I ADVANCE TOWARD CENTRAL LUZON

Page 1

(Attached Chart No 1)

A. After the fall of enemy resistance on BATAAN Peninsula; the battalion descended RIMAI Hill at noon, 9 April, and assembled in the vicinity of SAN VICENTE Bridge, where the men cleared the battle-field daily until 11 Apr. Meanwhile the battalion prepared for future action.

The Group (HEIDAN) decided to assemble its strength along road No 25 near TAKUP.O*, BANTEIGAN* and the banks of TLAWIR* River. In compliance with the regimental order (NATSU (*1) 3 Operation Order A No 117), to advance to these positions on the night of the 11th, orders were issued as follows:

NATSU 3 TO (*2) (1N TOBUSA Bn) OPERATION ORDER No 67

1 Bn Order, 12 Apr, 0800 hrs at junction of roads Nos 4 and 25 near the approach to the bridge.

NOTE: The symbol * indicates an exact ROMAJI transliteration of the original KANA.

Page 2

1. The regiment will leave the present area on the 12th, advance along No 4 road to the east side of Triangulation Point (*1), T2, and assemble its strength there.

2. The battalion (less 2 and 3 Coys) will form the main body and follow behind the signal company.

3. 3 Coy will form the advance guard leaving the junction of roads Nos 4 and 25 at 1200 hrs. They will advance along road No 4 toward the east side of Triangulation Point T2, leading the main body by about 500 m.

4. 2 Coy will carry on with the previously assigned duty of clearing the battlefield until completed and then overtake the main body.

5. 1st Lieut OKADA (*2) will turn over the remaining material of 2 Coy to 1st Lieut WATANABE (*3). 1 and 2 Coys will take charge of carrying the portable weapons.

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6. The rest of the forces will assemble on the road in the following order of march by 1240 hrs:

Battalion HQ, 1 Coy, 1 MG Coy.

B. The advance began the next day the 12th, at 1200 hrs. The following order of bivouac was given at 1730 hrs on the TLAWIR River bank in the vicinity of NARA (*5) Bridge:

N.TSU 3 TO OPERATION ORDER No 68

1 Bn Order 12 Apr, 1840 hrs, area north of NARA Bridge.

1. The regiment will bivouac on both banks of the TLAWIR River in the vicinity of NARA Bridge on 12th.

2. All units will bivouac under the direction of 2nd Lieut NAGAYAMA (*6). The bivouac orderly officer will be 1st Lieut TAKAHASHI (*7), and the patrol officer will be 2nd Lieut MORIWAKI (*8).

3. The commander of 1 Coy will send half a platoon, under the command of an officer to the vicinity of the Regimental HQ as bivouac guards. The guards will be under the command of the bivouac orderly officer. One section will be sent to protect the Pa Bty and a platoon of Regtl Gun Coy.

4. Security, other than the above, will be carried out by each unit.

Distribution: After the general outline has been forwarded, assemble recipients for oral notification.

C. On the 13th, we received personnel, allotted to us from the dispersed AKAGI (*1) Bn which was organized from No 3 Temporary Replacement Personnel.

To prepare for the change in the general situation and to improve guard, the group (HEIDAN) made plans to assemble its strength in the vicinity of SAN FERNANDO and GUAGU. It was decided that the regiment would form the third echelon and advance toward the vicinity of BACOLOR. In compliance with existing orders (M.TSU 3 Operation Order & No 119), the following order was issued at 0800 hrs:

M.TSU 3 TO OPERATION ORDER No 69

1 Bn Order, 13 Apr, 0800 hrs, area north of M.R. Bridge.

1. In order to prepare for the movement and to improve guard, the group will assemble its strength in the vicinity of SAN FERNANDO and GUAGU.

The regiment will form the third echelon and depart from this area early tomorrow morning, the 14th. It will advance along the M. (*2) - HAN - ABUGAY - GUAGU - BACOLOR Road, and assemble its strength in the vicinity of BACOLOR by 16 Apr. The plan of march is shown on a separate sheet.

2. The battalion will advance behind the regimental signal company.

3. At 0300 hrs on the 14th all units will assemble on M. Road, in order of sequence.

4. Supplies during the march will be iron rations.

5. I will remain here for the present. On 14th at 0300 hrs, I will be at the assembly point on the road.

D. After the assembly on M. Road was completed at 0300 hrs on the 14th, the battalion advanced to the regimental assembly point in the vicinity of FUKUYAMA (*3) Bridge. The regiment left at 0400 hrs.

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Due to log crossings over streams along the motor road, which was built hastily at night, it took time for troops to cross. An unsuitable selection of pace by those at the head caused the column to halt unnecessarily. With the aid of the adjutant close contact was maintained with the force to the rear. Malaria patients who had attacks of fever while on the march had a tendency to straggle, and were very difficult to deal with.

2 Bn to the rear turned towards BALANGA at their own discretion, selected a good road and advanced.

We arrived in ORANI at 1330 hrs. The following orders were given, and we bivouacked.

1 Bn Order, 14 Apr, 1930 hrs, east of ORANI Crossroad.

1. An echelon will bivouac in ORANI on 14th.
Bivouac orderly officer: Capt SEINOHARA (*1).

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2. All units will bivouac in positions indicated.
3. The officer of the day will be 2nd Lieut KUSAGAWA (*3).
4. A leader and eight men will be sent from 7 Coy as guards for the Force. They will take orders from officer of the day.
5. Supplies will be iron rations.
6. I will be in the area south of the fork in the battalion billeting area.

E. We left ORANI at 0200 hrs for SANTA CRUZ. Arrived at 0915 hrs; the following orders were issued before we bivouacked:

1 Bn Order, 15 Apr, 1330 hrs at SANTA CRUZ.

1. The echelon will be billeted in SANTA CRUZ today, the 15th. It will advance towards BACOLOR tomorrow, the 16th. Bivouac orderly officer: 1st Lieut KACHI (*1). Patrol officer: 2nd Lieut SHIMIZU (*2).

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2. Officer of the day will be 2nd Lieut FUJII (*3).

3. 2 Coy (3 Coy) will send to regimental (battalion) HQ half a platoon (leader and 8 men). They will be under the officer in charge as bivouac guards; and will take orders from the bivouac orderly officer or the officer of the day.

4. Apart from the above, all units will carry out their own security measures.

5. All units will assemble on the main road near the bivouac area by 0140 hrs, tomorrow, the 16th, in the following march formation: \square , 2 Coy, 3 Coy, 1 Coy, 1 MG Coy.

6. Supplies will be iron rations.

3. Officer of the day will be 2nd Lieut TOGAWA (*8) on the 16th and 1st Lieut HOJO (*9) on the 17th.

4. About half a platoon with an officer in charge, will be sent to Regimental (Battalion) HQ as bivouac guards. They will take orders from the Bivouac orderly officer or officer of the day. 16th: 3 Coy (2 Coy); 17th: (2 Coy).

G. One part of the group and the main strength in Central LUZON made plans and preparations for a punitive operation against Northern LUZON. It was decided that the regiment would assemble in T-RLAC* to prepare for mopping up operations.

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Based on these orders, orders were issued at 1800 hrs as follows:

NATSU 3 TO OPERATION ORDER No 75

1 Bn Order, 1800 hrs, 16 Apr at B-COLOR.

1. Remaining enemy troops are still operating in the area north of RAYAT Mountain and northeast of CABANATUAN. The regiment will move to the assembly point at T-RLAC and prepare for mopping up operations.

2. The battalion will be in charge of railroad transportation between SAN FERNANDO and T-RLAC in accordance with the transportation plans in the enclosed sheet.

3. 1 Coy will advance to T-RLAC on the train leaving SAN FERNANDO at 0600 hrs, on the day after tomorrow, the 18th.

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4. WO MORITA (*1) will command the battalion horses (with Cpl M-EDA (*2) and required aids from HQ Coy). He will be under the command of transportation officer 2nd Lt YAMADA (*3). They will advance to T-RLAC by train leaving SAN FERNANDO at 1308 hrs on the 19th.

5. The remainder of the force, (including baggage from own units, excluding horses) under my command, will advance to T-RLAC by train, leaving SAN FERNANDO at 1008 hrs on the 18th. Expect to arrive in T-RLAC at 1349 hrs.

6. The following will be in charge of loading (unloading) for transport by rail of the main strength of the battalion:

Page 17 All persons in charge of loading will take orders from Capt ARAKI (*3) concerning their duties. Person in charge of loading supplies will finish loading by 0730 hrs today.

7. HQ and all units will designate men to assist the person in charge of loading (and unloading) and for fatigue duties. The men will take orders from the person in charge.

8. 2nd Lieut NAGAYAMA (*4) will take charge of personnel sent from each unit for billeting at TARIAC. He will leave tomorrow, the 17th under the command of 1st Lieut MORI (*5).

9. All units with the exception of 1 Coy will assemble on the BACOLOR - SAN FERNANDO road the day after tomorrow by 0130 hrs. The head of column will stand at the east end of BACOLOR. Order of march is as follows: $\frac{F}{5}$, 2 Coy, 3 Coy, 1 MG Coy.

G. On 17th, preparations for rail transportation were begun.

H. We left BACOLOR at 0430 hrs on the 18th in marching formation. After assembling the strength at SAN FERNANDO, we left there at 1008 hrs by train for TARIAC. We arrived in SAN MIGUEL at 1330 hrs and decided to billet in the barracks there. The following order was issued:

NATSU 3 TO OPERATION ORDER No 76

1 Bn Order, 18 Apr, 1615 hrs, at SAN MIGUEL barracks.

1. The regt will be billeted in SAN MIGUEL for a period of four days from 18th. $\frac{F}{5}$, Regt Sig Coy, 1 MG Coy, 2 MG Coy, Regt Gun and PA Bty will be billeted in SAN MIGUEL Village as the eastern bivouac sector.

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8. Grand alarm post for the regiment will be in the vicinity of the junction of main road, south of SAN MIGUEL station. The western bivouac sector alarm post will be in the barracks square.

II CONDUCT OF OPERATIONS IN SUBSISTING
CENTRAL LUZON

Part One The Advance Toward C.B.N-TULAN

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(Attached Sketch No 2)

A. The regiment (less 1 Coy) plus 1 Sec of Group Wireless, 63 MT Bn, 1 pl of 2 Coy and 3 Squad of Group Fd Hosp formed the IM-I (*1) Det. It left SAN MIGUEL on 23 Apr. It was decided that 2 Bn as the right column would advance along the SAN MIGUEL-CONCEPCION - SANTA MONICA - SAN ANTONIO - CABANATUAN Road. The main strength advanced along the TARIAC - DEL CARMEN - BUCOT - C.B.N-TULAN Road while mopping up the sector north of Mt ARAYAT. The battalion Commander issued the following order, at 1100 hrs, on the 22nd:

Page 23 N.TSU 3 TO OPERATION ORDER No 77

1 Bn Order, 1100 hrs, 22 Apr, at SAN MIGUEL barracks.

1. In the northeast sector of C.B.N-TULAN and the northern sector of Mt ARAYAT, small numbers of remaining enemy troops are still operating. It is planned that the main strength of the group will envelop and annihilate the enemy in Northern LUZON and part of the group will annihilate those in the eastern half of Central LUZON.

The regiment (less 1 Coy), plus 1 Sec of Group Wireless, 63 Ind MT Bn, 1 pl of 2 Coy, 3 Squad of Group Fd Hosp will form IM-I Det and leave SAN MIGUEL tomorrow, the 13th. 2 Bn (less 5 and 7 Coys) as the right column will advance along the SAN MIGUEL - CONCEPCION - SANTA MONICA - SAN ANTONIO - CABANATUAN road. The main strength (left column) will advance along the SAN MIGUEL - TARIAC - DEL CARMEN - BUCOT - C.B.N-TULAN Road, while mopping up the enemy north of Mt ARAYAT.

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2. The battalion (less 1 Coy and 3 Coy) will be the advance guard of the left column, and will leave north end of SAN MIGUEL at 0400 hrs on the 23rd. The battalion will advance to CABANATUAN through SAN MIGUEL - TARIAC - DEL CARMEN - BUCOT - C.B.N-TULAN leading the main body by about 500 m.

3. 2 Coy (less 2 Pl, plus 1 MG Pl) will form the advance party and advance to CABANATUAN along the road mentioned above, leading the support by 300 m.

4. The remaining forces will fall in at the rear of the advance party in the following order of march: 2 Pl of 2 Coy (less 1 Sec), main strength of 1 MG Coy, 1 Sec of 2 Coy.

5. Each unit will assemble at the fork of the road in SAN MIGUEL in marching formation as mentioned above by 1530 hrs tomorrow, the 13th. (The advance party will keep at the same distance from the support)

B. We left SAN MIGUEL as scheduled at 0400 hrs on the 23rd and arrived at L.P.Z at 1330 hrs. We bivouacked there after the following order was issued:

1 Bn Order, 1300 hrs, 23 Apr, at L.P.Z Elementary School.

1. Today, the 23rd, a part of the detachment will be billeted in the vicinity of S.NPA MONICA and the main strength in the vicinity of L.P.Z. They will reconnoiter the enemy situation and terrain.

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2. The battalion will be billeted in the L.P.Z Elementary School, and will guard the C.B.M.TUAN Road while reconnoitering the enemy situation and terrain.

3. One platoon of the advance company will be sent to the road (to positions indicated separately) between L.P.Z and C.B.M.TUAN. They will keep a lookout in the direction of C.B.M.TUAN while reconnoitering the enemy situation and terrain.

4. Remaining troops will bivouac in positions indicated separately.

5. The alarm post will be the school grounds.

6. Supplies will be iron rations.

7. I will remain here for the present.

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C. According to the detachment order, one platoon and one section of 5 Wireless Unit, under the command of platoon leader, 2nd Lieut KIMURA (*1) of 3 Coy, was dispatched to guard the SAN JOSE area, the next day, the 24th. N.TSU 3 TO OPERATION ORDER No 79

1 Bn Order, 1730 hrs 23 Apr, at L.P.Z Elementary School.

1. Tomorrow, the 24th, the main force of the detachment will advance toward BUCOT (*2) from L.P.Z following the main road; at the same time, they will dispatch one force to SAN JOSE to guard that vicinity.

2. The battalion (1 Coy, 2 Coy, Bn Gun Pl of 1 MG Coy) will be the advance guard of the main body of the detachment. 2. The battalion will bivouac at the east end of BUCOT and guard the road to CABAN-TUAN. The battalion will reconnoiter the enemy situation and terrain.

3. The leading company will guard the road to CABAN-TUAN and reconnoiter the enemy situation and terrain.

4. Remaining forces will bivouac at positions designated by the adjutant.

5. Supplies will be iron rations.

1. BONGABON Garrison Unit Comdr will guard the present area with a part of the unit. B. According to intelligence coming in from various districts the head of the MACHI (*2) and a policeman of SAN PILAR arrested persons on the road suspected of being guerrillas. In order to carry out this, propaganda pamphlets were distributed by the head of BONGABON government office and pacification was carried out.

D. We arrived in PANTABANGAN at 1530 hrs. The inhabitants were assembled and pacified. The head of MACHI and the government office head were absent as they had escaped. The revenue officer was summoned and a MACHI office was immediately established. After inviting the mayor of MACHI and the head of the government office, the garrison unit was ordered to accompany them. The following order was given, and we bivouacked.

2. 1 Bn (less 1 Coy, 2 Coy, 1 Pl of 3 Coy, and 1 Pl of 1 MG Coy), plus one section each of the wire and wireless unit, one passenger vehicle and two trucks, will be the northeast sector garrison unit. It will be situated at BONGABON. It will maintain order in the northern portion east of the PAMPANGA River. NUEVA ECIJA and the northern portion of TAYABAS Province.

2. Part of the garrison unit will mop up the vicinity of BALER tomorrow, the 18th. For the mopping up, a Mark V Wireless Set has been attached recently.

3. 3 Coy Comdr will command two platoons of his company, 1 Bn Gun Sec, one Mark V Wireless Set and four trucks. He will depart tomorrow the 18th and mop up the BALER area within two days at a rough estimate. One medical officer will be attached for the mopping up.

4. 1 MG Coy Comdr will put the battalion gun mentioned above under the command of 3 Coy Comdr.

5. Mopping up forces will carry three days rations and forage.

6. 1st. Lieut IWICHI will take charge of 3 Coy; he will guard BONGABON during the mopping up.

E. According to intelligence, on 30 May, four AMERICAN soldiers were wandering in the vicinity of ANTIPOLLO. The prisoners will be handed over to the internment camp tomorrow, the 31st.

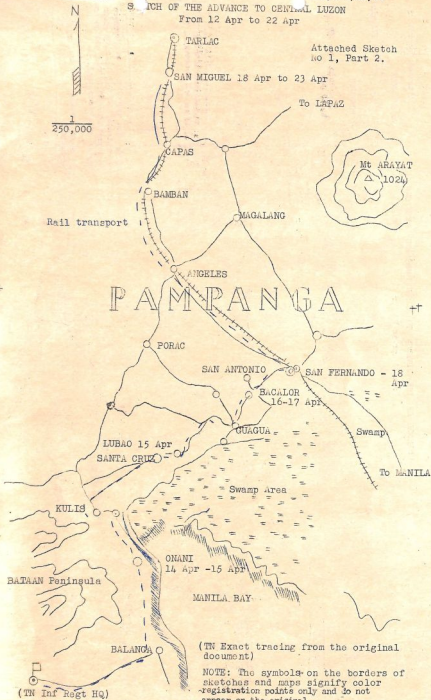

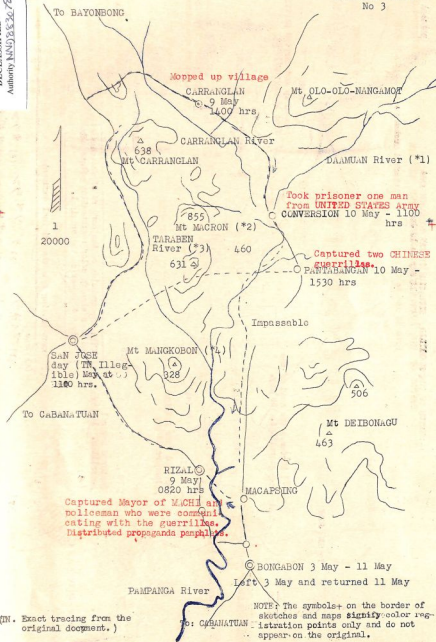

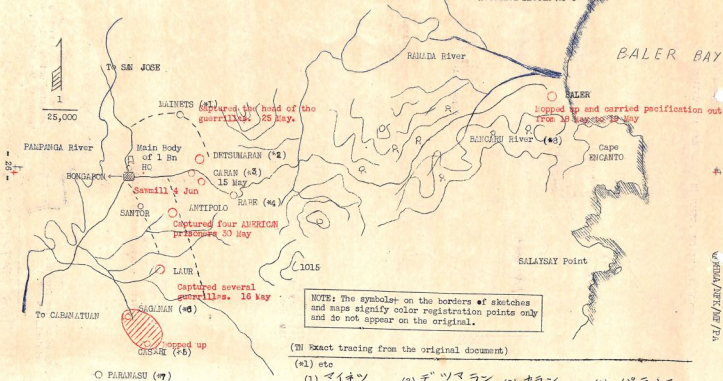
