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Col. Perry Combs was an indefatigable

40 megacycles - normal transmitter spec.

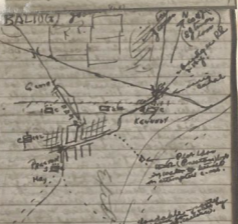

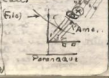
