





Subject: Enemy Encounter

To : CO, 2nd Bn, 14th Inf, USAFIP, NL

1. I hereby report that the enemy had infiltrated at the vicinity of CO "G" CP at GULAC at about 10:00 AM, 9 March 45, location of the CP and the front (see sketch attached).

2. At about 9:30 AM, 9 March 45, it was reported by runners revealing that there were 5 shots heard at SINILE around 1500 yards north of the "G" CO CP.

- a. The CO organized the 3 platoons (1 platoon in reserve) in order to meet and ambush the enemy at sinile.
- b. At 9:40 AM, 9 March 45, the men started, and while enroute to the designated place they are to ambush the enemy, a scout reported again that about 25 Japs were seen at the north bank of GAMAO RIVER, 150 yards north of the CP of this company. Upon receipt of this report, I immediately informed the CO to recall all the armed men enroute to sinile to occupy and defend the south bank of the river, making a frontage of about 400 yards.
- c. At 10:00 AM, 9 March 45, firing commenced. We maintained fire superiority over the enemy. After 2 hours of engagement, the Japs retreated towards the direction of sinile, thence to Santiago. Our men, personally commanded by the CO, this command, were in hot pursuit of the enemy until the Barrio of sinile near Barrio Patul.

5. Circumstances of capture:

On 11 March 1945, Co. "G" met an encounter in the sitio of Gulac, Sinili, Santiago. The fight commenced at about 10:00 AM and lasted for 2 hours. After the firings the "G" boys crossed the river and verified the casualties in the part of the enemy and found 30 Japs killed, 2 with sabers and believed to be officers and 28 EM. In their findings, our boys and the CO of the company found and took the above booties.

6. No prisoners were taken at the same time.



Subject: Airplane crash
To : CO, 2nd Bn, 14th INF, USAFIP, IL

1. It is hereby reported that a lone US P-38, Serial No. 44-235U, airplane No. J-20-10, accidentally crashed due, perhaps to engine trouble, at about 5:00 AM, 14 March 45, in the vicinity of ARABIAT, ECHAGUE, ISABELA. Pilot was late LYLE ROBB, a lieutenant by rank. The pilot died due to the sudden crash of his plane. The body was severely mutilated, and was taken by Bolo men in that area, and buried at point 34-21.5, San Jose Cemetery (see sketch). The burial was given in a semi-military manner by the CO, 1st "G" Bolo Unit Regiment. Location of crashed plane- point 35.5-22.5.

2. The scene of the crashed plane are big trees and thick talachios which is difficult to locate the pistol claimed to be in the possession of Bender's men. However, a rigid investigation is being conducted by this command in order to gather facts about the missing pistol.

3. The following were salvaged from the wreckage, *on separate cover:*

- a. Radio receiver & transmitter, destroyed (forwarded to Inst HQ already).
- b. One solid gold ring, 14 K
- c. One ring without crown
- d. Two caliber .50 MGs
- e. 145 rds cal .50, and 9 rds cal 20 mmammunitions
- f. One breathing oxygen container
- g. One flashlight without bulb and glass, w/2 batteries
- h. Spare parts of the crashed plane
- i. One wheel with interior and exterior tires.

SUBJECT: S-5 Report, submittal of
TO : CO, 2nd Bn, 14th Infantry

1. In compliance with letter, that HQ dated 4 February 45, to all Company Comdrs, re S-5 reports, the following is submitted:

A- ECONOMIC:

(1) The living condition is miserable. Some are homeless due to ravages of war, and most of the town populace are living in hide outs which could not be avoided. Cost of living is moderate for this period. Japanese war notes are no longer the medium of exchange between civilians. If spent, only between the Japs and their allies. Food rationing is not a problem in the general populace. This command has promulgated an order to all loyal civilians who are now in evacuation places that while in their hideouts food production must not be over-looked. This is principally encouraged with the end in view to keep the flow of supplies for the Army and for them as well.

B- HEALTH & SANITATION:

(1) Health condition in general is normal although the common diseases are prevailing. There are few cases of these diseases. Malaria is the worst disease that molests the members of the command as well as the general public. Due to inadequate supply of medicine to the civilians, this disease is a problem. However, a native medicine known as "dalipauen tree" substitutes the quinine and other drugs to combat this disease.

Estimated cases of the following diseases are:

Malaria -----	70%
Dysentery -----	10%
Tropical ulcer ---	8%
Influenza -----	10%
Beri-beri -----	2%
Typhoid -----	0%
Chronic cold -----	6%
Cholera -----	0%

Majority of children from 1 to 14 years old are underweight. Authority, the former sanitary inspector of Echague, Isabela.

(3) Hospitals - None

Dispensaries - There are 2 dispensaries located at Cordon and Santiago. These dispensaries are no longer in operation, as the personnel evacuated, besides there are no medicines. Sanitary inspectors are not active on both sides. This reason may be due to their fear of contacting us.

(4) There are no local medicines procurable by this command in this area. Medical personnel needed are available in the towns of Cordon and Santiago upon advising them to join us. Volunteer women organization around this area is actively operating for our cause. This organization is known as the Women Auxillary Service. Although it is under same category with that of the Bolo Units, training of members is in full-swing.

In Santiago there is a Japanese hospital operating for their soldiers only.

All medical supplies and equipment should be given priority in so far as future establishment of hospital and dispensary are concerned.

C- MINES, MILLS, FACTORIES, POWER PLANTS:

- a. Several sugar mills iron and wooden are available in this area.
- b. Cotton mill - None
- c. Iron Mill - None
- d. Power plant - None
- e. Rice mill - Two at Cordon, not operating and abandoned by owners. Four at Santiago (2 are functioning but always interrupted by our planes). Estimate out-put of milling per day is about four to five hundred cavans, based from S-2 reports. The mills function at night time only.

D- UTILITIES: POWER, GAS and WATER

1. Utilities - A sixty-horse power electric plant had been functioning but was bombed, location is near the Cine Joven. It is beyond improvement.
2. In this area there is no water plant nor gas operated.

E- FOOD, ANIMAL & VEGETABLE PRODUCTS:

(1) In general both Santiago and Cordon raise rice, camotes, corn, casava, mongoes, unions, eggplants and other perishable vegetables. At present, due to evacuations by civilians to secured places, their farms are neglected, in this way, there will be shortage of food supplies in the future.

No food products are available for shipment else where.

(2) No food formerly available that could be obtainable now.

(3) Agriculture is not very much attended to by civilians due to the fact that civilians are scattered in secured places in order to get away from the enemy thereby abandoning their farms. However, evacuees are encouraged to raise fowls and do some clearing in suitable land for cultivation. In Santiago and Cordon there are 135,000 hectares tillable but only 30% of this area is cultivated. Cattles in ranches are scares presumably due to consumption by the Japanese and the BCs.

(4) The civilians in these areas are adequately fed. They resort to rice, camotes, corns, casava, gabi and vegetables.

(5) Animals are not the problem. Carabaos and horses could be obtainable in this area as a means of transportation.

(6) All US leafy vegetables from Lanchaster Garden, USA, are urgently needed for future cropping.

(7) Fishing industry is not encouraged in this area as there are no suitable fishing ground. Besides of the danger in going to rivers, the people are afraid of the enemy. Fishing, however, is profitable as in this area it affords good fishing grounds and there is demand for same in the market.

(8) Fishing will not be intensively undertaken by the people because all their fishing nets, traps, etc are lost as a result of bombings.

F- COMMUNICATIONS:

(1) Telegraph and telephone station was formerly reported to be in Santiago. Telephone and telegraph wires were collected by our men and about 16 kms long are kept in safe places for future use.

(2) The road from San LUIS-ECHAGUE is of first class road (macadamized). It is passable at all times except the two bridges, at ILOT and the SAN LUIS, which were destroyed by our men during the D-DAY mission commenced. These bridges could be repaired easily in the future by obtaining bridging wood materials from the following places:

- a. Molavé - could be secured at ESTAMPA, CORDON.
- b. YACAL - could be secured at LUCBAN, CORDON.
- c. NARRA - could be secured at BANNAUAG, SANTIAGO and SAN PEDRO, SANTIAGO.

(3) No shipping industry in these areas as there are no navigable rivers. In the shallow rivers, small bancas are used.

(4) Numbers of bulcarts before the war: 4000 caritelas and 1000 bulcarts. At present, the common carabao sleds are used in transporting supplies in remote places.

(5) Railroad facilities - None

G- FINANCE & FUNDS:

(1) Japanese war notes used by both Cordon and Santiago towns were about P300,000. These composed of municipal and provincial funds. The relative value is none according to the proclamation made by President SERGIO OSME A.

(2) In general bartering is resorted by civilians between the Japanese. The civilians don't like to accept Japs war notes anymore. They prefer bartering their vegetables with soap, salt and matches to the Japanese operating around Santiago. Those who are engaged in this business are authorized by this command to spy their movements, emplacements, dumps and concentrations.

(3) This period, all business enterprises are paralyzed.

H- SITUATION REGARDING ARTICLES OF DAILY USE:

(1) Clothing.- This situation is a problem in all the people in this area. Shortage of this necessity constitutes a serious hardship among the general population. This is, however, remedied by the taos by wearing improvised clothes from bark of trees.

(2) Miscellaneous articles that are obtainable are as follows: baskets and hats made out of nitô vines, pandan mat, wooden tables, chairs, beds, and some cotton cloths locally woven. Pottery is also a business in Cordon area. But at this instant, not one is engaged in this business.

J- HOUSING FACILITIES:

(1) There are sufficient housing facilities in this area such as first class, second class and third class wood to rebuilt temporarily all burned house. Bamboos and bojos are obtainable at low cost. Cogon grass is abundant.

(2) Building materials that are needed are nails, bolts and all hardware, which could not be procured locally.

In general they are all pro-Filipinos. They have served or accepted their positions at the point of threat. However, individual reinvestigation in the future is recommended.

In as much as the above officials are not residing within this area, no specimen of their previous speeches or statements could be furnished. This is however be remedied thru farther asking of information to some Ilagan residents.

The Treasurer is conniving with us. As to the Secretary and Supervising Teacher no idea could be furnished because they are not yet contacted by this HQ. The Agronomist, E. Ramat is an inducted CLP of this command, very active in giving us informations and supplies. His son, Mortemer and daughter Miss Gloria Ramat are active S-2 agents of this command. As a proof to this, Mr. E. Ramat was caught on his way to this HQ carrying with him food supplies and was brought to the Japanese Garrison. No information about his release.

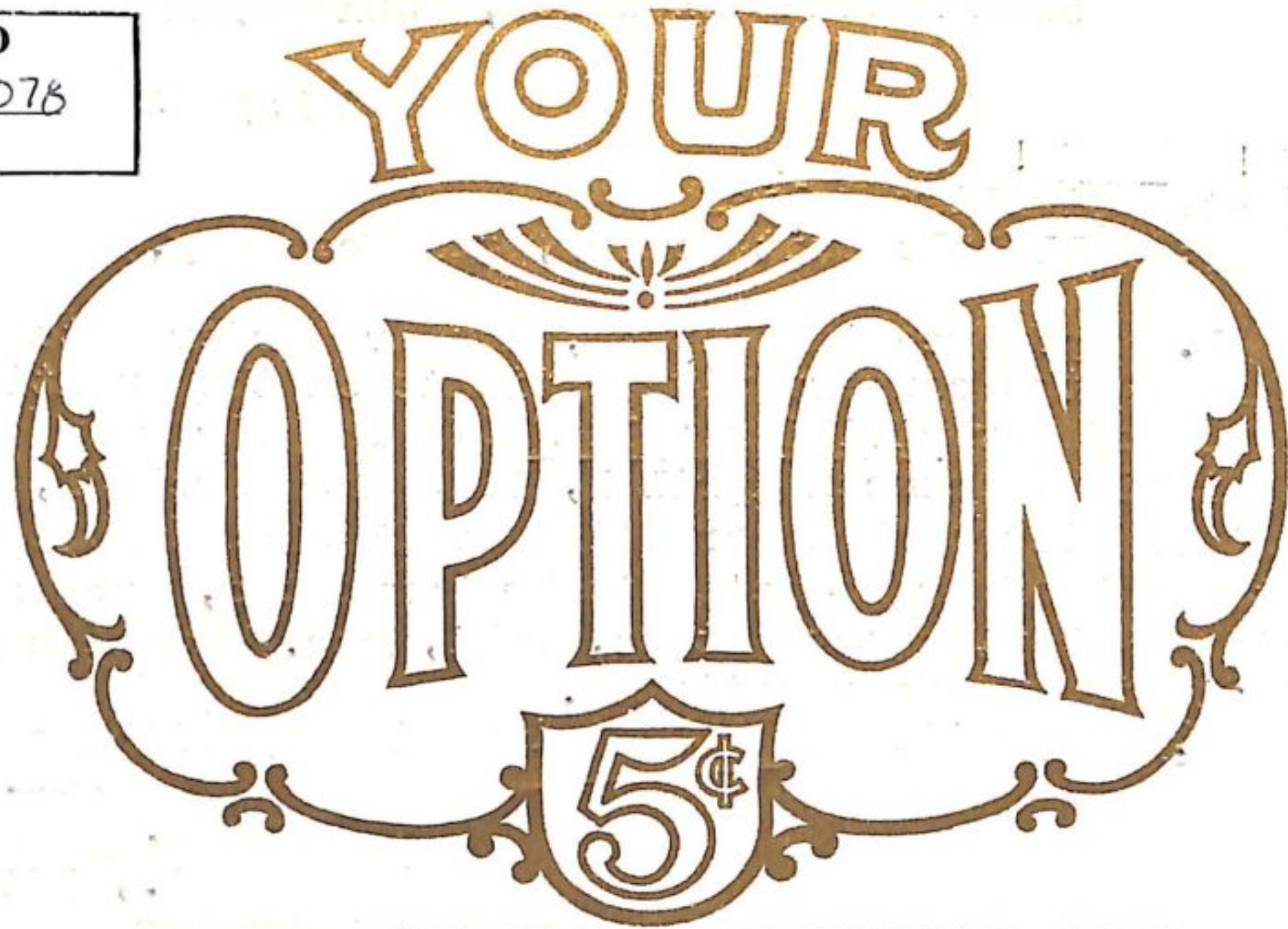

1. In connection with the rehabilitation of civilian population in the municipalities of Santiago and Cordon, Isabela, which are within the jurisdiction of this command, the actual general conditions obtaining in the different evacuation places is herewith submitted for the information of that HQ:

A. ECONOMIC

The living condition is generally fair with but few now feeling the shortage of food. Some persons were able to move away their palays from their fields while others completely abandoned theirs just to save their lives from the invading enemies. The food campaign now being waged by the Japs is seriously scaring the people. The nearby barrios and sitios producing big quantities of crops little distant away from the national highway are practically occupied by the enemies. They roam these places and all foodstuffs and animals still left by their respective owners easily fall under their hands, in other words, they become enemy infested areas. The Ganaps (now Makapili) too continuously robbed the loyal civilians of their foods, clothings and work animals.

B. HEALTH AND SANITATION

The general health condition of evacuees is indeed lamentable. Malaria is the most prevalent sickness taking high toll of deaths among the civilians who used to bivouac in the depths of virgin forests and mountain sides. Their small crudely built huts made of "cogon", "bohos" and "bicals" neglect observance of sanitation in view of the absence of sanitary inspectors who may encourage the promotion of sanitation. However, at this time of moving farther and farther from any enemy molestations, the sanitary conditions seem to be abandoned for the obvious reasons that the security and safety of their lives is everybody's primary concern for which case, the huts are temporary in nature. This is a common adventure.

Common sickness of children from one to ten years of age are diarrhea, gastro enteritis and dysentery. These are due perhaps to the main source of drinking water. Daily death toll is steadily increasing in number. In a family consisting of 14 members, at least 12 members are on bed. This may give a mind picture of the misery the civilian population has at present.

Proportion of civilians have:

Malaria	75%
Dysentery, gastro enteritis and diarrhea ..	12%
Influenza	6%
Beri-beri (adult and infant)	4%
Tropical ulcer	3%

Medical drugs are not available and in their absence, people temporarily resort to medicinal herbs and plants which are hardly procurable. To give relief to indigent families, the following medicines are badly needed by the 35,000 population of Santiago and Cordon, Isabela:

a judge or referee out of the province in which such debtor resides or is found, or before a justice out of the municipality in which such debtor resides or is found. (Sec. 474, Act 190.)

2. PRELIMINARY STEPS.

After the issuance of execution against property and upon proof, by affidavit of a party or otherwise, to the satisfaction of the judge or the justice of the peace, that said execution remains unsatisfied and that any judgment debtor has property subject to said execution which should be applied towards the satisfaction of the judgment, such judge or justice may, by an order, require the judgment debtor to appear at a specified time and place within the territorial limits fixed in the preceding section, to answer concerning the same; and such proceedings may thereupon be had for application of the property of the judgment debtor towards the satisfaction of the judgment as are hereinafter prescribed. The judge may require the appearance to be made before a referee appointed by him. (Sec. 475, Act 190.)

The court may appoint a receiver to keep these things found.

APPEAL; AMOUNT IN DISPUTE; COUNTERCLAIM. - The value of a mortgaged vessel and the profits from its use, demanded in a dismissed counterclaim in a suit to foreclose the mortgage, cannot be added to the amount of the mortgage debt in determining the value of the matter in controversy, for the purpose of an appeal to the Federal Supreme Court from the Supreme Court of the Philippine Islands.
