may be attempting work beyond their mental ability. To identify and place in the same section pupils more or less homogeneous in mental ability and therefore able to progress at nearly the same rate. The brighter or more mature pupils may be given an enriched curriculum and the duller or less mature pupils may be allowed to complete no more than the minimum requirements. It is believed that a section of pupils who are nearly alike in ability to learn can be taught much more easily than a group of pupils not classified according to ability. The teacher should use the test results to determine the causes of high or low scores, especially low scores, and to plan his teaching procedure and apply appropriate remedial measures.

- b. For guidance purposes. To assist pupils to choose wisely in planning their extracurricular and vocational programs.
- c. For administrative and supervisory purposes. To determine the comparative abilities of pupils in different classes of the same grade, in the same school or in different schools or localities, so as to identify those pupils, classes, or schools requiring much assistance or supervision.
- 3. The results of the tests should be reported to the General Office for compilation and analysis and for determination of national grade and age norms.
- 4. It is desirable to determine the general intellectual and educational status of the Philippine public schools in each grade and year at the beginning of this school year when radical changes in the school system are made effective. Students in the First Year high school have already been given Part I (Tests 1-6) and Part II (Tests 1-7) in June, 1941. In order that they may be included in this nation-wide intellectual and educational survey covering all public elementary and high schools, they should be given Part II (Tests 8-9) of the Philippine Intelligence Tests. Tests 8 and 9 are now being printed.
- Based on the results of the tests given during the first semester, each primary and intermediate school should be ranked separately, according to Bulletin No. 13 and Memorandum No. 38, both series 1940. It has been found that a number of division superintendents apparently were unable to determine their best, average, and poorest central and barrio schools because they had no adequate division testing programs.
