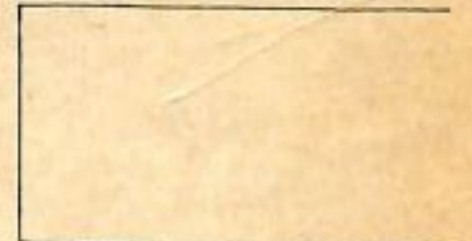

The following duties of MEMBERS of the GUARDS are hereby published for information and guidance of all concern:

SERGEANT OF THE GUARD

The (Commander) Sgt. of the guard is responsible for discipline and instruction of the guard and the manner in which its duties are performed. He supervise the performance of duty by other enlisted men. He is habitually present at the guardhouse and forms the guard whenever it is turned out. He prepares lists of the guard and causes the corporals to make frequent inspections of the sentinels.

He holds the key to the guardhouse, verify the count of prisoners and inspect the guardhouse and premises whenever he consider it necessary.

Takes orders from the CO and DO only, except that in case of alarm of any kind and at a time of great danger, the senior line Officer present is competent to give necessary orders for the employment of the guards.

Reports (old or new Sgt. of the guard as the case may be) to the CO or his representative as follows: Salutes upon presenting himself. The old Sgt. of the guard standing on the right side of the new Sgt. of the guard. "Sir, I report as old Sgt. of the guard," and presents the guard report. When the CO or his representatives notifies the old Sgt of guard that he is relieved, the latter salutes and retires.

ne new Sgt. of the guard again salute and report as new Sgt. of the guard," After receiving these instructions he salutes and retires.

He sees himself and the guards inform as where to locate the ~~for~~ OD at any time.

CORPORAL OF THE GUARD

The Cpl. on duty forms and posts his relief. During the hours for challenging, he advances any person who approaches the guardhouse. He sees to it that a sentinel is relieved when said sentinel calls RELIEF and notifies the Sgt. of the guard if the sentinel calls the GUARD. He acts as Sgt. of the guard when the latter is absent.

BUGLER OF THE GUARD

To sound all calls at ~~fall~~ ^{all} time and such calls as ordered by CO, ~~Officers and Non-Comm off.~~ of the guards.

PRIVATE OF THE GUARD

He should know his General and special orders.
He should present a neat and soldierly appearance and have his arms and equipments thoroughly clean.
To be alert in receiving verbal instructions from CO, Officers and noncommissioned officers of the guard and transmit same to his relief.
Every sentinel is required to memorize, UNDERSTAND and EXECUTE properly all general and special orders relative to his post.

NOTE: Challenging hours begin from 6:00 PM till 6:00 AM the following day.

In the course of their inspection, Supervising Agents, agents, agent's assistants, and examiners are hereby required to take along with them copies of said correspondence and assessment notices in order to verify the status of collection of the taxes, surcharges and penalties assessed, and otherwise to take such steps as would insure the prompt collection of the tax.



- I. MAPS - Situation Map No. 1, 130th Infantry.
- II. MISSION:
To resist enemy drive to Agusan through the Davao-Agusan National Road and other trail approaches.
- III. ENEMY:
 1. Strength - 65,000 Japanese regular troops, approximately 15,000 armed Japanese civilians, approximately 300 BCs and 200 armed Moros and rabid Pro-Japs Philippine civilians.
 2. Locations - See Situation Map.
- IV. AVENUES AND POSSIBLE ROUTES OF ENEMY ADVANCE:
 1. The most probable and principal route of enemy advance is through the Davao North Road.
 2. The next most probable enemy route of advance is via the national highway up to Km 55 (Magugpu), thence via trails through Kilagding and Binucayan.
 3. The third possible enemy route is via the Davao Penal Colony through the railway to Anibonigan, Kinamayan, then by trail to Kapaleng following the Libuganon River and again by trail to Binucayan.
- V. OUR TROOPS:
 1. Dispositions:
 - a. Advance CP of Regiment - Magugpu.
Rear CP of Regiment - Sawawon.
 - b. The first Battalion with Hq at Davao Penal Colony, total strength of 16 officers and 304 EM with 291 arms, will resist enemy infiltration to the interior area of Kapaleng. The following approaches should be covered:
 - (1) The railway line from Tuganay to Anibonigan;
 - (2) The road from Ising to Davao Penal Colony;
 - (3) The trail from Nanie to Davao Penal Colony.

c. The second Battalion, plus Combat Co and Co "I", with Hq at Madaum, total strength of 25 Officers and 410 EM, with 412 arms will resist enemy advance through the Davae-Agusan Road and through the various trails via Sawawon, Kilagding thence to Binucayan. The following approaches should be covered:

- (1) The coast line between Madaum and Macu;
- (2) The main road across Bingeuñgan;
- (3) Madaum-Km 48 Road;
- (4) Madaum-Magugpu trail;
- (5) The trail from the mouth of Tagum River to Km 45;

d. The third Battalion minus Company "I" with Hq at Magugpu, total strength of 13 officers and 208 EM with 178 arms will resist the enemy advance via the Davae North Road and the Agusan River. This unit must engage the enemy in a delaying action until the 2nd Bn has taken defensive positions around Magugpu.

2. Lines of Resistance:

a. In the event that the enemy attempts to push via the Davae North Road, Combat Company supported by Company "E", now holding defensive positions along the north bank of the Tagum River, should deny enemy crossings over the river. The Combat Company outpost at Tuganay (Km 41) must harass enemy troops taking the highway from Km 41 to Km 44.5. It is possible that simultaneous beach landing will be effected along the Madaum-Macu coast line. Should a beach landing be effected, Cos "F", "G", "H" and "I" must resist said beach landing. Should an advance along the Davae North Road be made without beach landing, Cos "F", "G", "H" and "I" will withdraw to the rear and establish a line of resistance along the Pagsabañgan, Magugpu and Km 62 area. In the event that the Combat Company and Company "E" would not be able to hold enemy advance via Bingeuñgan, these units will withdraw and establish defensive positions with the rest of the 2nd Bn.

b. The third Battalion will establish alternate defensive positions along the road up to Km 106 and should the enemy be able to advance up to Km 106, defenses along the Agusan River Bank should be established.

FIELD ORDERS No 8, 130th INF, 31 Oct '44

a. The 1st Battalion will withdraw to Kapaiong and resist enemy advance via the Anibongan railway, the Libuganon River and the trails from Pagsabañgan to Maniki and from Cabayañgan to Maniki.


VI. SUPPLY DEPOT:

Each Battalion must establish their food depot in the interior along their respective line of retreat. The Regimental depot for food and ammunitions will be designated from time to time.

VII. HOSPITAL AND FIRST AID STATIONS:

Hospital and first aid stations will be designated from time to time as troop dispositions are altered.

VIII. Battalion Commanders should prepare their respective Field Orders covering in detail the above-mentioned subjects. Unit Commanders must be thoroughly familiar with locations of principal and alternate defensive positions, route of withdrawals and strategic places where the enemy could be ambushed. As we always expect a numerically superior and better armed enemy, all units shall at all times resort to guerilla system of fighting. With our number and arms, no attempt should be made to engage the enemy along the open highway. Attacks and harassing should be sporadic and from all directions in order to puzzle the enemy. Their line of supply should be disrupted in every possible way.



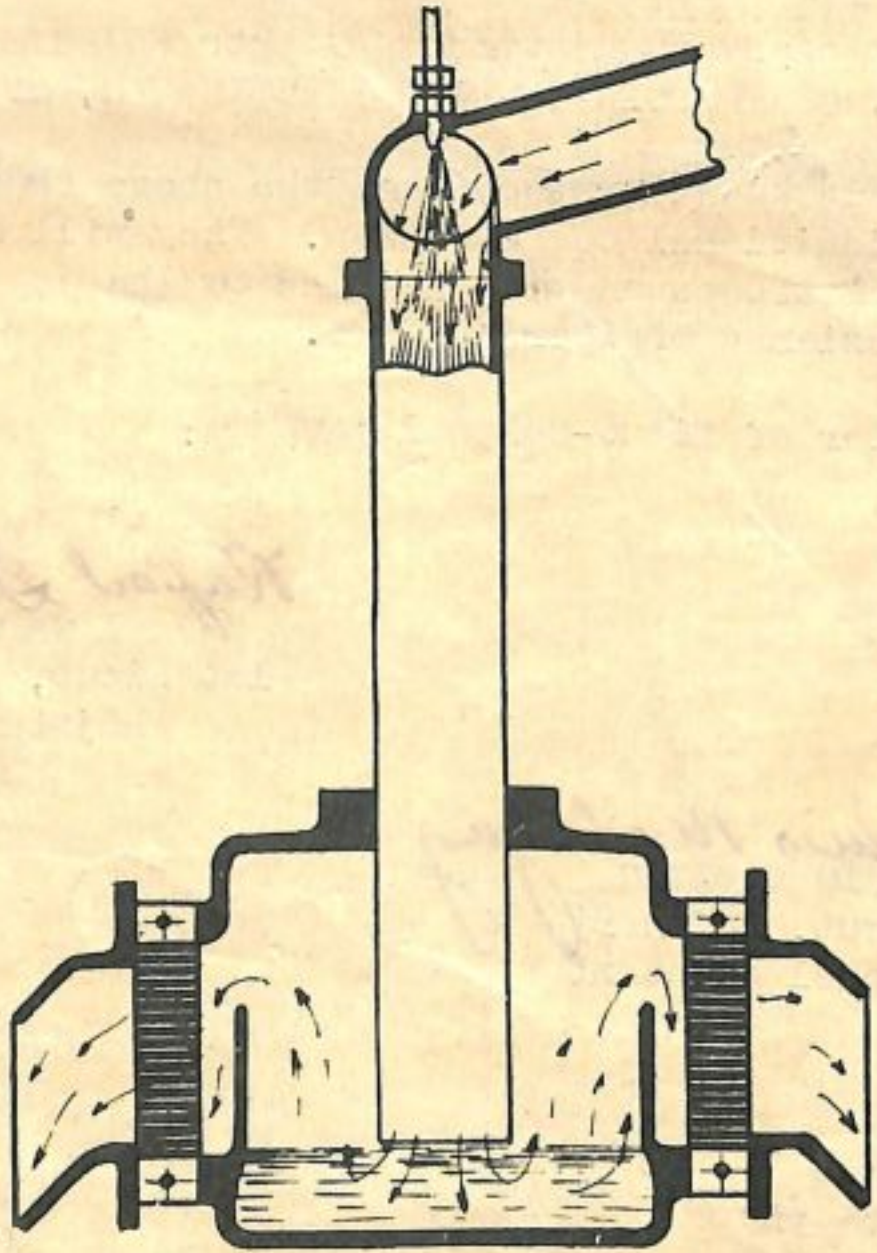


Figure 12.- Arrangement with water atomization and dabbling before gas issue from the plate devices.



Battalion reserve line will be in the crossing of Magupco and the Regimental Reserve line is located 200 meters behind the Battalion Reserve Line.

c. Four hundred (400) meters from the river bank behind Lawaan and Mabaus is the 81 mm Mortar emplacement. Two minutes after enemy engagement firing of the mortar will commence.
d. Reinforcement from Company L shall be a part of the reserve.
4. Rations will be sent to your area at 0530. Collecting aid station is with the Reserve.
5. My Command Post is 400 meters at the rear of Mabaus area.

2. Information about our friendly troops-

- a. Air Force support will bomb and strafe the Regimental objectives at a designated time.

- c. Gen Serv Troops will be at the rear behind Cos "K" and "I" for commitment in case necessary.
- d. Units of the 1st Bn, 130th Inf, occupy the right flank up to Aniboñgan area.

3. Mission-

- a. To capture Ising and its vicinity and immediately after bombing and strafing have been lifted, to proceed as far as Manay-Panabo-Cagañohan-road for the next line of defense.

b. The 130th Infantry will be committed to capture said objective at the disposal of the Regtl Comdr. Prior to attack at the zero hour the following dispositions relative to their assembly areas are:

- (a) Co "G" at Bincoñgan.
- (b) 2nd Bn minus Co "G" at Madaum to Maco beach.
- (c) Prior to attack the approach march begins from their assembly areas immediately after the air support has been lifted.

All Companies attacking Ising will assault the garrison at a given zero hour from the Regtl Comdr, at the time when the companies are all at their respective final positions.

4. Dispositions:

- (a) Co "G" and Combat Co will move at the same time to Km 36. Combat Co will build their defense line along the road to prevent enemy reenforcement from Panabo to Ising and at the same time will commit a portion of its strength to take care of the retreating Japanese from Ising.

1. Information about the enemy:

a. Ising - The enemy at Ising strength of which is not determined is well entrenched in their tunnels and pill-boxes, capable of making penetration under cover of darkness into our lines; capable of delivering fires from their pill-boxes and inviting fires from our front line units. Their tunnels were able to withstand saturation bombings for three consecutive days, indicating the strength of their fortifications.

b. Kms 36 and 38 area - Enemy reported to have been making trenches and dugouts along the rear for possible defense and stand in this area against any drive towards the south.

c. Panabo-Lasang-Naño area - Undetermined strength, activities not known and the possible source of reinforcement and reserve for the Ising sector.

d. Probable Line of Action:

(1) To make a stand at Ising and stage a delaying action against a drive towards Davao City.

(2) To make a drive towards the north and break our lines to give more relief from a possible pressure on the southern sector.

2. Our Troops:

a. Our troops are presently in defensive positions as follows:

(1) 1st Bn on the extreme right on the north bank of Ising River.

(2) GSS on the left of 1st Bn and also on the north bank of Ising River.

(3) 2nd Bn minus Cos "F" and "G" is on the right side of Ising-Bincuan Road and to the left of GSS, extending the line formed by the 1st Bn and GSS.

(4) Combat Co is on the left side of Ising-Bincuan Road, extending the line formed by the 1st Bn and GS.

(5) 3rd Bn minus Co "L" on the left side of Combat Co extending the line formed by units on its right on the north bank of Ising River.

(6) All the above units have assumed defensive positions forming a line of defense along the north bank of Ising River.

(7) Co "G" is guarding the trails coming from Kms 36 and 38 leading to Tuganay River and serving as security on our left flank and also a warning unit against possible enemy flanking attack from the garrisoned area at Tuganay.

(8) Co "L" is around the mouth of Tagam River and serves as a security against enemy threat from that area towards Bincuan.

(9) Our troops has a high morale inspite of almost two weeks of operation.

3. Mission:

a. To hold enemy drive towards Davao-North Road.

4. Disposition:

a. Units will stay in their present location and hold any enemy attempt to cross the Ising River.

b. Alternate Line of Defense - Tuganay River.

Should pressure from the enemy force us and make the defense of Ising River impossible, the units will assume alternate defensive positions with units disposed as follows:

- (1) 1st Bn to defend Manipis-Anibogan area.
- (2) GSS to form a line to the left of 1st Bn.
- (3) 2nd Bn minus Cos "F" and "G" on the right side of the road and to join front with the left flank of GSS.
- (4) Combat Co will assume defensive position on the left side of the road north of Tuganay river and extend the line formed by the units on his right.
- (5) 3rd Bn minus Co "L" will assume defensive positions along the trails leading to Km 41.
- (6) Co "G" will retire and join Co "L" at the mouth of Tagam River.

c. 2nd Alternate Line of Defense - Binaugan River.

Should the enemy still continue their drive to the north all units except 1st Bn who will defend Anibogan River will retire to the north bank of Binaugan River in the same order mentioned in the preceding paragraph. Cos "G" and "L" will remain at the mouth of Tagum River as flank protection.

d. If withdrawal is effected to assume alternate positions respective unit Comdrs will provide delaying action to make the withdrawal to alternate position organized and without confusion, units on the left side of the road taking the direct route on the left side of the road to their alternate position, likewise units on the right will take the withdrawal route on the right side of the road to their alternate defensive lines. No withdrawal to alternate positions will be made without specific orders from this headquarters.

5. Administrative Details:

a. My CP is at Km 40.5 and will be moved accordingly depending on developments. We have only limited supply of ammunition. Use your ammunition sparingly to save targets. Bn aid stations will stay where they are and move to the rear accordingly adjusting their movements to the movements of their units. Co kitchen will stay where they are and adjust their distance with the front line units.

a. In the absence of Training Regulations on combat principles of the rifle squad the followings are hereby published as guides on squad tactics:

(1) ESTIMATE OF THE SITUATION

(a) Estimate of the situation.- (1) Description - When the squad leader is given a job to do, there are certain things he should think about before beginning to work. In a fight, unless he follows some system, he may not take into account everything that he should do before starting to carry out his orders.

(2) Estimate for the squad - When the squad is acting alone or is lost to control of the section leader, the squad leader often has to consider all of the steps given in the estimate. When the leader is under control of the section leader, however, there may be only two or three points that the squad leader must consider.

(3) Form for the estimate of the situation -

(a) What is my job? What am I to do?



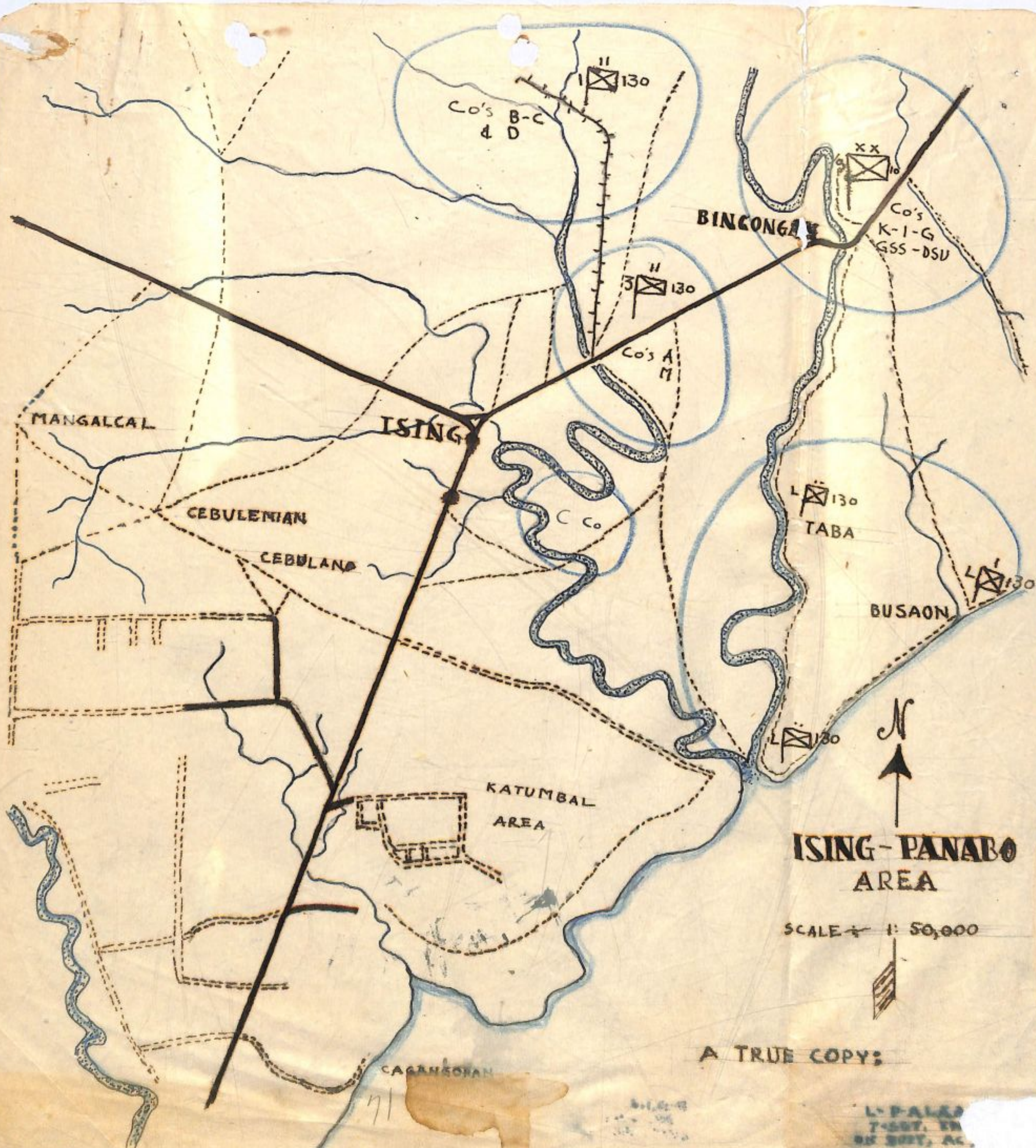
