HISTORY OF THE 1ST MASBATE COMPANY and 2ND MASBATE COMPANY PHILIPPINE CONSTABULARY

(Deduced from a special study of forty-seven (47) 1st and 2nd Masbate P.C. cases)

At the outbreak of war there were on Masbate island two Philippine Constabulary companies, the 1st Masbate Company and the 2nd Masbate Company, both units under Major Eustaquio A. Abay, the P.C. Inspector for Masbate province. The FC units on Masbate were components of the District of Southern Lugon under Colonel Arsenio Natividad, the District Inspector, whose headquarters was in Manila.

The 1st Masbate Company, commanded by 1st Lt Hilarion S. Ayalin, was stationed in Masbate, Masbate, while the 2nd Masbate Company, under Captain Bernardino Reyes, was stationed in Rio Guinobatan, Aroroy, Masbate. Major Abay had his provincial headquarters at Masbate, Masbate.

With the occupation of Southern Luson and the subsequent occupation of Manila by Japanese forces, the Fhilippine Constabulary units
on Masbate were isolated from Headquarters, District of Southern
Luson. There is no recorded activity of these units subsequent to
December 8, 19h1. However, it would be safe to presume that these
units continued with police duties until January 7, 19h2. On or
about January 7, 19h2, when Japanese forces landed at Masbate, Masbate, members of the 1st Masbate Company and personnel of the office
of the Provincial Inspector under Major Abay left their station and
evacuated to barrio Tugbo. Records examined made no mention of the

disposition of the 2nd Masbate Company at Aroroy, Masbate subsequent to the Japanese landing. The Japanese landing and occupation of Masbate, Masbate were effected without opposition from the Philippine Constabulary units. It should be noted that not one among the cases studied claims casualty (WIA, KIA, POW) as a result of the Japanese landing and occupation. Members of the units remained in hiding until about the second week of February 19h2 when funds for their maintenance were exhausted. Major Abay then directed Captain Bernardino Reyes to proceed to Leyte by sailboat to appraise the authorities thereat of the conditions obtaining on Washate and to request for funds for the maintenance of the PC units. 2 Captain Reyes arrived in Leyte on or about February 17, 1942 and was allegely inducted into the USAFFE by Colonel Cornell on February 18, 1952. Colonel Cornell then directed Captain Reves to return to Masbate to order the transfer of the Philippine Constabulary complements on Masbate to Leyte. It is alleged that Colonel Cornell's order of transfer was in compliance "...with the telegram of instructions of General SHARP, the Commanding General, USAFFE, Visayas-Mindanao Zone ... 113

The Fhilippine Constabulary units on Masbate were transferred to Leyte on or about February 27, 1942. The transfer was effected by

members of the 2nd Leyte Company, FC under the supervision of its company commander, Lt Blas E. Miranda on board the patrol boat "RADIO". 5 With this transfer, the Masbate Philippine Constabulary units, isolated from their district headquarters, the Department of Southern Luzon, came under USAFFE control and disposition.

Upon arrival in Leyte the 1st and 2nd Masbate Companies were fused into one command, the Masbate Company. It Hilarion S. Ayalin, the company commander of the 1st Masbate Company was designated to command the new unit. Captain Bernardino Reyes was assigned Sector Headquarters Commandant and Commanding Officer of the Military Police Company of the Samar-Leyte Sector, USAFFS.

The Masbate Company (1st and 2nd Masbate companies), together with the 1st, 2nd and 3rd Leyte Companies, became an element of the Fhilippine Constabulary Battalion of the Samar-Leyte Sector, USAFFE with Major Bustaquio A. Abay as Battalion Commander. 6 Records fail to show the exact date of the constitution of the Philippine Constabulary Battalion in Leyte. However, Major Abay being the first and only commanding officer of this battalion, it is believed that the unit was organized subsequent to the transfer of the Masbate FC units to Leyte.

From Tacloban, Leyte, the Masbate Company, FC was transferred to Baybay, Leyte. Lt Ayalin was relieved as commanding officer by

Captain Venusto F. Donato on or about the first week of April 1942.

It Ayalin was assigned supply officer of the 2nd Battalion of the
Leyte Provisional Regiment. Captain Donato, prior to his designation as Commanding Officer of the Masbate Company, was the assistant
Provincial Inspector of Leyte. This officer made no mention of his
designation as company commander of the Masbate Company in his 201
file. However, members of the Masbate Company alleged that Captain
Donato was their last company commander. From Baybay, Leyte the
unit was transferred to barrio Patag, Burauen, Leyte where orders to
surrender were received. It is alleged that the unit was disbanded
by Captain Donato on or about May 27, 1942. However, the following
members of the Masbate Company allegedly surrendered or were captured
and became prisoners of war at Tacloban, Leyte on dates indicated:

Numbers of the Headquarters, Fnilippine Constabulary Battalion
(formerly personnel of the office of the Provincial Inspector of
Masbate under Major Abay) who allegedly surrendered and became prisoners
of war at Tacloban, Leyte, are the following:

Major Eustaquio A. Abay - - - - - - - May 27, 1942 Cpl Jose M. Diano - - - - - - - - June 16, 1942

The majority of cases studied allege induction on February 26,

1942 and some claim induction on various dates in March 1942 (12th. 15th and 20th). These inductions were allegedly performed by Captain Bernardino Reyes or by Lt Hilarion S. Ayalin at Masbate or at Tacloban. It has been noted that some of those who claim induction on February 26 state that the induction took place at Tacloban. On the other hand, there are a few who allege induction in March. 1942 at Masbate. On the basis of statements of persons who, because of the position they occupied, are best qualified to know that the "whole constabulary units of Masbate were transferred to Leyte" on February 27, 1942.8 it is not possible that inductions by either Gaptain Reves or It Avalin took place in Masbate in March, 1962. nor is it likely that the same officers inducted their men on February 26 at Tacloban. It could be possible that some members were left on Masbate when the unit moved to Leyte and that these personnel later rejoined their unit in Leyte in March, 1942, hence their inductions on these later dates. It is believed that personnel who were transferred to Levte on February 27 were inducted prior to departure from Masbate on February 26 by Captain Bernardino Reyes, and those who have rejoined their unit in Leyte later, were inducted on various dates in March by either Captain Bernardino Reyes or Lt Hilarion S. Avalin in Levte.

A few cases allege automatic induction into the USAFFE on December 17, 1911 and actual induction on February 26, 1912 by Captain Bernardino

Reyes.⁹ In the case of Domingo Feruelo who died on Pebruary 15, 19h2, only automatic induction is alleged. ¹⁰ It has been determined that alleged automatic induction of Philippine Constabulary units on December 17, 19h1, or on any other dates for that matter, are not vaild USAFFE inductions. ¹¹

Captain Bernardino Reyes was allegedly inducted into the USAFFE by Colonel Cornell, the Commanding Officer of the Samar-Leyte Sector, USAFFE on or about February 18, 1942. By virtue of this induction Captain Reyes acquired USAFFE status and authority to induct. Further proof of the USAFFE identity of Captain Reyes is evidenced by the fact that his promotion to Wajor as of April 5, 1942 has been confirmed per paragraph 10, Special Orders No. 194, Headquarters Philippine Army dated 30 July 1945, 12

While Lt Hilarion S. Ayalin alleges to have been called to active duty in the Philippine Constabulary on November 27, 1941, as supported by Faragraph 17, Special Orders No. 268, Army Headquarters, Namila dated November 17, 1941, calling him to a six-months tour of active duty, 13 his name appears listed in Project "J"'s "Alphabetical Casualty Listing of Officers and Enlisted Personnel who were in the Philippine Island Area as of 7 December 1941" in the grade of Corporal,

QMC, ASN: 6739200, organization: Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 12th QM Regiment, FS, as "Missing in Action". The Project "J" record would indicate that It Ayalin was still a Fhilippine Scout on December 7, 1941. However, "it was held by the Department of the Army on 29 March 1949 that Hilarion Ayalin 6 739 200 was discharged from the Fhilippine Scouts 27 November 1941 to accept a commission in the Philippine Constabulary and that he had no subsequent service in the Fhilippine Scouts or Army of the United States until 28 August 1946, the date he entered on active duty as a 2nd Lieutenant in the Army of the United States." It Ayalin, therefore, has rendered valid service with the Fhilippine Constabulary, and has acquired USAFFE status and authority to induct by virtue of his induction by Captain Bernardino Reyes on or about February 26, 1942.

CONCLUSION

On the basis of the foregoing findings the following conclusions have been drawn:

- The 1st Masbate Company and the office of the Provincial Inspector were stationed in Masbate, Masbate. The 2nd Masbate Company was at Rio Guinobatan, Aroroy, Masbate.
 - The following were officers of the Masbate PC units:
 Major Eustaquio A. Abay Frovincial Inspector of Masbate;
 Later became OO of the FC Battalion,
 Samar-Lyeto Sector, USAFFS.

lst Lt Hilarion S. Ayalin - OC of the lst Masbate Company; designated CO of the Masbate Company (fused lst & 2nd Masbate Companies); and later assed S-lı, 2nd Battalion, Levte Frovisional Regiment, USAFPE.

Captain Bernardino Reyes - CO of the 2nd Masbate Company; later assigned Sector Hq Commandant and CO, MF Company, Samar-Leyte Sector, USAFFE.

Captain Venusto F. Donato - Last CO of the Masbate Company, Prior to this assignment he was Asst Frovincial Inspector of Leyte

- 3. Upon invasion and occupation of Masbate, Masbate by Japanese Forces on or about January 7, 1942, the 1st Masbate Company and Office of the Provincial Inspector withdrew to barrio Tugbo, Masbate, Masbate. Japanese invasion and occupation of Masbate were effected without opposition from Philippine Constabulary units.
- h. On or about the 2nd week of February 1942 Major Eustaquio
 Abay ordered Captain Bernardino Reyes to proceed to Leyte to appraise
 the authorities thereat of the situation obtaining in Masbate and to
 secure funds for the maintenance of the Philippine Constabulary units.
 Captain Reyes arrived in Leyte and was inducted into the USAFFE by
 Colonel Cornell on February 18, 1942. Captain Reyes was directed to
 return to Masbate with orders for the transfer of Philippine Constabulary
 units on Masbate to Leyte.
- 5. The units on Masbate were transferred to Leyte on or about February 27, 1942. The transfer was effected by members of the 2nd Leyte Company, FC under the supervision of Lt Blas E. Miranda on board the patrol boat "RADIO".
 - 6. The 1st and 2nd Masbate Companies were fused into one unit--

the Masbate Company -- upon arrival in Leyte, and together with the 1st, 2nd and 3rd Leyte Companies, became a component of the Fhilippine Constabulary Battalion, Samar-Leyte Sector, USAFFE, attached to the Leyte Provisional Regiment.

- Major Eustaquio A. Abay was assigned Commanding Officer of the Fhilippine Constabulary Battalion, Samar-Leyte Sector, USAFFE subsequent to arrival in Leyte.
- 8. The Masbate Company, PC was last stationed in barrio Fatag, Burauen, Leyte under Captain Venusto F. Donato where order to surrender was received. Except for a few who surrendered, the majority of its members went into hiding, alleging that the unit was disbanded by Captain Donato.
- 9. It has been determined that the alleged automatic induction into the USAFFE of Philippine Constabulary personnel on December 17, 1941 or on any other dates by virtue of Office Memorandum No. 233 dated October 6, 1945 does not constitute valid USAFFE induction. Automatic induction therefore, cannot be the basis of USAFFE status for members of the PC units on Masbate, particularly one Cpl Domingo Peruelo who allegedly died of pnuemonia on Pebruary 15, 1942 at Dimasslanc. Masbate.
- 10. Members of the Masbate Philippine Constabulary units may be accorded positive USAFFE status by virtue of the inductions by Captain Bernardino Reyes or Lt Hilarion S. Ayalin, if evidence acceptable under Section III, Veterans Branch Adjudication Policy, as ammended by Section I, Branch Memorandum No. 3, dated February 3, 1950, is presented.



ARCHIVES RESEARCH

A thorough check of available archives on the Masbate FC units has been made at Records Branch and at Project "J" Section. This revealed that:

- 1. There are no historical records pertaining to the units.
- 2. A majority of members of the Masbate PC units appear listed in Ceneral and Special Orders dated prior to December 8, 1941.
- 3. The "Alphabetical Casualty Listings of Officers and Enlisted Personnel who were in the Philippine Island area as of 7 December 1941" shows the following:
 - a. Cornell, Theodore M., It Col, Infantry
 ASN: 07279, Headquarters, Philippine Department
 Prisoner of War

Colonel Cornell allegedly inducted Captain Bernardino Reyes into the USAFFE at Tacloban, Leyte on February 18, 1942.

b. Ayalin, Hilarion, Cpl, QMC ASN: 6739200; Organization: Headquarters & Headquarters Company, 12th QM Regiment, FS

It Hilarion S. Ayalin was the company commander of the 1st Masbate Company. He was discharged from the Philippine Scouts on November 27, 1941 to accept a commission in the Philippine Constabulary.

- h. Notes on the "Leyte Provisional Regiment" (Reference to the 9hth Infantry Regiment, extracted from Historical Div. Acc. No. P-33 of the "GUERHILLA RESISTANCE MOVEMENT IN LEYTE") cites briefly the organization of the USAFFE force in Leyte.
 - There are no other records which would be of value in the preparation of this history.

We, JOSE ALGANTARA and MARCOS A. CARDING of legal ages, and both citizen of the Commonwealth of the Philippines, with residence and postal address at Masbate, Masbate, after being duly sworn to in accordance with law, depose and say:

That we know personally Corporal DOMINGO PERUEIO, P.C., long time ago; and that we belong to same company, lst Masbate Company, P.C., stationed at Masbate, Masbate;

That he served as a Corporal in the Philippine Constabulary together with us until the war broke out;

That when Japanese Forces have landed in Masbate, Masbate, on or about January 7, 1942. All the members of the Fhilippine Constabulary, 1st Masbate Company, under the Command of Major Abay and Lt. Hilarien S. Ayalin, CO., had evacuated from the town to the barrie of Tugbo, Masbate.

That after several days and months stay in the evacuation place, Opl. DOMINGO PERUZIO, P.O., got sick and could hardly render efficient service anymore. In view of which, the Commanding Officer, sent him home to contact with his femilies at Nabaffeig, Dimaselang, Masbate.

That in his stay in Nabaffgig, Dimasalang, Masbate, while he was sick, he was not able to recover his sickness and died on February 15, 1942.

I, EUSTAQUIO A. ABAY, Major, Infantry, PA, married and of legal

age, after having been duly sworn to in accordance to law depose and say:

That I know MAJOR BERNARDINO REYES, then Captain, as CO of the 2D Masbate Co., P.C.;

That about the second week of February 19/2, when Masbate province was subjected by the Japanese forces and inamuch as there was no more funds to support and maintain the two (2) Philippine Constabulary companies in Masbate, I directed Major Reyes to proceed to Leyte by sailboat or by any other mans and report our cândition in the island and to request for instructions from higher authorities especially for funds for the maintenance of the forces thereat;

That Major Reyes arrived in Leyte or or about 17 February 1942 and was inducted into the USAFFE by Colonel T. W. Cornell, Sector Commander, USAFFE, Samar-Leyte Sector on February 18, 1942;

That Major Rayse was instructed by Colonel Cornell in compliance with the telegraph of instructions of General SHARP, the Commanding General, USAFF, Visayas-Mindanao Zone, to return to Mashate province in order to get all the arms and ammunition and effect the transfer of all officers and enlisted men of the Philippine Constabulary and Philippine Army from Mashate to Leyte. That this mission was fully complied with and all the members of the P.C. Mashate companies with all their arms and ammunitions were brought to Leyte.

That I was the Frovincial Inspector of the Philippine Constabulary at Masbate, Masbate, P. I. when 1st Lt. Hilarion S Ayalin was assigned Commanding Officer of the First Masbate Company (PC) on 3 December 1941;

That on the 27th day of February 1942, per Radiographic Instructions from the Commanding Beneral, Visayas, Mindanao Forces, USAFFE, the whole constabulary Units of Masbate were transferred to Leyte:

The First and Second Masbate Companies (PC) were put under the command of Lt Hilarion S. Ayalin;

That on or about the first week of April 1942 the two Masbate Companies (FC) were stationed at Eaybay, Deyte and Lt Hilarion S. Ayalin was relieved Commanding Officer of said Companies by Capt V Donato;

That after 1st Lt Hilarion S. Awalin, PC was relieved he was assigned as Supply Officer of the 2d Battalion, Leyte Provisional Regt up to the surrender to the enemy on 26 May 1942.

That I was the Commanding Officer of the 1st Leyte Co, PC, from September 1941 to 10 Feb. 42 and 0.0.; 2nd Leyte Co., PC, Ormoc, Leyte, from 11 Feb. 42 to 21 May 42.

That I was the Commanding Officer of the WESTERN LEYTE GUERRILLA WARFARE FORCES from June 1942 to 28 July 1945, with headquarters at Ormoc, Leyte.

That I know 1st Lt. HILARION S. AYALIN, 0-27623, QMS, personally to be the C.O., 1st Masbate O., FC, Masbate, Masbate, from 3 Dec. "11 to 26 Feb. 1942, and C.O., of the same unit when it was transferred to Tacloban, Leyte, until the 1st week of April 1942, when he was relieved by Capt. V. Donato, Inf. FC. This transfer was effected by the Patrol Boat RADIO from Masbate to Tacloban, Leyte, under my supervision. The movement was in compliance with the radiographic instructions from the Commanding General, Visayan-Mindanao Forces, USAFE.

That 1st Lt. H. S. Ayalin, 0-27623, QMS, was inducted into the USAFFE on 26 Feb. 42 at Masbate, Masbate by Capt. B. Reyes, Inf. PC.

That 1st Lt. H. S. Ayalin, was assigned Supply Officer, 2nd Bn, LPR, at Ormoc, Leyte on or about the first week of April 1942.

That I have personal knowledge of the fact that he was last paid to include 15 May 1942 at Ormoc, Leyte.

That 1st Lt HILARION S. AYALIN, 0-27623, QWS, served under my command at Ormoc, Leyte, as Intelligence Officer, GHQ, WESTERN LEYTE GUERRILLA WARFARE FORCES, from 1st May '43 to 28 April '45.5

That during the entire period of his service with the WLGWF, I have found him to be loyal, honest and trustworthy. His intelligence reports regarding enemy movements and military installations were accurate and proved useful and helpful in our plan of operations against the enemies at Ormoc, Leyte.

That in the performance of his duties, many times he risked his life regardless of the cost provided it was in the interest of the service. Then he was assigned to Negros and Iloilo to contact the guerrilla forces thereat and to gather intelligence informations, he underwant several hardships, crossing Japanese infested territories in order to accomplish his mission. Due to the heavy Japa reinforcements in ETTS and the surrounding islands, he was not able to return to his unit immediately. All sea lanes were then guarded by patrol boats and submarines.

That 1st Lt. H. S. Ayalin, was not paid any salary or allowances for the entire period of his guerrilla service.

That through clerical error, the name of 1st Lt. HILARION S. AYALIN 0-27623, QMS, was not included in the roster submitted to AFPAC.

- I, Major URBANO C. FRANCISCO, 0-21500, Inf, of legal age, married and presently assigned as Zone S-3, VZ HQ MPC (AFP), Gebu City on oath hereby declare the following:
- (a) That I know Capt. Sergio G. Nuique, Inf before the Second World War get as Traffic Officer of the 18th Traffic District, comprising the provinces of Leyte, Samar and Masbate with his Headquarters at Tacloban. Leyte.
- (b) That on March 1942, he became the Executive Officer of the Constabulary Battalion, comprising the four Constabulary companies stationed in Layte Frovince distributed as following; 1st Leyte Go. PC-Taclobam; 2nd Leyte Go. PC-Ormoc; Masbate Go. PC-Baybay and 3rd Leyte Co. PC-Malthbox.
- (c) That on 19 May 1912, Capt Sergio G. Nuique went to Malitbog, Leyte with instruction from Col. Theodore M. Cornell, Sector Commander, Leyte-Samar Sector, that we of the Third Leyte Company, Philippine Constabulary (I was then Junior Officer of this Company) must occupy immediately interfor possession, fortify it and fight any invader.
- (d) That at noon of same day (19 May 1942) he received telegram from our Battalion Commander, now Lt. Col. Eustaquio Abay ordering him to return to Tacloban to attend the important conference called by Col. Theodore M. Cornell, USAFFE, our Sector Commander.
- (e) That on 2h May 19h2 (Sunday) Capt. Sergio G. Nuique returned to Malithog, Layte and after both officers and men of the 3rd Layte Company, PC were assembled, he informed us that our Sector Commander, Col. Theodore M. Gornell, decided to surrender.
- (f) That I know Capt. Sergio G. Nuique did not surrender for in his lacture to our Company at about 9:30 AM, 2L May 1942, his advice to our command was not to surrender, but lay off, keeping all our arms until better times.
- (g) That his Guerrilla Unit was responsible in three major encounters from 28 May 19/2 to Dec. 19/2 against the Japanese, Japs Spies and suppression of benditry and also this was the Guerrilla responsible for the kidnapping during the latter part of 19/12, of Col. R. R. Kangleon who was then on the concentration camp at Butuan Agusan.

(1) That when Col. Kangleon took command of all Guerrilla Units in southern Leyte (including that of Capt. Nuique's and mine) Capt. Nuique occupied various assignments as Commanding Officer "B" Co. Executive Officer, yith inf Regt and also in Operation and Intelligence Work and he was in the latter capacity when the American or Liberation Forces landed at Tacloban, Leyte on 20 October 19his.
