The above rigures of paragraph 2 are based on a self alliested allowance for Bilibid of 50% of the total Red Gross supply, which is a much more ligaral allowance than the Japanese have conseded to us in previous allowance of drugs to the various camps.
- 5. This limitation of therapy is not imposed by choice but by necessity, and is based on the known supply and clinical demand, and represents our best judgement as to the best manner in which to serve the greatest number.

Report on gause and other dressing materials used in 1943.

- 1. Attached and forwarded herewith is the requested report on gauze expendeture for 1943.
- 2. (a) Table one deals exclusively with roll gause.
 It will be noted that there was a constantly decreasing expenditure / during the year.
- (b) In the first quarter of the year, gauze reclamation was not carried out. This procedure was begun April 1st. At first a bleach formula was used but it was soon learned that a more effectant reclamation could be carried out by the use of soap and water alone, followed by sun bleaching and resterilization. This is an experience commonly met.
- (c) The maximum reclamation is carried out by the operating room and the surgical wards. This occurs for several reasons. Firstly, because they use the maximum amount of all expended rell gause, and secondly, because that department is issued the type of gause which is most amenable to reclamation.
- (d) It is to be remembered that the percentage of reclaimed games as shown in this table does not reflect the full extent of saving, in that, this gause is not only reclaimed once but several times.
 - (2%2) It is impractical to attempt reclamation. Also, a small amount, as used in the outpatient department does not return to the clinic. Also there is a coarser type of gauze which does not telerate reclamation either chemically or by soap and water.

- (b) The gause bandages referred to in this table are not washed but are used over and over. Gause bandages used in making plaster casts are, of course, unavailable for reclamation.

(d) The gause pads are made of a coarser weave of gause and therefore decompose under any method of reclamation. However this type of dressing is more often used in very dirty cases and are usually too saturated and contaminated to permit further use. A certain number of these also find use as compresses and as such, serve repeatedly as mentioned in reference to the cotton.

(e) The absorbent cotton noted in the table is used mostly as compresses and as such are used over extended periods of days. The increase in the use of cotton as shown in table two is incident to the fact that it took more rolls of cotton to meet the demands because three-hundred (300) rolls of cotton were infested with termites and two hundred and seventy-six (276) of these rolls were salvaged by disinfection but the rolls were not full rolls, an appreciable yardage having been already destroyed by the termites.

Subject:

Squad Arangements.

- 1. The following method of squad arrangements is recommended:
- (a) The occupants of each building shall be organized into squads of approximately ten (10) persons, with an officer or non-commissioned officer, designated by the Officer in Charge of the building, as squad leaders.
- (b) The leader of the squads of patients in the mental ward (No. 17) shall be the Senior Hospital Corpsman on duty.
- (c) Each squad leader shall be responsible to the Officer in Charge of the Building for the conduct of his squad and shall make such reports of muster as may be required by him.
- (d) The membership of each squad will be posted on the bulletin board of each building. All changes shall be reported promptly and appropriate entries made in the posted roster of squads. The offices of the Senior Medical Officer and the Warden shall have, at all times, a roster of the membership of every squad.
- 2. The above method of arranging squads is recommended for the following reasons:
- (a) A squad of approximately ten (10) persons, either well or sick, is considered more satisfactory than squads of ten (10) and twenty (20) persons respectively, because it is impracticable to domicile these groups separately. Hospital wards almost continously have a small number of persons from the well group in "refrain from work" status, but insufficient in number to make a full squad of twenty (20) persons.
- (b) By the designation of squad leaders from personnel who actually live in the same building as the squad, it is possible to affix more definitely the respondbilies of the squad leaders. It is necessary frequently to change the assignment of hospital corpsmen, both with regards stations and hours of duty. It is also desirable to continue their quartering in buildings apart from the patient wards. These features have been found, by past experience, to lessen the desirability of hospital corpsmen as squad leaders for squads composed of patients.







MEMORANDUM TO OFFICERS IN CHARGE OF BUILDINGS:

Subject: Squad Leaders.

- 1. Addressees are requested to select and to report to this office today, the names of responsible officers and/or non-commissioned officers to replace hospital corponen now assigned as squad leaders in all buildings except locked ward and the hospital corps quarters.
- 2. In locked ward, hereafter, the senior hospital corposan present, will be considered the leader of the squads in that ward. Corrently assigned permanent squad leaders in this ward are hereby relieved.
- In general, the squad leader should be the senior member of the squad, due consideration being given to state of health, temperament, and character. A squad leader must not be transferred without appropriately reported relief.
- 4. Squad leaders should be required to assume, very definitely, the leadership of the squad. A minimum requirement of the squad leader should include the mustering and reporting of his squad to the officer in charge of the building or his representative. He should know at all times who is in his squad. He may be employed in the dissemination and collection of information as may be required, and in other functions as may be determined by his building officer.

(3) In duty column, the same as in admissions (No. 1 above) with notation if patient dies or is AWOL. Deaths and AWOL's will be entered same day fact occurs. (4) Patients transferred to other wards, same as no. 2 above. (5) In the event these instructions cannot be carried out a full explanation of the circumstances will be entered on reverse side of report and be signed by nurse preparing same. (6) An effort by persons preparing reports to submit reports which are as legible as possible. (7) Beds in wards are designed primarily for use of patients, therefore "Total Bed Capacity" is the number of such beds, regardless of whether beds are being occupied by patients or other personnel. To: The Senior Medical Officer,
The Bilibid Hospital, for Military Prison Camps of P.I.

I. General Scope of Activities.

A. During the period of this report, two supplementary diets and three substitutive diets were fed.

1. Supplementary diets.

a. Diet Number One.

This diet, consisting of sweetened milk, fruits, soups, puddings, cakes, etc., was fed to a restricted number of extremely ill patients. The grain ration for these patients was served them in three meals per day by this kitchen.

b. Diet Number Two.

This diet for the period November 1 - 20, inclusive, consisted of soup, fruits, etc., differing only from Diet Number One in that no milk was served. Because of an inadequate supply of fruits and vegetables this diet was discontinued on November 20, 1944.

c. Supplementary Milk Diet.

This diet consisting of sweetened milk only was instituted on November 21, 1944 to replace Diet Number Two.

2. Substitutive Diets.


a. Lugao three times per day was fed to patients unable to utilize corn in their diet.

b. Plain lugao was once per day was fed to patients unable to masticate coconut-lugao.

c. Frotein replacements for fish were fed to patients allergic to fish proteins.

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GAS DISCIPLINE

(1) For the individual soldier, good gas discipline A. Definition means that he has a proper respect for the efficiency of gas, but no unreasonable fear of it; that knowing the value of his protective equipment, he takes care of it; that, upon detection of gas or sounding the alarm, he properly adjusts his mask and warns others.

(2) Collectively, good gas discipline implies maintenance of morale under gas conditions; that there is no panic, but, on the contrary, orderly and prompt execution of the

prescribed protective procedure.

B. Psychological Reaction

Psychology plays an important part in gas discipline. Most men are filled with fear before they come in contact with a chemical agent. It should be remembered that the Army gas mask properly used, gives 100% protection for the eyes and lungs, and the protective clothing the same against the vapors of Mustard gas.

RULES TO BE REMEMBERED

(1) Do not carry anything in your gas mask carrier but the mask

(2) Do not neglect the gas mask or allow it to re-

ceive rough handling.

- (5) Do not breathe after the gas alarm is given until you are sure that your mask is well adjusted to your face and that the facepiece has been cleared of gas by bloeing vigorously into the facepiece while holding that rubber
- (4) Do not remove your gas mask until permission to outlet valve. remove it is given by an officer or gas noncommissioned officer.

(5) Do not talk or move about unnocessarily during



PRINCIPAL CHEMICAL AGENTS

A Definitions

(1) A "chemical agent" is a substance useful in war which, after release and acting directly through its chemical properties, is capable of producing a toxic effect, a powerful irritant effect, a screening smoke, or an incendiary action.

(2) A "persistent agent" is one which will maintain an effective vapor concentration in the air at point of release for more than ten minutes. Some persistents last for days

end even weeks. .

(3) A "nonpersistent agent" is one whose effectivener in the Lir at point of release is dissipated within ten minutes.

(4) A "casualty agent" is a material of such characteristics that a dangerous or killing concentration can be set up.

(5) A "harassing agent" is one used to force masking

and thus slow up enemy operations.

(6) An "incendiary" is s chemical agent used primarily for setting fire to materiel. It may produce casualties due to heat burns.

(7) L 'lung irritant" is an agent which, when breathed causes irritation and inflammation of the interior of the

bronchial tubes and lungs.

(8) A "vesicant" is a chemical agent which is readily absorbed or dissolved in both the exterior and interior parts of the body, followed by the production of inflammation, burns, and destruction of tissue.

(9) A "lacrimator" is an agent which causes a copious

flow of tears and intense, though temporary, eye pains.

(10) An "irritent smoke" is an ggent which causes intole erable sneezing, coughing, lacrimation, or headsche followed by neuses and temporary physical disability.

(11) A "sternutator" is an irritant smoke.


(12) A "screening smoke" is in agent used to blind hostile obervation.

(4) First Lid--Wash with water and soap, then with 55 5% aqueous solution of caustic soda followed by alcohol. Keep warm and quiet. Treatment must be given immediately. Evac-

(b) Effects on Body--Piercing, irritation of eyes causing profuse tears.

b. Tar Gas Solution (CNS)

(1) Odor--Like fly paper

(2) Color--Colorless liquid, changing to colorless

(3) Effects on Body--Piercing irritation to eyes, profuse tears, followed by neases and vomiting.

(4) First sid--Sime is for Lung irritant ciscs

(5) How Used -- For heressing effect

4. SCREENING SMOKES

¿. White Phosphorus (WP)

(1) Odor--Like phosphorus metches

(2)-Color--Dispersed as solid which rapidly changes to flame and white smoke on contact with wir air.

(3) Effects on Body--Smoke, none; particles produce severe fire burns which heal very slowly

- (4) First Aid--Apply copper sulphets solution (CUSO4)
 (2 to 5%). This coets the particles with
 copper with effectively prevents oxidation.
 Pull out solid particles and treat as ordinary burn. Keep burning particles under
 water until medical attention arrives if
 no CUSO4 is available.
- (5) How Used -- Screening smoke and inconding.

PROTECTIVE ME.SURES ---- Protective measures will differ slightly depending upon the physiological type of gas encountered.

(1) In the case of lung irritent gas, like phosgene, the proper measures are to stop breathing until the gas mask is correctly adjusted and to continue wearing the mask

until the ges concentration has dissipated,

(2) For the vesicent gases, the protective measures include not only the proper wearing of protective clothing. It must be remembered that persistent vesicents such as Musterd gas and Lewisite in the vapor state will affect the eyes and skin and will injure lung tissue. In the liquid state these gases may be absorbed directly on the clothing and thence transferred to the skin. If clothing and equipment become contaminated, they also include the prompt removal of such articles, the thorough cleansing of the body with soap and water, and the decontamination of the infected articles before they are used again.

We also require lime for sanitary purposes and will appreciate it if an adequate amount of this material may be issued for use about the hospital.

PEDICULUS VESTIMENTI, Diagnosis and treatment of.

- All medical officers on all services will make weekly examinations of their patients to expedite the detection and eradication of pediculus vestimenti.
- 2. Each ward medical officer will submit weekly the report of such inspections to their respective Chief of Service, on or before 1200, Fridays. This report will include the following information: Name and rate of each infested patient; treatment administered, both personal and also general sanitary measures.
- 3. The following excerpts from: "The Diagnostics and Treatment of Tropical Diseases", by Rear Admiral E.R. Stitt, M.C., U.S.N., are considered pertinent. Especial attention is directed to the indicated measures for the detection of this type of infestation:

"Pediculus vestimenti, is the species concerned in the transmission of Indian and North African relapsing fevers as well as typhus fever While the head lice live among the hairs of the head and show their presence chiefly by the appearance of their pear-shaped eggs (nits) projecting from the heir shaft, the body lice ATTACH THEMSELVES TO THE UNDER SURFACE OF THE CARMENTS WORN NEXT THE SKIN, and holding fast to the undershirt, feed about twice daily ... THEY ARE RARELY FOUND ON THE SKIN. Lice will leave their host only when he has fever or when he dies but they may drop off a host or be brushed off."

4. The following excerpts concerning the treatment are from the same volume:

"1. The hair of the body and head should be clipped.

w2. The subject should be bathed, there being used freely kerosene-emulsion sosp, prepared by boiling one part of sosp in four parts of water, and then adding two parts of kerosene oil. The resultant jelly, when mixed with four parts of water makes a liquid sosp that is convenient to use and which may be applied effectively.

"3. Following the bath, the body may be annointed with kerosene, special care being devoted to the hairy parts. Skin irritation

may, however, require early removal of the oil.

- 1. The following information is quoted, regarding sulphaquanidine:
- of sulfaquanidine for the treatment of acute gastro-intestinal infections and later (1941) reported marked improvement in the majority of cases of acute bacillary dysentery treated with this drug.
- 2. Marshall's findings in the treatment of acute bacillary dysentery with sulfaquanidine have been confirmed in the United States and the Middle East.
- a pre and post-operative treatment for the control of infection associated with surgical operations on the bowel, but the results obtained do not war-rant its use for this purpose.
- 4. In view of the above and of possible difficulties in obtaining adequate supplies of the drug, it is recommended that sulfaquanidine be used only for the treatment of cases of bacillary dysentery.
- 5. The following schedule of dosage in bacillary dysentery is recommended:-

Acute Bacillary Dysentery - An initial dose of 6 grams followed by a dose of 3.5 grams every four hours, day and night until number of stools per day is reduced to five or less and then a dose of 3.5 grams every eight hours day and night until stools have been normal for 96 hours. If no improvement occurs after 96 hours of treatment with sulfaquanidine, stop the drug.

Chronic Bacillary Dysentery - Dosage: Three and one-half grams of sulfaquanidine every eight hours day and night until stools are normal for 96 hours. If no improvement occurs within seven (7) days of treatment, discontinue the drug."




I call your stantion to the following facts.
When this incident exposed by the military police, our men were summoned to their headquarters for questioning, and not only they met a bitter questioning, some of them were kept in custody for a week, that caused us humiliation and impairment of our reputation.

I urge you that all personnel intermed here to live up to the rigid discipline, morals and regulation of the military prison camp and pay careful attention to a fair distribution and an adequate handling of such relief goods which we consider as the government owned articles.





ORDERS FOR NURSES

- 1. Murses shall remain in their quarters and the grounds reserved for them, except going to and from the performance of assigned duty.
- 2. They shall remain inside their quarters from 8:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.
- 3. We men shall enter the nurses quarters except those designated by Captain Kusamoto, and the two men designated by the Senior Medical Officer to carry food to them.
- 4. The Chief Murse shall establish a rotating inside watch of two nurses to keep watch from 8:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.
- 5. Murses requiring medical treatment will be escorted to the Dispensary if able to be up and about at 3:00 p.m. and such times as may be directed by the Medical Officer. Murses too sick to go to the Dispensary will be visited by Dr. Erickson upon a call from the Chief Murse.
- 6. Nurses shall perform whatever progessional work may be assigned by the Senior Medical Officer.

Distribution of Food.

- 1. In accordance with instructions by the Japanese, the rice allowance per man, per day is as follows: Heavy sick, 400 grams; light sick 450 grams; well men 500 grams.
- (a) The allowance of vegetables per day is as follows: heavy sick 300 grams; light sick 400 grams; well men 300.
- (b) The allowance of meat per day for heavy sick is 150 grams; light sick and well men 100 grams.
- (c) Ward Medical Officers shall take steps to apportion the rice ration and other foods in accordance with instructions as far as possible.
- 2. Instructions have been issued by the Japanese that all unconsumed rice shall be reported by each ward for every meal every day.
- 3. After each meal any rice left over on plates or in rice containers shall be placed in a tin container and returned to the galley.
- 4. The report will be made by the galley after the unconsumed rice has been returned.
