NO. ----- 1) TO ACCOMPANY WARNING ORDER NO. 1

I. MAPS

A. Line route maps, diagrams and locations of Command Posts will be issued later.

II. INFORMATION

A. Wire:- The enemy is using the Long Distance Company's line, the railroad track, and telegraph line with the switchboard in the following buildings: Levy and Blum, and the concrete building at the foot of Sta. Cruz Bridge near the Bureau of Posts Building.

B. Radio:- Several radio stations will be noticed in the different districts in Manila and suburbs. Most of these stations are used by the enemy for long distance communications, detecting stations, and air raid warning stations. They are visible due to the antenna construction.

C. The wire communication installations of the enemy can be preserved for the use of our troops while the radio stations should be destroyed if possible by District Sabotage Units and all equipment that can be saved should be repaired for our own use.

D. Radio stations are being established in the different districts, in which some are already in contact with this Headquarters. New equipment will be distributed for the lower units. The axis of communication for the entire AREA will be issued later.

III. INSTRUCTIONS

A. Each district must have organized a Signal Unit for their district. This includes the personnel of their Headquarters and front line regiments under the direct charge of a Signal Officer for the district, and Communications Officer for the regiment.

B. Training of personnel should be done immediately without further delay.

C. Signal Officers of each District must have a ready plan for the installation, operation, and maintenance of signal communications in their respective districts to be submitted immediately to this Headquarters. This must include the following:

- (a) Location of Command Posts.
- (b) Employment of Agencies:
 1. Message centers.
 2. Messengers.
 3. Radio.
 4. Visual.
 5. Sound.
 6. Wire.
 7. Supply.

D. Signal Officers and Communications Officers with the help of the Intelligence Officers make a thorough study of the enemy's communications set-up and submit them to this Headquarters immediately.

- E. All captured signal equipment must be turned in to the District Headquarters. This must be repaired immediately by the signal personnel technician. Sets such as telephones must be converted to field sets similar to Telephone EE3 or EE5. This is possible.
- F. Enemy communications installations after occupation of the area should be repaired for the use of our own troops.
- G. Telegraph lines should be repaired for telegraph operation.
- H. Telephone and telegraph lines running to the occupied area should be cut and recovered. This should be turned in to the District Headquarters.

1. a The enemy is on the defensive, and it is estimated that within the area of this command, has a concentration of approximately 100,000 troops of all branches and services, scattered in their battle positions.
b(1) Our friendly troops, the Allies, have landed in the islands of LEYTE and SAMAR, which will be the center for future operations in the Philippines. (See Annex No. 1)
(2) Our own organized guerrilla units are in their stations in the provinces of PAMPANGA, BATAAN, BULACAN, and the CITY OF MANILA and suburbs. (See Annex No. 2)
2. The East Central Luzon Guerrilla Area Command will in accordance with SWPA plans attack the enemy in small guerrilla groups whenever and wherever the opportunity arises, by placing obstacles of all kinds on their routes of movement, and destroying bridges which will force the enemy to stop and repair, and while thus stopped, to attack them, and attack relentlessly using the hit and run tactics for the purpose of delaying enemy troop movements; by destroying small enemy garrisons or groups, and all available enemy means of supply and communications, keeping them constantly destroyed, anywhere and everywhere, for the purpose of preventing them from concentrating their forces in the points of Allied operations in order to facilitate as much as possible these operations.
3. (a) The Manila Military District will capture the CITY OF MANILA and suburbs with the least damage, to property and civilian lives.
(b) The Bulacan Military District will operate within the limits of its district in close coordination with the Manila Military District, the Nueva Ecija Military District, and the Pampanga Military District.

- (e) The Pampanga Military District with General Service Troops attached will operate within its district keeping close coordination with the Bulacan Military District, Batang Military District, Tarlac Military District, and Nueva Ecija Military District.
- (d) The Batang Military District will operate within its district keeping close coordination with the Pampanga Military District, and other units operating in BAMBALING.
- (c) The General Service Troops are attached to the Pampanga Military District.
- (f) The Mountain Corps Regiment less 1st Bn. will remain as G.H.Q. reserve.
- (g) 1st Bn. Mountain Corps will attack and annihilate retreating enemy in and out of San Mateo and vicinity.
- (x) 1. Units will always maintain suitable reserves for commitment only in emergency situations.
2. Independent units desiring incorporation to this Command, will be attached to the District in whose area they are operating. Reports of such attachments will immediately be communicated to this headquarters.
3. Liaison between adjacent units of this command and with other friendly guerrilla units will be maintained at all times.
4. Provisions for security from HUKBALAJAPs and other hostile elements will be made.
5. Security of civilians will be provided for, and provisions for food control and its equitable distribution will be made. Looters and terrorists will be arrested and confined until they can be tried in accordance with military law. The establishment of agencies to try these persons will be made in subsequent orders.
6. All enemy military objectives and equipment will be destroyed or captured.
7. As soon as Allied operations reach the area within each District, District Commanders will strive to contact the Allied field commander in the area, secure desired information of the enemy, and continue operations behind the enemy lines under the command of the Allied field commander.
8. USAFFE men with no record against them, desiring incorporation will be taken in and assigned. They will retain their former ranks but will not be given any command position. According to rank will be made advisers to different units.
9. All members of the Police and P. C. will be disarmed and if they have no record against them, and desire to join after a thorough investigation, will be sworn in if not USAFFE and assigned police duties. Members who have records against them will be delivered to a concentration camp for Filipino Collaborators to be designated by each District Commander.

10. All Collaborators such as spies, suppliers of war materials and food stuffs to the enemy, opportunists, and pro-Japanese elements including officials of the Puppet Government will be arrested, placed in custody and concentrated in a place to be designated by the District Commander.
11. All enemy nationals will be taken into protective custody, and concentrated in a place to be designated by the District Commander.
12. Enemy combatants, arrested or taken as Prisoner of War, will be questioned for valuable information which will be relayed to this Headquarters or to the nearest Allied Unit immediately, after which they will be concentrated in a camp for Prisoner of War to be designated by the District Commander. In the concentration camp, officers will be treated in accordance with their rank.
13. Travel within each District will be regulated, so that persons moving about should be required to have passes issued by the District Commander.
14. Each District Commander will be responsible for the maintenance of peace and order in his own district.
15. D-day and H-hour will be announced later.
16. When the communications with this Headquarters is cut off or interrupted, district commanders will act on their own initiative in accordance with the general plan. District Commanders, in coordination with each other, will start operations at the proper time, and not prematurely.
17. Everyone will abide strictly to the provisions of International Law.

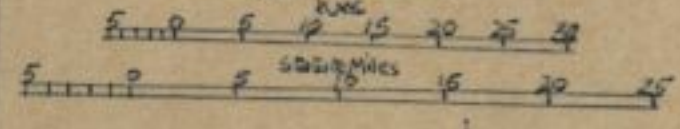

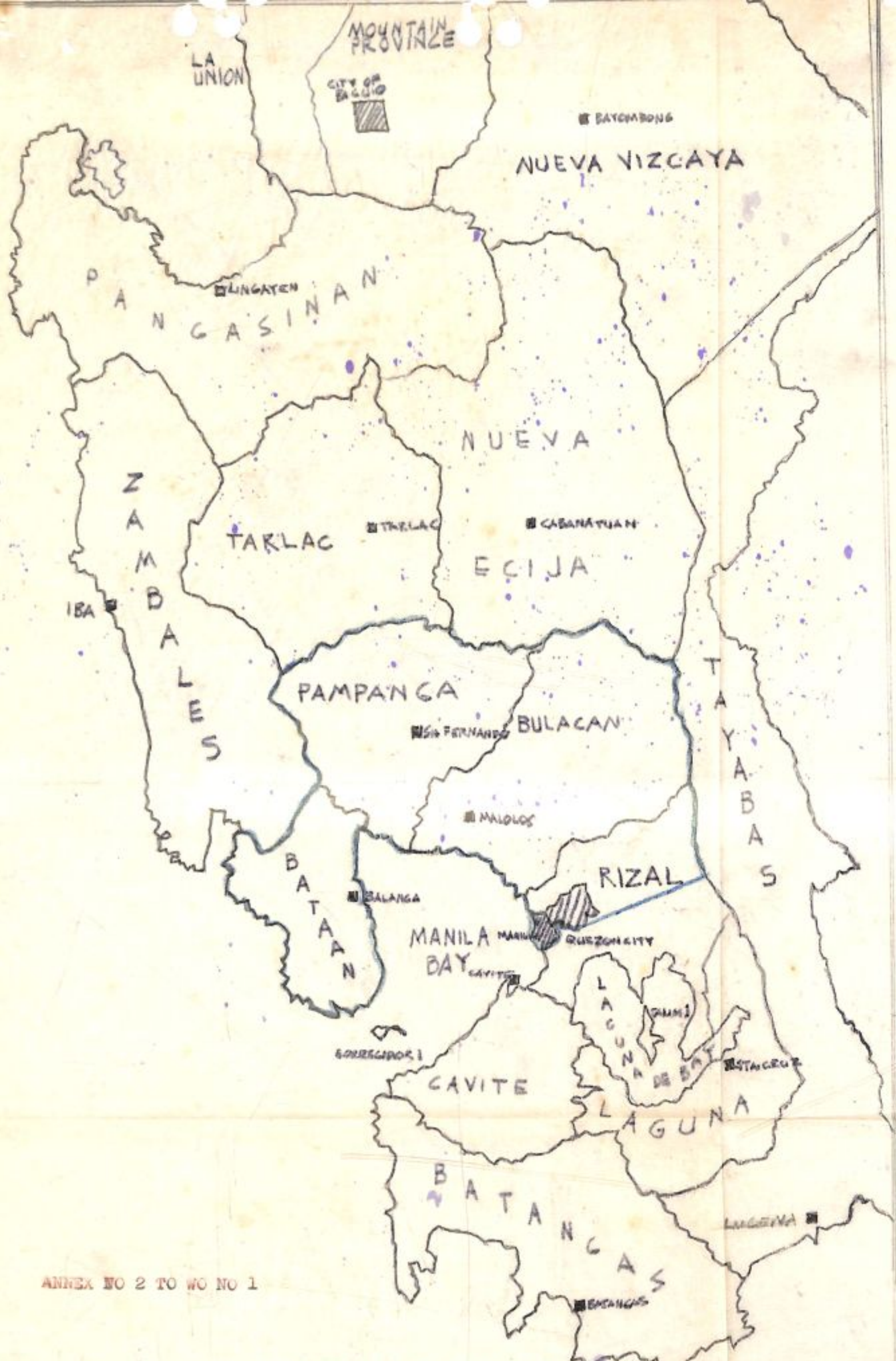

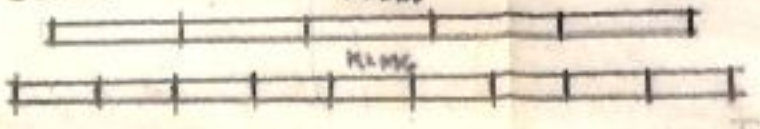

MAPS: Overlay on Meycawayan sheet. Scale: 1:50,000.

1. This command will provide security outposts and patrols to guard the area: MEYCAWAYAN-TAWIRAN(871.5 - 1783.8) -BINUANGAN (871.0 - 1790.3) - NAVOZAS River Fork at (875.0-1775.0) - PASOLO (875.0 - 1777.7) - POLO.

2. Information of Enemy Troops : This area has been swept by our own troops. Enemy stragglers still remain at large in the area. Infiltration of enemy stragglers probable from the direction of Bataan and Manila.

Own Troops: Reconnaissance unit of the 37th Division, U.S. Army patrols the highways in the area and has its command Post in the vicinity of PALASAN (875.4 - 1778.2). The 1675 Engineer Aviation Battalion is bivouached at the MEYCAWAYAN Schoolhouse.

3. a. The 61st Inf. Regt., MHD and the 31st Regt., Bulacan MB will provide security outposts and patrols in the area preventing infiltration of enemy troops, and eliminating all enemy stragglers and snipers still in the area.

b. The 31st Inf. Regt., MHD will provide outposts and patrol the line MEYCAWAYAN River line from MEYCAWAYAN-along the MEYCAWAYAN River to junction with TAGALOG Creek inclusive.

c. 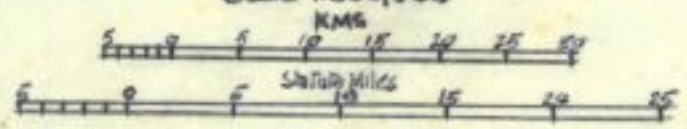

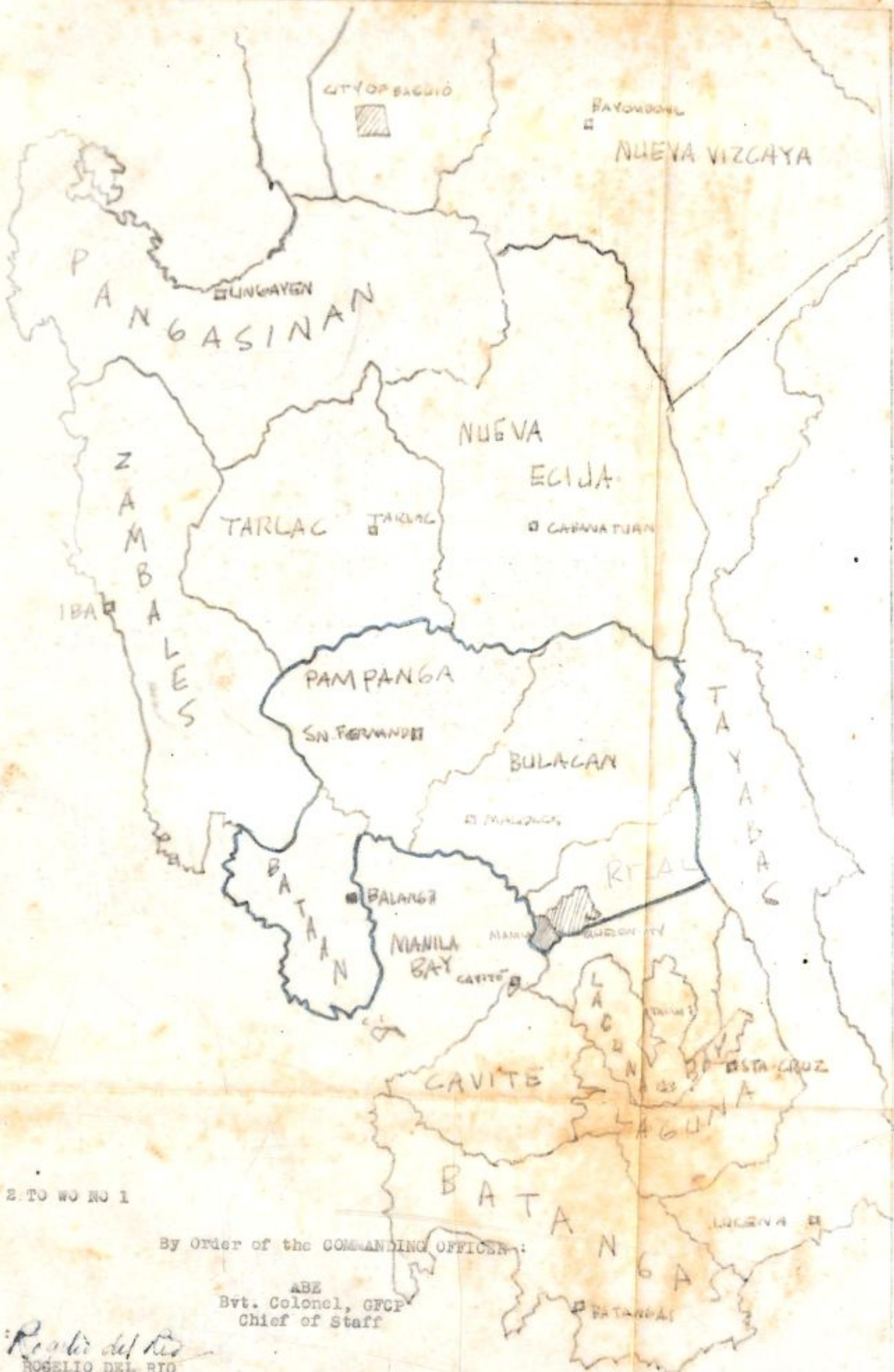

The civilian prisoners of war section will be further subdivided in such a way that spies and confirmed Collaborators whether, Filipinos or Aliens including government officials, national, provincial and municipal, will be together, and enemy Aliens not falling under the former category, will be separated.

4. Salvage: District and Special Unit Commanders are held responsible for all confiscated properties of the enemy, pending orders from this Headquarters.

II. TRAFFIC:

(a) Circulation:

1. All roads will be opened to traffic as the situation may permit, otherwise all available by-roads and cross-country trails comparatively safe from enemy interception will be used and amply protected, giving priority to ammunition, supply troops.

(b) Restrictions:

1. Plans of all available by roads and cross-country trails and their use will be ready at all times.

III. FIELD TRAINS:

(a) Bivouacs:

To be designated by each District and Special Unit Commanders.

NO. ----- 1) TO ACCOMPANY WARNING ORDER NO. 1

I. MAPS

A. Line route maps, diagrams and locations of Command Posts will be issued later.

II. INFORMATION

A. Wire:- The enemy is using the Long Distance Company's line, the railroad track, and telegraph line with the switchboard in the following buildings: Levy and Blum, and the concrete building at the foot of Sta. Cruz Bridge near the Bureau of Posts Building.

B. Radio:- Several radio stations will be noticed in the different districts in Manila and suburbs. Most of these stations are used by the enemy for long distance communications, detecting stations, and air raid warning stations. They are visible due to the antenna construction.

C. The wire communication installations of the enemy can be preserved for the use of our troops while the radio stations should be destroyed if possible by District Sabotage Units and all equipment that can be saved should be repaired for our own use.

D. Radio stations are being established in the different districts, in which some are already in contact with this Headquarters. New equipment will be distributed for the lower units. The axis of communication for the entire AREA will be issued later.

III. INSTRUCTIONS

A. Each district must have organized a Signal Unit for their district. This includes the personnel of their Headquarters and front line regiments under the direct charge of a Signal Officer for the district, and Communications Officer for the regiment.

B. Training of personnel should be done immediately without further delay.

C. Signal Officers of each District must have a ready plan for the installation, operation, and maintenance of signal communications in their respective districts to be submitted immediately to this Headquarters. This must include the following:

- (a) Location of Command Posts.
- (b) Employment of Agencies:
 1. Message centers.
 2. Messengers.
 3. Radio.
 4. Visual.
 5. Sound.
 6. Wire.
 7. Supply.

D. Signal Officers and Communications Officers with the help of the Intelligence Officers make a thorough study of the enemy's communications set-up and submit them to this Headquarters immediately.

- E. All captured signal equipment must be turned in to the District Headquarters. This must be repaired immediately by the signal personnel technician. Sets such as tele-phones must be converted to field sets similar to Tele-phones EE3 or EE5. This is possible.
- F. Enemy communications installations after occupation of the area should be repaired for the use of our own troops.
- G. Telegraph lines should be repaired for telegraph operation.
- H. Telephone and telegraph lines running to the occupied area should be cut and recovered. This should be turned in to the District Headquarters.

FIELD ORDER
NO. 2

1. (a) Powerful leaders of the Ganap Party at SAN JOSE, BULACAN have returned and mobilized all their former followers, by force, and armed them for the purpose of running down all USAFPE Guerrillas.

(b) The Bulacan Military District has troops in the vicinity of SAPANG PALAY and SAN JOSE, which towns are under the jurisdiction of the Mountain Corps, ECLGA.

2. This Command will attack and eliminate all dangerous Ganap elements in SAN JOSE, at such a day and time deemed propitious.

3. (a) The Bulacan Military District will attack the town of SAN JOSE for the purpose of eliminating the Capa's, father and son; Alberto and Felix Española, Renaldo Bartolome, Fermin Guafes and "Yoen" Canuto Cadiz only, and capturing the arms, ammunition and supplies of enemy garrisons in the town and vicinity, all of which will be for the BMD Command.

(b) The Mountain Corps will withdraw all its men from the town of SAN JOSE and vicinity immediately upon receipt of these orders and keep away therefrom until further orders.

(x) 1. After accomplishing the mission, the troops of the Bulacan Military District committed for these operations, will withdraw in the general direction North, Northwest, or West of SAN JOSE and reports of results of operations to the GHQ, will be made as soon as possible.

2. Any enemy retreating East or South of SAN JOSE, will be captured and disposed of accordingly by the Mountain Corps.

3. Necessary assistance will be rendered by the Mountain Corps, on call from the Bulacan Military District.

4. After these operations, the town of SAN JOSE will remain under the jurisdiction of the Mountain Corps, ECLGA, and all troops under the Bulacan Military District will withdraw completely from SAN JOSE and vicinity.

4. (a) The District Commander will be responsible for the supply of his command.

(b) Incendiary materials will be available from the Chemical Warfare and Sabotage Unit commander immediately.

5. Command Post - No change.
