



## VITAMINS



Ergosterols, 7-dehydrocholesterol, and other sterols are sometimes called provitamin D, and some of these protamins are thought to be present in small quantities in the animal body. When the animal body is exposed to ultraviolet irradiation some of them are changed to vitamin, thus indicating that vitamin D can be synthesized in the body.

**Viosterol.** - It is a pharmaceutical preparation consisting of a solution of maize oil of the ergosterol derivative, calciferol; it is a very important commercial source of vitamin D on the market. Viosterol is usually marketed in a strength expressed by the term "250 D" which means that it has a vitamin D potency 250 times that of cod-liver oil.

Calciferol melts at 114.<sup>5</sup>; it is not precipitated by digitonin, as are ergosterol and cholesterol; is dextro-rotatory, whereas ergosterol is levorotatory (-132°) in CHCl<sub>3</sub>. The m.p. of ergosterol is from 166° to 183°.

Sources of Vitamin D. - Cod-liver oil (and those of many other fish as those of sardine and herring) is the most import-

2. So also it has been shown that in the absorption of salts from the intestine, the rapidity of absorption stands in no direct relation to the diffusion velocity -- not simple diffusion: absorption must proceed sometimes from higher concentration to lower. Thus, the normal salinity of the blood is about that of a NaCl solution of 0.9 per cent. strength. If a loop of the intestine is filled with a NaCl solution in strengths not greater than 2 per cent, water will pass into the blood. But if the concentration of NaCl solution is greater than 2 per cent water is not absorbed into the blood, but passes into the intestine.

3. When substances are absorbed into the blood the tissues utilize more oxygen, showing that work is performed in the absorption.

4. There is selective action on the part of the membranes: NaCl and glucose are absorbed into the blood much more quickly than the MgSO<sub>4</sub> and sucrose respectively; that certain amino acids are absorbed preferentially.

(4) This selective action is lost when tissues of the intestinal mucosa are injured, as it occurs by adding a small amount of sodium fluorido, which is a cell poison. Only when the intestinal epithelium is removed or injured, as in the above-stated poisoning with sodium fluoride, is it possible to demonstrate a definite relationship between osmotic forces and absorption - that absorption becomes a process of simple filtration or diffusion. Dead intestinal epithelium behave in many respects like an artificial gelatin membrane; neither it exhibits the characteristics of selective absorp-

tact. At one moment from a rise in the ground it may see one company and not the other. By having a man climb a tree it may see both at the same time.

c. If one company falls behind, the connecting group drops back to maintain contact.

d. In this case, close touch must be kept with the company from which it was sent.

e. If contact with the other company is lost, immediate report of the fact is made by runner to the company commander of the company from which the group was detailed.

f. Unless ordered in, the group remains out to protect the flank. It thus automatically becomes a combat patrol.

g. While contact is being kept the connecting group does not fight except for self-protection or to give warning of a flank attack by the enemy.

14. OUTGUARD. a. When troops halt for several hours, part of the command is placed so as to protect the remainder. These protecting troops are called the outpost.

b. The reserve sends out the supports, and the supports in turn place small groups to their front to keep the enemy from surprising them. These groups are called outguards.

c. A squad when on this duty as a unit is called a sentry squad. When it is divided so that half of the squad is on duty at one point and the other half at another, each is called a cossack post.

d. A sentry squad posts three reliefs of one or two sentinels each.

e. A cossack post posts only one sentinel for each of the three reliefs.

f. Supports and outguards are numbered from right to left.

g. The posts of the outguard and the number of sentinels will be given in orders. The leader of the outguard will select the posts for the sentinels.

h. The posts of sentinels must be such that they can from cover -

(1) See the ground in front and to the flanks of the outguard.

(2) Be easily approached under cover from the rear.

i. At night it may be necessary to change the positions of the sentinels. The posts are chosen to cover possible avenues of approach in the outguard sector.

j. Members of the outguard not posted as sentinels rest near by under cover.

k. Sentinels are given the following information:

(1) As to enemy:

- (a) Direction.
- (b) Probable routes of approach.
- (c) Special sector to watch.

(2) As to own troops:

- (a) Location of the support and outguards to the right and left. Number of his re-

3. Tracing of the fire trenches.
    - i. The fire trench must accommodate the unit to occupy it. Such disposition requires at least 5 lineal feet per man.
    - ii. It must protect machine guns from attack.
    - iii. It must cover dead space in bands of machine gun fire.
  4. Construction of the fire trench.
  5. Construction and placing of obstacles of hastily constructed obstacles, concealed wire entanglements on the front and flanks of the group at a distance of about 50 yards will give the best protection.
  6. Selection of openings in wire to be used in case of counterattack.
  7. Clearing the field of fire.
    - i. Especially important if the position is in woods.
    - ii. Only the small underbrush and small trees are left standing to prevent such clearings from being seen by the enemy at distance.
  8. Selection of command post for the group leader.
    - i. The command post must have observation to front and flanks.
    - ii. It must be hidden from hostile view.
    - iii. It must afford quick communication with all parts of the group.
  - f. Preparation of the ground. - (1) When time permits, the group is divided into reliefs. Each relief is assigned a definite task on which it works until such task is completed. The remainder of the platoon is held at rest in a position of readiness.  
(2) When cover must be obtained quickly each group deploys on the trace of its combat emplacement and digs it at once.  
(3) In daylight, when an assault platoon has been stopped and is compelled to dig in at once, men remain beneath the ground and work toward each other.  
(4) At night or when protected from enemy observation the relief method of paragraph (1) above is used.  
(5) The first steps to be taken in the hurried preparations of a position are, in order of importance--
    - (a) To get protection to the front and flanks. Riflemen, scouts, or some of both are used.
    - (b) To get cover. Foxholes are dug, or such cover as shell holes, ditches, or embankments is used.
    - (c) To get obstacles in front of positions, on

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
