Samples from Lopez Central: At Lopez Central it was a surprise to find that in the surface layers the nitrification was only 6.44 percent of the added nitrogen. The highest nitrate production was in the 8 to 16-inch layer, the amount being 13.48 percent. Only a trace of nitrate was produced in the lowest layer, 40 to 48-inch. This low activity of the nitrifying organisms could be attributed to the type of soil, clay on tight clay subsoil which gave poor aeration, and the acid soil reaction, (from pH 5.40 to pH 6.15).

Soil from the Belands of Sara-Ajuy District: It was a surprise to find in the foregoing reports that at Sara-Ajuy over the surface soil nitrified very poorly. The top eight inches of soil nitrified only 0.71 percent of the added nitrogen, while the subsequent strata down to 40 inches showed only a trace of nitrates, and the last layer, 40 to 48-inch, gave a negative result. According to previous chemical analyses, this soil is low in essential nutrient elements, such as nitrogen, phosphorus, and potassium. These elements are food requirements for the nitrifying organisms and it is therefore logical to expect that this deficiency accounts in part for the failure of nitrification in Sara-Ajuy soil. The acid soil reaction and poor aeration as exhibited by clay soils are also possible factors in this failure.

Soil Samples from San Carlos Were Moderately Active in Nitrification: At San Carlos the highest amount of nitrates was produced in the surface eight inches of soil. The lowest which was 15.85 percent of the added nitrogen occurred within the 24 to 32-inch layer. In spite of the depth the last two layers, 32 to 40-inch and 40 to 48-inch produced 49.62 percent and 28.33 percent respectively, far higher than the production in some of the upper layers, (8"-16", 16"-24", and 24"-32"). On the whole, however, it can be considered that the soil of the San Carlos district possesses normal nitrifying power down to a depth of four feet. The physical properties including soil reaction are partly responsible for this normal activity.

Soil Samples from the District of Bais Have High Nitrifying Power: At Bais the highest amount of nitrate which was 88.92 percent was produced within the top 8-inches of the soil. The succeeding layers down to 40 inches produced fair amounts of nitrate, the bottom-most layer, 40 to 48-inch producing 61.69 percent of the added nitrogen. On the average, however, soils from all the different depths contained a sufficient number of nitrifying bacteria as shown by the amount of nitrate produced.

The foregoing determinations for the nitrate-forming capacity of soils were first developed for the sugar industry by Dr. Arrhenius, the Swedish soils chemist working in Java. However the Java Proefstatich has now abandoned this form of determination in soils research for various reasons. It is now known moreover that the nitrate-forming capacity of soils is not so important for sugar cane inasmuch as the cane plant can utilize nitrogen in the ammonium form, directly without being changed to nitrates. The foregoing data, which undoubtedly throw a new viewpoint on the biological activities of our sugar-cane soils will probably, however, be as far as we here in the Philippines will go in this branch of soils research, for the present at least.

Soil from Hacienda Luisita in the District of Tarlac Central Has the Highest Nitrifying Power of all Samples Collected: It can be seen from the foregoing results that at Tarlac the highest nitrate production occurred in the top 24 inches. In the top eight inches 71.80 percent of the added nitrogen was converted into nitrate. This amount, however, is not as high as the production found in the 8 to 16-inch layer, nor the 16 to 24-inch layer, in which 89.28 percent of the added nitrogen was nitrified. The above results further show that strong nitrification was found to occur in soil from the lower depths down to four feet. The lowest layer, 40 to 48-inch, gave nitrate production of 25.50 percent of the added nitrogen. Here it can be stated that the contributing factors responsible for this high nitrate production are probably the favorable soil reaction, pH 7.00-7.55, and a soil type, sandy loam, which allows free circulation of air at the greater depths.

With Soil from the Uplands of the Calamba Sugar Estate Nitrification Was Absent at the Depths Lower than Two Feet: From the above tabulation it is a surprise to find that although the surface soil of eight inches was able to convert 71.42 percent of the added nitrogen into nitrates, yet the extent of this activity did not go lower than 24 inches. Only a trace of nitrate was noticed in soils from lower depths. These findings indicate the scarcity of nitrifying bacteria at lower depths. This is possibly due to poor aeration as shown by the physical properties of the clay subsoil.

High Nitrate Production Was Found to Occur in the 40-48 inch Layer of Binalbagan Soil: At Binalbagan the nitrification results show that the activities of the nitrifying bacteria were fairly uniform for the different layers down to a depth of four feet. The highest nitrate production was found in the first and second eight-inch layers, the amounts being 79.02 percent and 78.90 percent respectively. The last layer 40 to 48-inch gave a nitrate production of 47.62 percent. This is unusually high for this depth. Besides the favorable soil reaction, (a pH of 7.01 to 7.38), this is a soil washed from the bordering fields, and as a consequence the rich loamy aerated surface soil is quite deep.

La Carlota Soil at Hacienda Esperanza: The above tabulation shows that nitrate production was quite normal as far down as 40 inches. The highest nitrate production occurred in the top 16 inches, and the lowest production, which was 3.97 percent of the added nitrogen, was found as would be expected in the lowest layer, 40"-48". In the foregoing results it is interesting to find the gradual decrease of nitrate production at increasing depths. This is probably largely due to the decreasing supply of air at increasing depths, resulting in a diminished activity of the organisms that are concerned in the formation of nitrates.

Rawlien-Philippine Soil is Active Even to a Depth of Four Feet: Nitrate production which is 47.28 percent of the added nitrogen occurred in the 32"-40" layer. The lowest amount of nitrate was obtained in the 40"-48" layer. But on the whole the nitrifying organisms were fairly active down to four feet as shown by the nitrate production. In this case it is interesting to note the reaction of the soil in the different layers and the physical properties of the soil permitting the free circulation of air to a considerable depth, which is favorable to the growth of the nitrifying organisms.
