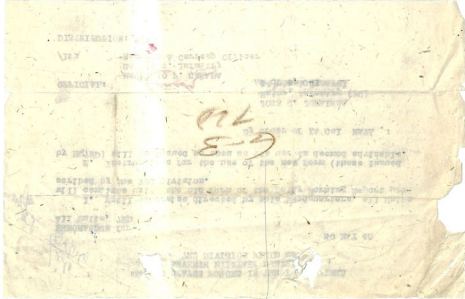

2. To this, the East Negroes Sector, has been assigned a definite territory, circumscribed by definite meets and bounds. 3. It has been noted that alleged representatives of other sectors have been surreptitiously procuring supplies within the territorial jurisdiction of this Command. Said procurement is surreptitious because it has been consistently done without the knowledge or consent of the Sector Commander.

4. Such practice must stop at once.

5. Any person, after having been apprised of his clear duty, who insists in trespassing upon this Sector, shall be apprehended and turned over to this headquarters for proper disciplinary action by such person's superior officer, in the case of one subject to military law, or for prosecution, if such individual is a person NOT subject to military law.

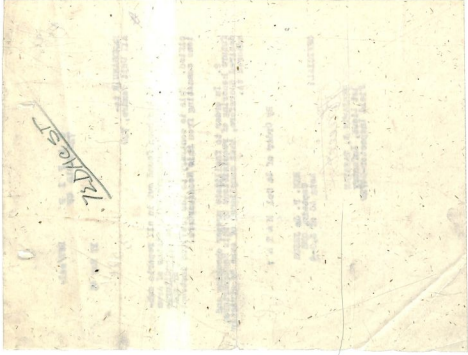

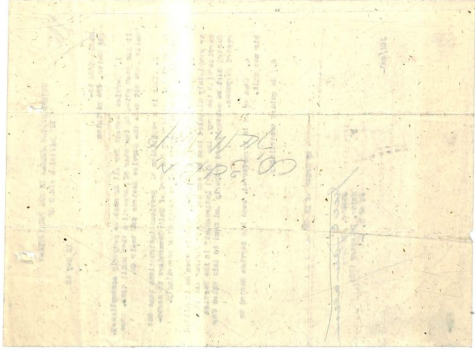

1. Effective immediately, the authorized allowance for fresh components of thirty centavos (P0.30) per man per day is reduced to fifteen centavos (P0.15) per man per day.

2. This measure is necessitated by the present shortage of funds. Supply Officers are enjoined to use their initiative and resourcefulness in obtaining maximum use of the funds allowed for fresh components. Instead of individual Supply Sergeants purchasing for their respective units, for instance, the allowances due the Co (or the Rest if sufficiently consolidated in one area) may be pooled to take advantage of wholesale prices and supplies thus purchased equitably distributed to units according to strength reports.

3. Steps are being taken to supplement the authorized allowance of P0.15 per man per day by making available to all units dry components, and as far as possible fresh components in the form of livestock and fish.

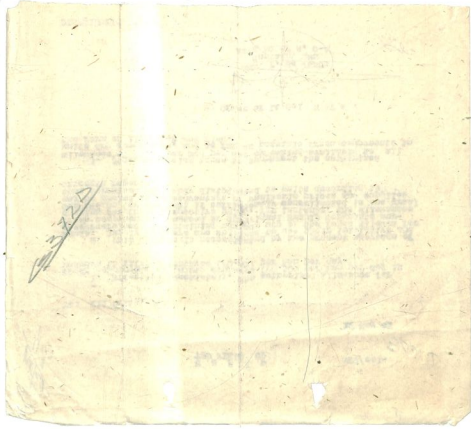

1. Publish the attached Executive Order and have it read to your men. Every officer and man in your unit must know the content of this Executive Order.

2. The Executive Order is clear and unmistakable. This is a confirmation of our Memorandum issued to all Units sometime ago assuring all units of our status; assuring every officer and soldier of their future economic stability, moreover, assuring them of their appointments and promotions.

3. This Executive Order solves the problem asked by those who have been doubting our existence. It is directed that every officer must read this Executive Order to his men and must make his men understand clearly what it is all about.

4. We have been together during those dark days in spite of adversities we have undergone. Hunger, misery, privations, hardships and many other forms of sacrifices were not able to separate us from each other neither disband us from our organization. We continued to fight the enemy, we stuck together for a common cause in spite of our doubtful existence. We were to give the enemy from "sweat even at the cost of our own lives. We were motivated by our aim and ambition to preserve this country for our posterity and for future Filipinos to enjoy the blessings of liberty, freedom and democracy. That was our norm of conduct and behavior during those dark days in our history.

Today the situation has changed. All our doubts have been solved. Our existence defined and all officers and men are now members of the Philippine Army; the Seventy Second Division is now United States Force. All our appointments and promotions are confirmed. (See Executive Order No. 21.) The Americans are here now to destroy the last enemy vestige in the island. Germany virtually surrendered. Any moment from now the enemy in South West Pacific may collapse; our victory is sure. We are now paid full salary in victory currency. Everything now is bright. Privations and wants and all forms of sacrifices we have had are now sad memories. Our condition are much better; much alleviated; much improved. Our decision to free our country of the yellow invaders in conscience with our feelings of love of Country and to free her from barbarous invaders has not a bit changed. Instead the favor of patriotism in us increases day by day. More than ever therefore we must stick together as one man to finish destroying the last enemy resistance in this island. We must finish our mission. We must carry on. We must continue to give bent to our feelings to liberate our Country. Our task to save our Country from the destruction of the SWP rascals is about to be finished.

History will record our doings and deeds and let us be worthy of immortality that is reserve for all of us. If we stick together until the end, posterity will honor us in its golden pages as men who have given to our beloved Philippines freedom and democratic ways of life. The honor is ours; the happiness and prosperity for our people to receive and our Country to enjoy the prestige and honor that the world bestowed on her.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 21

DECLARING TO BE ON ACTIVE SERVICE IN THE PHILIPPINE ARMY  
ALL PERSONNEL NOW ACTIVELY SERVING IN RECOGNIZED MILITARY  
FORCES IN THE PHILIPPINES

WHEREAS, many civilians residing in the Philippines of Filipino, American, and other foreign citizenships, and Officers and Enlisted Men of the Philippine Army, of the Armed Forces of the United States and of Allied Nations, have continued armed resistance against the Imperial Japanese Government since the sixth of May '48;

WHEREAS, this action has written in blood an epic of courage, devotion and loyalty to the Government and the people of the Philippines;

WHEREAS, these military forces have contributed in a large measure to the Allied military effort and to the liberation of the Filipino people from the yoke of the Japanese invader;

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Government of the Philippines to recognize this allegiance.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, SERGIO OSMEÑA, President of the Philippines, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Emergency Powers Law, Section 22 a and Section 27 of the Commonwealth Act Number One notwithstanding, do hereby ordain and promulgate the following:

1. All persons, of any nationality or citizenship who are actively serving in recognized military forces in the Philippines, are hereby considered to be on active service, in the Philippine Army.
2. The temporary grades of Enlisted Men, enlisted or promoted in the field by Commanders of recognized military forces or by their delegated authority, are hereby confirmed.
3. The temporary ranks of all officers, appointed or promoted in the field by Commanders of recognized military forces, are hereby confirmed.
4. The date of entry into active service in the Philippine Army will be that of joining a recognized military force.
5. The effective date of rank for Commissioned Officers and Enlisted Men will be the date on which they were appointed or promoted to such rank by the Commander of recognized military force.
6. A recognized military force, as used herein, is defined as force under a Commander who has been appointed, designated or recognized by the Commander-in-Chief, Southwest Pacific Area.

Done at the seat of Government in the Field, this 28th day of October in the Year of our Lord, Nineteen Hundred and Forty-Eight, and of the Commonwealth of the Philippines, the 14th.

  2. It is noted that reports on Status of Arms and Ammunition are very much lower than what is actually in your units and as shown by our records.
  3. Some Unit Commanders are reluctant to report their real status, apparently fearing that part of their arms might be withdrawn from them. This should not be the case, as beside hiding their true capabilities, Unit Commanders are at the same time depriving their own units of whatever help it may be possible to extend to them if their real situation were known.
  4. Unit Commanders, for the good of their own units should be honest in the submission of their reports on Status of Arms and Ammunition. All expenditures of ammunition and all arms lost or damaged must be regularly reported, so that records of this Headquarters can be kept up-to-date for proper guidance in determining future issues.
  5. Henceforth, failure of Unit Commanders to explain in discrepancies in their reports as compared with the records of this Headquarters will be drastically dealt with. Future dis-

1.- Information gathered by your reconnaissance patrol sent out by your Battery as embodied in an answer to our message dated 9 January was found erroneous. The enemy had crossed the Bago river which make original reports of our scouts correct and verification of your reconnaissance patrol defective.

Presence of the enemy could have been noted by your outpost due to firing the night previous. This could have been verified by patrols you would have sent were your guards on the alert or on post. Actually there was no interior guard detail or the guards detailed were asleep and not properly checked up by your officers.

For your information while you were attempting to hit the enemy across the Bago river, a group of Japs were already at your South at Palhe and did not fire against you due to their limited number and not knowing your capabilities. One Jap was observed riding a carabao observing your fire.

2.- This defect is made due to late sending of reconnaissance patrols and inaccuracy of the reconnaissance patrol leader in accomplishing intelligence missions. Defects like this are very costly mistakes.

3.- Desire you take definite steps to correct similar errors in the future, so as not to endanger other units or installations depending on you for security.

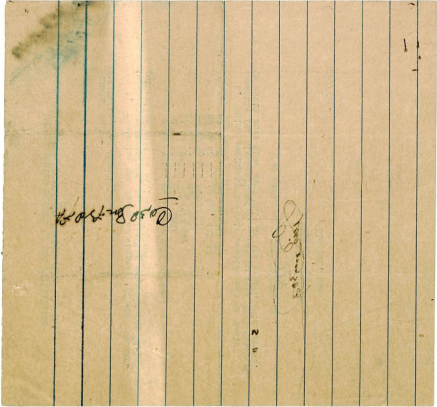

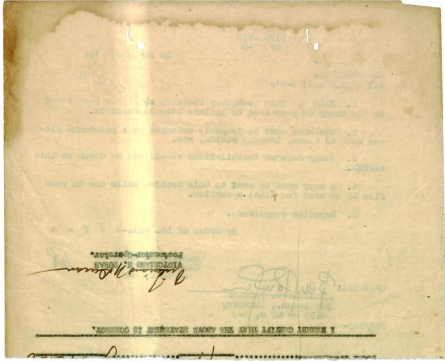

Referring to your letter of the 20th ultimo, requesting correction of the deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report of Mr. Sixto B. Ortiz, Supervising Treasurer, to the Honorable, the Secretary of Finance, I have the honor to submit hereunder the action taken on, and explanation of, the alleged deficiencies, viz:

1. PERSONNEL:- The employees of this Office who are not civil service eligibles have been duly advised to the effect that unless they qualify in the next second grade civil service examination the employees concerned will be replaced by eligibles in the said examination. Copies of my letters were furnished that office.

2. PROPERTY:- The records of this Office show that only the newly finished school buildings of Barrios Lutey and Matang are not insured and the lands upon which these buildings are constructed are not being titled. Application for the insurance of these buildings will soon be filed with the Honorable, the Treasurer of the Philippines. With reference to the lands, registration proceedings are still pending in the Court of the First Instance of Negros Oriental.

3. ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE:- The accounts receivable of this office, as shown in our books of accounts, were accounts receivable from the Department of the Interior on account of election expenses incurred during the election of November 8, 1938. These accounts were not receivable from private parties. They amounted to P388.91, clearly itemized in our books, showing names of persons or companies and the nature of services rendered.

4. OFFICE:- The general appearance of this office, arrangement and cleanliness deserved a rating more than fair. It is well located, ventilated, clean, painted and the things inside are well arranged. All the pieces of equipment are well dusted.

All the other deficiencies pointed out in the above mentioned inspection report will be duly corrected.

3. All Supply Agencies concerned should exercise proper care in utilizing civilians and civilian labor pools, and must see to it that requests are not granted to such an extent as to interfere with operations of such agencies.

4. Civilians who are willing to be such, may be employed as permanent labor pools. They will be paid, at the authorized rate of P1.00 per day, with subsistence. Labor pools bearing casualties in the performance of their duties will be entitled to relief, in accordance with Government orders issued in this respect.

5. In order to be of as much help as possible to civilian haulers in return for their services, QM Agents and Supply Offices are authorized to pay them partly in cash, at authorized Government rates, and partly in kind (food, cloth, salt or sugar), depending on the availability of supplies of these commodities in their localities. Supply Offices and QM Agents will exercise due care and discretion and should be guided in this respect by conditions existing in their respective areas.

Subject: Economy in expenditure of Ammunition

To : All Sub-sector Commanders, WMA

1. It is desired that all units should economize in using ammunition. Unnecessary losses or use of ammunition must be avoided. Firing at any object other than the enemy, is prohibited and anybody violating it will be severely dealt with for disobedience to orders.

2. Patrols or units going to operations must be given the following instructions in the use of ammunition:

a. To fire only when the enemy is within effective range - that is, within 300 yards.

b. To use not more than 10 rounds per rifle and 40 rounds per M for ambush and not more than 5 rounds for sniping. Additional rounds will be fired unless in imminent danger of being captured or annihilated in which case additional rounds may be fired until such time when the danger is removed.

c. To issue only 30 rounds per rifle and 60 rounds per M to units or patrols going out for operations.

d. Units resisting in defense of their areas, during enemy attacks will use only 10 rounds per rifle and 40 rounds per M at every defensive position.

The above limitations do not prohibit the use of additional rounds whenever there is opportunity for the annihilation of the enemy.

3. All unit commanders must instruct their men and see to it that our ammunition is fired sparingly and judiciously. Let us reserve our own ammunition for any future major operations.

It is a noble thing for the Americans to fight for the protection of their own liberty at the sacrifice of their own lives. But is it a noble or just policy to force another people to fight for that liberty even when it is very obvious that further resistance is futile, as in the case of the small units which are engaged in the meaningless and absolutely hopeless guerilla-like activities, at this time when all the USAFFE has already surrendered?

Is it in accordance with the principle of liberty for the Filipinos to perish fruitlessly in defense of American interests in the Philippines, where the USAFFE no longer exists?

Luis B. Jakosalem, the highest remaining leader in the southern district of Cebu Island surrendered to the Japanese Imperial Army together with his son, his nephew 2nd Lieutenant Venancio Hernando, the radio-operator 2nd Lieutenant Ladislao Morono, and other leaders, thus avoiding inevitable and futile death. This act is the expression of the principle of liberty bestowed upon every person.

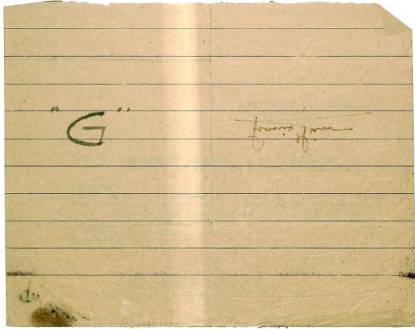

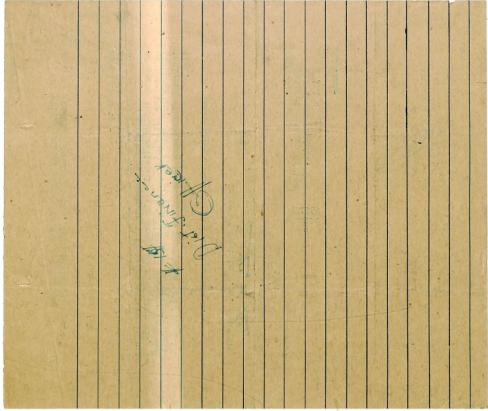

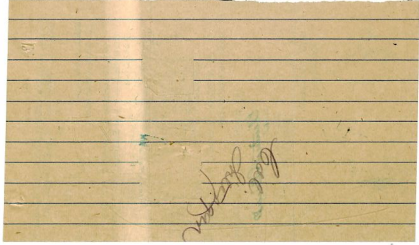

SUBJECT: DISPOSITION of cases involving  
Fifth Column Activities.

1. In connection with the authority of this office to supervise the administration of Military Justice within the Command, the following instructions for guidance of all concerned are hereby published:

(a) It has been observed and cases are brought to the knowledge of this Office that the G-2, all S-2 and subordinate Unit Commanders are keeping and holding War Prisoners - suspected or confirmed Fifth Columnists, - for indefinite length of time in their respective headquarters. Some even go to the extent of ordering the execution of suspected Fifth Columnists without going into the formality of a trial either Summary or otherwise.

(b) This practice is contrary to all existing laws of War and regulations. Attention of all concerned are called to the provisions of H.A., (The Hague Regulation) Art. 29 and Art. 32 of the American A.W., which provides that "any person who in time of war shall be found x x x acting as a spy x x x shall be tried by a General Court-Martial or by a Military Commission, and shall, on conviction thereof, suffer death."

(The above regulation have found expression in our Philippine Army A.W., Article 43, which provides that spies (now termed Fifth Columnists) shall be tried by a General Court-Martial or by a Military Commission.

(c) For the disposition of cases dealt in this Bulletin all concerned must be guided hereafter by Bulletin No. 1, issued by the Office of the Inspector General 4th Philippine Corp, dated Nov. 22, 1942, by authority and order of Lieut.-Colonel W. BRADY, Jr.

All Commanders of Departments, Sectors, and Sub-Sectors concerned are hereby directed to circulate this instructions to their respective commands.

1. When there is any casualty or casualties in your unit, it is imperative that they must be reported immediately to this Hqrs. It has been noted that no casualty reports were received by this Hqrs specially from units in operation, which it is a common knowledge that we suffered some casualties.

2. Individual Casualty Reports maybe accomplished later.
