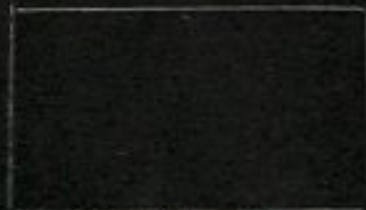

On August 6, 1944 at one o'clock in the morning one large-sized plane appear over the City ; and after dropping ~~xxx~~ a (3) small bombs in to the sea fled causing damage . Today another enemy plane approached the same area, but took to flight before reaching Davao? This is the exact word or statement in the Tribune. I have the Tribune in my position , this action might cause damage over that islands of our beloved Philippines, but it is only stated by the Japs that bomb dropped over Davao did not cause any damage, this might be the beginning of actions in this Islands and operation as everybody is predicting the liberation of our beloved Philippines.

2. They had successfully accomplished their mission; contacted civilians in Ambuloao, Bokod areas and vicinities, also liberating forces in that sectors.

3. Most of the 6,700 populations of Bokod Municipality and Kabayan with a population of 5,450 evacuated to Baguio while others civilians who are sick of Malaria, Dysentery, and Influenza, due lack of medicine and food supplies, and many are dying.

4. At present all sick civilians are concentrated in Bokod Central, and Ambuloao, while civilians in Kabayan who were un-able to evacuate in Baguio are behind the enemies. However they were informed to evacuate to Baguio, if they have possible way to get out from the foes.



1. On September 17 & 18, 1942, raids and ambushes in Benguet and La Union on enemy locations and columns were conducted jointly by our men under Lt. Acop and other troops, under Capt. Burnett.

Results - (a) Of the Japanese patrol patrolling Naguillian, La Union, 78 Japanese were killed and many seriously wounded. On our side, 9 killed.

(b) 4 truck loads of Japanese soldiers were all killed at Zablan, Benguet. Casualty of Japanese included Americans and Filipino drivers of trucks.

(c) Japanese Garrison of 9 Japanese soldiers at Tuba, La Union were all killed.

(d) One Officer and 4 enlisted men of the Japanese garrison at Teacher's Camp, Baguio were killed in a raid there under Cadet Lara.

1. This morning may be the beginning of another chapter in our military career. Beginning last night and until this morning when I received the whole text of the message rendered through KEMH by General WAINWRIGHT which proposed the surrender of the remaining United States and Philippine Forces in the Philippines, I am burdened with a momentous decision. In as much as the radio message of General WAINWRIGHT was in a form of an order it makes my burden greater. As a good soldier there is only one course for us to follow and that is to obey the order. But to obey this particular order it is necessary to look into the circumstances that has influenced the issuance of such orders and also the objectives, that is wanted to be attained. It is clear from his message that the order he gave has not the sanction of the Commanding Officer, by General MACARTHUR. When General MACARTHUR left the Philippines he was of the opinion that the Philippine-American Forces in the Philippine Islands will hold their ground until such time that reinforcements from the United States will come. He must have been shocked when received the notice of the fall of Bataan. Although that odds were against them. From his own broadcast in his headquarters we can divine that he viewed it with bitterness, not so much against the valiant heroes that defended Bataan, but he considered that they could have held out much longer. And as a result of such bitterness he endeavored to send over the Philippines a bombing expedition under a General Officer. The damage done by such expedition was enormous considering that there were only thirteen that came over. And he must have been glad to know that only one of these planes was disabled. The fall of Corrigidor must have further embittered his heart. But he has one promise that he officially made. "He came from the Philippines and he is coming back."

2. With the fall of Corrigidor and Bataan the war is not ended. Fighting is continuous in all other fronts outside of the Philippines. In fact in the Philippines it is true from what has been enumerated. From the message of General WAINWRIGHT, we have been informed that fighting has been going on on almost all the principal islands. The motive of the issuance of the instruction of General WAINWRIGHT were enumerated in his own instructions, principally for humanity sake and to prevent further loss of lives, on those who are defending the four ports of Manila Bay. It was a condition forced on him by forces beyond his control. In other words it is not a desire to end the hostilities in the islands that he gave out this order of surrender, it is not because fighting in the different islands of the Philippines could be wiped out as easily as the hostilities on those four ports. From the entire text of the message we can read that the terms were forced on him in as much as his first proposal was refused

condition of the total surrender of all troops were included. If our Commander-in-Chief of the USARIP had his choice, it is likely that this instruction would not have been issued. If his wish could be materialized, he would not like that fighting would cease in the different islands. Therefore the instruction that was issued was not in accordance with his desire but was forced on him by the circumstances which were beyond his control.

Moreover, from the propaganda dropped by the Japanese planes at 12.00 noon today, General WAINWRIGHT is already a prisoner of war having surrendered May 7, 1942, and as such automatically lose his command over active field forces still in operation (See enclosed copies of the Japanese propaganda.)

3. A Commander-in-the-field is supposed to be given ways and means to exercise his discretion provided he prosecute the principal mission assigned to him. In this particular case the mission has not been revoked. The mission of defending the Island and continuing the fight has not been revoked by higher Headquarters and as such a subordinate may in such case exercise also his own discretion depending upon the attending circumstances. I don't believe for a moment that we shall be condemned by Headquarters of General MACARTHUR such less by the government of the United States of America and by the Commonwealth Government if we refuse the instructions herein enumerated. It will be a disgrace to the history of the Philippines that in such a short time the conquest of the Philippine will be terminated especially when effective guerilla fight is still going on. If this condition were forced on our Commanding Officer by the Japanese, they know that to fight a guerilla war will take much longer time than to subjugate an organized defensive position as Bataan and Corrigidor. We will not be swayed in our Oath of Office. We will not destroy or alienate our allegiance to the United States of America. We will still uphold and protect and defend the Constitution of our Commonwealth. We will continue our activities even in a much modified form. We will endeavor to maintain the integrity of our unit. Because, after all, the greater judge will be the government that give us our mission. Never before in history has the courage of both the Americans and the Filipinos been proven unreliable. And with our own courage and full faith in our God and with the support of the people, our indifference to the orders of our Commander-in-Chief will not only be justified by the Government but also by History itself. Gentlemen: As I said from the start, we are now confronted with the next chapter of our military history and our military career. After this, we might be criticized by the Japanese Government for not carrying out the instructions. But we will show the same gallantry as those heroes of both the Americans and the Philippines whom we can not help but admire. And we will still carry on our duties as we see fit. This will entail privations, this will entail work, hardships that we must show that we are equal to the task. We will not do justice to the soldiers who ably defended Bataan and to all our former fronts if we do otherwise. Now we shall carry on our former mission, the details of which will be discussed much later. Who has anything to say so far? Who has any objection? Who has any dissenting opinion? By your silence, I can infer that you agree with the proposition.

4. The tactical part will be as planned before. Detachment Commanders in several places will give priority to the protection of their foodstuffs and supplies. Records will be hidden except that need to be taken by us, the detail of which will be given to the particular officer concerned. We will reduce our pack and quarter belongings so that we will be very mobile and can move out at a moment's notice. The instruction not to molest the population will be continued. Unit Commanders are given full powers to exercise this discretion in the prosecution of our assigned task. What we are trying to accomplish is to keep the need of the organization so that the enemy can not claim that in five months they have completed the conquest.

We will not admit that we are weak. If we are short in materials and personnel, we cannot be short in resourcefulness. If I may paraphrase Churchill, all I can promise you is 'toil, blood and sweat, no tears.

Now your resistance becomes meaningless, so throw away your arms and surrender to the nearest Japanese Army. If you do so the Japanese Army will not do you any harm.

And to all Filipino soldiers, you are under the influence of American propaganda. You have let yourselves be misled by the Japanese to build a brighter and better Philippines with utmost ability. It's not too late for you to surrender if there are any American soldiers who try to stop you from laying down your arms, they are your enemies and are to be shot or killed.

Now therefore, we wish you all in the quickest possible manner to cooperate to build a better Philippines for the Filipinos.

NEWS FROM KGBI
May 10, 1942

Over KGBI at 6:00 P.M. tonight in a news broadcast to the Philippine in English and Tagalog it was announced that from official sources in Washington tonight it was denied that the radio broadcast from KGBI reputedly by Gen. Wainright could not have been by Gen. Wainright himself because it was not Gen. Wainright's voice and because the phrasing of the speech was typically Japanese. Furthermore, since Gen. Wainright had surrendered the day previous he had no control over other forces in the Philippines.
