Narration:

Ten months ago they were taken by the Japanese from Amoy and were brought to the Philippines. They were 50 in number when they arrived at Manila last 15 July '44. A week after that they arrived at Fabrica they were employed on various works. Last 5 Jan '45, they escaped and hide at the home of a Chinese at Sagay. ~~Name of the Chinese is "Lo Pong".~~ They happened to go there because on several occasions, Yap Tiao Hoy was brought over by the Japs to that farm on some manual work or sometimes to buy some viands and vegetables. They admitted to have been in Formosa for more than a year before they brought here to the Philippines. They were captured by our boys at Lda Bitoon, Sagay last 20 April '45. They claimed to have not been in the Army of the Japanese and can't give the identifications of the Japanese Troops at Fabrica because they do not know how to speak the Japanese language.

2. Reported likewise, is the practice of some members of a certain supply unit (No specific mention- presumably this unit is operating around Bacolod City) of buying palay @ P7.00 a cavan and re-selling same @ P25.00 each.
3. Investigate with the aim in view of filing court-martial charges for violating Art. 82 AW (PA), if proven, the penalty of which is death or such other punishment as a court-martial or military commission may direct.



1. Returned. Only 2 carloads of firewood gets to the Manapla Central every week. Sometimes due to excuses of lack of food, no firewood gets to the central at all. Alcohol being manufactured is negligible at present, and the contents in the storage tank is barely 8" from the bottom plate. Due to shortage of firewood, yeast, and acids, not much alcohol is being distilled. The report in the basic communication is a gross exaggeration. The firewood dealer renders a weekly report here.

2. If that Hq is so concerned with the production of alcohol from Manapla, why was my request to blow up the distillery as early as last June, 1945 disapproved? If the plan was to stop alcohol production, by blowing the distillery, even if they use all the wood in the forest, they still wont have alcohol.

Subject: Suspected Spies

1.- The following suspects are being sent to the 72nd MP Co for temporary custody:

(1) Carmelino Cajonera - (Affidavit herewith attached) He was induced by Sgt Emilio Dionson to this Headquarters for investigation.

(2) Miss Julia Ulbide and Miss Saragon - they will be investigated as soon as this Office have sufficient time. They were induced by the 2-2 Anti-Tank Bn for having connections with the enemy while inside occupied Area. More evidences will follow.

2.- For purposes of Intelligence, this Headquarters will ask and gather information in so far as it is of informational value to our Combat Units. In deciding whether they should be detained or freed we hold that office responsible where this Office believes a case exist against these suspects. If after a certain period this Section can not gather sufficient evidences against them these suspects will be at your disposal.

regulation but also incidental consequences.' In the application of the ordinance in question, it is plain that the amount required of each owner of a building in San Juan del Monte is so high and excessive as to exceed the necessary amount sufficient to cover the expenses of issuing the permit, the cost of the necessary inspection or police surveillance and other incidental expenses. In the instant case, for example, the amount of P456.50 that is being charged for the construction of the two buildings of the St. Joseph Academy is considered by us excessive, not to say confiscatory. While it is believed that the rate of the permit fee should be graduated on the basis of the kind and size of the building, so as to be just and equitable, yet in the opinion of this Department, the maximum amount to be charged for such permit fee, in order to be considered a fee for regulatory purposes and not for revenue, shall not be in excess of P25.00.

"In view of the foregoing, it is requested that the municipal council of San Juan del Monte be instructed to amend article 12 of Ordinance No. 2, series of 1926, in accordance with the foregoing views."

"The foregoing views are fully concurred in by this Department. Provincial Boards and therefore requested to issue appropriate circulars to the different municipal councils and municipal district councils in the province and to disapprove under the provisions of section 2233 of the Revised Administrative Code any municipal ordinance imposing building and repair permit fees in excess of P25.00."

1. We, members of the Board of Investigating Officers, convened this date at Calantucan, Ilog, at about 4:00 o'clock in the afternoon to submit a report of the findings and recommendation re shooting of Aguede Bandang:

(a) That after careful study and deliberation of the deceased's affidavit, we the board of investigating officers were thoroughly convince that the deceased was guilty of having guided the Japs to Cantoray together with one Julian Gallega which led to the eventual capture of Lt. Emilio Gemilla together with his thirteen (13) companions with arms.

(b) That after the affidavit was taken at the BN CP at Calantucan which is herewith attach, the decease upon being led to WPC for detention, attempted to escape and therefore was shot by Sgt. Aurelio Lagen, Jr. whose affidavit is herewith attached.

Recommendations:

(a) We, the members of the board of investigating officers, do hereby recommend that Sgt. Aurelio Lagen, Jr., be exonerated of any charge re shooting of Aguede Bandang inasmuch as the former did the shooting in the performance of his duties. Furthermore, the deceased was guilty of the crime punishable by death.

(b) We the members of the board recommends further that Lt. Cornelio Tenerife and his six (6) rifle-men who were responsible for the capture of Aguede Bandang be given a reward due them.

2. Potenciano Terille had been many a time stealing carabaoes in unoccupied areas and sold them inside the town of Kabanaklan. (Please read his sworn statement) He is considered by his in-laws as an undesirable element and ~~is~~ they even rejoiced that he was at last apprehended. He could even dare say to us that if given a chance to escape he will tell the Japs not only tell but guide the enemy to every headquarters he knew.

3. It is therefore strongly recommended that Potenciano Terille be placed under protective custody until his guilt is proven beyond reasonable doubt and you can use your final decision.
