Remarks: In Binalbagan 210 are marines, 50 are infantry & 2 are kurasiki employees. Infantry in Binalbagan decreases from 85 to 50, 8 Nov. '44 & 11 Nov. '44 respectively when 2 Japs died during the USFIP interception in Sitio Catason, 4 replaced the 4 dead Japs in Isabela during the operation of "C" Company and 9 was added to Isabela 2430 Zed Nov. 11, '44.

Aguisan are rotated every afternoon by another 40 marines from Central Binalbagan.  
Isabela increases from 16 to 25, 2430 Zed 11 Nov. '44 brought in by 2 trucks from Binalbagan.

REMARKS - La Carlota proper shows biggest strength of active 13 June '44 when the Mobile Unit arrived. Also (JOC) when HQ JOC arrived on same date. The Minos last 8 June '44 was the usual strength of 200 was noted when they were in the process of improving the area. No landing field.

11. RESULTS OF ENEMY ACTIVITIES

1 June '44 to 14 June '44 no activity of the enemy is worth recording. Yes. They patrol but only in areas within their vicinities. Get no encounter and result - civilians were caught, investigated being suspected as soldiers and others as robbers. And when on patrol they fire the 11 rifles, Bren Gun to no effect.

15 June '44 - Japs, JOCs and Minos the Mobile Units patrolled as far as reaching the area of "A", still the enemy term this as only a patrol - result - civilians, some USFIP headquarters and capture some typewriters, transmitter and other supplies (not very reliable). JOC and Minos patrol up to Galapi, from La Carlota passing La Castellana. Result - houses were burnt down. (see damage under verification)

b. Naval -  
 14 June '44 - sighted (above the mt) 16 transport-north bound (not verified)  
 15 June '44 - sighted (above the mt) 8 transport, north bound.

c. Aerial -  
 Information received reliable that 4 airplanes type not known conveying the 16 transport.

Note: A party of two truck-loads of Saps and Tai Nos arrived La Castellana garrison prior to 28 March instant to reinforce the present occupants thereof during their patrol campaign in our area; the said troops returned north-bound presumed in Carlota garrison forthwith upon completion of mission. Isabela's strength as of weekly report issued 21st effected by a decrease of 4 in all, up to date of this report's issue.  
No other report re changes.

(B) LOCATION AND NATURE OF DEFENSE INSTALLATIONS -

Previous reports re changes in facilities, re-strengthening undergone in the Isabela garrison, has been completed. No other significant changes in other garrisons noted.

(C) UNIT COMMANDERS -

New report: Isabela -

Present Garrison Commander Capt. TORIBIO BARRIA liable to be changed by other officers as quoted. Ditto left garrison 7:00 a.m., instant, destination unknown as effected by said retraining.

No other changes.

(D) ENEMY UNITS:

Isabela - Japs' interpreter alias "KING" died in hospital recently; Mayor Claudio Montilla's most-hated Jap Official Capt. Tadisho Sakata left with an unknown destination to be relieved by other CO; Small Captain TASHIMA also left Isabela in the earlier part of the evening of the 28th with destination unknown as effected in said reshuffling. Capt. Sakata's departure was on a.m. inst.

No other changes.

(E) ARMAMENTS:

Hinigaran - Enemy in Hinigaran are using 30 caliber rifles in their patrols.

Montevideo - Ditto

Isabela - Ditto; Plus a number of Automatic Rifles and Handgrenades which renders a lot of support for the infantrymen during enemy outines.

La Castellana - Bren Guns, AA and MGs have recently arrived from La Carlota garrison to promote potential arms support for the enemy in case of any threat from us.

(F) SUPPLY DEPOSITS: - No significant changes for above period.

(G) RESOURCES AVAILABLE:

Enemy's routine of commandeering palay from the civilians in the safety zones still raging in progress at a large scale. At times, some of the palay owners are paid at a lower price than they are to ask from the Japs; as yet, these poor civilians could do nothing much in their favor. Enemy's campaign for scraps in regard for the present. Enemy at Bacolod in terrible depression as where and how to secure the necessary prime commodities to be fed to the respective garrisons in dire need of same for long now.

(h) Mass Transit Facilities:

Privately-owned trucks and jitneys inside the respective garrisons provide up-to-date collaboration with the transportation facilities of the enemy.

No plan being for civilians to be loaded and vice versa are maintained by operators of these vehicles. Surveys of Japs and JGs for civilian trips had been very irregular these days.

Motor boats and launches enemy's thorough of water transportation.

(i) COMMUNICATIONS:

Isabela - Receiver and transmitter set in the New Cebu Air Station; enemy's method of sending and receiving urgent messages to and from General Mac at Macolei. Other garrisons are limited to each by telephone lines.

(j) Casualties - New Reports

Montevideo - 21 March '44... 2 of newly drafted Pines and divergence transport hit by Japs and JGs in a night operation of the enemy in the vicinities of San Isidro; the 2 family boys are presently in critical condition.

de Guzman - 21 March '44... in the evening of same, a purple balloon was shot at and enemy collaborator Alfonso Berner were nabbed and shot to death by sec operatives and secret agents of this sub-sector.

Ditto, Nippon-US/IF engagement somewhere in the vicinities of Alifan inflicted a casualty of 3 killed and 1 wounded seriously wounded on enemy's side, plus many civilians killed and many seriously wounded on their side also.

Ditto - Casualty on our side: 2 killed and 2 wounded. Wounded personnel on our side getting along fine. No other reports.

(k) Isabela S-T Under Our Control, etc.

Occupants of safety zones defined by the enemy are now a-days concentrating in contingency and variations the present change of situation has greatly affected a remarkable change in the attitude of these people towards the friendly network.

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(7) CHUANG NOVEMBER-

Minigrants This week seemed to show a complete lull upon the enemy in respective garrisons esp. in their cutting operations in our areas. Naval inspection routines with in town garrisons and along the river banks and banks of the Minigrants river is closely maintained by the Japs. Constant movements of enemy trucks from north to south and vice versa observed for the past weeks covered. No other information.

1000...at about 02:00 P.M. The enemy maintained several jet patrols of usually 6 to 11 engines at the day bridges. The position usually nests themselves camouflaged thereby at about 7:00 p.m. and withdraws from town at usually 8:00 in the following flights to friendly installations. Reports of enemy trucks from higher hrs to labels had been considerably irregular these weeks.

1000...at about 11:00 P.M. a party of 11 Japs and some civilians went to attempt an attempt of daily duties. In their return, they were interrupted by a group of our fighters headed by a Jap and engagement lasted for about 5 minutes of return firing live over since. No casualty on either side.

1000...at about 11:00 P.M. in the evening, a party of 10 Japs and 10 civilians, some civilians was observed each side, part of captured and very civilians therefrom, went out for daily duties to the vicinities of Balid, Suigan

him, Aiola and Crossing Sabana; on the return trip to town they had accomplished a haul of 12 coral pigs and 3 truckloads of sugar. Upon reaching the vicinities of Aiola and Molayna, the enemy noticed the presence of friendly troops waiting in ambush and they (Japs) fired upon them. There was an aggressive exchange of fire from both sides lasting for almost until very late in the afternoon. The said encounter inflicted a casualty of 3 killed and several seriously wounded Filipinos, and only a few civilians both killed and seriously wounded. On our side, 2 were killed and 3 slightly hit.

Note: More accurate information re verification of casualties on enemy's side is underway and will follow up as soon as practicable.

Retrieved - 22 March 1945, at about 7:00 a.m., a party of Japs and Japs went out on mission for definitely to be within the vicinities of San Isidro. Unfortunately enough, one of our boys were stationed there and were surprised by the enemy. An exchange of fire ensued resulting into exchange of fire from both parties. Casualty on our side were two critically hit and 1 Jap killed on enemy's side. (Note: Casualty on enemy's side was included in the report of casualty (4) above.)

It was only a few days later that he was seen still alive and now a confirmed enemy collaborator.

Unconfirmed reports gleaned by a "Stoolie" from a JC in Binigaran states that the enemy, the race of fanatics, will carry out their long awaited plan this week. Or is this a part of their honey coated false propaganda to add more fright to our mass? It's but proper to be always on the alert with the ceaseless vigil of watchfulness.

SUBJECT: ADDITIONAL DOMESTIC QUOTA FOR 1939-40 CROP

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 10 of Act No. 4166, and by virtue of the authority vested in me by Executive Order No. 118, dated September 16, 1937, as amended by Executive Order No. 210, dated June 23, 1939, it is hereby ordered that:

1. The 1939-40 domestic consumption quota as established by Philippine Sugar Order No. 18, dated June 26, 1939, is hereby increased to a total of 150,000 short tons, commercial weight.
2. The additional quota will be divided among the mill districts on the basis of their mill district coefficients set forth in Part 49 of Supplement to Executive Order No. 901, as amended by inter-district transfers.
3. Milling of the additional quota will be permitted until December 31, 1940.
4. All mills filling their portion of the additional quota by milling of cane will be required to pay the corresponding milling license fee.

  - 1. On Jan. 7, 1948, 21 Japs. patrolled Mda. Puyas, Marcia.
  - 2. They molested the civilians, by taking away with them chickens and eggs. They go out by hiking.
  - 3. The strength of the enemy is 30.
  - 4. The enemy is composed of Infantry men.
  - 5. The enemy went to the nearby haciendas for inspection.
  - 6. The changes of officers and men took place Jan. 7, 1948.
- C. Defensive organization:
  - 1. The Japanese dug foxholes around their garrison.
  - 2. The enemy's retreating place is the road going to Bacolod.
- D. Units in Contact:
  - 1. The enemy's unit reserve forces in Bacolod, has the strength of 2000.
  - 2. The enemy's artillery is composed of light cannons: 75 mm. and trench mortars.

  - 1. The enemy have reserve unit in the City of Bacolod, numbering 2000, and are ready to reinforce their garrison in Marcia in case of attack.

  - 1. No contact has been made by our troops with the enemy and no casualties has been made.

- Activities accomplished during the week ending Jan. 14, 1943.
1. During the week, time was devoted to the training of the men.
  2. Everyday there are patrols sent out to snipe the enemy.
  3. Sgt. Yu, in charge of the mobile unit and his men are always patrolling the outskirts of the town of Murcia, waiting for the Japanese to go out from the town proper.

According to information furnished by Sergeant Aguado, City Police of Bacolod, to our agent that on Jan. 6, two (2) Japanese transports arrived at Davao, carrying reinforcement of about 1,000 soldiers with light cannons, automatic rifles, rifles and trench mortars. Further information revealed that the enemy in the City are preparing for Mountain Campaign on or about the 15th of this month. The probable places they will attack are the bivouac of Sub-Sector "C" and "D" which are under Major Backlog and Capt. Penids respectively.

The officers and men that relieved their force in Murcia are all fresh ones, some are only eighteen (18) years old boys.
