Bn History: The Philippine Army General Hospital in Bataan was formed from the nucleus of personnel on duty Office of the Chief, Medical Service, Hq PA, on December 26, 1941.

Bn History: This PA General Hospital was initially located in Km #1825 Mariveles, Bagac Road, Bataan, started first mission on January 7, 1942 with few beds. On or about the middle of January 1942, some more battle casualties from the front line were admitted.

Before the end of January, the need for a better site for our hospital was felt and in this connection arrangements were made with our Hq, PA, to transfer our Medical Installation to Km#17 (Base Camp), Mariveles-Bagac Road Detour. This place was more appropriate site for a hospital because it possessed facilities lacking the first site, Km 1825.

Activities of the PA General Hospital in Bataan were varied especially during the latter part of March and first days of April 1942. During this period the number of admission in our hospital reached the 1000 mark due

to evacuation of patients from the Western Sector and the patients casualties that could not be admitted in Hospitals # 1 & 2, USA.

Our Hospital was made the target in the indiscriminate bombing by Jap Bombers when three (3) bombs were dropped inside our area killing Colonel VICTORIANO LUNA, MC, Chief of Medical Service, Hq, PA and Major MACKLOS KEY, MC, Medical Inspector, USA and severely wounding Colonel VANDERBOGGET, MC, USA. Colonel VANDERBOGGET was given the first aid and emergency treatment in our hospital and later was transferred to General Hospital, #1, USA. The cadaver of Major MACKLOS KEY was taken to General Hospital #2, USA, Little Baguio.
