GENERAL SHOP WORK  
1931 SHOP TEACHERS' INSTITUTE;  
PALO, LEYTE, APRIL 20-30

I. OBJECTIVES:

- (a) To furnish development experience in shop activities based more upon the development of projects.
- (b) To give elementary instruction in a number of more or less related lines of work corresponding to the interest and ability levels of the pupils.
- (c) To include not only woodworking, but also elementary ironworking, home mechanics, and bamboo and rattan furniture making.

AIMS:

- (a) To give clear, definite, and simple directions.
- (b) To have clearly in mind the processes to be taught and the materials to be used before work on an article is begun, and to explain to pupils the parts of the article and the uses of the finished article.
- (c) To exercise great care in the selection of materials with respect to uniformity in structure and shade, and the absence of imperfections so that when the articles are completed they may be of high standard in workmanship.
- (d) To give pupils a clear idea of the correct names of all necessary materials, the source, the color, the quality, the cost, and the amount required.
- (e) To see that tools are of the proper kind, of the best quality, uniform if possible, and kept sharp and free from rust.
- (f) To train pupils in the habitual and correct use of a metric ruler with which each should be provided.
- (g) To encourage habits of cleanliness in work by providing wash basins and water and by urging pupils to supply themselves with soap and individual towels to use before starting to work.
