete identification of unit by name and place will be made.

(2) Indicate specifically month, day, and year. Do not use figures to indicate month. In telegraphic reports only the year.

(3) Strength of command on last day of period covered by report will include all men, warrant officers, nurses, and detached men (present and absent). Unassigned nurses and other civilians with the command will not be included in the strength.

(4) When any National Guard or Reserve Officers are on active duty, the fact will be stated on the proper line. These Medical, Dental, etc. (Reg. 9, No. 2, Vol. 9, Title 9, Part 9, Sec. 1001, etc.)

(5) Regular reports, or details en route on duty at a station or with the command, will be shown. These Army Nurse Corps (Reg. 30, Sec. 5, Civ. 3, Title 38, Part 38, Sec. 3001, etc.)

(6) Under "Enlisted Personnel, M. D." will be noted the number allotted by the War Department and in the power column—Total present, etc. Following (E) "Total" the numerical strength will be divided as to Regular Army, Regular Army Reserve, National Guard, and Detachments. These (IV) "Total (Reg. 9, No. 2, Vol. 9, Title 9, Part 9, Sec. 1001, etc.)

(7) Military personnel, other than Medical Department, attached for duty, such as Quartermaster Corps, Finance Department, etc. Under civilians will be shown those post from M. D. units and all others. These: Civilians (M. D. 2) all others 00, Total 00.

(8) Report under "Remarks (3)" statistical data pertaining to personnel and transportation as called for by higher authority. In case of each enlisted man in the first three grades upon first joining his station or command, the name of the commanding officer concerned and the number of his dependents will be noted. Any change in the number of dependents will be noted on subsequent reports.

(9) In each column insert both the number being used by or under the direct control of the Medical Department and immediately thereafter, in parentheses, any additional number at the station, including those stored by a War Reserve. Zero will be used in the appropriate column or columns marked (0) to show that an entry has not been entered.

The persons are assigned to furnish the following information: First section (Form 10a), data concerning men, horses, and other animals; second section (Form 10b), movements of transportation material and other supplies; third section (Form 10c), movements of communications material; and fourth section (Form 10d), movements of medical supplies, other personnel, and other information. The third section includes activity in addition to the Medical Department personnel, of personnel attached to units, who are under military control, and personnel of the Medical Department who are not attached to units. The fourth section includes activities in addition to the Medical Department personnel, of personnel attached to units, who are under military control, and personnel of the Medical Department who are not attached to units. Additional sections may be adopted as necessary for their respective activities. (Para. 2, AR 40-100.)

(2) **BY WHAT PERSONNEL.**—All Medical Department units will render this report. In those of units reports will be rendered for each element of training unit. (Para. 2, AR 40-100.)

(3) **THE INTERVAL FOR REPORTING.**—Units otherwise directed by competent authority, the first and second sections of the report normally will be rendered weekly to include data appearing on the preceding report for Saturday, and the third section on the last day of each month. Under exceptional circumstances any section of the report may be required daily. (Para. 2, AR 40-100.)

(4) **ORIGINATOR PERSONNEL WHEN REPORTING.**—In time of peace, and in the zone of the interior in time of war, the statistical reports will be made in duplicate, one carbon copy forwarded direct to the Surgeon General, U. S. Army, Washington, D. C.; the original copy to the zone and department element and the second carbon copy retained, except line detachments, battalions, and other organizations forming part of a

division, camp, or subordinate administrative element which renders a consolidated report will render this report in duplicate only, forwarding the original to the zone higher authority, who will consolidate the reports of units under his jurisdiction in triplicate and forward as directed above. (Para. 2, AR 40-100.)

In a theater of operations in time of war the reports, unless otherwise directed by competent authority, will be made in triplicate, one carbon copy forwarded direct to the Chief Surgeon of the force, the original (through medical channels) to each intermediate administrative element as may exist, and the second carbon copy retained, direct that consolidation, preparation, and other organizations forming part of a division, camp, or subordinate administrative element which renders a consolidated report will render the report in duplicate only, forwarding the original to the zone higher authority, who will consolidate the reports of units under his jurisdiction in triplicate and forward as directed above for a theater of operations. (Para. 2, AR 40-100.)

(4) TIME INTERVAL FOR REPORTING.—Unless otherwise directed by competent authority, the first and second sections of the report normally will be rendered weekly in duplicate data appearing on the morning report for forward, and the third section as of the last day of each month. Under exceptional circumstances any section of the report may be required daily. (Para. 3d, A.I. 49-100.)

(5) CHANNELS THROUGH WHICH HANDLED.—In time of peace, and in the Zone of the Interior in time of war, the statistical report will be made in triplicate, one carbon copy forwarded direct to The Surgeon General, U. S. Army, Washington, D. C.; the original copy to the corps area or Department command; and the second carbon copy retained, except that detachments, regiments, and other organizations forming part of a

division, camp, or subordinate administrative district which renders a consolidated report will render the report in duplicate only, retaining the original to the next higher authority, who will transmittal the reports of units under his jurisdiction in triplicate and forward as directed above. 1. Medical Department organizations and establishments are not preparing and submitting prescribed medical department reports. It is desired that every attempt be made to prepare pertinent reports promptly and transmit them to this office when due. Following is a list of the more important reports at this time:

a. Statistical Reports. (Par. 71 to 78 Incl. FM 8-45).

- (1) Form 86ab MD is submitted weekly.
- (2) Form 86c MD is required monthly.

b. Report of Sick & Wounded. (Par. 51 to 60 Incl. FM 8-45)

(1) Required monthly by all establishments, organizations or units attended by a medical officer. It consists of the Report Sheet (Form 51 MD), EMT's & FMR's.

(2) EMT (Par. 39 to 44 Incl. FM 8-45). Every case treated prior to admission to a hospital should be tagged with an EMT; every case KIA should be tagged prior to burial. All duplicate EMT's will accompany the S & W report of the medical unit who tagged them.

(3) FMR. (Par. 45 to 50 Incl. FM 8-45). In the absence of the FMR and jacket Forms 92c and d, MD, field medical records may be improvised by hospitals in the theatre of operations, using the report card (Form 52 MD), omitting the register number, and the clinical record brief (Form 55a MD) and such other lettered forms 55 MD as the case may warrant. Such original EMT's as are received will be attached to and made a part of the FMR. All will be securely fastened together.

c. Casualty Reports (Par. 79 & 80 FM 8-45). (See attached mimeographed letter, same subject, Headquarters Philippine Department., dated December 16, 1941.

2. In the absence of printed forms they must be improvised as closely as possible.

3. Reference Par 1 b (3) above, records will be forwarded to this office, it not being required that duplicate reports be retained at your station.

The sections are designed to furnish the following information: First section (Form 86a), data concerning sick, injured, and battle casualties, hospitalizations, and other statistical data; second section (Form 86b), movement of commensurable elements; and third section (Form 86c), status of Medical Department personnel, other personnel attached to the Medical Department for duty, and interpretation and material available for utilization by the Medical Department. The third section relates solely to Medical Department personnel, as personnel attached herewith while the other sections (first and second sections) include statistical data covering the entire personnel of which the Medical Department unit forms an integral part. Additional sections may be adopted as necessary for their respective areas. (Par. 2a and 2b, AR 60-1083.)

61 BY WHOM RETURNED.—All Medical Department units will render this report. In case of peace separate reports will be rendered for each element of training task. (Par. 2c, AR 60-1083.)

62 TIME INTERVAL FOR RENDERING.—Unless otherwise directed by competent authority, the first and second sections of the report normally will be rendered weekly to include data appearing on the morning report for last date, and third section as of the last day of each month. Under exceptional circumstances any section of the report may be required daily. (Par. 2d, AR 60-1083.)

63 CHANGES THROUGH FORCE REDUCTIONS.—In case of peace, and in the case of the theater in time of war, the statistical report will be made in triplicate, one carbon copy forwarded through The Surgeon General, U. S. Army, Washington, D. C.; the original copy in the corps area or department report; and the second carbon copy retained, except that detachments, regiments, and other organizations forming part of a

division, camp, or subordinate administrative district which renders a consolidated report will render the report in duplicate only, retaining the original in the next higher authority, who will maintain the reports of units under his jurisdiction in triplicate and forward as directed above. (Par. 2e (A), AR 60-1083.)

In a theater of operations in time of war the reports, unless otherwise directed by competent authority, will be made in triplicate, one carbon copy forwarded direct to the Chief Surgeon of the Area, the original through medical channels to such intermediate administrative offices may exist, and the second carbon copy retained. Colorized detachments, regiments, and other organizations forming part of a division, camp, or subordinate administrative district which renders a consolidated report will render the report in duplicate only, forwarding the original to the next higher authority, who will consolidate the reports of units under his jurisdiction in triplicate and forward as directed above for a theater of operations. (Par. 2e (B), AR 60-1083.)

64 EXPLANATION OF SPECIAL SYMBOLS.—The purpose of the capitals (A), (B), (C), (D), etc., and of the asterisks (*) is explained in paragraph (7). The Arabic numerals in parentheses (1), (2), etc., refer to the paragraphs in quoted instructions for the preparation of the section of the report (Form 86a, 86b, or 86c) in which the details of the preparation are covered.

65 TELEGRAPHIC REPORTS.—Telegraphic reports will be rendered only when specifically required or in emergency. Such reports will be forwarded in code and will contain the data on all items on the report started with an asterisk. Capitals (A), (B), etc., immediately preceding or following the heading, will be used as code letters to designate the heading. In addition to the telegram, all sections of the completed report (see 86, 86a, etc., only) will be forwarded by mail as provided for in paragraph (6). (Par. 2f, AR 60-1083.)

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF

THIRD SECTION, STATISTICAL REPORT (FORM 86c)

The numbers preceding the following paragraphs correspond with and relate to the numbers appearing on the face of this form.

(1) In a theater of operations the numerical designations of the unit only will be given. In the zone of the Interior complete identification of each by name and place will be made.

(2) Indicate specifically month, day, and year. Do not use figures to indicate month. In telegraphic reports state the year.

(3) Mean strength is obtained by adding daily strength of command (officers, nurses, and enlisted men) for each day for the period, plus number of patients in hospital (officers, nurses, and enlisted men) not otherwise included in strength of command, each day for the period and dividing the sum by the number of days in the period. (Form.—Discharged soldiers or other elements will not be included in this strength.)

66 State number of vehicles employed and paid out of Medical Department funds (automobiles, motorcycles, etc.).

(4) Personnel, other than Medical Department, attached to the Medical Department for duty.

(5) Report other statistical data pertaining to personnel and transportation as called for by higher authority and other items or items bearing no relation in the opinion of the officer reporting should be communicated to such authority.

(6) In each column insert both the number being used by or under the direct control of the Medical Department and immediately thereafter, in parentheses, any additional number at the station, including those stated as a War Reserve. There will be used in the appropriate column or column marked (7) to show that an entry has not been overlisted.
