HISTORY OF THE 1ST LETTE COMPANY, FC (Deduced from a special study of forty-two (h2) let Leyte Company, FC cases)

As of December 8, 19h1, there were three Philippine Constabulary companies in Leyte under Major Arturo A. Reyes, the Provincial Inspector whose headquarters was in Tacloban. These units were the 1st Leyte Company stationed in Tacloban; the 2nd Leyte Company, in Ormoc; and the 3rd Leyte Company, in Malitbog. 1 On or about February 27, 19h2 the Philippine Constabulary units on Masbate were transferred to Leyte 2 and became a fourth FC unit in Leyte. 3 These units became components of the Philippine Constabulary Battalion of the Samar-Leyte Sector with Major Eustaquio A. Abay, the Provincial Inspector of Masbate, and Battalion Commander. 1 The battalion was administratively attached to the Leyte Provisional Regiment. Major Arturo A. Reyes, in addition to his duties as Provincial Inspector of Leyte, was assigned Provest Marshall.

A majority of members of the 1st Leyte Company, as well as those on duty with the Office of the Frovincial inspector, allege induction on various dates - December 2h, 26 and 27, 19hl - at Tacloban, Leyte by either Lt Robert G. Burlando or Lt Juan C. Torres. Some allege their inducting officer to be one Lt Hamon Torres and Lt Conzales (first name not indicated). There were some who allege induction by

"PA Officer", while others by It Surlando and It Torres, or by

It Torres and one American Officer. It is apparent that members

of the unit are confused with regards to the date of their induction

as well as their inducting officer. However, considering the fact

that there was no USAFFS unit in Leyte at the outbreak of the war

(the 91st Division, PA moved to Luzon and the 93rd Infantry, PA

moved to Mindanao), and that a defense force was later organized to

defend the area, it is believed that the 1st Leyte Company and other

FC units in Leyte became components of this defense force - the

Philippine Constabulary Battalion of the Samar-Leyte Sector, and that

members thereof were actually inducted into the USAFFS.

Other evidence which indicate Fhilippine Constabulary units on Leyte to be USAFFE are various special orders issued by USAFFE headquarters, Visayan-Kindanao Force and Fhilippine Constabulary headquarters, District of the Visayas in January and February 1912, wherein members of the Hilippine Constabulary on Leyte are listed. In this connection it should be noted that, unlike some Fhilippine Constabulary units on Luson which were routed or isolated by enemy action, the Constabulary on Leyte remained intact, and communication.

facilities with both USAFFE headquarters, Visayan-Kindanao Force and Fhilippine Constabulary headquarters, District of the Visayas remained open, because Leyte island was spared of a Japanese invasion. Japanese forces came into Leyte in the last week of May 1942 only to accept the surrender of Col Cornell, the USAFFE commander of the Samar-Leyte Sector and the troops of his command.

Captain Robert C. Burlando was the alleged inducting officer of personnel of the District Headquarters, 9th Military District at Tacloban, Leyte. It is believed that Capt Burlando could have been present during the induction ceremony of the 1st Leyte Company by It Juan C. Torres, leading the inductees to believe that he (Burlando) was their inducting officer. Statements of Felix Relevo¹⁰ and Apolinario Bantilan¹¹ bear out this possibility.

A few of the cases examined allege induction by one It Ramon
Torres and It Gomzales (1st name not indicated). There are no records
of officers by these names either in this headquarters or at Headquarters,
Armed Forces of the Philippines who has served with the USAFFK forces
in Leyte.

Among those who allege induction by It Juan C. Torres are It

Blas E. Miranda¹² and let Sgt Elias Rocabo¹³, company commander and 1/Sgt of the 1st Leyte Company respectively. Since these persons are presumed to know the circumstances of induction and service of their unit, it is safe to presume that the induction of the company was performed by Lt Juan C. Torres on or about December 27, 1941 at Camp Bumpus, Tacloban, Leyte. 1st It Juan C. Torres was the Battalion Surgeon of the 2nd Battalion, 94th Infantry (Fi) at Tacloban, Leyte. His USAFFE status is established by certificate of acceptance issued by It Russel D. Barros dated October 3, 1941¹⁴. It should be noted that this officer also inducted members of the 3rd Leyte Company.

lst It Blas E. Miranda was the Company Commander of the 1st Leyte Company until February 10, 1942 when he was transferred to the 2nd Leyte Company also as Company Commander. 15 1st It Marcos E. Nolasco, the Company Commander of the 2nd Leyte Company was designated Company Commander of the 1st Leyte Company. 16

The 1st Leyte Company was last stationed in Jaro, Leyte where order to surrender was received. Copy of surrender order of Col T. M. Cornell dated 20 May 1912 is hereto attached. 17 Of the forty-two cases studied, only It Marcos E. Holasco, It Pedro Eamiguel, Prt

Prancisco A. Lasarte, of the 1st Leyte Company, and Major Arturo A. Reyes, Capt Venusto F. Donato, It Crispin G. Lara and Opl Eugenio H. Labong of the Provincial Inspector's Office allege to have surrendered to the Japanese during the last week of May 1912. The rest were disparded and some surrendered at later dates when the Japanese rounded them up.

CONCLUSION

On the basis of the foregoing findings the following conclusions have been drawn:

- 1. The 1st Leyte Company was stationed at Camp Bumpus, Tacloban, Leyte on December 8, 1911.
 - 2. Officers of the company were:

3. The 1st Leyte Company, FC was inducted into the USAFFE by 1st Lt Juan C. Torres on or about December 27, 1941 at Camp Bumpus, Tacloban, Leyte. Members of the unit who allege USAFFE status by virtue of this induction must prove their USAFFE identity in the same

4. The unit became a component of the Philippine Constabulary Battalion which was organized and became a part of the Samar-Leyte Sector.

 The unit was last stationed in Jaro, Leyte where it received the order to surrender. While the entire Leyte Force was officially surrendered on May 25, 1942, some personnel of the Office of the Provincial Inspector and the 1st Leyte Company allege to have surrendered either before or after this date.

6. Of the cases studied, the following personnel of the office of the Provincial Inspector and 1st Leyte Company allegedly surrendered and became Frisoners of War at Tacloban, Leyte:

> Major Arturo A. Bayes - Provincial Inspector & Provest Marshall Capt Venueto F. Donato - Asst Provincial Inspector 1st Lt Orispin G. Lara - Medical Inspector Cpl Eugenio H. Labong - Office of the Provincial Inspector 1st Lt Marcos S. Molasco - Company Commander, 1st Layte Company 1st Lt Pedro G. Emaiguel - Junior Officer, 1st Leyte Company Ptt Francisco A. Lasarte - 1st Leyte Company

The rest of the unit was disbanded. However, some members of the unit surrendered later when unsurrendered USAFFE soldiers were rounded up by Jacanese authorities.

ARCHIVES RESEARCH

- A thorough check of available archives on the 1st Leyte Company, FC has been made at Records Branch and at Project J Section. This revealed that:
 - 1. There are no historical records pertaining to the unit.
- A majority of members of the company appear in some special and general orders issued by Headquarters, Philippine Army or Philippine Constabulary dated prior to December 1941.
- Some members of the unit appear in Special Orders of promotion issued by the Fhilippine Constabulary Headquarters, District of the Visayas in January and Pebruary 1962.
- 4. The "Alphabetical Casualty Listings of Officers and Enlisted Fersonnel who were in the Philippine Island area as of 7 December 1941"

shows the following:

a. 2nd It Robert C. Burlando 0-383985 Hq Sv Troops, 26th Cavalry - KIA 15 Dec 14

Lt Burlando was mentioned as the inducting officer in some of the cases studied.

b. 1st It Russell D. Barros 0-298701 Btry C, 91st Coast Artillery

It Barros accepted 1st It Juan C. Torres for service in the USAFFE. It Torres was the inducting officer of the 1st Leyte Company.

- Some of the officers of the Office of the Provincial Inspector are listed in USAFFE archives.
- 6. Notes on the "Leyte Provisional Regiment" (Reference to the 94th Infantry Regiment, extracted from Historical Div. Acc. No. P-33 of the "GUERRILIA RESISTANCE MOVEMENT IN LETTE") cites briefly the organization of the USAFFE force in Leyte.
- There are no other records which would be of value in the preparation of this history.

AFFIDAVIT

- I, Major URBANO C. FRANCISCO, 0-21500, Inf, of legal age, married and presently assigned as Zone S-3, VZ HQ LPC (AFF), Cebu City on eath hereby declare the following:
- (a) That I know Capt. Sergio G. Muique, Inf before the Second World Mar yet as Traffic Officer of the 16th Traffic District, comprising the provinces of Leyte, Samar and Masbate with his Headquarters at Tacloben, Leyte.
- (b) That on March 1942, he became the Executive Officer of the Constabulary Establion, comprising the four Constabulary companies stationed in Eyet Frevince distributed as following: 1st Loyde Co. FC-Tacloban; 2nd Leyte Go. FC-Crnoc; Mashate Go. FC-Eaybay and 3rd Leyte Co. FC-Mailthog.
- (c) That on 19 May 1912, Capt Sargio G. Muigue went to Malithog, Leyte with instruction from Col. The clore M. Cornell, Sector Commander, Leyte-Semer Sector, that we of the Third Leyte Company, Philippine Contabulary (I was then Junior Officer of this Company) must occupy immediately interior possession, fortify it and fight say invader.
- (d) That at noon of same day (19 May 19h2) he received telegram from our Bettalion Commander, now Lt. Col. Eustaquic Abay ordering him to return to Tamelben to attend the important conference called by Col. Theodore M. Cornell, USAFFE, our Sector Commander.
- (e) That on 24 May 1942 (Sunday) Capt. Sergio G. Muique returned to Malitbog, Leyte and after both officers and men of the 3rd Leyte Conpany, FC were assembled, he informed us that our Sector Commender, Col, Theodore M. Cornell, decided to surrender.
- (f) That I know Capt. Sergio C. Muique did not surrender for in his lecture to our Company at about 9:30 MM, 2h May 19h2, his advice to our command was not to surrender, but lay off, keeping all our arms until better times.
- (g) That his Guarrilla Unit was responsible in three major oncounters from 28 May 1942 to Dec. 1942 against the Japanese, Jeps Spies and suppression of banditry and also this was the Gerrilla responsible for the kidnapping during the latter part of 1942, of Col. R. R. Kangleon who was them on the concentration camp at Buttan, Agusan.

(i) That when Gol, Englison took command of all Guerrilla Units in southern Leyte (Including that of Copt, Nitigue's and min-) Copt, Nitigue occupied various assignments as Commanding Officer 91" Co, Expositive Officer, 91th Inf Bogt and also in Operation and Intelligence Work and he was in the latter capacity when the American or Liberation Forces landed at Tecloban, Leyte on 20 (october 150).

That I was the Frovincial Inspector of the Fhilippine Constabulery at Mastate, Mashate, F. I. when Lat Lt. Hilarion S Ayalin was assigned Commanding Officer of the First Mastate Company (FC) on 3 December 1941;

That on the 27th day of February 1942, per Radiographic Instructions from the Commanding General, Visayas, Mindance Forces, USAFFS, the whole constability Units of Masbate were transferred to Leyte;

The First and Second Masbate Companies (PC) were put under the command of Lt Milarion S. Ayalin;

That on or about the first week of April 1542 the two Mashate Companies (FC) were stationed at Paybay, Leyte and It Hillrion S. Ayalin was relieved Commanding Officer of said Companies by Capt V Donato;

That after 1st Lt Hilarion S, Ayalin, FC was relieved he was assigned as Supply Officer of the 2d Lattalion, Leyte Provisional Regt up to the surrender to the energy on 26 May 1912.

right to remain silent, voluntarily state the following statement
which may be read as evidence in trial:

That from the period January 1939 to 23 May 19h2 inclusive, I was assgd as Clerk-Stenographer in the office of the then Provincial Inspector, FC, Tecloben, Leyte.

That I know personally OPL GREGORIO R CONCHAS COCCLI- Inf to be a regular member of the defunct Philippine Contabulary, enlisted at Ornoc, Leyte on 7 March 1937 and thence aged with me at 2d Leyte Company, PA (CD), Ornoc, leyte and was on ontinuous service until the outbreak of the war.

That Opl Comchas was inducted into the USAFFE on 27 December 11 by FA Officer, 9th Hiltery District (FA), Taclotan, Leyte with the renk of FRIVATE FIRST CLASS.

That he was assigned as Clerk-Typist with me in the same office (Frevincial Meadquarters, PG, Teolotan, Meyte) until the war broke out, and he was last paid to include 15 May 1942 by 1st Lt M E Molasco, Disbusing Officer.

- 4. That said Serafin R. Micolas did continious efficient service in the lat Leyte Company from December 17, 19hl (Date of his enlistment) to May 22, 19h2 (date unit was disbanded because of the order of surrender to the enemy Japanese).
- 5. That I know further the above facts because I was incharged during that time the records of the 1st Leyte Company FO, such as Boster of Troops and Daily koming Reports, wherein Seratin R Micoles enlisted.
- 6. That my USAFFE identity was established before the office of the Recovered Personel Division PA.

- . I, Apolinario Bantilan, married of legal age and presently in the service of the Philippine Constabulary with the rank of S/Sgt in the 42nd Bompany stationed in Burauen. Leyte, after having been duly sworn to adcording to law hereby depose and sav:
- 1. That I know personally Serafin R. Nicolas a resident of Dagami, Leyte to have been a member of the 1st Leyte Company, Philippine Constabulary stationed in Camp Bumpus, Tacloban, Leyte.
- 2. That said Serafin R. Nicolas enlisted in the Phil. Constabulary last December 17, 1941 with the rank of private and was inducted to the USAFFE last December 26, 1941 by inducting officer Torres and one American officer whose name I did not remember in Camp Bumpus, Tacloban, Leyte.
- 3. That said Serafin R. Nicolas did continious service from December 17, 1941 to May 22, 1942 with the same unit. That same unit was disbanded on May 22, 1942 due to the order of surrender to the enemy by our commanding officer Lt. Nolasco.
- 4. That I know all the above facts because I was the Mess Sergeant of 1st Leyte Company, Philippine Constabulary when said Serafin R. Nicolas enlisted and that we were all inducted to the USAFFE last December 26, 1941 all at the same time. Nolesco, who was then easigned as Commanding Officer of the 2nd Peyto Co., and subsequently assigned to lat Leyto Co. on Tebruary 11, 1912 under my command until all of us surrendered;

That Lt. Holasco was inducted in my presence by Capt. Manuel O. Holasco, by order of Col. 

At the outbreak of the war Leyte was prectically without any defense force. On 15 December 19h1, however, orders were received from Headquarters Fhilippine Army activating the 93rd Infantry Regiment for induction into the USAFFE. A call for all officers and reservists who had not yet reported to active duty was sent, and the following day, officers and men began to flock in. When the organization was completed a report on the matter was made to Headquarters Army of the Fhilippines. A directive was, however a few days later, directing the 93rd Infantry Regiment to propers to move to Minianso where it was assigned as Force poserve.

The 93rd Infantry Regiment moved to Mindenso in the first week of Jamesry 1942 leaving Leyte again without any defense troops. Orders were, however, received a week later, authorizing the activation of the 94th Infantry Regiment to remain in Leyte to defend the island in case of foreign aggression. This regiment later was designated as the Leyte Provisional Regiment.

The Leyte Frovisional Regiment remained in Leyte during the entire period from January to May 1842. Although amphibious operations were made by the enemy throughout the entire period in the nearby islands nothing happened in Leyte. The officers and non kept themselves occupied by improving defensive positions and storing food supplies for a prolonged defense of Leyte, if need be. But the enemy did not come. Batsam fell.

Corregidor fell, still no Japs came. All of a sudden, however,



the officers and sen of the Leyte Provisional Regiment were surprised to hear General Wainwright ordering General Sharp to surrender with the Visayas-Windanso Porce. Greater was their surprise when Colonel Cornel, the Commanding Officer of the Leyte Provisional Regiment received General Sharp's orders ordering his officers and men to surrender to the Japanese when they come to Leyte to receive the Prisoner of War.

Disgusted by the order to surrender without having had a chance to fire a single shot against the enemy, a number of officers and man escaped to the mountains determined to put up indefinite resistance against the Japanese. When Colonel Cornel surrendered with his staff, only a few officers and man of the Leyte Provisional Regisent were left to surrender with them.

The afficers and men who escaped to the hills became the founders of the guerrilla groups which emerged in Leyte shortly after the occupation of the Eslands by the Japanese conquering hordes, determined to carry on the fight against the energy indefinitely.

SUBJECT: Surrender

- TO : Cept. RAYMUNDO G. CANTARA, FS, Sector Finance Officer, SIS, Tacloban, Leyte
- 1. In compliance with instructions received from higher authority you will assemble all of your troops with erus, ammunition and equipment at Tacloban, Leyte.
- This coverent must be completed by May 24, 1942. You will use all available means for assembling your troops.
- 3. All troops will invediately be discrete and all arms, amount to and equipment collected in a scoure place in the ascendily area. You will be responsible that all material and troops are present to be surrendered to representatives of the Japanese Army upon their arrival. Those about will be reported to bis Japanese authorities as describers.
- 4. You will take the necessary steps to insure that conflict with the Japanese Forces is avoided.
 - 5. You will not disband any unit under your command.
- 6. No willtary objectives, war implements and untertain, arms, assentitions, provisions, etc. and no civilian property will be burned, destroyed or hidden. All officers are enjoined to carefully instruct those under them and any with whom they comin contact to strictly observe the above provisions. You will have evalishe a sketch showing the location of all of the above material that cannot be moved to your aspending area.
 - 7. You will continue to subsist your troops as in the past.
- 8. All emploaves will be immediately recoved from highways, bridges and may other places where they night cause demage and assembled in the vicinity of your troop. If it land possible to recove emploaves in any locality without destroying structures or highways a complemous sign reading "DANNERS" will be placed therest.
- 9. The Japanese Army will treat all officers and enlisted men according to International Law. Courteous and prompt obe-

dience to the epanese Army and their orders is absolutely necessary.

10. There must be no thought of disregarding these instructions. Failure to fully and honestly carry them out can have only the most disastrouers sults.

11. It is expected that all military personnel will render the same loyac support in carrying out this difficult mission that they have given me in the past.
