1. **SOLDIERS:** Soldiers' morale very high. It is expected that with the Allied help coming nearer everyday, no threat nor propaganda of the enemy can change the high spirit of the soldiers. The starvation now raging in this area has in noway dampened their moral. Instead they voiced their eagerness and enthusiasm to raid the enemy garrisons with the purpose to loot enemy supplies. Starvation however is knocking at the door and the situation, specially among those having families to support, is desperate.

2. **CIVILIANS:** Civilians' morale very high. Effective counter propaganda and the confident thought that our strength is in the position to take the measure of the enemy with effectiveness, bolstered the civilian morale. They now defy enemy threats, notwithstanding the fact that some live in the lowlands-places accessible to enemy raid. To prove their defiant attitude, the Japanese money is now very unpopular in the "Tagbos". Commodities cost very high if bought with enemy currency. The ratio of its buying power is three to two in favor of our scripts.

From all tangible indications, the soldiers, amidst tempting circumstances and all other vicissitudes of life, still assume the high hopes of our final victory. On the other hand, our recent operations with the enemy, which have in large measure given us the potentialities of satisfactory combat results, have determined our men to forge ahead. Among many other reasons which are instrumental to the amelioration of our soldiers' morale are due; Axis reverses in the combat world, and also the material acquisition of the new brand of arms and ammunition, becomes the probable credulity for more successful operations. Consequently, the combat spirit of the fighting units are heightened with burning desire. Generally, the soldiers' morale of this Command is apparently high.

Civilians:- The exemplary conduct of our men against overwhelming odds in the face of adversities evidently points out a mellifluous admiration of the civilian populace. Much more the economic hardships which gravely aggravated the temporary confusion of everybody are now restored as a result of the extensive food production campaign. 

American Liberators landed Negros Island; The news set up a final and complete epitaph for the war History of the Island. The liberation for Negros is discernible. This has, to a large extent, open up the final analysis of the struggle, that we have been fighting, altho characterologically, has set up extreme joy and happiness, not only to the Armed Forces, but also to the civilian population. The Army Units of this command are, in large measure, affiliated with the feeling of supreme enthusiasm, the joy for a higher life, and much more, the tangible certainty, that for which, peace and tranquility will be restored. This assures them to be later on free and independent, devoid of any barbaric and ruthless oppression. The set-backs and decadence of our economic condition will be studied and rehabilitated. The tremendous efforts of reconstruction of our social welfare and political status will be everybody's concern. Morale of the civilian population, viewed from the foregoing aspects is excellent.
