SUBJECT: Project 001-C - Payrolls of Hq & Hq Co, 3d Bn, 64th Inf and Hq & Hq Sv Co, 64th Inf

64th Inf, it was noted that several of the individuals appearing on these payrolls appear on those rosters; however, they appear as volunteers and drivers and there is no indication they were military personnel.

6. A search of all available USAFFE payrolls for the 64th Inf and 61st Div failed to reveal any other payrolls listing individuals without rank.

7. The payroll of Hq & Hq Co, 3d Bn, 64th Inf shows the date of induction for four of the individuals in question. It was noted on available SO of the 64th Inf & 61st Div that the terms inducted and appointed were used in connection with the hiring of civilian employees. (See 201 of Tipanan). It is believed this was true in connection with this payroll.

8. It is recommended that the 14 individuals appearing on the April 1942 payrolls of Hq & Hq Co, 3rd Bn, 64th Inf (Folder #16) and Hq & Hq Sv Co, 64th Inf (Folder #28) be determined as civilian employees and that a memo for record be placed in the payroll folders as the top sheet, listing the names of the individuals determined to be civilian employees. Further, that the archive cards be marked "civilian".

1. This project was initiated in an attempt to determine the status of the individuals listed without rank on the April 1942 payrolls of Hq & Hq Co, 3rd Bn, 64th Inf (Folder #16) and Hq & Hq Sv Co, 64th Inf (Folder #28).

2. The aforementioned payrolls contains the names of 14 individuals. Available 201 files were examined and the following information was obtained:

- a. 201 files for 12 of the 14 individuals listed were located.
- b. 3 certifications to VA.
 - (1) 2 negative.
 - (2) 1 positive.
- c. 11 of the 12 individuals allege USAFFE inductions.
- d. None have acceptable archive proof of USAFFE.
- e. All allege service with Motor Transport Units of the 61st Div or 64th Inf Regt.

3. The 61st Div history shows in part:

"With the reduction of forces in Panay, General Chenoweth ordered the recruitment of volunteers to replace the units that went to Mindanao. The 64th and the 65th Infs were organized in Panay and the 73rd Inf in Negros. On or about 28 Dec 41, the forces remaining in Panay and Negros were ordered to prepare for an indefinite guerrilla resistance. Since then all preparations were centered in hauling supplies to the mountains, until enemy landings on Panay were made on 16 Apr 42. Food supplies, enough to last 1 year were stored in different caches in the mountains and the Div was geared for guerrilla operations."

4. It appears most of the elements of the 61st Div were scattered through the southern Philippines. The 63rd Inf remained at Panay. The first battalion of the 63rd was used as a nucleus for the 64th Inf. The Regiment was so far under strength, a call was made for volunteers and a special effort was made to obtain drivers, mechanics, etc. It is my opinion that with the tremendous job of getting a year's supplies, to the mountains, the personnel of the Division who were experienced as drivers, mechanics, etc. were transferred to Motor Transport.

5. In comparing the payrolls in question with rosters of the Motor Transport Co,
