

GENERAL ORDER
NO. 2

1. In accordance with the War Plans of this Headquarters and the discretionary power vested this Command by virtue of paragraph 3.(x) 16 of WARNING ORDERS NO. 1, GHQ, ECLGA, issued 8:00 o'clock, 8 November '44, all Regiments and Independent Battalions and special Units under this District not otherwise activated, are called to ACTIVE DUTY effective Midnight of 10 January 1945.


2. All unit commanders concerned are hereby directed to mobilize their respective full man-power and exhaust every resource within their means to administer and maintain the active organized status of the men of their units, comprehended on the basis of 24-hour duty, within their respective areas.

3. Further detail is contained in MEMORANDUM, this Headquarters, dated 9 January 1945.

MEMORANDUM

TO : ALL C.O.'s. of Regiments, Independent Battalions & Special Units, PMD, ECLGA, In the Field.

1. In connection with any subsequent ACTIVE CALL hereafter to be issued shall, unless provided to the contrary, be comprehended to mean as follows:

a. Actual 24-hour duty

b. Mobilization of the men and their subsequent administration and maintenance will be had within their unit areas and to the responsibility of the unit commanders.

c. Individual date of actual ACTIVE DUTY will be comprehended to take effect on the date the said individual will report for duty to your Headquarters and not as of the date of G.O. No. 2 to be subsequently issued by this Headquarters.

2. Units so activated will have the immediate missions as follow:

a. Execution of Field Orders issued from time to time by this Headquarters.

b. Procurement and storing of food supplies; medical supplies; engineering equipments like wheelbarrows, shovels, pick and mattocks etc., which condition may permit them to procure within their areas; ultimately, to handle salvage and confiscated enemy properties, goods or merchandize of profiteers and suppliers of the enemy. Plans for the storing and protection of these supplies procured, commandeered and/or confiscated must be had. The same will be called upon in the future for the use of our own troops and/or landed troops subsequently to operate in the District.

c. Local Intelligence work regarding the movements of local dissenting elements, enemy collaborators, government officials of the Puppet government, profiteers and supplier of war materials to the enemy; ultimately, to effect the internment of the above-mentioned elements together with enemy nationals into their units respective concentration camps for the same.

d. Civilian protection and evacuation.

e. Other sabotage and demolition works as they may, from time to time, be advised by the Office of the Inspector General provided, however, that the same is not in conflict with existing Field Orders and expressed policy of this Headquarters issued regarding sabotage and demolition work within the District.

GENERAL ORDER
NO. 6

1. On 26 March '45 this Hq has received orders from the US 6th Army thru the GHQ, ELCGA, that all officers and men of this District be sent home with the exception of those who are actually attached to US Army units and those who, altho already released, but have been attached to American forces. The same order has required this Command to turn over to the US 6th Army all arms not being used by those actually operating with American units.
2. To comply strictly to the above orders of the US 6th Army all unit commanders are hereby directed to send home at once those not included in the above paragraph. Re-return of arms memo of even date to unit commanders shall be referred to.
3. The total strenght of our several units who are or were attached to American units number over 800 officers and enlistedmen. These men will, according to the GHQ, be inducted into the Philippine Army in a week or two. They will, moreover, receive pay from the date they were attached to and recognized by the US Army and up to the date they ceased service thereto.
4. Pending their induction into the Philippine Army those several units who were or are still operating with American units shall be grouped together in one quarters in their respective location until such time as this Headquarters will send for them for total grouping in Sta. Rita in so far as housing facilities will allow.
5. Those officers and enlistedmen of the PMD who are sent home but have applied for the Philippine Army will be called later. On account of a big Philippine Army which is being organized all of our applicants who qualify the physical examination will have a chance to continue their service in our armed forces. Illiteracy is not a bar to admission into the Army.
6. Those officers and enlistedmen who have filed application to join the Military Police Command of the USARPA, which is the PMP, will report immediately to this Headquarters for medical and physical examination. This Headquarters will send our applicants to Manila in two or three days to report for duty. Free transportation and food will be furnished them by this Headquarters.
7. The Pampanga Military District, according to GHQ, ELCGA, has accomplished its mission as a Guerilla Force. Our area has long ceased to be a zone of Military operations. This District is a way behind the existing front lines in Luzon. Moreover, a civil government for Pampanga under the Commonwealth of the Philippines is fast being established. For the foregoing reasons our Guerilla Forces of the Pampanga Military District do not have anymore reason to continue as such.
8. The order to send our boys home and the return of our arms to the US Army after our work is finished shall not by any means be interpreted as an act of ingratitude on the part of the US Army or on the part of our Commonwealth Government. On the other hand the rations, and clothing, and medicine given; the monetary compensation which will be given to our men attached to Army units, as well as the privileges and priorities which are being given to our applicants in the Philippine National Police (PNP, and the Philippine Army are material proof to the contrary. Our government has taken cognizance of the bloody sacrifices and unequalled loyalty of our men to the

government of the Commonwealth of the Philippines and to the United States. Executive orders by President Osmeña and the several policies and rulings which were adopted by the Cabinet have definitely assured the recognition of our humble but priceless services to our country and people during the years of a national crisis.

9. In lasting recognition of the faithful and courageous services of our Guerillas the District Staff is now taking steps towards the recommendation of our deserving officers and enlisted-men to the Philippine Army and the Philippine National Police in the form of either confirmation of guerilla ranks and grades or of a recommendation of whatever rank or grade is deemed fitted for them.

10. As a fitting finish to the glorious work of our men during the darkest period of our history, the General Staff of the Pampanga Military District hereby express their undying gratitude to our officers and enlistedmen for their unswerving loyalty which alone made possible the writing in blood of an epic of a people's struggle under the most adverse circumstances against the invaders who desecrated our soil. It is fervently hoped that the history we wrote be an example to be followed by the generations to come.

11. This order shall be published by all units of this Command.




GENERAL ORDER:
