Subject: Special SE Report

1. Japs soldiers quartered in the NONS and West Elementary School buildings left Dumaguete midnight of 23 July. Report states that those 185 soldiers were enroute to Surigao. Their object was to help rescue the transport named "NUESTRA SEÑORA DE GUIA" that was sunk at Surigao waters. (B-2)

2. One (1) SUGAR CHARLIE docked Dumaguete on 22 July and unloaded 150 sacks of sugar, 500 sacks of rice and 24 drums of alcohol. They are presently stocked at the KEBEI Hq. The SUGAR CHARLIE was marked on the sides, PELL3.

3. The Japs in Sibulan are replaced by a new force composed of eight (8). Former commander, Sgt OKADA, before he left, was overheard saying, "We will be sent somewhere in Borneo." Present armaments used are eight (8) cal .30 Enfield Rifles and one (1) TM.

4. Aerial activities - Observed daily are intensive air combat practice. Procedure - A plane (light bomber, painted yellow) towed with it a hollow cylindrical object of about 1 meter in diameter and 6 meters in length made of canvas cloth. The frame seems to be of wood because the canvas is apparently glued to the frame. The cylinder is tied by a big rope about 100 meters in length and the other end of the rope is tied to the tail of the plane. While this plane with the cylinder is flying, two (2) NATE planes fly over it (cylinder) and machine gunned it with a .50 cal MG, from the rear gunner of the plane. It has been noted that they are using the real bullets because, as indicated, one (1) man in barrio Manga, Dumaguete was hit

by astray bullets from the air and killed, and also another one was seriously wounded in Bantayan, Dumaguete, because of machine gun fire of the planes.

5. On 22 July, one (1) plane crashed at the eastern portion of the landing field resulting to one (1) aviator killed.

Subject: Rise in Prices of Cereals

To : All Finance Officers, DCM Agents and Supply Officers, 7th

1. In order to prevent farmers from suffering any loss caused by present high price of labor, tools, seedlings, working animals, etc. and to provide an incentive for farmers to plant more; all concerned are authorized to pay higher prices than the prices set forth in Executive Order No. 20 dated 14 April '44 of Island Governor, Hon. Alfredo Montelibano for the coming harvests, but not more than the prices quoted below for cereals (Palay, rice, and corn). This is not in any way to counterbalance inflation or the soaring prices, but merely to protect farmers. Bargaining of prices should be done whenever possible especially in localities where harvests are very abundant.

2. The following are the prices set forth in the above-mentioned Executive Order together with the prices herein authorized:

TO: MATA & GALVEZ

1. Previously, the organization of our Service Units and the various Headquarters Battalions of the line regiments in our organization had always been to assign them to garrison certain areas. Of course, we are all aware that this is not the best way to make the disposition of such Headquarters and Service Units. This fact has been imposed upon us, for which I am not blaming anyone of you or any other of our Commanders in the field, because of the situation existing then. Presently, however, for which I am glad to note, you have made proper changes in their disposition. It is only proper and necessary that under the present situation, which has already changed radically, that it will be necessary for all of us to utilize all Headquarters and Service Units as such, that is, to make them to be of service to the units in the field who will carry out our assigned missions.

2. Under the present enemy situation in Negros, you will notice that the concentration of enemy installations and enemy forces are:

- (1) LA CARLOTA-BACOLOD-SARAVIA-PARRICA Area;
- (2) BALS-TANJAY-DUMAGUETE Area.

Both of you are aware of the enemy tactical situation in your respective fields.

3. As I have already suggested before in anticipation of this situation, it will be necessary for us to shift our arms and ammunition now the hands of Headquarters and Service Units, except those essentially necessary for the local protection, to the various line battalions that we have in the field. At the same time, such units should be so disposed as to enable them to handle the service of supply in the various local granaries that have been established and developed, using at the same time, the local labor potential to the maximum, assisted by the local civil officials in the rear areas.

4. At present, I am not particularly aware of your Engineer Units, but I am positive that you will use them accordingly.


5. Reference to the LA CARLOTA situation, I have already taken up with you (MATA) previously the encircling of at least four (4) line battalions around this area. The importance of LA CARLOTA to the enemy is obvious and is worth repeating:

- 2 -

- (1) LA CARLOTA is the only inland garrison now in the hands of the Japs in Negros;
- (2) LA CARLOTA is the only interior garrison now in the hands of the enemy that is surrounded by a net-work of roads.
- (3) It is inland, and therefore, safe from immediate surprise American Army operations.

6. The situation in the BALS-TANJAY-DUMAGUITE Area is probably less complicated. I believe that the District main effort should be delivered in this area, with a suggestion that a feint be made against DUMAGUITE and deliver the main effort in the BALS Area. Depending upon the situation, a follow-through may be exploited when and if an advantage presents itself, or a strong cordon may be used to localize the enemy, especially in and around DUMAGUITE. By immobilizing the enemy in DUMAGUITE Area, we can safely conclude that all of southern Negros, and particularly all of Negros Oriental, shall be free from enemy. This alone will give us tremendous advantage, both materially and morally.

However, caution, careful, thorough and wise planning will be essential in all our operations in order to avoid needless loss of lives. By all means we must consider this: Will the investment in lives and blood be reasonable compared with the gain that we expect to get, or with the mission we want to accomplish - is it necessary? All units, officers and men, undertaking any operation should be carefully briefed in order to make them all understand just exactly what they are expected to do.

GENERAL MACARTHUR'S PLANES AND TORPEDO BOATS REPULSED A JAPANESE TASK FORCE ATTACKING MINDORO ISLAND. IN DEFEATING THE ENEMY SURVIVE UNITS AMERICAN ALBION SUNK 3 OF 6 JAPANESE DESTROYERS AND SCORED HITS ON A BATTLESHIP AND CRUISER. THE REMAINING ENEMY WARSHIPS SCORED AFTER SABLEING THE MINDORO COASTLINE. THURSDAY ALLIED COMMUNIQUE ALSO TELLS OF JAPANESE AIR ACTIVITIES AGAINST AMERICAN TROOPS ON MINDORO. 3 OF PHILIPPINES HEAVY BOMBERS ATTACKED CLARKS FIELD FOR 4 TIMES IN 5 DAYS. AMERICAN FIGHTER PLANES ACCOMPANYING THE BOMBERS SHOT DOWN 13 OF 20 JAPANESE INTERCEPTORS. THE COMMUNIQUE SAYS ALSO THAT 39 MORE ENEMY AIRCRAFTS NOT PREVIOUSLY REPORTED BELIEVED WERE DESTROYED IN THE CHRISTMAS DAY ASSAULTS ON CLARKS FIELD. IN THE 4TH ATTACK OF CLARKS FIELD THE JAPANESE LOST 85 PLANES DEFINITELY DESTROYED. OFF THE COAST OF LUZON ALLIED FLYERS SUNK A 1,000 TON ENEMY FREIGHTER OVER THE VESAY AS HEAVY UNITS CONCENTRATED 50 TONS OF BOMBS ON PUERTO PRINCESA AT PALAWAN. ON LETTE ISLAND GENERAL MOPPING UP OPERATION ARE CONTINUING. THE LATEST COMMUNIQUE REPORTS ALSO THAT ANOTHER 827 JAPANESES DEAD HAVE BEEN COUNTED ON LETTE.

THIS NEWS IS PRESENTED AT DICTATION SPEED FROM AMERICA.

United States Submarine sank a large Japanese aircraft carrier and 26 other enemy vessels in Pacific and Asiatic waters. In addition to these American undersea craft sank 6 more combatant vessels. Included in this is a light cruiser, a destroyer, 2 aircraft vessels and 2 destroyer transports. Since the start of the war American submarine alone have sank or destroyed 930 Japanese vessels. American super fortresses bombers in daylight Wednesday set fire in an aircraft factory and other targets in the Tokyo area. A medium force of Saipan based B-29 delivered his 5th Major assault against the Tokyo region. The lost to enemy action. Anti Aircraft fires and Japanese fighter opposition over Tokyo is described as moderate. Some 750 miles south of Tokyo American Naval Vessels and Liberator heavy Bombers again attacked within 4 days that IWO has been subjected to a combine sea and air assault. It also mark the 20 consecutive days that the island has been under the American attacks.

In the latest operation units of the Pacific fleet ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~ set fire to enemy landing craft and blown up enemy gun boats.

On the seicntic mainland China based American fighter/ bombers destroy 29 more Japanese planes at Tsinnan airfield in northern Shantung, province. Within the past 3 days American flyers have wrecked a total of 70 enemy aircrafts at Tsinnan.

1. Your belated communication dated 1 Feb. 45, re operation in the Aguisan-Binalbagan Area, received only yesterday.

2. We effected one operation in the above area because since the start of our operations against the ALF, 27 Dec. 44 to date, no unit prevented or tried to prevent the daily coming in or going out of the enemy troops between ALF and Binalbagan town, sometimes thru Aguisan. As a matter of fact, the enemy crossed at will to and from the ALF to Binalbagan.

3. In our first and only operation in the town of Binalbagan, 30 Jan. 45, Lt-Col. Intengan was present with 12 of his own men, all taking part in said operation. The enemy noticed our troops and withdrew to the crossing, and therefore, no open engagement took place.

4. For your information, we have taken over today the ALF and we are going to hold the same. In view of this, we believe that there is no further need of the unit of your 2nd Bn operating in the Anc-i-Trinitaria Area, and the same may be used usefully elsewhere.

5. We shall continue however to send in operatives within Binalbagan town and elsewhere, as we also need all information available that may be useful to us, and if it might be also valuable to you, it will be passed on accordingly. Therefore, we trust that there will be no objection on your part, as our main objective

before and now being the ALF, it is imperative that we gather information in places elsewhere.

5. This message is coursed thru your 2nd Bn for their information, and we hope that coordination and cooperation shall always exist between our respective units.

Dear PRING:


During one of my inspections in South Negros, I met Mayor TAYKO of SIATON. Mayor TAYKO is very energetic and full of initiative. He has been very sympathetic and cooperating with the Military Forces in his area. In fact, were it not for the cooperation of his municipality, our 75th Infantry would have found great difficulty in subsistence. Fortunately, this was not so because of the help of Mayor TAYKO and his municipality.

Mayor TAYKO discussed with me a town planning for the Municipality of SIATON which was burned both by the USFIP and by the Japs during the period March to August, 1944. I had been apprised of his plan which goes to the extent of even actually prescribing the form of houses according to the plans prepared before by the National Government. Laying out of streets and sanitation are included in his plans.
