SUBJECT: Epidemic of Vincent's Angina.

1. It is requested that the below information be disseminated to the men in your building at evening tenk this date and A.M. tenk in the morning:-

" It has been noted that an epidemic of Vincent's Angina (Trench Mouth) is present in this Camp.

It is recommended to the inhabitants of this Camp that they be extremely careful of washing mess gear properly; not to borrow or use mess gear belonging to others; not to pick up discarded cigarette butts from the ground, nor to smoke cigarettes or pipes from any other person. "

SUBJECT: Shell Fragments and Shutters on Windows.

To : Officers in Charge of Buildings.

1. Shell fragments, pieces of shrapnel, bullets, etc. which fall within the compound will be turned in at the Japanese guardhouse immediately after being picked up, or as soon as practicable thereafter.

2. During air raids, the lower and middle shutters on windows of buildings in the lower compound will be closed immediately upon the sounding of "Air Raid." Upper shutters will be closed when the Japanese sentries direct that they be closed. In the upper compound, the windows must be closed at all times during "Air Raid."

Re: Vitamin Preparations (Continued).

3. For general information, the vitamin preparations not in immediate jeopardy are:

- (a) Ascorbic acid, 25 mgm dosage.
- (b) Multiple vitamins.
- (c) Thiamin oral preparations.
- (d) Vitamin A & D concentrate.

4. Bilibid has used a great preponderance of the expended vitamin preparations during this period of observation, as compared to other camps deriving their supplies from the 1943 Red Cross stock. The above figures of paragraph 2 are based on a self-allotted allowance for Bilibid of 50% of the total Red Cross supply, which is a much more liberal allowance than the Japanese have conceded to us in previous allotments of drugs to the various camps.

5. This limitation of therapy is not imposed by choice but by necessity, and is based on the known supply and clinical demand, and represents our best judgement as to the best manner in which to serve the greatest number.

REPORT OF EXAMINATION IN THE CASE OF:

F.C. ELLSWORTH, CIVILIAN.

This patient has a sacro-iliac arthritis, unilateral, right side, hypertrophic type. There is no change in his condition since last examined by us except that his general condition has improved.

(2) Codeine sulphate: All tablets, solutions of hypodermic use; and solutions which contain gr. 1/4 or more per dram.  
(3) Paregoric.

(b) Barbiturates:

- (1) Sodium amytal: Capsules.  
(2) Sodium pentobarbital: Capsules.  
(3) Phenobarbital: Tablets and elixir solution.

(c) Sulfa drugs:

- (1) Sulfanilamide: Tablets.  
(2) Sulfadiazine: Tablets.  
(3) Sulfaguanidine: Tablets.  
(4) Sulfapyridine: Tablets.  
(5) Sulfathiazole: Tablets.

(d) Vitamin products:

- (1) Ascorbic acid: Tablets and ampules.  
(2) A-D Concentrate: Capsules.  
(3) Nicotinic Acid: Tablets.  
(4) Riboflavin: Tablets.  
(5) Thiamin Chloride: Tablets and solution.

(e) Miscellaneous:

REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED IN BILIBID AGAINST AIR RAIDS (PRACTICE)

1. Alert Period ( Partial black out at night)

Alarm will be given verbally.

All the lights have to be covered so that no direct light will go out of the building.

No person shall go out of the building except those who are;

- (a) Guards on duty.
- (b) Staff and office personnel who have urgent business with the Japanese.
- (c) Medical officers in charge of wards either going to their wards, or back to their quarters.
- (d) Users of outside latrines.

2. Air Raid Period. (Complete black out at night)

Alarm will be given by Guard House bell. Three times three gongs at few second intervals as follows XXX XXX XXX.

All clear signal will be made by five gongs at few second intervals.

During the air raid period no person shall go out of his quarters.

MEMORANDUM TO CAPTAIN N. NOGI, IMPERIAL JAPANESE ARMY:

Subject: Report on gauze and other dressing materials used in 1943.

1. Attached and forwarded herewith is the requested report on gauze expenditure for 1943.

2. (a) Table one deals exclusively with roll gauze. It will be noted that there was a constantly decreasing expenditure during the year.

(b) In the first quarter of the year, gauze reclamation was not carried out. This procedure was begun April 1st. At first a bleach formula was used but it was soon learned that a more efficient reclamation could be carried out by the use of soap and water alone, followed by sun bleaching and reesterilization. This is an experience commonly met.

(c) The maximum reclamation is carried out by the operating room and the surgical wards. This occurs for several reasons. Firstly, because they use the maximum amount of all expended roll gauze, and secondly, because that department is issued the type of gauze which is most amenable to reclamation.

(d) It is to be remembered that the percentage of reclaimed gauze as shown in this table does not reflect the full extent of saving, in that, this gauze is not only reclaimed once but several times.

(e) Where gauze is used in such small dressings (2x2) it is impractical to attempt reclamation. Also, a small amount, as used in the outpatient department does not return to the clinic. Also there is a coarser type of gauze which does not tolerate reclamation either chemically or by soap and water.

3. (a) Table two is concerned with other dressing materials.

(b) The gauze bandages referred to in this table are not washed but are used over and over. Gauze bandages used in making plaster casts are, of course, unavailable for reclamation.

(c) The muslin bandage is washed and used repeatedly until worn out.

(d) The gauze pads are made of a coarser weave of gauze and therefore decompose under any method of reclamation. However this type of dressing is more often used in very dirty cases and are usually too saturated and contaminated to permit further use. A certain number of these also find use as compresses and as such, serve repeatedly as mentioned in reference to the cotton.

(e) The absorbent cotton noted in the table is used mostly as compresses and as such are used over extended periods of days. The increase in the use of cotton as shown in table two is incident to the fact that it took more rolls of cotton to meet the demands because three-hundred (300) rolls of cotton were infested with termites and two hundred and seventy-six (276) of these rolls were salvaged by disinfection but the rolls were not full rolls, an appreciable yardage having been already destroyed by the termites.

MEMORANDUM TO CAPTAIN N. NOGI, IMPERIAL JAPANESE ARMY:

Subject: Squad Arrangements.

1. The following method of squad arrangements is recommended:

(a) The occupants of each building shall be organized into squads of approximately ten (10) persons, with an officer or non-commissioned officer, designated by the Officer in Charge of the building, as squad leaders.

(b) The leader of the squads of patients in the mental ward (No. 17) shall be the Senior Hospital Corpsman on duty.

(c) Each squad leader shall be responsible to the Officer in Charge of the Building for the conduct of his squad and shall make such reports of muster as may be required by him.

(d) The membership of each squad will be posted on the bulletin board of each building. All changes shall be reported promptly and appropriate entries made in the posted roster of squads. The officers of the Senior Medical Officer and the Warden shall have, at all times, a roster of the membership of every squad.

2. The above method of arranging squads is recommended for the following reasons:

(a) A squad of approximately ten (10) persons, either well or sick, is considered more satisfactory than squads of ten (10) and twenty (20) persons respectively, because it is impracticable to domicile these groups separately. Hospital wards almost continuously have a small number of persons from the well group in "refrain from work" status, but insufficient in number to make a full squad of twenty (20) persons.

(b) By the designation of squad leaders from personnel who actually live in the same building as the squad, it is possible to affix more definitely the responsibilities of the squad leaders. It is necessary frequently to change the assignment of hospital corpsmen, both with regards stations and hours of duty. It is also desirable to continue their quartering in buildings apart from the patient wards. These features have been found, by past experience, to lessen the desirability of hospital corpsmen as squad leaders for squads composed of patients.

MEMORANDUM TO OFFICERS IN CHARGE OF BUILDINGS:

Subject: Squad Leaders.

1. Addressees are requested to select and to report to this office today, the names of responsible officers and/or non-commissioned officers to replace hospital corporamen now assigned as squad leaders in all buildings except locked ward and the hospital corps quarters.
2. In locked ward, hereafter, the senior hospital corporaman present, will be considered the leader of the squads in that ward. Currently assigned permanent squad leaders in this ward are hereby relieved.
3. In general, the squad leader should be the senior member of the squad, due consideration being given to state of health, temperament, and character. A squad leader must not be transferred without appropriately reported relief.
4. Squad leaders should be required to assume, very definitely, the leadership of the squad. A minimum requirement of the squad leader should include the mustering and reporting of his squad to the officer in charge of the building or his representative. He should know at all times who is in his squad. He may be employed in the dissemination and collection of information as may be required, and in other functions as may be determined by his building officer.

MEMORANDUM TO: All Concerned.

1. The following instructions for preparation of the Ward Morning Reports are published for the guidance of all concerned:

a. Names appearing on Ward Morning Reports have to be checked against Receiving Office records; therefore, a name such as "Smith" only is confusing when it is considered that an average of 100 names appear on the combined ward reports. It is the desire of the Surgeon that these reports be as accurate as conditions permit. It is suggested that:

(1) Full name, rank, and organization of patient be shown in admission column.

(2) In case of patients received by transfer from other wards, the full name only should be shown, and be grouped by wards.

(3) In duty column, the same as in admissions (No. 1 above) with notation if patient dies or is AWOL. Deaths and AWOL's will be entered same day fact occurs.

(4) Patients transferred to other wards, same as no. 2 above.

(5) In the event these instructions cannot be carried out a full explanation of the circumstances will be entered on reverse side of report and be signed by nurse preparing same.

(6) An effort by persons preparing reports to submit reports which are as legible as possible.

(7) Beds in wards are designed primarily for use of patients, therefore "Total Bed Capacity" is the number of such beds, regardless of whether beds are being occupied by patients or other personnel.

This diet, consisting of sweetened milk, fruits, soups, puddings, cakes, etc., was fed to a restricted number of extremely ill patients. The grain ration for these patients was served them in three meals per day by this kitchen.

b. Diet Number Two.

This diet for the period November 1 - 20, inclusive, consisted of soup, fruits, etc., differing only from Diet Number One in that no milk was served. Because of an inadequate supply of fruits and vegetables this diet was discontinued on November 20, 1944.

c. Supplementary Milk Diet.

This diet consisting of sweetened milk only was instituted on November 21, 1944 to replace Diet Number Two.

2. Substitutive Diets.

a. Lugao three times per day was fed to patients unable to utilize corn in their diet.

b. Plain lugao ~~was~~ once per day was fed to patients unable to masticate coconut-lugao.

c. Protein replacements for fish were fed to patients allergic to fish proteins.

## GAS DISCIPLINE

### A. Definition

(1) For the individual soldier, good gas discipline means that he has a proper respect for the efficiency of gas, but no unreasonable fear of it; that knowing the value of his protective equipment, he takes care of it; that, upon detection of gas or sounding the alarm, he properly adjusts his mask and warns others.

(2) Collectively, good gas discipline implies maintenance of morale under gas conditions; that there is no panic, but, on the contrary, orderly and prompt execution of the prescribed protective procedure.

### B. Psychological Reaction

Psychology plays an important part in gas discipline. Most men are filled with fear before they come in contact with a chemical agent. It should be remembered that the Army gas mask properly used, gives 100% protection for the eyes and lungs, and the protective clothing the same against the vapors of Mustard gas.

## RULES TO BE REMEMBERED

(1) Do not carry anything in your gas mask carrier but the mask

(2) Do not neglect the gas mask or allow it to receive rough handling.

(3) Do not breathe after the gas alarm is given until you are sure that your mask is well adjusted to your face and that the facepiece has been cleared of gas by blowing vigorously into the facepiece while holding that rubber outlet valve.

(4) Do not remove your gas mask until permission to remove it is given by an officer or gas noncommissioned officer.

(5) Do not talk or move about unnecessarily during a gas attack.

(6) Do not become panicky; keep calm and remember your protective equipment is effective if properly used.

(7) Do not forget that clothing contaminated with Mustard gas should be removed as soon as possible.

(8) Do not remove another man's clothing that is contaminated with Mustard gas unless you are equipped with protective gloves.

(9) Do not forget that all gas cases require, First, REST; Second, WARMTH; Third, FRESH AIR.

(10) Do not permit men who are casualties from inhaling gas, to walk, talk, or move about

## PRINCIPAL CHEMICAL AGENTS

### A Definitions

(1) A "chemical agent" is a substance useful in war which, after release and acting directly through its chemical properties, is capable of producing a toxic effect, a powerful irritant effect, a screening smoke, or an incendiary action.

(2) A "persistent agent" is one which will maintain an effective vapor concentration in the air at point of release for more than ten minutes. Some persistents last for days and even weeks.

(3) A "nonpersistent agent" is one whose effectiveness in the air at point of release is dissipated within ten minutes.

(4) A "casualty agent" is a material of such characteristics that a dangerous or killing concentration can be set up.

(5) A "harassing agent" is one used to force masking and thus slow up enemy operations.

(6) An "incendiary" is a chemical agent used primarily for setting fire to materiel. It may produce casualties due to heat burns.

(7) A "lung irritant" is an agent which, when breathed causes irritation and inflammation of the interior of the bronchial tubes and lungs.

(8) A "vesicant" is a chemical agent which is readily absorbed or dissolved in both the exterior and interior parts of the body, followed by the production of inflammation, burns, and destruction of tissue.

(9) A "lacrimator" is an agent which causes a copious flow of tears and intense, though temporary, eye pains.

(10) An "irritant smoke" is an agent which causes intolerable sneezing, coughing, lacrimation, or headache followed by nausea and temporary physical disability.

(11) A "sternutator" is an irritant smoke.

(12) A "screening smoke" is an agent used to blind hostile observation.

### CLASSIFICATION

(1) Physical state----Chemical agents may be encountered as gases, liquids, or solids.

(2) Physiological effect----Chemical agents affect particular parts of the body in several ways. These are classified as follows:

- a. Lung irritants
- b. Vesicants
- c. Lacrimators
- d. Irritant smokes
- e. Incendiaries

(3) Tactical Use----Chemical agents are classified in accordance with their principal tactical use as--

- a. Casualty agents
- b. Harassing agents
- c. Screening agents
- d. Incendiaries

1. LUNG IRRITANTS

a. CHLORINE (Cl)

- (1) Odor--Disagreeable, Pungent
- (2) Color--Greenish yellow gas
- (3) Effects of Body---Causes choking and coughing, smarting of eyes and discomfort in chest. Two minute exposure causes a casualty.
- (4) First Aid--Keep quiet and warm. Treat for bronchial pneumonia
- (5) How Used--For casualty effects

b. PHOSGENE (CG)

- (1) Odor--Disagreeable, pungent, like new cut hay or
- (2) Color--First white then changes to corn colorless gas.
- (3) Effects on body--Choking, coughing, hurried breathing, pains in chest, a few breaths causes a casualty.
- (4) First Aid--Keep quiet and warm; give heart stimulants; give oxygen in severe cases.
- (5) How Used--For Casualty effects.

2. VESICANTS

a. Lewisite (ML)

- (1) Odor--Like geraniums, then biting
- (2) Color--Dark brown liquid, changing slowly into a colorless gas.
- (3) Effects on Body--Skin shows slight irritation in 15 minutes followed by grayish discoloration and blisters in 30 minutes to 1 hr. Systemic poisoning and vomiting. Powerful lung irritant effects within  $\frac{1}{2}$  hr.
- (4) First Aid--Wash with water and soap, then with 5% aqueous solution of caustic soda followed by alcohol. Keep warm and quiet. Treatment must be given immediately. Evacuate to hospital.
- (5) How Used--For casualty effect.

b. Mustard (HS)

- (1) Odor--Like garlic or horseradish
- (2) Color--Dark brown liquid, changing slowly into a colorless gas.
- (3) Effects on Body--Symptoms delayed 2 to 4 hrs. If exposed, eyes burn and inflame. Skin, in contact with gas or liquid, discolors, followed by severe blisters and sores. If breathed hoarse cough develops followed by severe pains in chest and inflammation of lungs.
- (4) First Aid--Wash areas with kerosene or gasoline followed by hot soap and water. Wash eyes with boric acid solution or salt water solution.
- (5) How Used--For Casualty effect.

### 3. LACRIMATORS

#### a. Chloroacetophenone

- (1) Odor--Like apple blossoms
- (2) Color--Bluish gray smoke from burning type ammunition; colorless from shell.
- (3) Effects on Body--Piercing, irritation of eyes causing profuse tears.
- (4) First Aid--Wash affected parts with water.
- (5) How Used--For Harassing effect.

#### b. Tear Gas Solution (CNS)

- (1) Odor--Like fly paper
- (2) Color--Colorless liquid, changing to colorless gas.
- (3) Effects on Body--Piercing irritation to eyes, profuse tears, followed by nausea and vomiting.
- (4) First Aid--Same as for Lung irritant cases
- (5) How Used--For harassing effect

### 4. SCREENING SMOKES

#### a. White Phosphorus (WP)

- (1) Odor--Like phosphorus matches
- (2) Color--Dispersed as solid which rapidly changes to flame and white smoke on contact with ~~wir~~ air.
- (3) Effects on Body--Smoke, none; particles produce severe fire burns which heal very slowly
- (4) First Aid--Apply copper sulphate solution (CUSO<sub>4</sub>) (2 to 5%). This coats the particles with copper which effectively prevents oxidation. Pull out solid particles and treat as ordinary burn. Keep burning particles under water until medical attention arrives if no CUSO<sub>4</sub> is available.
- (5) How Used--Screening smoke and incendiary.

PROTECTIVE MEASURES-----Protective measures will differ slightly depending upon the physiological type of gas encountered.

(1) In the case of a lung irritant gas, like phosgene, the proper measures are to stop breathing until the gas mask is correctly adjusted and to continue wearing the mask until the gas concentration has dissipated,

(2) For the vesicant gases, the protective measures include not only the proper wearing of protective gas mask but also the proper wearing of protective clothing. It must be remembered that persistent vesicants such as Mustard gas and Lewisite in the vapor state will affect the eyes and skin and will injure lung tissue. In the liquid state these gases may be absorbed directly on the clothing and thence transferred to the skin. If clothing and equipment become contaminated, they also include the prompt removal of such articles, the thorough cleansing of the body with soap and water, and the decontamination of the infected articles before they are used again.

It has been noted that squad lists posted in buildings have not been kept up to date as previously instructed.

Attention is again called to the fact that these lists must be up to date at all times. Therefore when a change does occur, it is advisable to make change on published lists immediately.

Several buildings have neglected to show correct entries regarding squads on their night reports. On some occasions they have failed to submit night reports. These reports must be submitted and great care taken to insure following information:- upon admittance of a person; what squad he was placed in, what building he came from; upon transfer of a person; what squad he was transferred from and to what building; when transfer from one squad to another squad in the same building occurs, this information must also be shown on night reports. Initials, rate and organizations must be noted in all cases.

This memorandum will be read to all ward hospital corpsmen.

In the future it is requested that if possible the weight of the rolls of paper be taken into consideration in determining the number to be issued for a month's supply.

Brooms, mops and soap are needed.

8. Sanitation in General.

It is considered that the personnel of the sanitation department have done excellent work in their daily attention to such procedures as policing the grounds, collecting the garbage, cleaning the drainage gutters and the latrines.

A new drain was installed in the pig pen.

We have no cresol at present, a fact which severely handicaps the sanitation detail in their work, and further disturbs cleaning in the wards. Cresol is indispensable in almost all of the essential sanitary procedures in the hospital. It is requested that fifty (50) gallons of this disinfectant be issued as soon as convenient.

We also require lime for sanitary purposes and will appreciate it if an adequate amount of this material may be issued for use about the hospital.

MEMORANDUM FOR ALL MEDICAL OFFICERS:

Subject: PEDICULUS VESTIMENTI, Diagnosis and treatment of.

1. All medical officers on all services will make weekly examinations of their patients to expedite the detection and eradication of pediculus vestimenti.

2. Each ward medical officer will submit weekly the report of such inspections to their respective Chief of Service, on or before 1200, Fridays. This report will include the following information: Name and rate of each infested patient; treatment administered, both personal and also general sanitary measures.

3. The following excerpts from: "The Diagnostics and Treatment of Tropical Diseases", by Rear Admiral E.R. Stitt, M.C., U.S.N., are considered pertinent. Especial attention is directed to the indicated measures for the detection of this type of infestation:

"Pediculus vestimenti, ..... is the species concerned in the transmission of Indian and North African relapsing fevers as well as typhus fever ..... While the head lice live among the hairs of the head and show their presence chiefly by the appearance of their pear-shaped eggs (nits) projecting from the hair shaft, the body lice ATTACH THEMSELVES TO THE UNDER SURFACE OF THE GARMENTS WORN NEXT THE SKIN, and holding fast to the undershirt, feed about twice daily ... THEY ARE RARELY FOUND ON THE SKIN. Lice will leave their host only when he has fever or when he dies but they may drop off a host or be brushed off."

4. The following excerpts concerning the treatment are from the same volume:

"1. The hair of the body and head should be clipped.

"2. The subject should be bathed, there being used freely kerosene-emulsion soap, prepared by boiling one part of soap in four parts of water, and then adding two parts of kerosene oil. The resultant jelly, when mixed with four parts of water makes a liquid soap that is convenient to use and which may be applied effectively.

"3. Following the bath, the body may be anointed with kerosene, special care being devoted to the hairy parts. Skin irritation may, however, require early removal of the oil.

"4. It has been found that lice on clothing removed from the body may remain alive nine days and their eggs as long as forty days. The clothing therefore should be disinfected by one of the following methods: (a) Steam; (b) boiling for five minutes; (c) 5% compound cresol solution for thirty minutes; (d) chemicals such as cyanide or chlorpicrin."

MEMORANDUM FOR ALL MEDICAL OFFICERS:

Subject: Sulphaquanidine.

1. The following information is quoted, regarding sulphaquanidine:

"1. In 1940 Marshall of Johns Hopkins suggested the use of sulfaquanidine for the treatment of acute gastro-intestinal infections and later (1941) reported marked improvement in the majority of cases of acute bacillary dysentery treated with this drug.

2. Marshall's findings in the treatment of acute bacillary dysentery with sulfaquanidine have been confirmed in the United States and the Middle East.

3. The use of sulfaquanidine was also suggested for this as a pre and post-operative treatment for the control of infection associated with surgical operations on the bowel, but the results obtained do not warrant its use for this purpose.

4. In view of the above and of possible difficulties in obtaining adequate supplies of the drug, it is recommended that sulfaquanidine be used only for the treatment of cases of bacillary dysentery.

5. The following schedule of dosage in bacillary dysentery is recommended:-

Acute Bacillary Dysentery - An initial dose of 6 grams followed by a dose of 3.5 grams every four hours, day and night until number of stools per day is reduced to five or less and then a dose of 3.5 grams every eight hours day and night until stools have been normal for 96 hours. If no improvement occurs after 96 hours of treatment with sulfaquanidine, stop the drug.

Chronic Bacillary Dysentery - Dosage: Three and one-half grams of sulfaquanidine every eight hours day and night until stools are normal for 96 hours. If no improvement occurs within seven (7) days of treatment, discontinue the drug."

2. WARNING: This drug may cause severe toxic reactions and irreparable damage. It should not be used except under the supervision of a physician. Constant observation of the patient is essential. Examine the blood frequently for signs of anemia or leukopenia and urine for hematuria.

WARNING

Without the permission of the authorities of the Military Prison Camp, some of the war prisoners interned here have sold the cigarettes to the public through the driver of carriage, which has been donated by the Red Cross of the United States of America.

We consider as, such articles donated by the Red Cross, the government owned articles which should not be sold or given to others, pursuant to the military regulation, discipline, and morale of Japanese Army, such deed conducted by you deserves a severe punishment, however, the violators were seemed not aware of the military regulation, discipline, and morale of Japanese Army at the time of the violation occurred. We will on this occasion overlook this disgraceful incident, not inflict the punishment on the violators.

I call your attention to the following facts. When this incident exposed by the military police, our men were summoned to their headquarters for questioning, and not only they met a bitter questioning, some of them were kept in custody for a week, that caused us humiliation and impairment of our reputation.

I urge you that all personnel interned here to live up to the rigid discipline, morale and regulation of the military prison camp and pay careful attention to a fair distribution and an adequate handling of such relief goods which we consider as the government owned articles.

Through the courtesy of the Japanese Military Police, we have this day received three hundred pesos which confiscated from the criminal who has, perhaps, produced the said sum of money by the transaction of the above mentioned cigarettes, we will, therefore, permit you to use the said three hundred pesos as the relief fund for the entire personnel of war prisoners interned in the Milibid Hospital.

5. Nurses requiring medical treatment will be escorted to the Dispensary if able to be up and about at 3:00 p.m. and such times as may be directed by the Medical Officer. Nurses too sick to go to the Dispensary will be visited by Dr. Erickson upon a call from the Chief Nurse.
6. Nurses shall perform whatever professional work may be assigned by the Senior Medical Officer.

MEMORANDUM TO ALL MEDICAL OFFICERS AND OFFICERS IN CHARGE OF BUILDINGS:

Subject: Distribution of Food.

1. In accordance with instructions by the Japanese, the rice allowance per man, per day is as follows: Heavy sick, 400 grams; light sick 450 grams; well men 500 grams.
  - (a) The allowance of vegetables per day is as follows: heavy sick 300 grams; light sick 400 grams; well men 300.
  - (b) The allowance of meat per day for heavy sick is 150 grams; light sick and well men 100 grams.
  - (c) Ward Medical Officers shall take steps to apportion the rice ration and other foods in accordance with instructions as far as possible.
2. Instructions have been issued by the Japanese that all unconsumed rice shall be reported by each ward for every meal every day.
3. After each meal any rice left over on plates or in rice containers shall be placed in a tin container and returned to the galley.
4. The report will be made by the galley after the unconsumed rice has been returned.
5. All persons should be cautioned not to take a larger serving of food than they can eat. This will save food and prevent waste.
