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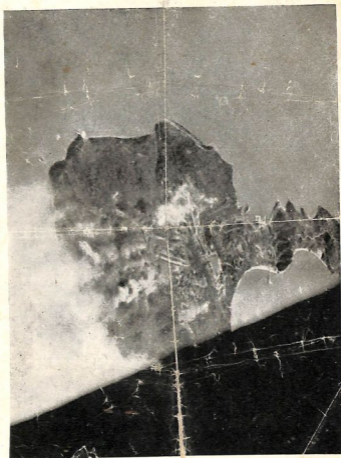


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Don't be misled by absurd propaganda. Almost all of the main force of the U. S. Pacific fleet was destroyed by the Japanese naval force at Pearl Harbor in Hawaii on the 8th of December last, and again the remaining of the said main force, including aircraft-carriers, was completely destroyed by the Japanese naval force on the 12th of January last. Moreover, on the 10th of December last the islands of Guam, Wake and Midway were completely occupied by the Japanese forces. Furthermore, the British forces unconditionally surrendered Hongkong to the Japanese forces on the 24th of December last, and the Island of New Britain was occupied by the Japanese forces on the 23rd of January last. And on the 15th of February last, the much-vaunted and so-called impregnable fortress of the British Far Eastern forces at Singapore also surrendered unconditionally. On the 8th of March last, Rangoon was completely occupied by the Japanese forces, and the Dutch East Indies also unconditionally surrendered on the 9th of March last as you already well know by newspaper dispatches and radio broadcasts.

On the other hand, on the 2nd of February last, U. S. Secretary of Navy, Frank L. Knox mourned before Congress over the fact that the U. S. Navy must defend not only two oceans but also Middle and South America with a naval strength sufficient for the defense of only one ocean. The task is a difficult and almost an impossible one; and at present Franklin D. Roosevelt confessed in his fireside-chat on the 22nd of February last that the United States of America must continue at any cost the transportation of provisions and munitions in order to protect England from the attack of the Nazis, and that the transportation of troops and war supplies to the southern Pacific and North Africa is impossible owing to the great distance and the grave perils along the way. Moreover, Buenos Aires (March 26, Doms) reported an information from Ottawa that Canadian Prime Minister Mackenzie King announced that the Canadian government is more concerned over its own defense than the desperate plight of Australia and has decided not to send expeditionary forces to Australia.

Anyone who thoroughly realizes the above-mentioned facts can understand that the propaganda "that between the 25th of March and the 10th of April substantial reinforcements from the United States of America will be sent to the Philippines" is completely false and absurd, without any explanation.

It is a last warning of the Imperial Japanese Forces, out of the humanitarian benevolence of "Budo", the moral code of the Japanese warrior, that it is the last chance for you to choose at your free-will between being misled by false propaganda of the United States of America and continue this meaningless and futile resistance against the Japanese forces and expose your corpses in the wilderness of Bataan in vain, or throw down your arms immediately and surrender yourselves to the Japanese forces and save your lives to guarantee the future happiness of yourselves and the welfare of your families.
