

3. Barrack Commanders muster their barracks and report absentees to the P.O.W. Duty Officer.

4. In case of Fire during the Air Raid Warning carry out the Orders regarding Fire Fighting Precautions.

5. Special Groups as detailed in Orders regarding Fire Fighting Precautions stand by in Barracks until called for.

6. During the Air Raid Warning strict discipline shall be maintained within the Barracks. There must be no loud talking and no smoking unless permission is specifically granted.

7. In case orders are issued to enter the Air Raid Shelters P.O.W.s shall proceed on the "DOUBLE" to the designated shelters. Men unable to enter Shelters shall lie flat on the ground. There must be strict discipline and no unnecessary talking.

8. In case the Air Raid Warning is sounded when the Working Parties are out of Camp carry out Instructions 1-7 inclusive as far as practicable. In addition the following Procedure Shall be observed:

8.(a) Each Barrack Commander detail Barrack Fire Party from men available in Barrack as follows:

Fire Buckets 2 Men    Wet Straw Mats 2 Men  
Fire Swatter 1 Man    Fire Pumps 4 Men

8.(b) Each Barrack Commander detail remainder of men in their Barrack as a standby party in case of need. Notify the P.O.W. Duty Officer of the number of men available. These men may be used for Stretcher Party, Salvage Party or any Emergency.

THIS ORDER SUPERSEDES ALL PREVIOUS ORDERS ON THE SAME SUBJECT.

9. In case a BLACKOUT is ordered all Blackout Shades will be pulled promptly and lights in the Barracks shaded. P.O.W. Duty Officer and Barrack Commanders inspect to see that no lights are showing from the prisoner's Barracks.

GROUP NO.1 FIRE PUMP: All permanent Fire Pump Party personnel will proceed to the Guard House, obtain the Fire Pump, take it at the "Double" to the water supply nearest to the fire and bring it into action at the scene of Fire at the earliest possible moment. All working party "Yasumi" personnel in Camp, not engaged in fighting the Fire as per Paragraph 2, will rendezvous on the Parade Ground and await orders. They will be used as reliefs for Fire Pump Party or as required.

5.(c). GROUP NO.2 DOCUMENTS, NO.3 CLOTHING, NO.5 DEMOLITION:

Group Leaders will proceed to Group Rendezvous and await orders.

5.(d). GROUP NO.4 FOOD: All Cookhouse personnel will rendezvous at the Cookhouse and await orders.

5.(e). GROUP NO.5 MEDICAL: All Medical personnel, other than those specially detailed, will proceed to Group Rendezvous and await orders.

5.(f). CANTEEN: P.O.W. Officer in charge of Canteen will remain in Canteen and await orders.

5.(g). CAMP EMPLOYED, LEATHER SHOP WORKERS, etc.,: The balance of the personnel in Camp, not specially detailed above; i.e. Officers, Camp Employed, Leather Shop Workers, Etc., will equip themselves with Fire Buckets, Fire Extinguishers, Mats, etc., and take immediate action to deal with the outbreak of Fire.

5.(h). SPECIAL GROUPS: P.O.W. personnel not assigned to regular working parties, nor included in Paragraph 5,(g), will be considered as "Yasumi" personnel and will rendezvous on Parade Ground and await orders.

5.(i). ORDERS REGARDING FIRE FIGHTING: Orders dealing with circumstances arising out of an outbreak of Fire will be issued on the spot, at the time, by the Camp Supervising Officers; and all such orders must be executed at the "DOUBLE".

SUBJECT: FIRE FIGHTING PRECAUTIONS

I. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS.

The following procedures will be observed when the Fire Alarm Warning is sounded or fire is discovered in the Camp. All prisoners of war will strictly comply with all details of these Fire Fighting Procedures.

2. PROMPT ACTION ON DISCOVERY OF FIRE.

The persons first discovering Fire in the Camp will promptly give the Alarm by calling out "FIRE" several times in a loud and clear voice. This will be followed by calling out the location in a similar manner. All other persons hearing the Alarm will immediately pass the word along.

It must be clearly understood by all P.O.W. that, on the outbreak of Fire, it is the Duty of those in the immediate vicinity of the fire to take steps to put it out irrespective of the particular task assigned to individuals under these precautionary regulations.

3. CARE OF FIRE BUCKETS/FIRE EXTINGUISHERS, etc.

Fire Buckets, Fire Extinguishers, Fire Swats, Fire Mats or Water Tubbs on no account must be used for any other purpose than Fire Fighting. All the above equipment must be clearly marked with the location or Barrack to which it belongs and on no account must be moved from its allotted position except for Fire Fighting.

4. PROCEDURE TO BE OBSERVED AT NIGHT OR WHEN WORKING PARTIES ARE IN CAMP.

PROCEDURE; The following procedure will be observed when the Fire Alarm Warning is sounded, at night or when the working parties are in camp.

4(a). The Senior P.O.W. Officer will proceed immediately to the Camp Supervising Office. He will report the present strength of the Camp and the number of the patients and then await orders.

4(b). Special Groups as stated below will proceed immediately to their respective group rendezvous. Group Leaders will parade their party and report to the Group Supervising Officer when all are present; then stand by for orders. No action (other than as previously noted under Paragraph 2 above: "Prompt Action On Discovery of Fire") must be taken by groups except on the order of the Supervising Officer in command of the group.

3. Sew on missing buttons
4. Have clean number tags on tunics
5. All men must have legible hat tags

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B Each barracks will:

1. See proper fire equipment in barracks, plainly marked with barracks number and in good working order. Old fire mats should be replaced with broad new ones.
2. Keep all fire tubs full of clean water
3. See that Fire Fighting Precautions Bill is posted in a conspicuous place; that it is up to date and that all men in barracks concerned are aware of their duties
4. See that the proper signs are posted in barracks and at bunks
5. Build the floors of each barracks up level, filling in all depressions etc
6. Remove all mats from sleeping spaces. Dust and sweep down sleeping places. Wash down sleeping floors using creosote solution if available. Spread flea powder.
7. Clean all sleeping mats and totanis
8. Scrub all tables and benches. Dry in the sun
9. Wash all windows and doors
10. Clean up all trash boxes and ash traps
11. Knock down all cobwebs inside and outside barracks, bengas etc
12. Remove all hanging fly papers
13. Hang up soap lathers and rice puddles on nails at far end of barracks
14. Thoroughly clean all bengas, washstands and vicinity of same
15. Empty all urinals and clean as much as possible
16. All ash traps must be EMPTY at time of inspection

C Special Instructions

1. Guarding officers are excused from going up on Sept. 6th and 7th. They will clean up their

own bunks and kits and assist Barracks Commanders as required.

2. Leather Shop officers are excused from duties in the Leather Shop on 6 and 7 Sept. They will clean up their own bunks and kits and assist Barracks Commanders as required.
