FIRST MAPANDAN GUERRILLA COMPANY LGAF
MAPANDAN, PANGASINAN

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"COMPANY HISTORY"

I. The USAFFE organization being existed at Mapandan, Pangasinan, was an Army of the Agno, First Organized Pangasinan Army Corps in the Philippines, under the leadership of Brigadier General Miguel R. Acosta authorized by Lt. Col. Arthur K. Noble and Lt. Martin Moises, all USAFFE Officers.

The USAFFE Organization under the command of Gen. Acosta was organized May 18th, 1942. The organization was under the close surveillance by the Japanese soldiers because on the morning of December 26, 1942 while the general and some members of his staffs were having their USAFFE Christmas mass at Matematic church, Santa Barbara, Pangasinan, the Japanese soldiers raided them and capturing twenty-nine others including Rev. Fa. Cenensi and Mrs. Lozano of the WAS. During the raid, the general and others made their good escape while the soldiers' records were captured. After the raid he transferred his Headquarters at barrio Dalongue, Santa Barbara, where another Jap's spy had traced the new place.

On 4th February 1943 the Jap's spy had reported his findings to their garrison at Dagupan. Few hours later the Japanese soldiers arrived and instantly raided the general's headquarters. Aside one enlisted man who was shot to death by the enemies everybody in the headquarters was able to escape. The following morning on 5th February 1943 the general and the remnants of his staffs surrendered to the municipal officials of Calasiao in Pangasinan. Thus, the surrender of the supreme commander caused the disbandment of the whole organization.

Early February 6, 1943, officers of the different sections of Gen. Acosta's organization planned to organize and united themselves to form an army organization to continue the resistance. Participants in the re-organization were the following officers and enlisted men; Capt. Miguel Languit, Plans and Training Officer (Ex-PS), Capt. Amado S. Diosana, Division Provost Marshal (Ex-PC), 1st Lieut. Nicanor Carino, Ordnance Depot Officer (ROTC), 1st Lieut. Enrique F. Aquino, Regt'l S-4 (ROTC), 2nd Lieut. Arcadio G. Aquino, Military Chief of Police of Mapandan (ROTC), 2nd Lieut. Roman Penuliar, Motorize Unit (CIV.), and Sgt. Ricardo Cavinta (EX-PA). The conference was held in the afternoon of February 6, 1943 at barrio Amanawac, Mapandan, Pangasinan. The organization approved was the "FIRST MAPANDAN GUERRILLA COMPANY, USAFFE, derived from the First Pangasinan Organized Army Corps. Capt. Amado S. Diosana was made the Company Commander, 1st Lieut. Nicanor Carino as the Company Executive Officer and Junior Officers are; 1st Lt. Enrique F. Aquino, 1st Lt. Ricardo Cavinta, 1st Lt. Juan Visperas, 2nd Lt. Arcadio G. Aquino and 2nd Lt. Roman Penuliar. Capt. Miguel Languit as Liaison Officer and 1st Lt. Bernabe M. Datuin (Ex-PS) as Intelligence Officer.

After the re-organization Capt. Miguel Languit ordered Capt. Amado S. Diosana with Sergeants; Miguel Visperas, Benjamin Bugay and seven other enlisted men to contact Maj. Lapham at the Cordillera Mts. East of Uaingan. A written note from Capt. Languit to Maj. Lapham who the former was his intimate friend for several years was brought by them explaining the attachment of the company. One week after the messengers arrived at Mapandan Headquarters. It was a very good news that the company was accepted for its attachment to the Luzon Guerrilla Army Forces (LGAF) under the supreme command of Maj. Lapham.

During the attachment the company continued its constant duties of showing its forever and solid loyalty to our country the Philippines and to the mother land, the United States of America, had in several instances performed soldierly activities, strengthen the morale of the people, suppressed banditry and lawlessness and helped maintain peace and order. The company survived through the voluntary contributions from civilians who were loyal to the Commonwealth Government of the Philippines and to our mother country, the government of the United States of America. The company was constantly performing same duties until the arrival of the Liberating Forces, at Mangaldan, Pangasinan, 10th January 1945.

II. On 10th January 1945, at 2:00 P.M. the USAFFE Officers and soldiers of the 1st Mapandan Grila Co., LGAF met and attached to the US 6TH Inf. Div.

under Gen. Patrick at Mangaldan. The company roster was then submitted to Maj. Miguel Divine (PA) who was one of the staff officers of Col. Reese, Commanding officer of the 1st Inf., Regt. 6th Div.

On 11th January 1945 all the men of said command were line up and had taken their oath before Maj. M. Divine (PA) and Capt. Pernillos (US) Army Regt'l adjutant of the 1st Regt. 6th Div. After oath taking the men of the company were distributed to the different companies--Co. K, L, M, and Cannon Co. of the 3rd Bn. 1st Inf. Regt., 6th Div. At about two o'clock of same day the Mapandan Guerrillas attacked the Japanese garrison at Mapandan, killing nine of them and capturing two trucks and one special car and later turned them to the CIC for disposal.

On 19 Jan. '45 after liberating the town of Rosales, Ex-O of the LGAF, Col. S. M. Obana and Major Harry McKensie called the attention of Capt. Amado S. Diosana and Ex-O, 1st Lt. Nicanor Carino to submit the roster of troops of the Mapandan Guerrillas. A copy of roster was then submitted with the strength of hundred ten (110) men including Officers and Enlisted men as per verbal order of Col. Obana. The supposed strength of 159 of the company was then reduced to 110 men including Officers and Enlisted men. Twenty-nine others were then excluded to the roster submitted for recognition. The twenty-nine others not included in the roster continued their attachment to the different US units showing their faiths and loyalties to our mother country the United States of America and to our country the Philippines. That in one of the company's encounters with the enemies at San Jose, Nueva Ecija on 5 February 1945 our Plans and Training Officer, Capt. M. Languit and Intelligence Officer, 1st Lt. B. Datuin were killed in action were buried to the USAF, Cemetery No. 1, at Santa Barbara, Pangasinan, 5 February '45 while the wounded in action was evacuated to the US Army Base X Hosp. New Guinea.

On 4th March 1945 Pvt. Pedro Serafica a member of one of our platoons attached to Cannon Co. was killed in action at San Mateo, Rizal and was buried to that place. The Company continued its attachment to the 3rd Bn. 1st Inf. Regt. till the end of April '45. Beginning on 1st May up to 15 June '45 the 6th Division to which the company was attached, ordered the company for its relaxation at its Headquarters, Mapandan, Pangasinan while the former having done the same at Manila.

On 21 April 1945 the Company Ex-O. Lt. N. Carino received a memorandum at Mapandan from Lt. Col. S. Obana, Ex-O of the LGAF, that on 16th June '45 the I-Corp, US Army through the LGAF HEADQUARTERS at Rosales called on the Company for reassignment to the 3rd Bn Hq., 65th Inf. 6th Div. under the command of Lt. Col. Muller stationed at Payawan Hills, Kiangan Mt. Province. But before the company starts for its reassignment, late Capt. Amado S. Diosana enlisted eight more men not included in the original roster. These men fought with the company to their respective assignment of attachment. Three of them were wounded in action. They are Pfc. Pedro Fernandez, Pvt. Alfredo Mendoza and Pvt. Rodrigo Aleparas. They are carried in the roster submitted for recognition to the Guerrilla Affairs Section, Philrycom, APO 707, Quezon City. That on 20th June '45 one of the company platoons headed by Capt. A. Diosana, in compliance with a verbal order from Col. Muller, went to patrol for the purpose of determining the enemies possible hide out on the summit of the hills but were unfortunately ambushed and attacked by the enemies with machine-guns and rifles as a result of which said platoon was harassed and scattered and failed to return to the Headquarters except Pfc. Salvino Visperas who was wounded in action being escorted by Cpl. Juan Carbonel.

Because of this misfortune which was met by the above-mentioned platoon, Lt. N. Carino was ordered by Col. Muller to head another platoon to follow up and ascertain the whereabouts of Capt. Diosana. That same day of 20th June '45, Lt. N. Carino and his platoon were able to locate the remnants of the missing platoon already headed by Sgt. Enrique Visperas and were informed of the probability that Capt. A. Diosana together with Pvt. Daniel Ungay were killed at the above said encounters at the hills. As a matter of fact said Captain and Private never showed up any more since then up to the present. As a result of this 1st Lt. N. Carino was immediately assigned as the commanding officer and 2nd Lt. Arcadio G. Aquino as the company executive officer and 1st Lt. Enrique

As a S-4. While 1st Lt. Ricardo Cavinta and 2nd Lt. Roman Penuliar who missed to joined the company in all its severe encounters were always assigned as Junior Officers.

On 21 June 1945 at 1900 O'clock the company CP was surprisedly attack by the Japanese soldiers with all types of weapon of theirs against the company soldiers springfield 08 rifles only. That after stiff fighting for about an hour under the command of Lt. N. Carino, the company was able to repulse the attack but lossing six men and fourteen others were wounded that the corpse of the soldiers who were killed in action were taken to the 6th Registration Graves at Bagabag, Nueva Viscaya for registration and were buried at the USAF, Cemetery No. 1 at Santa Barbara, Pangasinan while wounded soldiers were taken to the 91st Hosp. at Bayombong, Nueva Viscaya then transferred them to the 7th Evacuation Hosp. at Villasis, Pangasinan.

On 22 June '45 the company was reassigned and attached to "Fox Co." 20th Inf. 6th Div. under the command of Capt. McNeil operating in Bambang, N. V. until 30th June '45. That on 27 June '45 while Lt. N. Carino with Sergeants; Ricardo Datuin and Metodio Datuin were on patrol and while they were checking a tunnel upon which they came across, they were fired at by a Jap from inside wounding the wrist of the Lieutenant's left hand; but it took them no time in killing the Japanese soldier and were able to find in his possession one Jap's flag which Lt. Carino still keep up to the present.

Because of the Lieutenant's wound, he was treated at the 91st Hosp. at Bayombong, N. V. from 27-30 June '45 and was finally taken on 1 July '45 by airplane to the 511th Gen. Hosp. at Mandaluyon, Rizal from which he was released on 24 July '45. During his absence 2nd Lt. Arcadio G. Aquino, the Executive Officer assumed the command of the Company temporarily until Lt. Carino was reassigned to the 6th QM, 6th Div. under the command of Capt. Kraemer at Bagabag, N. V. where the remnants of his soldiers were attached. They were attached to the 6th QMC and detailed as perimeter guards until the end of August '45.


On 1st Sept. '45 the Commanding Officer, Lt. N. Carino, received a verbal order from the 6th QM reassigning the whole company to the 128th Inf. 32nd Div. at Bayombong, N. V. under Lieut. Barnstein and were again detailed as perimeter guards up to 15th October 1945.

III. That from 15th October '45 the company was finally reassigned and attached to the USAFIP, NL, 2nd Inf. Div. under the command of Col. Volkman, at La Union where the officers and men of the company underwent military training on military subjects-combat principle, scouting and patrolling, manual of arms, close order drill, hygiene and sanitation, courtesy and discipline until 27th January 1946. From 28 January '46 to 30 March '46 all men of the company were processed and honorably discharged through the energetic effort of Lt. N. Carino, commanding officer of the company and with the cooperation of 2nd Lt. Arcadio G. Aquino the executive officer and 1st Lt. Enrique F. Aquino the S-4, respectively.

That the Officers and Enlisted men of the company had rendered their patriotic and brilliant services toward the Commonwealth Government of the Philippines and to our mother country, the Government of the United States of America. That through the sacrifices accomplished by the soldiers of the company, the 6th Inf. Division of the United States Army had recognized the 1st MAPANDAN GUERRILLA CO. PA-LGAF on 11th January 1945 with the strength of Hundred and Forty one (141) Men including officers and enlisted men.

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This is to certify that the above Company History of the 1st Mapandan Grls Co., PA-LGAF is true and correct.



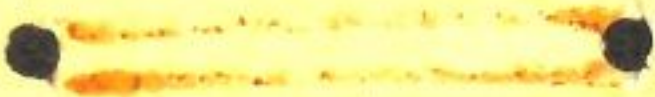
