MANILA, Sept. 23 - President Laurel today issued Proclamation 30 proclaiming a state of war between the Republic of the Philippines and the United States and Great Britain effective 10:00 o'clock this morning. The Proclamation follows:

"WHEREAS The Filipino people during the whole period of subjection to alien rule have unremittingly labored for freedom and independence and to this end fought two centuries of countless revolutions;

"WHEREAS, upon attainment by the Philippines of the cherished goal of freedom and independence and on the occasion of the inauguration of the Republic of the Philippines of October 14, 1943, the President appealed to all nations and peoples of the world for and goodwill and to the United States of America especially pleaded that the Philippines be spared suffering ^{and} destruction incident to the resumption of military operations on our soil;

"WHEREAS, notwithstanding the appeal the United States and Great Britain have attacked from the air certain parts of the Philippines hereby endangering the territorial integrity of the Republic causing death or injury to its citizens and destruction made to their property;

"WHEREAS, the Philippines must safeguard its independence and its territorial integrity as every self-respecting sovereign state be with honor bound to do;

"WHEREAS, the Republic of the Philippines has entered into a pact of alliance with Japan based on mutual respect on sovereignty to safeguard territorial and independence to the Philippines;

"NOW, Therefore, I Jose P. Laurel, President of the Republic of the Philippines, do hereby proclaim that a state of war existed between the Republic of the Philippines and the United States and Great Britain effective September 23, 1944 at 10 o'clock this morning.

"Face to face with responsibilities of war I earnestly call upon every Filipino in this momentous hour to show his unswerving loyalty and give support to the government so that regardless of trials and tribulations, we are undergoing and those we shall have to suffer in the near future, we may closely and firmly unite to safeguard the free independent existence of the Philippines".

MANILA, Sept. 23 - Continuing the indiscriminate terror raids on Manila, enemy planes Friday morning destroyed historic Binondo church and scores of buildings, among them the La Insular cigar factory and the Oriente building housing the Constabulary headquarters and the Bureau of Lands office. The burning of the Binondo church has incensed Manilans who are burning with indignation on enemy tactics in machine-gunning civilians' population during Thursday's and Friday's raids. Meanwhile, enemy planes shot down or damaged during the raids totaled 50 planes, according to a check up by the Manila air defense warden.

JAPANESE BASE, SOUTH PACIFIC, Sept. 22 - Two enemy air craft carriers believed to be the base of enemy planes attacking Manila were set ablaze when Japanese navy air unit attacked the enemy task forces early this morning. Other units of the navy are continuing raids on the enemy forces. Commenting on the proclamation of war between the Philippines and the United States and Great Britain, Japanese army and navy headquarters released the following communique today; "Now that the United States air forces are inhumanly bombing and strafing non-combatants, the Philippine Republic has taken up to accept the challenge to the independence and integrity of the Republic. The Imperial Japanese army and navy, have their preparations for positive operations against the enemy now complete, are watching a chance to smash the enemy to the finish to safeguard the independence of Philippine Republic. Firmly convinced that justice always prevails in the end, we request the people of the Republic to trust the Japanese army forces and cooperate with them as best as they can, guided by the spirit of ^{to fulfill the glorious} mission to bring about real peace in the Greater East Asia."

III. Miscellaneous:

5 Oct. '44 - Two days ago, Capt. Belencio with Dean M. Kalaw and Col. Jurado showed up in the poblacion of Naujan accompanied by about 40 EM, all armed, under Lt. R. Belencio. Capt. Belencio succeeded to have a talk with Gov. Gaba. It was gathered that ~~that~~ Gov. Gaba frankly told Capt. Belencio about the futility of their antagonistic acts and utterances and also related to him the past happenings which led to the ruin of their (he and his 2 sons) reputation. Capt. Belencio, as is his characteristics, absorbed all the blame. He was even advised by Gov. Gaba to refrain from actively cooperating with Col. Jurado. Col. Jurado and Dean Kalaw, meanwhile, left the town. Capt. Belencio remained in Bancure.

6 Oct. '44 - Capt. Belencio, while in Balansig, was quoted to have said that he would establish a "troop school" in Bancure. He was expecting the arrival of about 1,000 men from the North within a week. He claimed that he would stay in Naujan for the following reasons:

(a) That the whole province of Mindoro is their (2" Bn) sector.

(b) They want to find out if they will be disarmed once they set their feet in this sector.

(c) To find out if they will not be given food while in Naujan (reported by Pfc. Garcellano)

8 Oct. '44 - Nine (9) EM of the 2nd Bn., all armed (2 with pistols) and 7 with rifles), went to Sn Agustin via Nag-Iba.

9 Oct. '44 - Capt. Belencio with seven fully armed men disarmed the soldiers of Lt. Brucal under Lt. Gallarde at Napale. In addition, several rifles (about 30) were confiscated.

Reliable sources stated that a part of the Jap Navy is taking shelter between Lubang and Anbil Islands.

Intel Report - 11 Oct. '44

10 Oct. '44 - Personal observation of a reliable person disclosed that in Cueneza, Batangas, a big concentration of Jap forces is located in the town's market. North of the market is sheltered about 100 light tanks, gasoline supply, etc. In the mountains of Cueneza, installations of anti-aircraft guns are placed commanding the bays of Batangas and Balayan. In San Luis, at Gulugod-baboy, anti-aircraft guns are also installed.

Major Real (P.C.) was said to be in the custody of the Japs in Batangas contrary to the rumor that he was in Sierra Madre Mountains.

11 Oct. '44 - Reliable sources disclosed that about 3,000 Japs were distributed in the towns of Taal, Lemery, and Batangas.

Rumor is to the effect that the Belencios have orders for their men to "shoot at sight" six ranking officers of the 1" Bn., including Major Ruffy, Capt. dela Torre, and Lt. dela Torre.

Lt. dela Torre stated that Capt. Solsena, BCT, is seeking permission to stay in Naujan where he with eight fellow officers plans to establish his C.P. Eight (8) other Panay officers are said to be staying in the Aranas home, Nag-Iba.

From reliable sources, Capt. Belencio with fully armed men, in three calesas, left for Pola yesterday p.m.

S i r :

In view of the present concentration of enemy troops along the Southern coast of Batangas which is only about twenty Miles from Mindoro, it is possible that the Japanese may still come to trouble the civilians should they receive information regarding our Army movements in this province. It is not only common knowledge but we have documents to show that Mayor Felicisimo Garing of the Philippine Republic, has in various occasions been fully cooperating with the enemy. Now that the Commonwealth Government has been reestablished in Naujan, Mayor Garing has been removed from office. His behavior has been observed to be desperate lately because of the predicament of the Beloncios who are his close relatives.

For the best interest, therefore, of the civilians whose protection the Army is committed to give, I request the Commanding Officer of the Fourth Military District to have Mayor Garing imprisoned in the concentration camp for the duration of the war.

1. Capt. E. P. Beloncio with nine (9) men, armed with pistols and revolvers are presently in Pinagsa bañgan. They are staying in their evacuation place about 1/2 kilometer from the road (near the Pinagsabañgan bridge). It is on the right side of the road when one is going to the direction of Pinamalayan. Personal observation by Pvt. Rosa, Jose dela. RELIABLE:

2. The Japanese who are 17 in number, in Pinamalayan shows no activity. They are always in the camp and goes out only when they are looking for viand. Personal observation by Sgt. Rosa, Rustico la. RELIABLE:

3. One (1) sailboat arrived ~~yesterday~~ yesterday loaded with evacuees from Ilihan, Batangas. They drop anchored in the barrio of Silonay, Calapan. According to them they were ordered to leave the place within two (2) days and ~~can~~ failure to do so will suffer something from them. The information taken from them is that the Japanese are now in the mountains ~~and~~ and are now facing the greatest problem due to lack of food, that forces them to get and commandeer everything from the civilians, such as pigs, chickens, cows and rice or palay and other commodities. Interview taken by Pfc. Garcellano, Manuel. RELIABLE:

4. According to a fairly reliable source the Japanese ammunition depot is located in the convent in Batangas, Batangas; where the Colonel is presently residing. The colonel's name was Habi. The Colonel has with him one mestiza whose name is unknown to the one who gave the info to us. These mestiza was an intelligence operative of the Guerrilla Forces there and she is the one who told this info to the outside force. Source: Romeo Espiritu as told by Conrado Babasa who was a member of the guerrilla in Batangas, under Capt. Ramirez.

5. The Medina's brothers are now in the Concentration Camp. The people are now refreshed when they were brought out of the town. Reported by Sgt. Rosa, Rustico, la. RELIABLE.

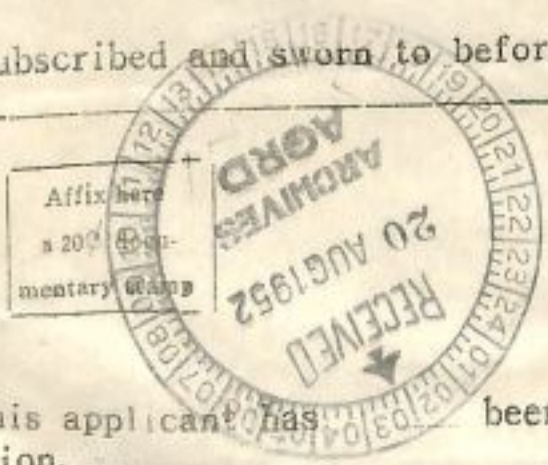

SUBJECT: Intelligence (S-2) Report (Daily)
TO : CO., 1st Battalion, Bolo Area

1. On October 26, one Japanese Bomber Plane was shot down by two American planes in Baco. The plane was already burning when it reached the ground. On the following day 22 Japanese soldiers went to the place and occasionally Lt. Juban with his fifteen men made an attack. Three Japanese soldiers wounded and two civilian women from barrio Malaylay were killed. No casualties were reported. (Reported by Cpl. Astern) RELIABLE.

2. There are 45 Jap soldiers in the Calapan Garrison and 2 Filipines and 14 Japanese Military Police. There are 39 constabulary and 30 Japanese civilians ~~hhhhhhh~~ in Calapan. They do not have any kind of gun except rifle caliber 30. (Reported by Cpl. Astern) RELIABLE.

3. Morale - The people of Calapan are aware of the rumor to the effect that the Army will enter the town and make a hit to the Japanese garrison. (RUMOR) by Cpl. Astern.

4. The Japanese in Calapan have the following transportation:- 2 Trucks, 2 Automobile, 1 Jitney and Calesa. Wireless telegraph is the only means of communication. (Reported by Astern) RELIABLE!

5. ENEMY BEHAVIOR in Batangas:- The Jap. are considering all means of transportation. In cases of motor vehicles, they are taken over for use but not as ownership. In the case of animal drawn vehicle, it is but right confiscation or in some cases purchase but at a very nominal price. Animals like goats, cows, and even chicken encountered by troops on the way are taken over.

It is very apparent that the Japanese are short of means of transportation. It is also certain that they are short of feed as troops in Taal and Lemery are seen having camoting kahey during meal. The shortage of feed may force them to confiscate the stock of the civilian. (Reported by Mr. Umali) Fairly Reliable.

6. Jap. forces in the Balayang Bay Area must be more than ten thousand. The forces in Taal and other neighboring barries must be quite large. It is estimated that they are no less than 30,000. (Reported by Mr. Umali) Fairly Reliable)

1. On 6 Nov 44 at 1600 two (2) trucks loaded with twenty four (24) Japanese soldiers (Inf.) and an officer in automobil from Calapan bound for Gosay to relieve the five gaurds (5) there, stopped at Magassawang Balite because the trucks get engine trouble. As they could not fix the two trucks the officer in automobil went ahead and the soldiers hiked up to their destination.

In their return 7 Nov. '44 0800 riding already in a truck taken from Gosay and in an automobil stopped again at Magassawang Balite and bought pigs, chickens and egges in a very cheaf price.

They pulled one deffective truck and left it in Malinao. They proceeded to Calapan. In each truck left behind they left one civilian driver who are waiting for Japanese mechanic to fix them this afternoon. According to the driver the automobil may return with some Japs soldiers to accompany these mechanics.

Reported by special operative Pvt P. dela Rosa. (Reliable)

2. This day 7 Nov. '44 1030 there were evacues who arrived in San Jose II, Naujan from Batangas. The leader or head of the party Mr. Dionisio Ramos gave the following informations:

(a) Lipa has been subjected to air raid again since last Saturday, 5 Nov. till yesterday when they left Batangas, Batangas. No noticeable resistance was offered by the Japs. Casualties in both sides is not known.

(b) The civilian populace were forced to occupy the poblacion of Batangas and other towns because they preferred the outskirts and interior barriers for their encampment. Women were given immoral treatment by the Japs when chances arise. Working animals such carabaos, cows, horses, pigs and other fowls are being grabbed from the civilians for their use. Reported by agent "L ROSS". (Fairly reliable)

2. Bolo, Bausan, Bat. 29 Oct. Japs setting up barracks.

3. Batangas, Batangas, 31 Oct '44 1 U. S. Photograph plane visited Batangas and flew around the town at normal alt. This same date 8 Japs truck passed by our place loaded with drums which contains either alcohol or gasoline. Also Japs. cavalry unit is stationed in Bat. Elec. Sch. Japs ammunition depots are in the wireless station, hilltop. Here they have tunnels. The rumor here that Bat. pier and High School was bombed was false. on 21 and 24th Oct. '44 U.S. planes only machine-gunned the 4 Q-Boats and 2 vessels.

4. The people in the Barrios of Batangas are forced to evacuate along the seashore from Batangas, Bat. to Lobo along the interior barriers. The people in Tabagao had completely evacuated. In Batangas pier Japanese had two (2) anti-aircraft gun.

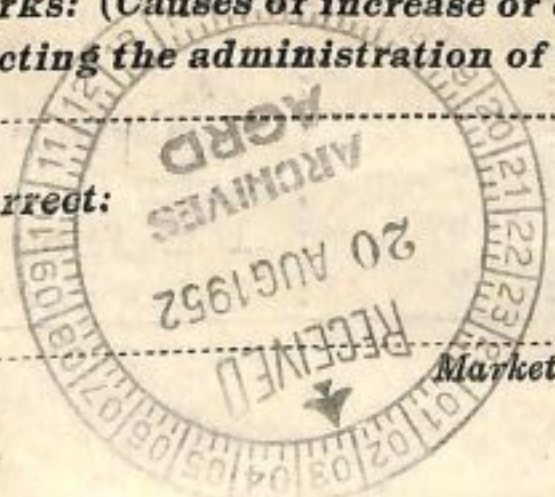

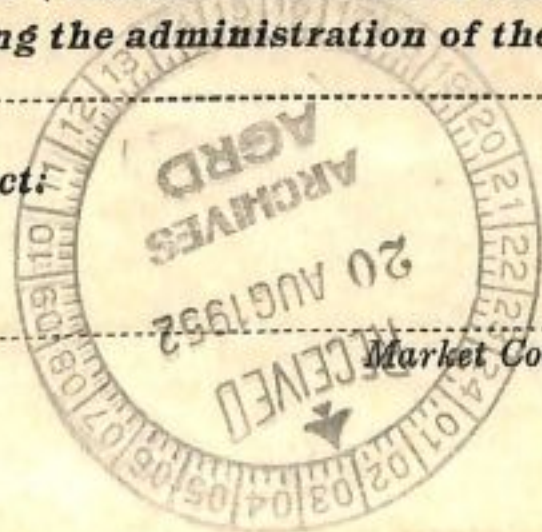

Subject: Intelligence Report -(Special)
To : CO., "4th MD", Bolo Area

The following is a detailed report of Pfc. JOVITO DELOS REYES, who was sent to Batangas on special mission:

I. Japanese artillery-men numbering 300 are stationed in Taal Elem. Sch. Bldg. # 3. They came from Tagaytay and the others from western Batangas.

2. Most of the Japs said that several thousand soldiers are to be added to this town (Taal).

3. This garrison is armed with two(2) 2.95 cal. gun and rifles, ammunitions, and supplies. Also, calesas and carts were taken by the Japs.

II - LEMERY GARRISON: 1. Two hundred (200) men of the Engr. Corps are stationed in the Sch., Bldg., No. 1, equipped with rifles & light arms.

III- SAN LUIS GARRISON: 1. Around one hundred (100) Japs inf. men are quartered in this town. 2. In the Do. of Dulongos a point in the Mt. overlooking Balayang Bay, Jap installed 1 anti-aircraft gun. (Remark; Personal Obs.).

III - At 18⁰⁰ A.M. several waves of U.S. planes bombed the airfield in Lipa and a Jap. troop concentrated in Cuenca. It began 18⁰⁰ which lasted for one hour. The casualties were the airdrome of Lipa and the civilians working there.

2. No interception was made except the Japs. fired their anti-aircraft and machine gun.

3. At 18⁰⁰ a wave of U.S. planes bombed Batangas airdrome, including the ships in the bay.

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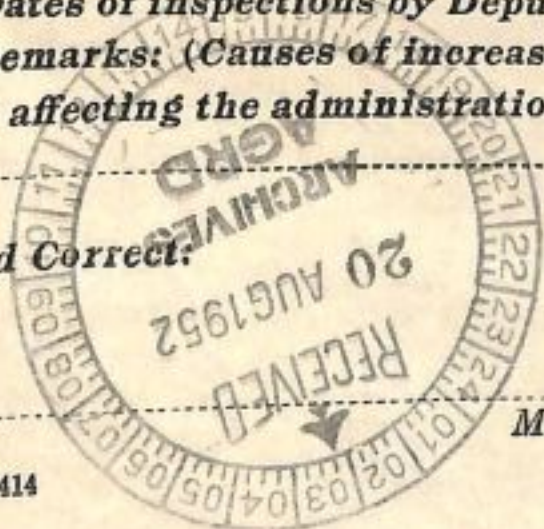

25 Nov. '44 - At about 1330 to 1430 consecutive bombing somewhere in Unisan, Pitogo and Tayabas was observed. (Reported by Agent Antonio Gaba O.P. San Jose 2, Naujan) Reliable.

The Japanese in the city of Manila are occupying the big buildings, churches, schools and colleges. They are frequently leaving their camps especially in time of raids. As per information from evacuees from Manila, who has just arrived in Estrella, 17 Nov. '44 - they said that the Japs are living with the civilians. In the case of schools and colleges they said that one half of the buildings are used as barracks while in the other half of the buildings the students and teachers are holding their classes. Further more they said that it was the Japanese Anti Aircraft that are causing casualties among the civilians, 'cause of faulty ammunitions which after shooting at the American planes the bullets drop to the civilians and then explode. (By Miss Adelida del Rosario one of the Manila evacuees - Reliable)

All American Officers who were captured in Bataan, and who were then concentrated in the Bilibid Prison, were suffering from hunger. They are still being maltreated by the Japanese, which forces them to make a jail break. Most of them were killed. (By Miss Adelaida del Rosario and Miss Celedonia Ramos and by Agent Manuel Garcellano) Reliable.

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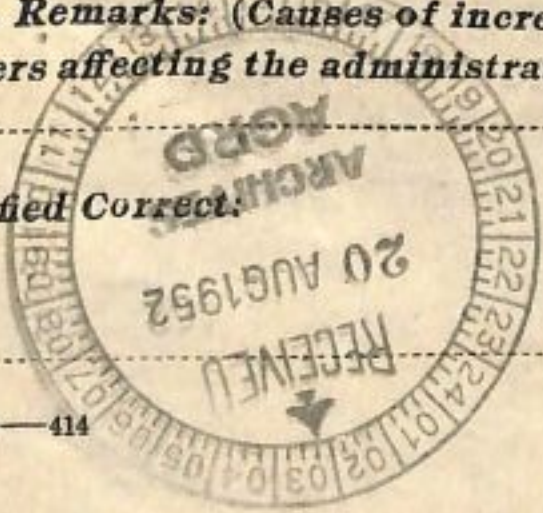
