1. No records of US Forces in the Philippine Islands, I and II Philippine Corps or any Philippine Divisions are on file in this branch.

2. Records of the "original" US Forces in the Far East for the period 7 Dec 41 through Jun 42 are not on file. The only pertinent material revealed by a diligent examination of the retained records of the "reconstituted" USAPFE, active 1943 through 1945, is a file copy of letter from Hq USAPFE, file FEDCS 314.7, Subject: "Historical Philippine Campaign", addressed to The Adjutant General, War Department, Washington, D. C., dated 24 Jun 43 which states that data requested by the War Department is being forwarded. The data referred to, copy of which is an inclosure to the above referred to letter, and included with the file copy, was compiled, in the absence of records, from the memory of officers who were in the Philippines prior to its fall.

3. A diligent examination of the retained records of Southwest Pacific Area, the only other major command active in the area concerned during the period in question, revealed the following material:

a. Approximately ninety (90) telegrams to and from General MacArthur and General Wainwright which in general consist of requests for supplies and information concerning the combat situation existing at that time. Thirty-four (34) of these are operation reports which cite the day by day situation existing on Bataan while under siege, and appear to have especial significance.

b. A file copy of letter from CHQ, SWPA, file AG 313 (10-11-42), Subject: "Records of United States Army Forces in the Far East", addressed to The Adjutant General, Washington, D. C., dated 11 Oct 42. This letter states that the USAPFE records on the list, which is an inclosure to the letter and is included with the file copy, were brought from the Philippine Islands to Australia and would be forwarded to the War Department by first available air courier mail departing for the United States.

4. It is believed that the correspondence referred to in par 2, above, and the correspondence and records referred to in par 3b, above, are on file in the Departmental Records Branch, AGO, Washington 25, D. C.
