

INSTRUCTIONS ON THE ACCOMPLISHMENT OF GSXRP (PA) FORM NO. 9

- 1. GSXRP (PA) Form No. 9 is the claim proper for any arrears in pay and allowances that may be due the estate of a deceased Philippine Army personnel who served under the United States Army Forces, whether as a USAFFE-Guerrilla, or Civilian Guerrilla. It is an affidavit and must be subscribed and sworn to before a person authorized by civil law to administer oath. Claimants will accomplish three copies of this form, typewritten, or printed in ink (do not use pencil). Entries should be legible. If the form is destroyed, a typewritten copy may be made.
- 2. Who may accomplish Form 9 Any person who is entitled to share as an heir in the estate of the deceased soldier in accordance with Philippine Laws on succession may accomplish this Form as the claimant. If theiheir is a minor, or otherwise incapacitated to act, his legal guardian, if there is one, or the nearest blood-relation who can act in his behalf, may accomplish it. Such legal guardian must attach letters of guardianship issued by a competent court, or secondary evidence thereof together with a certificate of the loss or destruction of records of the court that granted such letters of guardianship. The nearest blood-relation of a minor or incompetent must prove his relationship to the minor or incompetent by means of affidavits of at least two disinterested persons, stating the relationship, and the fact that the minor or incompetent is under his care. Attorneys-in-fact may accomplish this form also when authorized by a power of attorney signed by one who in his own right is entitled to share in the estate.
 - 3. How to fill in the blanks: -

PAGE 1 -

Under Republic of the Philippines - write the name of the town or city and the province where the form is being accomplished.

Name - write first, middle, and last name of claimant. If the person accomplishing the form is an attorney-in-fact, write the word "By" followed by the name of the attorney-in-fact after the rightful claimant's name, thus:

I, Juana A. Cruz, by Pedro Santos, Atty-in-fact,

If the claimantis the legal guardian or nearest blood relation of the minor or incompetent, only the name of the legal guardian or nearest blood-relation will be written.

Nationality - Write the citizenship of the claimant

Relationship - Write the relationship of the claimant to the deceased soldier.

Postal Address - Write mailing address of claimant.

(1) If the person accomplishing the form is the rightful claimant or his attorney-in-fact, delete "(the legal guardian of the legal and/or principal heir)"; if the claimant is a guardian or nearest blood-relation of a minor or incompetent, delete "(the legal and/or principal heir)". Whatever deletion is made must be initialed by the person accomplishing the form. If he is unable to write, place his right thumbmark over the deletion.

Name of Deceased - Write first name, middle name, and last name of the deceased soldier.

Rank and Grade - Write the rank or grade held by the soldier at the time of his death, or when last known to be alive. If this is not known, write the word "Unknown".

ASN - This refers to Army Serial Number of the soldier. If this is not known, write "Unknown".

Branch of Service - If the deceased was in the Infantry, write "Infantry"; if in the Field Artillery, write "Field Artillery", etc. If the branch of service of the deceased is not known, write "Unknown".

Last Known Organization - Write the organization of the deceased
which you know or have information about
to the smallest unit (to the company, if
possible), thus:
"C" Co, 81st Inf, 81st Div"

If the full designation of the unit is not known as above illustrated, write the Regiment, or the Division, whichever is known, or both. If this organization is not known, write "Unknown".

- (2) Last Legal residence Write the residence of the deceased soldier at the time of his death, if he died after returning home, If he did not return home, write his residence at the time he reported for duty to the Philippine Army or to his guerrilla organization.
- (3) Date of induction or enlistment in the Philippine Army If the deceased was a regular soldier in the Philippine Army or Philippine Constabulary, write the approximate date when he enlisted, and the place where he enlisted. If he was a volunteer, or he was a reservist and was called to active duty to the Philippine Army in 1941 1942, write the approximate date when, and the place where he volunteered or reported for active duty. If his entire military service was in a Guerrilla Unit write the approximate date when and place where he joined the guerrilla unit. If the date or place is not known, write "Unknown".
- (4) Write in chronological order the inclusive dates of the soldier's activities from 8 Dec 41, or the date he began military service if after 8 Dec

- (6) If the soldier left a will, delete the words "(no will)", and attach a copy of the will to this form, If he died without a will, delete the words "(A will)". Initial the words deleted. If the claimant can not write, place his right thumb mark over the deleted words.
- (7) If the claimant is the deceased soldier's widow and she has not remarried, delete the last part of this paragraph beginning from the word "Or". If the claimant is other than the widow, or if the soldier was single, write the words "Not Applicable" on all the blanks. If the widow has remarried, write the name of the second husband, the date of that subsequent marriage and the place where it was solemnized, and delete the words "I have not remarried since his death, OR". Initial the deletion, or if claimant can not write, place his right thumb-mark over the deleted words.
- (8) (a) If the claimant was present at the time of death of the deceased, write "Yes", and the date and place of death. If the claimant was not present, write "No".
 - (b) If the claimant was the body of the deceased, write "Yes", and state the date, place, and circumstances when the body was seen. If not, write "No".
 - (c) If the claimant knew or has information about the cause of death, state the cause of death. If the claimant does not know nor has any information about it, write "I do not know".
 - (d) If the claimant was not present at the time of death of the soldier, nor has been the body of the deceased, write the approximate date when the claimant first learned of the death, and give the name and designation of the person or office who gave the information. If the claimant has up to this date not been informed by anyone that the soldier is dead, write "I have not been informed by anyone of his death".
 - (e) If a death certificate or other notice of death was received by the claimant, write "Yes", and give the name of the office who gave the certificate or notice. If not, write "No",
 - (f) If a death certificate or other notice of death was received by the claimant, state the date when such certificate or notice of death was received.
 - (g) -
 - (h) If the claimant received notice of death, give the place where the claimant received the notice. If none was received, write "Not Applicable".
 - (i) If the claimant was informed whether orally or in writing by any public official or Army Officer of the death of the soldier dier, write "Yes", and give the date the the name and designation of the official or army officer who gave the information.

Page 3

(a) Monies received by the soldier should be stated by the claimant if known by him. The inclusive dates for which the money was received, the grade of the soldier and amount received during the period should be shown. Under "Remarks" state whether the money received was in guerrilla or emergency currency or in philippine Victory Notes. Monies received from the USAFFE should be shown separately from monies received in guerrilla or emergency currency, thus:

If the claimant does not know anything about any monies received by the deceased for his military service, write "Unknown" under each column.

(10) (a) (b) and (c)

If the deceased ever became a Prisoner of War of the Japanese, write the date when he surrendered or was captured. If he was a prisoner more than once, state the dates when he surrendered or was captured. If he was not released, write "Not Released". If he excaped, write "Escaped" and give the date when he escaped. If after release or escape he returned home, give the date he reached home. If he did not return home, write "Did not reach home." If the deceased was killed in action while with the USAFFE in 1941-1942, write the words "Not Applicable" in all the blanks.

- (d) If the deceased soldier was at any time after the surrender inactive in a civilian capacity, state what work he performed. If the soldier was employed in a Japanese or Puppet Government agency, state the nature of the employment, the name of the office or agency where he was employed, and the inclusive period oe employment. If the soldier died in action while in the USAFFE in 1941-1942, or if he died while in the Concentration Camp in 1942, write "Not Applicable" on the first blank.
- (11) If the soldier died in action while in the USAFFE or while a prisoner of War in the Concentration Camp in 1942, write "Not Applicable" in the blanks of (11) (a), (b) and (c). If the soldier was a member of a guerrilla unit, write the date when he first joined any guerrilla unit in paragraph (11) (a).
- (b) Give the complete name of the guerrilla unit to which he belonged and the Commanding Officer of that unit. If he joined more than one unit, give the complete name of each unit and the respective Commanding Officer.
- (c) If the soldier was away from hom during the periods of his guerrilla service, state how long he was away from home. If he come once in a while only, state how many times he came home andhow long he stayed at home each time. If he was at home all the time, state so also.

ding the date of death, or the date he was last seen, heard 41, up to and incl of, accounted for, or last known to be alive. This includes inclusive periods of active military service in the Philippine Army or Philippine Constabulary. of Guerrilla Unit, inclusive periods of sickness, of being a prisoner of the Japanese or their agents, or periods of inactivity as a civilian. There should be no overlapping or omission of any dates. During periods of active military service in the Philippine Army or Philippine Constabulary, or Guerrilla Unit, the organization should be written, together with the place of service, and the Commanding Officer of the soldier. If any of these is not known, write "Unknown". During periods of sickness, inactivity, or as a Prisoner of the Japanese or their agents, write only the place where he was sick, where he stayed while inactive, or where he was confined as a Prisoner opposite the corresponding inclusive dates. Known periods of sickness, inactivity or confinement as a prisoner should be shown even if it lasted for a very short time only. The last date will be the date of death, or the date the soldier was last seen, heard of, accounted for, or last known to be alive. To illustrate:

The deceased was called to active duty in the Philippine Army on 15 October 1941 at Baguio City. He was assigned to the 21st Infantry, and served in Bataan during the war until the surrender of Bataan on 9 April 1942. He surrendered to the Japanese on 10 April 1942 and was a Prisoner of War at Camp O'Donnell, Capas, Tarlac. He was released on 1 August 1942 and reached home on 2 August 1942. He was sick of malaria at home until 15 December 1942. When he got well, he worked in the farm. On 1 January 1944, he joined the 121st Inf, USAFIP, NL. On 5 May 1944, he was arrested by the Japanese military Police and taken to the Japanese Garrison at Baguio City. That was the last time he was seen.

If the deceased was employed in a Japanese of Puppet Government agency, the inclusive periods of employment, name of the office or agency where he employed, and its location must also be stated.

PAGE 2 -

Paragraph (5)

List the names of the soldier's grandparents on both the father's and mother's side, his father and mother, wife, children, grandchildren, brothers and sisters. If the soldier was single, and at the present time his parents, brothers and sisters, and all grandparents are all no longer alive, list also all unces and aunts and nephews and nieces. Indicate the relationship to the soldier opposite each name, and if living, his or her present age and the word "Alive" under the proper column. If any relative is dead, write the relationship to the deceased soldier, and the date of death of that relative.

(12) The word "Dependents" in this paragraph refers only to the deceased soldier's wife, and to legitimate children below 18 years of age. If the deceased soldier was married or a widower with children below 18 years of age prior to 1 July 1942, write the residence of the wife or children from 1 Dec 41 to 30 Jun 42. If the dependents moved from one town or city to another between 1 Dec 41 and 30 Jun 42, write the inclusive periods when the dependents lived in each town or city.

PAGE 4 -

Place and Date - Write the place where and the date when this form was accomplished on the uppermost blanks.

Signature and Thumbmark-

If the claimant is able to sign his name type or print the claimant's name on this space, and sign over the typed or printed name. If the claimant is illiterate, put right thumbmark over typed or printed name. The right thumbmark will also be placed on the oppositie blank, whether or not claimant is able to write. If the person accomplishing this form is an attorney-in-fact, the name of the attorney in fact will also be typed or printed below the real claimant's name, and the attorney-in-fact will sign both the name of the real claimant, and his name, thus:

The attorney-in-fact will then put his right thumbmark on the opposite space.

Witnesses -

When the person accomplishing this form is able to sign his name, there will be no need for witnesses, and the words "Not Applicable" will be written on all the blanks provided for witnesses. When the person accomplishing this form signs by thumbmark only, two witnesses who are able to read and write will sign over their typed or printed names on the spaces provided for witnesses, and write their respective post office addresses on the blanks below their names.

Authentication -

This Form, being an affidavit, must be subscribed and sworn to before a person authorized by civil law to administer oath. Among those who can administer the oath for this form are Municipal Mayors, Justices of the Peace, Provincial Governors, Judges and Clerks of Courts of Record, Commissioned Officers of the Army of the Philippines still on active duty, Notaries Public, etc. This Form and all documents you may submit in connection with your

claim for arrears in pay are by law exempted from documentary stamp tax.

Should difficulty be experienced in accomplishing this form it is requested that you contact the nearest Red Cross Chapter or Field Team located in the Military District Headquarters.

Claimants are warned that it is not necessary to pay individuals to assist them in filing their claims.

STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURE FOR THE PROCESSING OF CLAIMS FOR ARREARS IN PAY DUE THE ESTATES OF DECEASED PA PERSONNEL

In order to expedite the processing of claims for the arrears in pay and quarters allowances due the estates of deceased Philippine Army personnel, this standard operating procedure is hereby published for all teams concerned with the handling of said claims in the field, especially the local chapters of the Philippine Red Cross and the processing teams of the ten Military District Headquarters, PA.

I. WHERE TO FILE A CLAIM

All PA deceased claims will be filed with the Deceased Claims Section, PA Branch, Recovered Personnel Division, PHILRYCOM, APO 707, at Mandaluyong, Rizal. A claimant may choose any of the following ways to file his or her claim, whichever is most convenient:

1. In person.

2. By mail.

3. Through the local chapter of the Philippine Red Cross.

4. Through the nearest processing team of a Military District Headquarters, PA.

All offices and agencies helping claimants prepare their claim papers free of charge are requested to inform them accordingly. Claimants should be advised that their claims filed with the Recovered Personnel Division are only for the arrears in pay and quarters allowances due the decedents' estate. It is necessary for them to file other separate claims for pension and insurance benefits and for death gratuities with the respective offices concerned.

II. WHO ARE AUTHORIZED TO FILE A CLAIM

When the right party-claimant is unable to file his or her claim personally due to disability or other reasons, any of the following persons may file the claim for and in the name of the claimant:

- 1. Any of the heirs listed in paragraph 5 of Form 9.
- 2. Guardian of minors.
- 3. Persons with special power of attorney from the claimant.

In any of the cases mentioned above, the name of the claimant must invariably appear in Form 9 as the rightful party-claimant.

III. REQUIREMENTS TO COMPLETE A CLAIM

A claim in order to be complete must contain all the following documents in duplicate:

1. GSXRP (PA) Form 9 to be accomplished properly in triplicate and duly subscribed and sworn to before an oath-administering officer or any person authorized to administer oaths. The claimant should submit the original and duplicate and keep the triplicate for his or her file.

2. Proof of USAFFE or Guerrilla status, or both.

3. Supporting documents for the determination of heirs. These documents vary according to the degree of relationship between the deceased soldier and the claimant and other forced heirs. The claimant must prove by these documents that he or she is the only leagal forced heir, or is one of the legal forced heirs. In the latter case, the claimant must prove also the legitimate relationship of all forced heirs to the deceased soldier.

IV. DESCRIPTION AND NATURE OF THE DOCUMENTS NECESSARY

- 1. Proof of USAFFE status may be established by any of the following:
- A. Record from the Veterans Affairs Division (formerly Casualty Division), Headquarters, Army of the Philippines.

(1) Death certificates.

(2) Casualty report showing that the soldier was treated in a field hospital for battle wounds or for sickness contracted during his service prior to 7 May 1942.

(3) POW Record.

This is based on the list of PA personnel from Luzon,
Visayas, and Mindanao, who were concentrated at Camp
O'Donnell, Capas, Tarlac, as prisoners of war. If a
soldier's name is recorded in this list, it is prima
facie evidence that he was inducted into the USAFFE
and is sufficient to establish his military status.

This list includes civilian prisoners of war (Filipinos)
who are not to be considered with military status merely
because they were listed therein.

B. Special Orders.

(1) Orders calling the soldier to active duty supported by evidence that he so reported prior to 7 May 1942.

(2) Promotion Orders prior to 7 May 1942.

C. An affidavit in duplicate of two members, preferably officers of the Philippine Army who belonged to the same USAFFE unit (no larger than a Regiment) and can certify as to the date, if known, and place said soldier was inducted into the USAFFE, his rank and unit, and the name and rank of the inducting officer, if known: or

A certificate either from the soldier's Commanding Officer, Executive Officer, or Platoon Commander, stating that the subject soldier was under his command in the USAFFE; or an affidavit in duplicate of the lst Sergeant, Platoon Sergeant, Staff Sergeant, squad leader, company clerk, or any two members of the same Company, who was/were with the soldier in the same company to testify that the soldier was a member of that

Company, stating le date when he became a member lereof.

D. An affidavit in duplicate of any two PA members, preferably officers, who have returned to full military control and who know the deceased soldier personally and can testify to the fact that they saw him in active service in the USAFFE, stating the date, if known, and place he was seen and other circumstances or conditions to attribute to the fact that he was a member of the USAFFE, together with

An affidavit in duplicate of the Municipal Mayor and/or the Chief of Police or any two municipal officials, who was/were in office the latter part of 1941 or the early part of 1942, and who can certify that said soldier was called to active duty and left to report for active military service, stating the date, if known, and the place where soldier was supposed to report; or a certificate of the present municipal mayor or Chief of Police based on existing records of Special Orders of call to active duty.

(NOTE: Affiants should be preferably of higher or equal rank or grade with the subject soldier and each should therefor indicate his former USAFFE rank and unit and present station, if still in the service, rank branch of service, Army Serial Number, and assignment).

2. Proof of Guerrilla status:

An affidavit in duplicate of two members, preferably officers, who belonged to the same guerrilla unit organization with the deceased soldier to certify as to the date and place of induction, his rank and assignment, subsequent promotions, if any, name and rank of the inducting officer and his activities. Each affiant should indicate his guerrilla rank and assignment and present station, if still in the service, Army Serial Number, and assignment.

- 3. If deceased soldier was USAFFE and Guerrilla, each of the above proofs should be submitted, as stated in 1, and 2, above.
- 4. Proof of death of the soldier, Any one of the following will be sufficient:
- a. AG-Cas Report. This may be secured at the Veterans Affairs Division, Headquarters, Army of the Philippines, Camp Murphy, Quezon City.
- b. Death Certificates issued by the Executive Commission or by the Bureau of Public Welfare during the Japanese occupation.
 - c. Death Certificate from the Local Civil Registrar.
 - d. Certificate of death from a hospital.
 - e. Church record.

f. Affidavits regarding death. In the absence of existing records, any of the following (whichever may apply) may be presented

(1) If the soldier was a USAFFE or Guerrilla, or both, and he died in the service thereof: An affidavit in duplicate of any two former members, preferably officers of the USAFFE or guerrilla who have actual knowledge of the soldier's death, stating among other things the date (approximate if exact date cannot be recalled), place of death, cause of death, and whether the occurrence of death was personally witnessed or the dead

man soon and identified; otherwise, the date and place he was last seen alive, his physical condition at the time, and other circumstances surrounding his death.

(2) If the soldier was a USAFFE or guerrilla (or both) but did not die in the service thereof: An affidavit in duplicate of any two reliable and disinterested persons, stating the pertinent data in paragraph (1) above.

- (3) If the soldier was a USAFFE or guerrilla (or both) and is presumed to be dead due to the length of his absence:

 An affidavit in duplicate of two responsible and disinterested persons who knew the deceased soldier personally and can testify to the fact that said soldier has not returned to his home nor has been heard of from the time (state the date) he was last seen or left for active military service in the USAFFE or guerrilla, or from the time he was captured by the Japanese during the occupation.
- 5. Proof of death of an heir may be established by any of the following:
- a. Certified true copies of the original death record of the Municipal Government (certified by the Local Civil Registrar or the keeper of records thereof.)
- b. Certified true copies of the original death record in the Church (certified by the keeper of records thereat.)
- c. Affidavits in duplicate of either of the Municipal Secretary, the last attending physician, the priest or minister who solemnized the funeral service, or any two reliable and disinterested persons who have personal knowledge of the fact of death, stating the date, place, and cause of death, and the date and place of burial. If the event occurred some 30 years ago, affiants should also state their present ages.
 - 6. Proof of birth may be established by any of the following:
- a. Certified true copies of the original birth record of the Municipal Government (certified by the Local Civil Registrar or the keeper of records thereat).
- b. Certified true copies of the original birth record in the church (certified by the parish priest or the keeper of records thereat).
- c. Affidavits in duplicate of either the attending physician, nurse, midwife, attendant, or any two reliable and disinterested persons who have personal knowledge of the fact of birth, stating the parentage, and the date and place of birth. If the event occurred some 30 years ago affiants should also state their present ages.
 - 7. Proof of marriage may be established by any of the following:
- a. Certified true copies of the original marriage record of the Municipal Government (certified by the Local Civil Registrar or the keeper of records thereat).

- b. Certified true copies of the original marriage record of the church (certified by the parish priest or the keeper of records thereat).
- c. Affidavits in duplicate of any two reliable and disinterested persons who have personal knowledge of the fact of marriage stating the date and place, the names of sponsors or witnesses, and the name and title of the person who performed the ceremony, If the event took place some 30 years ago affiants should also state their present ages.
 - 8. Proof of guardianship may be established by any of the following:
 - a. Evidence granted by proper court.
- b. Affidavits in duplicate of two reliable and disinterested persons testifying that claimant is the nearest adult relative of the minor or minors as to blood relationship.

V. DOCUMENTS NECESSARY TO DETERMINE HEIRS

The existing procedure regarding documents necessary for each claim to determine the heirs is as follows: The order of succession according to the Civil Code of the Philippines will govern, the nearest always excluding the farthest, to wit:

- 1. Legitimate children and their descendants.
- 2. Legitimate parents and their descendants.

3. Acknowledged natural children.

4. Brothers and sisters, nephews and nieces.

5. The surviving spouse.

- 6. Collaterals within the sixth degree. (Cousins, etc).
- 7. The State.

The widow of the deceased soldier will always be the one to file the claim if she is alive since she is entitled to one half of the estates of the deceased as her share in the conjugal partnership property. Otherwise, one of the principal heirs must file the claim.

VI. ACCEPTANCE OF CLAIMS

For the purpose of determining their acceptance, claims are classified as follows:

1. Complete claims

These claims should be forwarded immediately to the Deceased Claims Section, PA Branch, Recovered Personnel Division, for appropriate action. Claimants will be advised to defer further inquiry regarding the status of his or her claim as this will hamper the processing of other claims. If additional information is desired, the Recovered Personnel Division will communicate with the claimant.

2. Incomplete claims - these are divided into two classes:

a. Complete with respect to that part of the claim to be used as the basis to determined period for which the decedent's estate is entitled to pay, consisting of (1) Form 9, (2) Proof of USAFFE or Guerrilla status or both, and (3) Proof of death of the soldier; but incomplete due to the lack of some supporting documents necessary for the determination of heirs.

Whenever that part of a claim is complete as described above, (Form 9, proof of USAFFE or Guerrilla status or both, and proof of death) be forwarded to the Recovered Personnel Division. Upon receipt thereof, the Deceased Claims Section will cause said claim to be registered and a receipt issued and sent to the claimant through the Red Cross Chapter or Military District Headquarters concerned.

That part of the claim which consists of papers required for the determination of heirs should be witheld by the office handling the case until all the papers required are submitted by the claimant, at which time, said papers should be forwarded to the Recovered Personnel Division in bulk for final action.

b. Incomplete with respect to papers required to determine the period for entitlement to pay as well as papers necessary for the determination of heirs. Those claims will not be forwarded to the Recovered Personnel Division until such time as they have attained, at least, the category of claims described in paragraph 2a above, in which case the same procedure will be followed.

VII. EFFECTIVITY

This new standard operating procedure will take effect immediately upon its receipt. All parts of the old procedure not consistent with the provisions of this SOP are hereby superseded.

In the near future Processing Teams of the U.S. Army will be dispatched to the ten (10) Old Military Districts of the Philippine Islands to process Philippine Army Personnel so that payment of arrears in pay can be made. To accomplish this it will be necessary for the processee to have: in his possession the applicable documentary evidence to verify spoken statement.
- II. This documentary evidence will be submitted to the Processing Team and will be attached to the affidavit (P A AGO Form #23), as supporting papers whon forwarded for adjudication. The importance of having available, at the time of processing, all applicable documentary evidence listed below, cannot be stressed too highly.
- 1. PROPER IDENTIFICATION SHOWING INDIVIDUAL AS A MEMBER OF PHILIP-PINE ARMY.

a. FOR MEMBERS OF USAFFE.

(1) Special Orders calling soldier to active duty.

(2) Special Orders of promotion dated prior to date of last payment in 1941 or 1942.

(3) Official rosters of personnel compkiled by unit commander (4) Certification by the Municipal Mayor of the City, or Chief of Police of the town where the soldier resided in 1941 or 1942, attesting to the fact that reliable records presently existing and available for inspection indicate that the soldier was called to active duty at a specified time during the same period.

(5) Affidavits of two officers or Non-Commissioned Officers of the Philippine Army or of the Army of the United







I. DISCUSSION.

It is recommended that the deadline for filing of claims of deceased Philippine Army personnel be extended to 29 February 1948, and that a press release announcing such fact be approved for publication.

a. Prior to 5 January 1948, 38,020 claims for the arrears in pay of deceased USAFFE soldiers had been filed out of a possible 50,000 or roughly 70 per cent.

b. As of the same date 4,462 claims filed for recognized deceased Civilian guerrilla veterans had been received, which figure constitutes less than 50 per cent of those which have been recognized and may be entitled to receive benefits.

c. While many guerrilla claims are not being filed due to the fact that the deceased veteran joined or was recognized in our armed forces after liberation and consequently is entitled to little, if any, arrears in pay, it is not known in every case the reason for failure to file a claim. It is known that a number of individuals have experienced difficulty in obtaining all supporting papers and evidence which they consider necessary before filing. In this connection in December 1947 several newspaper articles appeared in the local press which elaborated on this fact. Furthermore, some claimants are from localities in which information concerning the establishment of the 15 January 1948 deadline has been slow in reaching. An attempt to rectify this matter is being made by HMDF as well as numerous veterans organizations, and they are utilizing all resources at their disposal in an attempt to assist this division in contacting lawful heirs of deceased veterans.

d. The recent press release announcing the deadline has resulted in a very large number of individuals writing or visiting this division in an attempt to qualify for filing. It is believed that granting such extensions to the heirs of deceased veterans will be in keeping with the recommendation made to the War Department by the Board of Inquiry under Major General Livesay, that all possible consideration be granted to the heirs of deceased in connection with arrears in pay.

DEADLINE FOR FILING DECEASED CLAIMS EXTENDED

Headquarters PHILRYCOM today announced that the deadline of 15

January 1948 for the filing of claims under the provisions of the Missing

Persons Act for arrears in pay and quarters allowance which might be due

the estates of deceased Philippine Army personnel has been extended to

29 February 1948.

It was emphasized that this deadline of 29 February 1948 applies only to claims for arrears in pay of <u>deceased</u> members of the Philippine Army inducted into the USAFFE, including <u>deceased</u> members of recognized civilian guerrilla organizations, filed by their respective legal heirs with the Deceased Claims Section, PA Branch, Recovered Personnel Division, located at Mandalugong, Risal.

Headquarters PHILRYCOM has decided to grant this extension in view of the large number of deceased claims which have not been filed by legal heirs, especially those who reside in remote parts of the Philippines.

All claimants who have not yet filed their claims are urged to communicate immediately by mail dr in person with the Recovered Personnel Division, so that the necessary forms and instructions can be forwarded to them for accomplishment. Claimants are advised that it is not necessary that a claim be complete before it is filed. It is sufficient that claimants submit any available papers in their possession before the deadline of 29 February 1948 in order to come within said deadline. They can submit other supporting papers later.







In compliance to the checknote from your office dated 10 Dec 47, the following suggestions are submitted in connection with granting concessions or special consideration for claims received after 31 Dec 47, as would be found in the Deceased Claims Section:

- (1) If post marked on or prior to 31 Dec 47.
- (2) Claims received by Military District Headquarters, Red Cross Chapters and Legal Aid Offices, on or prior to 31 Dec 47, provided that such claims be accompanied by a certificate of the individual in charge to the effect that the claim itself was filed prior to 31 Dec 47, but for one reason or another was not forwarded until after that date.
- (3) Veterans who had previously filed a claim in the Living Claims Section prior to deadline date but who have died and nearest of kin has not filed a claim prior to 31 Dec 47 or a veteran has a claim on file but died after 31 Dec 47 prior to receiving his arrears in pay.
- (4) Claims which have been erroneously forwarded and filed in allied agencies such as Guerrilla Affairs, Claims Service, US Navy, Veterans Administration, HAP, or any similar organization which might possibly have received the claim prior to 31 Dec 47. However, such case should be very carefully screened if received more than 45 days after the dead line date.
- (5) Cases wherein the claimant can furnish a copy of correspondence from this section acknowledging previous filing, but returning the claim requesting additional supporting papers and we have no record of such correspondence.
- (6) Cases in which a form 9 has been furnished this Division but which was found to be in error and was not registered and was returned to the claimant for correction or other appropriate action.

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In connection with the deadline of 31 December 1947 for filing Philippine Army claims for arrears in pay, the Commanding General, Philippines-Ryukyus Command, wishes to announce that a special concession will be given to heirs of deceased or missing individuals who served in the USAFFE between 8 December 1941 and 6 May 1942, whether in a civilian or military capacity. Such heirs who have not yet filed their claims due to difficulty of securing proof of service in the USAFFE may inquire in person or by mail, postmarked on or before 31 December 1947, at the Recovered Personnel Division, Mandaluyong, Rizal. Any inquiry made on or before this date will be considered substantial compliance with the deadline.

Contrary to popular belief, incomplete claims will be accepted by the Recovered Personnel Division, and supporting papers to complete a claim may be filed after 31 December 1947.

Forms for claims for arrears in pay may be obtained from the Recovered Personnel Division, Mandaluyong, Rizal, or from any RPD Field Team, or District Military Headquarters, Armed Formes of the Philippines, or Red Cross Chapter, or any representative of the Legal Aid Office, Department of Justice. 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

- 1. There are at present several insane Army personnel who have not yet been processed or reprocessed for arrears in pay. The advice of this Office is now sought on the procedure of reconstituting their records and of processing them for arrears in pay.
- 2. While guardians for these personnel may be appointed under the New Rules of Court, the procedure for their appointment is a protracted one. To remedy this situation, this Office is at present preparing a draft of a bill for presentation to Congress when it convenes next January. In the meantime there is an arrangement had with PHILRYCOM that the latter shall have all the papers pertaining to these incompetents prepared in anticipation of the passage of the bill in question. Upon enactment of this Bill, all the pertinent claim papers shall be transmitted to this Office for disposition and settlement.

Processing of Mentally Incapacitated EM or Officer. Chief, PA Br 29 Oct 47

- 1. In processing claims for arrears in pay of EM and officers who are mentally incapcitated (non compus mentis), two courses are opened:
- (a) Claim by duly appointed guardian under Rule 94 of the Supreme Court of the Philippines.
- (b) Claim by representation thru his natural guardian and when the case has been determined, application for appointment of guardian be then made under Rule 94.
- 2. Under Section 1 Rule 94. Who may petition for appointment of guardian for resident. Any relative, friend, or other person on behalf of a resident minor or incompetent who has no lawful guardian, or the minor himself if fourteen years of age or over, may petition the court having jurisdiction for the appointment of a general guardian for the person or estate, or both, of such minor or incompetent. An officer of the Federal Administration of the United States in the Philippines may also file a petition in favor of a ward thereof, and the Director of Health, in favor of an insane who should be hospitalized, or in favor of an isolated leper."
- 5. Cour Proceeding requires expenses. The appointment of a guardian is not practical in all instances as in the determination of me a claim it sometimes proved that the estate of the ward does not warrant the presentation of petition for appointment of a guardian, as in many cases subject have even required to pay back.
- 4. Recommend that the procedure of these cases should be under parageraph 1 Section (b) above, and the steps are as follows;
- (a) A medical certificate issued by competent authority that subject EM or officer is incompetent (non compus mentis).
- (b) Proof of natural guardainship be established and also the persons interested in that case of the ward as heirs.
- (c) That the natural guardian should file form 23 in the name of the ward subscribed that the content therein were to his belief and information to be true and correct.
- (d) That the papers should be processed with the ordinary requirement as required by the regular SOP for the Living Claims Section.
- (e) That the papers shall be processed in the name of the incompetent EM or officer and when finally determined the amount due to the ward that

A deadline date of December 31, 1947, has been amounted, after which date the Recovered Personnel Division will not accept new claims for arrears in pay. Exception will be made for civilian guerrillas recognized after November 1, who will be allowed sixty days to prepare and file their claims. In amounting the deadline date, Colonel Horris H. Warcus, Director of the Division, stated that while it applied to both USAFFE and Civilian guerrillas, he believes most of the USAFFE claims have been received. Many sivilian guerrillas who are entitled to arrears in pay commensurate with the length of active service they rendered and for which they have not already been paid, have not yet filed claims with the Recovered Personnel Division. The mames of most of these persons are known, Colonel Marcus said, but there is no way of contacting them as their present addresses are not on record.

I. DISCUSSION.

a. By the attached C/N (Tab A), the D C & C/S has approved a plan to announce a deadline beyond which claims for arrears in pay will not be accepted by the Recovered Personnel Division.

b. At the time this plan was approved, it appeared that the task of adjudicating claims of the Philippine Army for arrears in pay would extend until July 1948. With the benefit of increased personnel furnished by the Philippine Government, and the training of personnel which was made possible by the suspension of USAFFE payments, the RPD is now adjudicating cases at a rate approximating 50% faster than was contemplated. It therefore appears possible at this time to set a deadline not later than December 31, 1947, at which time it is contemplated that all Philippine Army claims on hand in the RPD will have been adjudicated once and some redeterminations made.

c. The length of time that it will be necessary to maintain the present strength of the RPD after December 31, 1947 will depend upon the receipt of claims which have not yet been received and requests for redeterminations of claims which are now being adjudicated. Since the Missing Persons Act is scheduled to go out of existence in July 1948, it is believed that machinery must be kept open to accept correspondence and make redeterminations until that date. However, such an organization for this purpose might be greatly reduced after Jan 1, 1948. Such a reduction can be safely accomplished after completion of all work on hand only if assurance is given that no further claims will be forthcoming.

d. The Guerrilla Affairs Division expects to complete recognition of all units prior to November 30 and is expending every effort toward completion of individual cases prior to 31 December 1947. Nost of those to be recognized undoubtedly have already filed a claim with the RPD or do not intend to do so. However, in the event GAD initially recognizes a unit or individual after November 30, persons concerned can be notified by RPD that claims, if not already filed, must be submitted within 30 days of date letter of recognition is issued.

- 1. AG Rec Pers Div has recommended (1) that a deadline of December 31, 1947, beyond which no claims for arrears in pay will be accepted by the RPD, be established, and (2) that the RPD be authorized to announce such a deadline date immediately by proper newspaper and radio releases through the office of the PRO. The recommendations have been referred to this office for opinion on the legality of such a step.
- 2. DISCUSSION. a. The recommendations are based on the facts that the Missing Persons Act, as amended, is scheduled to go out of existence on 25 July 1948, and that the length of time necessary to maintain the present strength of the RPD after December 31, 1947, depends upon the receipt of claims not yet filed and requests for redetermination of claims now being adjudicated. The present organization of the RPD might be greatly reduced after 1 Jan 1948 if assurance is given that no further claims will be forthcoming after that date.
- b. The statement that the Missing Persons Act will go out of existence in July 1948 is based on the provisions of P.L. 239-80th Cong. 25 July 1947, which provides for the termination of certain emergency and war powers. Sec 2 of the Act provides: "Notwithstanding the termination date or termination period heretofore provided therefor by law, the following statutory provisions are repealed effective upon the date hereinafter specified, or upon the expiration of the period hereinafter specified, and shall remain in full force and effect until such date or until the expiration of such period. Such statutory provisions are hereby amended accordingly: * * * c. Repeal effective one year after the date of enactment of this joint resolution: * * * Act of March 7, 1942 (56 Stat. 143-148, ch. 166), as amended."
- c. The matter of fixing a deadline for accepting claims for arrears in pay is procedural and one within the province of the Commanding General, PHILEYCOM, to determine in the administration of the Missing Persons Act. As stated above the Missing Persons Act will not become inoperative until 25 July 1948, and, legally speaking, claims may be paid thereunder until such date. However, the acceptance of claims, as distinguished from the payment of such claims, is within the province of the Commanding General to determine, as previously stated, and he may establish a deadline beyond which such claims will not be accepted and in no way be violative of the terms and conditions for payment enunciated under the Missing Persons Act.

Announcement of Deadline for Accepting Claims for Arrears in Pay.

- d. However, in the enforement of this limitation, should the Commanding General so desire this deadline may be relaxed upon a proper showing by the applicant of his reasons for not submitting his claims prior to the deadline announced and a showing that same was not due to a lack of diligence on his part, and such claim may then be properly admitted and processed.
- 3. We therefore interpose no legal objection to the announcement by this Headquarters of a deadline beyond which claims for arrears in pay will not be acceptedby the Recovered Personnel Division.





NEED ITEM

A deadline date of December 31, 1947, has been announced, after which date the Recovered Personnel Division will not accept new claims for arrears in pay. In announcing the deadline date, Colonel Morris H. Marcus, Director of the Division, stated that while it applied to both USAFFE and Civilian guerrillas, he believes most of the USAFFE claims have been received. Many civilian guerrillas who are entitled to arrears in pay commensurate with the length of active service they rendered and for which they have not already been paid, have not yet filed claims with the Recovered Personnel Division. The names of most of these persons are known, Colonel Marcus said, but there is no way of contacting them as their present addresses are not on record.

To correct a misunderstanding which has recently been apparent, it was further announced that no suspension has been placed on adjudication of civilian guerrilla claims. While the Recovered Personnel Division, since July 29, has adjudicated the cases of 40,000 USAFFE personnel, it was pointed out that current cases of civilian guerrillas are being adjudicated at the same time, without any delay.

This Headquarters is making representation in behalf of the ninety-seven (97) flying cadets of the Philippine Army Air Force who were inducted into the USAFFE on 15 August 1941 by Colonel Charles Backes, US Army, then Chief of the Philippine Army Air Force at Zablan Field, Camp Murphy. When the war broke out in December 1941, these cadets, although not commissioned in the Philippine Army, were required to join USAFFE forces in Batasn and Corregidor. Many of them were paid their salaries at the rate of \$150.00 which, at that time, correspond to the base pay of a Third Lieutenant, Philippine Army.
- 2. - 1. The Recovered Personnel Division has been set a deadline of June 30, 1948 for termination of its mission of adjudicating arrears in pay for personnel of the Army of the Philippines by the following factors:
 - a. Funds now authorized but unexpended by June 30, 1948, will revert to the Treasury.
 - b. GHQ FEC has indicated its desire that this deadline be set, by special planning of civilian personnel budget for this organization for the Fiscal Year 1948.
- 2. The Guerrilla Affairs Division is rapidly transmitting the revised recognition dates of guerrilla units to the Recovered Personnel Division for action. No trouble is anticipated in the completion of the recognition of units in sufficient time for this organization to adjudicate the claims. Other factors, however, have presented certain problems to this Division which, at the present time, appear to have no solution.
- 3. In the recognition of guerrilla units, rosters of the units are not always available and it is necessary for this Division to devise methods of identification of personnel by means of recovered records, affidavits, etc. In all cases, the Guerrilla Affairs Division indicates the approximate strength of the units at various time during the period of their recognition. In the adjudication of three (3) large units where rosters or other means of identification are available, it has been found that 43.5% of the individuals belonging to these units have not yet filed a claim for arrears in pay. This is indicated by the following chart:

If this can be used as a criterion there will be a total of approximately 141,810 recognized guerrillas without claims upon completion of our work. On the other hand there are many claims on hand submitted by persons whose entitlement to arrears in pay cannot be established, or who have not been recognized.





- 4. This Division is at a loss to understand the reason for the failure of these persons to submit a claim for arrears in pay, particularly after the wide publicity that has been given to this subject in the newspapers. Every effort has been made through proper publicity to inform the public of this situation but the results have been meager. Teams established at the beadquarters of each Military District (PA), the Red Cross, and a special Legal Section of the Department of Justice (Philippine Republic) are also assisting in this program. There is no way of getting in touch with these persons individually since their addresses are not known. It is felt, however, that the following facts may have some bearing upon the situation.
 - a. Many of these people concerned may be illiterate, although it is felt that they would have been informed by this time by their friends and relatives.
 - b. Some of these persons realizing that their claim is very small, feel that it is not worth the expense and trouble of claiming.
 - e. An undetermined number of these persons may have joined the organization at the time of the landing of the American forces and have received pay from the date of their joining the organization. In such a case, no arrears in pay would be due them. If this assumption is correct, the work load of this Division will be materially reduced.
- 5. Since no funds would be available for the payment of these claims after June 30, 1948, and since a reasonable length of time must be allowed this Division to adjudicate each claim and transmit it to the Army of the Philippines for payment, it is believed that a deadline must, sooner or later, be set beyond which claims cannot be accepted. It is felt that it is a little early yet to announce such a deadline but the policies to be followed by this Division from this point on, must be guided by some definite plan of action. It is therefore recommended:
 - a. That this Division continue as in the past to publicise through newspaper articles and other mediums, the necessity for submitting claims for arreass in pay at the earliest possible date, with a view to establishing a deadline of March 31, 1948 after which no claims will be accepted. The announcement of this deadline date should be made at least 6 months in advance of the date, or about September 30, 1947.

b. That it be assumed, that recognized guerrillas who have not submitted claims by that date fall into one of the three classes mentioned in par 4, a, b, c, above, and will not file claims.

- 1. Beneficiaries of alleged members of the 10th Military District are appearing in RFD for the purpose of submitting claims for arrears in pay. Upon examination of the casualty roster of the 10th Military District submitted by your office, it is found that names of persons whose arrears in pay are being claimed are not listed thereon.
- 2. In these case, under present procedures, claim cannot be accepted and our only alternative is to advise claimants that before claim can be accepted, individual recognition must be applied for and received.
- 3. Problem as stated above was discussed in a telephone conversation with Capt Wilson of your office on 20 May 1947. Capt Wilson stated that the 10th Military District casualty roster had been prepared and submitted, after considerable research, by Capt Felimon S. Lagman, former Adjutant General for the 10th Military District (defunct) and now Adjutant General of the 10th Military District (PA). Capt Wilson suggested that inasmuch as Capt Lagman maintains his office in the 10th Military District Meadquarters in Mindanao, it would be a good procedure to advise claimants who resided in Mindanao to secure an interview with him making request for inclusion on the casualty roster.
- 4. Concurrence is therefore requested in the use of the following procedure in this division for cases of the type described in paragraph 1, above:
- a. Each claimant of the type described in paragraph 1, above, will be furnished a letter substantially as follows (which is self explanatory):

a. Unexpended balance of the 1942-1946 appropriations entitled "Expenses, Army of the Philippines" will, by law, revert to the U.S. Treasury on 1 July 1948.

b. The Recovered Personnel Division widely publicised deadlines for the receipt of claims on 15 Jan 48 and 29 Feb 48 for living and deceased Philippine Army veterans, respectively.

- e. Although present plans provide that all claims received will have been negatively determined or an approved positive determination forwarded to the Chief, Finance Service, Philippine Army on or before 31 May 1948, an established "cut-off" date for forwarding of approved cases to HMDF must be established for the following types of cases:
- (1) Claimants who can prove that they were prevented from filing a claim before the deadline due to circumstances beyond their control.
- (2) Claimants who are dissatisfied with determinations made and request redeterminations. (All claimants who did not receive full pay and allowances are potentially within this category.)
- (3) Miscellaneous types of cases such as those from claimants who did not receive notice forwarded them by this headquarters of incompleteness of papers due to failure of local postal delivery, etc., etc.
- d. Finance Service, and Auditor, HMDF have detailed elerical, administrative and auditing procedures to carry out on each case forwarded by RFD. It is necessary that each case forwarded go through these procedures sufficiently in advance of 30 June 48 for a total figure to be arrived at by Chief, Finance Service so that funds can be advanced by this headquarters on or before 30 June 48.

- 1. At the present time the Recovered Personnel Division of this headquarters is forwarding determinations of status for living and deceased veterans of the former Philippine Commonwealth Army to your Pinance Service for computation and settlement of arrears in pay. Upon receipt of these determinations by your headquarters detailed administrative and auditing procedures are carried cut and individual checks are written on bulk funds previously advanced by this headquarters.
- 2. Due to the non-availability, after 30 June 1948, of funds for expenses of the former Philippine Commonwealth Army it is necessary that a "cut-off" date be established after which cut-off date determinations of status will not be forwarded for settlement. This will give your Finance Service an opportunity to accomplish the required administrative and auditing procedures and compute the total amount of money which will be needed to pay all cases forwarded sufficiently in advance of 30 June 1948 to allow this headquarters to advance the proper amount before appropriations lapse.
- 3. It is requested that you make a review of the situation at this time and indicate by Andorsement hereon your desires in this matter. It is suggested that 15 June 1948 be set as the date on which the last determination will be forwarded by the Recovered Personnel Division.
- 4. Upon receipt of a date which can be mutually agreed upon consideration will be given by this headquarters to the release of publicity announcing it to the public.
- 5. It is suggested that detailed information necessary for use in arriving at this date be secured by conference with the Director, Recovered Personnel Division and the Staff Finance Officer of this headquarters.

ARKRARS IN PAY PROGRAM CLOSES

Major General George F. Moore, Commanding General, PHILEYCOM
announced today that the last approved claim for arrears in pay for
service in the Philippine Commonwealth Army will have been forwarded
to the Chief of Staff, Armed Forces of the Philippines for computation
and settlement next Tuesday, 15 June 1948. He said that the arrears
in pay program now closes after three years of operation, it having
commenced during the liberation in 1944 and 1945. During this period
determinations of status for members of the USAFFE and
determinations of status for civilian guerrilla claims
have been forwarded to the Chief, Finance Service, AFP for computation
and settlement of their arrears in pay. Claims for arrears in pay
have not been accepted from living veterans since 15 January 1948,
nor from beneficiaries of deceased personnel since 29 February 1948.

General Moore said that the period 15 June to 30 June 1948 would be utilized by the Chief, Finance Service, AFP, Camp Murphy, for the purpose of making final computations of the amount of money involved in all approved claims not yet computed. On or before 30 June 1948 the Chief, Finance Service will have received from the U.S. Army a sufficient amount of money in a lump sum to pay all approved cases. General Moore said that it was necessary to close down the approval of claims and more prior to the date when appropriations lapsed in order

time to make final computations of the amount of money involved in all approved claims not yet computed and to audit and complete the necessary administrative action connected with the program. The Chief, Finance Service, AFP will continue after 30 June to make payments from funds allotted for all claims which were approved prior to 15 June 1948 until all approved claims have been paid.

General Moore stated that the Recovered Personnel Division at
Mandaluyong, Rizal, would be permanently closed to claimants insofar as
arrears in pay of the Philippine Army is concerned, and would be reorganised prior to 1 July 1948 to provide a records depot which would be a
reservoir of information for the U.S. Veterans administration for
that organization ause in adjudicating claims for veterans benefits.
General Moore emphasized that claimants should not report to the
Recovered Personnel Division, Mandaluyong area in connection with
arrears in pay since they would be denied access thereto as no records
or personnel will be available for interviewing purposes. The location
of the new records depository is not completely settled at this time,
but in view of the movement of PHILATCOM to the Angeles Area, that site
is being considered.

The General pointed out that a constantly increasing number of letters are being received from claimants appealing the determinations made during the program. He said that appeals filed prior to 15 June 1948 will be processed; however, he stated that some claimants had .

requested redeterminations many times usually without the submission of additional evidence bearing upon their case. He said every request for reconsideration had been given impartial consideration, but that due to the non-availability of appropriated funds all correspondence received on and after 15 June 1948 pertaining to arrears in pay would not be acted upon, but would be returned to the writer with a brief review of the reasons for not taking action.

- 1. Your recent communication with reference to arrears in pay of a member or members of the former Philippine Commonwealth Army is returned herewith without action.
- 2. The arrears in pay program was begun immediately after liberation of the Philippines from the Japanese in 1945. It continued until June 1948, during which time determinations of status and approval for arrears in pay was granted by this headquarters in deserving cases. This program was handicapped by its very nature; records were almost non-existent, especially for members of USAFFE; however, generous and liberal policies for the interpretation of substantiating evidence submitted with claims was set up by this headquarters and every possible effort was made to reinburse those former soldiers of the Philippine Commonwealth Government who so bravely contributed to the liberation of their homeland from the aggressor.
- 3. The payment of this arrears in pay was made from funds appropriated by the U.S. Congress for the expenses of the army of the Philippines for service rendered between 1941 and 30 June 1946. United States law requires that public funds which are not expended within two years after they are obligated for specific purposes must revert to the U.S. Treasury. The action of this law has now taken place with reference to appropriated funds of the United States for expenses of the army of the Philippines. No further action can therefore be taken by this Command upon determinations of status for the purpose of claiming arrears in pay.
- 4. This headquarters will, in the future, cooperate to the fullest extent to assist in the providing of information to the U.S. Veterans Administration when officially requested by that organization for the adjudicating of any benefits which by law may accrue to former veterans of the Philippino Commonwealth Army.

1. With reference to conference of 14 Mar 47 in which it was stated that it would be impossible to provide this division with copies of rosters of the 10th MD (guerrillas under Col Fertig) and 7th MD (under Col Abcede) the following procedure is recommended as a method which can be used to pay arrears in pay to members of these organizations:

- a. The Recovered Personnel Division will not require that the name of a member of the 7th or 10th MD be included on a roster furnished by your office before payment.
- b. Minimum requirements for the adjudication and approval of each claim for arrears in pay of the 10th and 7th MD will be as follows:
 - (1) An affidavit by the claimant showing a complete record of all his military activities on form 23.
 - (2) At least one <u>original</u> official document which proves beyond a reasonable doubt that the claimant was a member of the organization in which service is claimed on Form 23. This original document to be in the form of official orders or rosters properly signed by an officer of the organization or the oath of enlistment or appointment as found in recovered records of the 7th or 10th MD.
 - (3) Information in the form of original records or certificates or affidavits which establish grades held (also see d. below).
- c. On each approval for payment forwarded to the Finance Service, Army of the Philippines, for payment will appear this statement:

"No payment should be made in this case unless this person is shown as having received initial current pay on the payroll of his organization while it was under operational control of the 6th Army, AUS, and no payment should be made if he received current pay in a grade lower than that shown herein. In either event request these papers be returned by indersement hereon stating reason for which returned."

- d. Any cases returned for the reasons given in paragraph c, above will be closed if, current pay was not received, or readjudicated in the lower grade if payment was received in a lower grade.

This procedure is not considered feasible for any other guerrilla command.

Change in Procedure for processing claims in FA Headquarters.

Director, RPD 12 Feb 47

- 1. The following procedure is now being utilized between RPD and Headquarters Army of the Philippines in the case of deceased claims:
- a. HPD furnishes Finance Service, PA with approved adjudication for arrears in pay for deceased personnel.
- b. At the time the document described in (a) above is furnished, the Finance Service, RPD furnishes the JAC, PA with all papers necessary in the making of his determination as to heirs.
- c. The Finance Service, PA, forwards documents described in (a) above, to the Office of the Auditor, PA, for pre-audit and clearance, suspending the case after this clearance until receipt from the JAG of official determination as to names of bonafide heirs.
- d. Upon receipt of names of bonafide heirs by the Finance Service, PA, checks are made out to each heir and delivered to them.
- 2. While the procedure now being followed as described above is a good one, due to the difficulty of obtaining from thousands of claimants the complex papers required in each case for the determination of heirs by JAG, FA, the number of cases that can be adjudicated by RPD is limited. This limitation imposed by the necessity for securing complete "determination of heir" papers prior to adjudication of each case, will eventually result in arrival of the 30 June 1948 deadline prior to completion of adjudication at which time all monies unexpended in present appropriations will revert to the Treasury of the United States.
- 3. With a view to preventing this latter condition, the following procedure, if legal and feasible, within Headquarters Army of the Philippines is proposed:
- a. RPD will forward each case in which adequate evidence is present to enable adjudication (without regard to papers necessay in making determination of heir) to the Finance Service. PA, where, after pre-audit and clearance by the Auditor, a check will be written in favor of the JAG, PA, Legal Administrator of estates for all persons domiciled in the Philippines.
- b. Upon receipt from claimants, RPD will forward papers for the determination of heirs to the JAG, FA, on cases forwarded to Finance Service as described in la, above.
 - c. Upon receipt of papers described in 1b, above, the JAG will,

at leisure, make determination of heirs and write his own check to each heir from the total payment to the estate of that individual received from the Chief, Finance Service.

- 4. While I do not know at this time whether the procedure recommended in par 3, above, is legal it is believed that a conference should
 be organized to determine the legality and feasibility of this procedure
 with representatives of this division; Office of the Finance Service, PA;
 Office of the PA Auditor and Office of the JAG, PA.
- 5. With the procedure recommended above, it will be possible to adjudicate and approve the payment of all deceased claims in advance of the 30 June 48 deadline and allow the JAG of the PA to administer estates after that date.
- 6. Under above proposal, the present procedure of receiving papers from beneficiaries of deceased personnel with which to make determination of heirs would continue to be performed by this division; however, it could at any future date be transferred to the Philippine Army with personnel now employed in this phase of the procedure.

- 1. The following procedures governing the payment of all Terminal Date Guerrillas processed by Terminal Date Team No. 1 subsequent to 27 December 1946 have the concurrence of the Chief of Finance, HaP, and are forwarded for approval.
 - a. Terminal Date Guerrillas will not be paid in cash.
- b. Terminal Date Guerrillas will be identified immediately prior to being processed by answering to their names as called from the recognised rester at which time their immediate Commanding Officer will identify them. Officers will not be processed until all men of their unit have been processed except that the processing of officers of one Company or Battalion may not be suspended while awaiting the processing of another Company or Battalion of the same regiment.
- o. In the case of EM, Inclosure No. 1 will be completed during processing and will be certified to by the Guerrilla CO. In the case of Guerrilla CO's, Inclosure No. 2 will be completed and will be certified to by the PA Summary Court Officer. Both Inclosure No. 1 and 2 will be attached to the payroll and form 23 to which they pertain.
- d. The stamp formerly placed on the Ferm 23, which provided a space for the payer to receipt for each received, will no longer be used.
- e. After processing, claiments (Terminal Date Querrillas) will be instructed to leave the MPD area and will be given a brief explanation to the effect that their claims will be adjudicated and they will receive payment by check at their homes (the mailing address which is listed on Inclosures No. 1 and 2).
- f. After Companies or similar units have been processed (as sompletely as possible) the Company Commander will prepare the payroll for those members who were processed. The payroll will be prepared under the supervision of Philippine Army Officers of the Terminal Date Team. The payroll will not be signed, by the payee, due to the fact that payments will be made by check, however, the OIC of the TD Team and Guerrilla CO will sign the payroll as indicated in paragraphs g and h below.

- g. Inclosure No. 3 WD Form 366 will be used in the preparation of the payroll for EM. Both the Unit CO and the PA Officer in charge of the Processing Team will sign the 1st certificate.
- h. Inclosure No. 4 is the form to be used in the preparation of officer's payrolls and will be signed as indicated.
- i. Upon completion of the procedures outlined above, the payrell Form 23 and all supporting papers will be forwarded to the Operations Section.
- j. The Operations Section will organize and have trained personnel to conduct a final review of all TDG forms and the payroll. Special attention will be given to the Guerrilla services as listed on the Form 25 and all procaution will be taken to insure against the payment for POW and Civilian status.
- 2. Terminal Date Team No. 2, presently processing Magsaysay's Guerrillas in Zambales province will continue to pay in cash until the teams return to Manila or until the back-log for Magsaysay's Guerrillas is completed.

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


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

- 1. Recovered Personnel Division has received numerous request from recognized guerrilla personnel asking that they be assigned army serial numbers. It is believed that the assignment of ASN's is part of the "initial processing" given all guerrillas at the time they report to military control. The basis for the request is to enable the individuals to receive their current pay. Guerrillas requesting initial processing are of three categories as follows:
 - a. Those who have never reported to military control.
- b. Those recently recognized who are to remain on active duty in the Philippine Army.
- c. Disabled guerrillas, individually recognized and confined in the hospital.
- 2. This office has never been concerned with initial processing; the misunderstanding seems to have resulted from the fact that RPD conducts processing which is commonly called "reprocessing" and is for the purpose of filing claim for arrears in pay for members of the Philippine Army. It is not known what office or headquarters now conducts the initial processing, however, it is believed that this initial procedure was at one time the responsibility of USATG and until recently was the responsibility of the 86th Inf Div.
- 3. Although not familiar with the full requirements of initial processing, it is believed that HPA is the logical headquarters to assume this responsibility. This is especially true in the case of disabled guerrillas, due to the fact that the Commanding Officer, Detachment of Patients at the 1st Gen Hosp, PA maintains complete records on the individuals since their entry into the hospital. Also the assignment of ASN must originate with The Adjutant General, HPA.
- 4. In order to establish a policy and to clarify the views of Recovered Personnel Division, it is recommended that the following procedure be suggested to the Chief of Staff, PA:
- a. The Commanding Officer, Detachment of Patients, 1st Gen Hosp, PA should be directed to assign army serial numbers allocated by The Adjutant General (PA) and that he inform G-1, PA of the date that the individual was admitted to the hospital.
- b. HPA make arrangements to initially process the small remainder of cases pertaining to individuals who are not confined in the hospital.
- c. Upon completion of the action stated in a and b, above, special orders be issued by HPA placing the individual on active duty.
 - 5. Request your concurrence or comment.

CLAIMS DIVISION MEMORANDUM NO. 99.

Procedures for the development and settlement, in the Philippine Islands, of claims for arrears of pay and allow-ances of deceased Filipinos who served in the Army, including the Philippine Scouts, the Navy, or as civilian employees of any executive department or establishment of the United States, where death occurred on or after December 8, 1941.

In view of the cessation of hostilities in the Pacific Area and changed conditions resulting therefrom, and the present availability of adequate facilities for the prompt processing of claims for arrears of pay and allowances of the personnel indicated above in the United States, the assignment of personnel of the General Accounting Office to the Philippine Islands for the purpose of establishing therein an office for the settlement of such claims as directed in Claims Division Memorandum No. 91, August 2, 1945, will not be made and the project is abandoned. Claims Division Memorandum No. 91, August 2, 1945, is accordingly rescinded.

Claims on behalf of the involved estates will be presented by the Judge Advocate General of the Philippine Army, or his designated delegate, to the Army Service Forces, Office of the Fiscal Director, Office Special Settlement Accounts, 27 Pine Street, New York, New York (where the accounts involve members of the military forces or civilian employees of the War Department), and to the Mavy Department, Bureau of Supplies and Accounts, Field Branch, 13th Street and Euclid Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio (where the accounts involve members of the Naval forces or civilian employees of the Mavy Department). The accounts will be stated in the said offices in accordance with established practices, whereupon the stated accounts together with appropriate administrative reports with claims attached will be transmitted to the Claims Division, General Accounting Office, Washington, D. C., for such further development as may be required, settlement, and the issuance of certificates of settlement. Certificates of settlement will be scheduled to such Army and Navy disbursing officers for payment as may be indicated . by the War and Navy Departments from time to time.

COPY

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Where no balance appears due in any particular account, the claim will be disposed of by the Claims Division by letter or certificate of disallowance addressed to the Judge Advocate General of the Philippine Army, or his delegate, and copies shall be furnished Office Special Settlement Accounts, and Navy Department, Bureau of Supplies and Accounts, Field Branch, Cleveland, Ohio. Complaints of parties in interest will be referred to the Judge Advocate, or his delegate. Appeals by the Judge Advocate General, or his delegate, relative to the amount allowed or disallowed, or for any other reason will be referred in the usual manner to the Comptroller General of the United States, Washington, D. C.

No account of any decedent herein will be settled unless and until proper claim is received in the Claims Division, General Accounting Office from the Judge Advocate General of the Philippine Army, or his delegate.

No account of any decedent herein will be settled unless claim is filed on behalf of heirs, the existence of whom must be known to the claiming officer of the Philippine Government, and his certificate to the effect that claim is filed on behalf of known heirs in each case will be sufficient for the purposes of settlement, without further proof or evidence of identity of the various heirs, unless the circumstances in particular cases so require.

Until the volume of these claims has been processed, the War and Navy Departments will deliver the claims and attached accounts to the Claims Division, General Accounting Office, under separate cover, distinctively marked, and distinguishing claims involving civilian employees from those on behalf of personnel of the armed forces. Upon receipt, they will be promptly processed and certificates of settlement will be scheduled to proper disbursing officers under separate cover with appropriate and distinctive marking: i.e., "Philippine Accounts".

PROCEDURE FOR EFFECTING SETTLEMENT OF ARREARS OF PAY OF CERTAIN DECEASED FILIPINO PERSONNEL

- 1. Purpose. The purpose of this memorandum is to expedite the setthement of claims for arrears of pay due deceased Filipino personnel of the War Department, military and civilian, whose estates are to be administered under Philippine Commonwealth Act No. 675 of July 24, 1945.
- 2. Procedure for Processing. a. Claims for amounts due the estate of deceased Filipinos will be accepted only when presented over the signature of the Judge Advocate General of the Philippine Army, or his duly authorized representative. Proof or evidence of identity of heirs is not required, unless warranted by circumstances in particular cases. Therefore, the Judge Advocate General of the Philippine Army will submit a claim form indicating that such claim is submitted on behalf of heirs whose existence is known to him, in substantially the following form:

In the event that the claim is made by another efficer acting under delegated authority, the claim form will show his name, grade and title.

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A copy of the instrument delegating authority to any officer to act for the Judge Advocate General of the Philippine Army and a copy of all changes, new authorizations or rescissions will be promptly forwarded to the Claims Division, General Accounting Office, Washington 25, D.C.

The Office of Dependency Benefits, Special Settlement Accounts
Division, 213 Washington Street, Newark 2, New Jersey, is charged with
the responsibility for the developing and processing of these cases to
the Glaims Division, General Accounting Office, for settlement. However,
since in some cases certain details as to the financial status of the
deceased are lacking, it is essential that a determination of the status
of the decedent since date of last payment in full be made. Accordingly,
the certified claim of the Judge Advocate General of the Philippine Army
will be forwarded to the Adjutant General, Headquarters, USAF Western
Pacific, who will determine the status of the decedent during the entire
period since date of last payment in full. A copy of the report of
determination in each case will be attached to the claim and forwarded to
the Office of Dependency Benefits, Special Settlement Accounts Division,
213 Washington Street, Newark 2, New Jersey.

b. The Special Settlement Accounts Division will prepare an administrative report or a departmental settlement of account in each case in accordance with present policies and procedures established for that office for transmittal to the General Accounting Office, Claims Division, 3800 Newark Street, N.W., Washington 25, D. C. These claims and attached papers will be transmitted under separate cover, distinctly marked distinguishing claims involving deceased civilian employees from those submitted on behalf of military personnel.

- e. The office of the Fiscal Director, Headquarters, USAF Western Pacific, is designated as the paying office for Certificates of Settlement issued by the General Accounting Office in Filipino cases. The General Accounting Office agreed to schedule these certificates to the paying office under separate cover with appropriate and distinctive markming, i.e., "Philippine Accounts."
- d. The designated paying office will pay the amounts certified to be due in each case to the Judge Advocate General of the Philippine Army for distribution to the heirs in accordance with Commonwealth Act No. 675 of July 24, 1945. Copy of the Certificate of Settlement issued by the General Accounting Office in each case (Form 40g, Notice of Payment of Settlement, to accompany check) will accompany the payment.
- e. Where no belance appears due in any particular account, the claim will be disposed of by the Claims Division, General Accounting Office, by letter or certificate of disallowance addressed to the Judge Advocate General of the Philippine Army, or his delegate, and copies shall be furnished the Special Settlement Accounts Division. Complaints of parties in interest will be referred to the Judge Advocate General, or his delegate. All processing teams have been directed to stop processing all regular and terminal date guerrillas who indicate their status to be or to have been that of Phil Scout and to forward the individual's name, rank and ASN and any allied papers to Project "J" Branch. At the same time these former Scouts are directed to report to military control if they have not already done so.

- e. All papers in his case should be forwarded to this branch together with a certified extract of the roster upon which his name appears. The certified extract is very important and should include all information -- particularly dates of recognition and grade.
- d. If he has a current military status, full information as to grade, serial number and military address should be obtained and forwarded to this branch.
- 3. This branch will determine in each case whether or not the individual has, in fact, a Scout status, and, if so, what action has been taken with respect to arrears in pay. If he has already been paid as a scout for the period of recognition as a guerrilla the case will be considered closed. If he has not been so paid, this branch will redetermine his case so as to give him a casualty status under the Missing Persons Act for any unpaid period between the dates of recognition. A certified true extract of the roster is considered sufficient justification for such a redetermination.
- 4. If it is determined that the individual has no Scout status, the case will be referred back to the Philippine Army Branch with a statement to that effect.

"A. IDENTIFICATION OF SOLDIER IN PA

1. A person's identity as a member of the Philippine Army will be established by one or more of the following papers:

a. Special Orders calling him to active duty;

b. Special Orders of promotion dated prior to 7 May 1942;

e. Orders of appointment or certificate of membership issued by a recognized guerrilla leader;

d. Official rosters of personnel compiled by unit

e. Other official military records preserved by the claimant and found to be genuine and satisfactory;

f. (1) In the case of PA officers only, affidavits of two disinterested commissioned efficers who know the facts, preferably of a grade equal to or higher than the rank of the claiment, and whenever possible such affidavits to be those of the Commanding Officer and Executive Officer of the unit concerned.

(2) In the case of PA enlisted personnel only, affidavits of any two commissioned officers conversant with facts, or any two noncommissioned officers conversant with the facts who are equal to or higher in grade than the claimant.

B. FROMOTIONS IN PA

1. Confirmation of a claimed promotion will be based upon evidence deemed to be reasonably conclusive of the fact that promotion was made by a recognized commander and that the individual performed duties there-under commensurate with the grade. This will ordinarily be established by one or more of the following:

a. Special Orders issued by a competent authority announcing the promotion;

ADJUDICATION

- 1. Adjudicate by organizations, the Philippine Army to furnish chart of organizations, and list of officers assigned thereto. A personnel liason officer from each organization, with available records, be attached to Recovered Personnel Division as source of information.
- 2. The criterion to be used in determination of rank where no records are available will be actual duties performed. (I am informed by officers now on duty at Camp Murphy that Lieutenant Colonels there never command more than a hundred men and performed no duties commensurate with rank, while Captains commanded full strength companies.)
- 3. Claims of enlisted men should be supported by affidavit of officers, or non-commissioned officers when officers' affidavits are not available. Claims of officers should be supported by affidavits of officers of equal or higher grade.
- 4. Confirming orders will be issued by Philippine Army Headquarters upon receipt of directive from this headquarters.

LOYALTY

- 5. Separate loyalty affidavit is unnecessary when affidavit for Philippine Army Personnel, PA AGO Form 23 is used, as paragraphs 2.a.(5) and 4.a.(2) cover the subject. Recommend continued use of above form.
- 6. CIC check to be made in all cases. (Maj Hanna, Evaluation Section, 1st CIC Region, states that if we furnish personnel "American it can and should be accomplished.)
