SUBJECT: Investigation of enemy aliens

TO : Lt. Col. I. Sevilla, Inspector-General, ECLGA

1. You may be interested in the enclosed copies of a memorandum I submitted to General Basilio J. Valdes on February 27, 1945, and two lists signed by Lt. George S. Guysi of the 493rd Counter Intelligence Corps Detachment (Regional), United States Army Forces in the Far East, - all relating to enemy aliens in the Philippines. There are two items in the lists to which I desire to call your particular attention; namely, (1) list of officials of the local Nazi Party, and (2) list of Japanese subjects as of 1942.

2. With regard to item (1), I should like to point out that after the occupation of Manila by the Japanese forces in 1942, a German told me that the G-2 of the U.S. Army was not efficient because in 1941 they interned all German citizens in Manila "except the chief of the Nazi Party". At that time we could not, for obvious reasons, argue with either Japanese or German citizens. Silently but surely, however, we secured the desired list by using the facilities of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

3. With regard to item (2), it should be mentioned that Japanese were exempted from registration as aliens during their regime. This list, therefore, was the most difficult to secure, considering the fact that the Japanese Military Police were very active in rounding up persons engaged in Anti-Jap activities. Under my guidance, we succeeded in compiling the data from the files of neighborhood associations which were used as basis for the distribution of prime commodities. The list includes not only Japanese civilians but also Taiwanese and some Chinese who declared in their neighborhood forms that they are subjects of the Empire of Japan. In this connection, it may be pertinent to state that according to the newspapers yesterday a Japanese civilian was caught while attempting to cross the Pontoon Bridge at Pandacan. It may also be added that quite a number of Germans are still going around.

4. As the Commonwealth Government has not yet recreated the Bureau of Immigration, the agency that controls the activities and movements of aliens in the Philippines, I wonder whether our organization, to prevent enemy aliens from engaging in subversive activities, could assist in the investigation of these undesirable elements and turn them over to the CIC with appropriate recommendations. As a former official of the Bureau of Immigration and

with the aid of the papers and documents I have compiled, I can easily identify aliens who are subject to internment.

5. I left Manila in January because the Japanese Military Police were after me. Consequently, I lost contact with our LINE "C". I took every precaution, however, so that the valuable papers and documents I compiled would not be lost or confiscated.

6. I went to Bataan first where I had a narrow escape from the Japanese. I later transferred to Pampanga, following your verbal suggestion. Again I had a narrow escape from the Japs, so I reported to the P.M.D., ECLGA., where I was given an assignment as Liaison Officer and Assistant Judge Advocate. I returned to Manila last month upon verbal instructions of General Valdes.

7. I mentioned the importance of these papers to Col. Abelardo de Dios and Col. Jose Lingad when I accompanied them a few days ago to the Office of the Secretary to the President.

GENERAL VALDES:

In compliance with your instructions, I have the honor to submit herewith two copies each of the following alien records for the use of G-2 USAFFE and G-2 SIXTH ARMY:

We are also in possession of miscellaneous records which may be consulted by G-2 officials in connection with the internment of enemy nationals.
