1. To safeguard the Tactical disposition of soldiers in the field, the following is strictly published to all concerned, both soldiers, Emergency Provincial Guards and etc.

(a) No armed men shall go to market places, gatherings of any sort, conspicuous to public eyes.

(b) No soldiers, Emergency Provincial Guards and etc., shall discuss or converse to make the topics of conversation, whereabouts, location, disposition, etc of Army units, Army personnel, (Officers and Enlisted Men) and Civilian Officials.

(c) No drinking of TUBA, liquor or any sort of alcoholic liquid to the extent of getting drunk, particularly to market places and gatherings of any sort.

(d) Gambling of any kind is absolutely PROHIBITED.

(e) No members of this command is authorized to commandeer, unless duly authorized by the competent officers with authority of same.

2. (a) If and when, Army personnel or Emergency Provincial Guards are sent out on official mission in market places or gatherings of any sort, sidewalks may be given or furnish same, HOW it should be properly hidden unless personnel concerned are to make arrest or apprehension, where commanding officers shall be properly furnish men concerned authority and special pass for same purpose.

(b) When arrest is made by competent Officers and personnel duly authorized, immediate investigation and charge be filed and same be turn over to the nearest Military Police Station or in the absence of same to the nearest Army Headquarters, both personnel and written charges filed against same. Failure to do so within 24 HOURS after an arrest is made, drastic shall be taken against such persons, (Officers and Men) who made the arrest subject to articles of war. Commanding officers of personnel arrested shall be immediately notified and informed within 24 hours.

3. Final disposition of all prisoners shall be made by this office in the SECOND DIVISION, comprising the towns of - Alimodian, San Miguel, Moasin, Cabatu-an, San. Barbara, Carraga, Liganes, Pavia and Iacile City.

2. Violation of this order will mean confiscation of your arms!
3. This is effective to all officers and EM of London 20 and all other Army personnel passing or within these areas.
